

VIRGINIA: AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AMELIA COUNTY HELD IN THE COURTHOUSE BUILDING ON MONDAY, MAY 8, 1961

RE: ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE - BOUNDARY LINES

WHEREAS, at the March meeting of this Board the hereinafter set forth ordinance was proposed for adoption at this meeting on May 8, 1961 at 10 A.M. and,

WHEREAS, the Clerk of this Board did cause a copy of such proposed ordinance posted at the nine voting precincts in Amelia County (see return of Sheriff filed with papers of this meeting) and did cause a copy to be published in the Courier Record, Blackstone, Virginia once a week for four successive weeks - (see certificate of publisher also filed with the papers of this meeting, said copies so posted and published giving notice to all persons interested in the said proposed ordinance to attend this meeting to be heard for or against the proposal.

Thereupon the hour of 10 o'clock A.M. having arrived, and the Chairman of this Board inviting anyone who desired to be heard to come forward and the ear of the Board would be available to them, and no one appearing to be heard, and thereupon after consideration of the same the Board doth unanimously adopt the said Ordinance as the law of Amelia County, Virginia as follows:

BOUNDARY LINES ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, at the March meeting of this Board the hereinafter set forth ordinance was proposed for adoption at this meeting on May 8, 1961, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amelia, Virginia, that the boundary line of each lot, parcel or tract of land within the County of Amelia shall be a lawful fence as to all livestock designated in Section 8-874 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

This Ordinance shall be effective from the date of its adoption and shall continue in effect until altered or repealed.
