Hart Rd. & Rt. 14 Improvements Set to Begin Next Summer

Additional Turn Lanes and New Sidewalks Will Bring Increased Safety to this Intersection

Lake County has recently announced that the long-awaited intersection improvements at Hart Road and Route 14 will be sent out for construction bids this September, which means that construction at the intersection will likely begin as soon as school is out in summer 2020.

The improvements are expected to increase safety at this often-dangerous intersection by providing additional turn lanes, which will also reduce wait times during peak hours.

In addition, the project also includes additional sidewalk/bike path connectivity along Hart Road and Route 14, which will eventually connect Barrington High School to the Roslyn Road

Barrington Works Together To Stop Bullying

About a month ago, a Barrington High School student experienced a very unfortunate situation where her family's home and lawn were vandalized as a part of a potential hate crime that included the directive to "go [expletive] kill yourself." Because both the victim and the suspect in this case are juveniles, we as a Village cannot comment further about the details of this case.

However, I want to make it very clear that we in Barrington have zero tolerance for bullying or hate crimes of any nature. Barrington is a place where all individuals should feel safe and free from harassment at all times.

I believe that in Barrington, we are all truly neighbors... thank you to all who work tirelessly to make Barrington a place where all should feel safe, always.

At our June 10 Board of Trustees meeting, I was so pleased that a number of our residents attended and spoke passionately and eloquently about how this incident had touched them and impacted their lives.

But more than that, I was especially pleased

to hear the father of this young woman talk about the outpouring of love and support that his family had received since the incident – and his recognition that 99% of our community is welcoming and inclusive of all.

From a personal standpoint, the reference to suicide in this incident was particularly upsetting to me. Barrington has an unfortunate history with suicide, as about a decade ago we had several Barrington High School students take their own lives during a relatively short period of time. The hate messages in this recent incident were a frightening reminder that we cannot let down our guard about suicide in our community, and especially when it comes to our children.

Toward that end, we in Barrington work very hard on an ongoing basis to initiate and support numerous programs that help further the goal

of making our community a safe place for all. I'd like to share a few of those programs with you.

Over 20 years ago, community members brought the [Character Counts](#) initiative to Barrington. This national program works to recognize those in the community who embrace the six pillars of character – trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship. Each year, the Barrington Junior Women's Club recognizes community members who live these pillars as examples, helping to foster healthy engaged citizens.

In addition, the Village of Barrington is involved with the [Healthier Barrington Coalition](#) (www.healthybarrington.org), which is a partnership of 25 area organizations working together to make the Barrington area a healthier place to live, work and play through assessment of needs and collaborative action. The coalition includes a significant mental health component, and their web site was created to help residents easily and quickly identify local providers who offer counseling, support, and mental health and substance abuse treatment.

In addition, we actively support Barrington's [B Strong Together](#) (www.bstrongtogether.org), whose mission is to enhance the health and well-being of Barrington area children and youth in mind, body, and spirit. Similarly, our [Barrington Police Department](#) works with the Barrington 220 school district on numerous programs to address bullying and promote the well-being of all our students, including [Broncos Committed](#) and [Text-a-Tip](#). I wholeheartedly encourage all in our community to support these programs.

The incident that occurred last month was hateful and very unfortunate. **But I believe that in Barrington, we are all truly neighbors, and it is incumbent upon each of us to love and care for our neighbors as we would our own.** And so, as often occurs in Barrington, many have stepped up to help us achieve that end. Thank you to all who work tirelessly to make Barrington a place where all should feel safe, always.

White House Wins Community Foundation Grants



Barrington's White House has been awarded three grants by the Barrington Area Community Foundation (BACF) for 2019. The awards include \$4,000 to provide ten \$400 vouchers to non-profit organizations to rent the house for strategic meetings and events. It also includes \$3,500 for marketing materials for the first BWH Summer Cultural Series. And finally, it includes \$1,500 for the Best Use of Volunteers, which will be used to develop a training program and purchase a service pin to recognize significant levels of volunteer commitment.

Barrington's White House has over 55 volunteers who donated more than 1,613 hours in 2018 assisting with running cultural events, serving as historic docents, providing board oversight, writing grants, and more. This is an average of 29 hours per volunteer and a value of \$40,000 in equivalent dollars.

BWH Cultural Director Rollin Potter Inducted into BACOA Hall of Fame

Congratulations to Barrington's White House Cultural Director **Dr. Rollin Potter**, who was recently inducted into the Barrington Area Council on Aging (BACOA) Hall of Fame. Rollin has been a volunteer for the Barrington Cultural Commission since 2014 and the White House Cultural Director since 2015. His passion for the arts and his many cultural connections have made Barrington the place to be in the Northwest Suburbs. Congratulations, Rollin!

Barrington Says Goodbye to Director of Development Services Greg Summers

The Village of Barrington would like to thank Director of Development Services **Greg Summers** for his 11 years of dedicated service to our community. In June Greg announced that he will be leaving the Village to take on the exciting new challenge of Assistant Village Manager in the Village of Orland Park.

Greg's long tenure at the Village has resulted in numerous accomplishments. He was intimately involved with managing the two-year Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project, the Village's Global Storm Water Study, and dozens of flood reduction projects, including the new storm water basin at the former Miller Park site.

In addition, he and his team oversaw the planning for the Route 14 underpass and Lake Zurich Road realignment, Hart Road and Route 14 intersection improvements, and the new north commuter entrance drive. Greg also introduced numerous cost and process efficiencies as well as customer service enhancements. He was also instrumental in the Village applying for and receiving more than \$32 million in grant funding for numerous projects.

During his tenure, Development Services received more than 14 awards from the American Council of Engineering Companies, the American Public Works Association, the Chaddick Institute for Metropolitan Development, and the United States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design. KNOW WHAT'S BELOW... CALL "JULIE" BEFORE YOU DIG

Doing an outdoor project? Illinois law requires that you call JULIE at 811 two business days before you dig, or go to illinois1call.com. A representative from each member utility company will mark the location of their facilities with paint and/or flags. Member utility locators should always have clearly visible identification and rarely need to enter your home to complete a locate request.

Excavation should be carefully performed only after confirming that all member utilities have marked the location of their underground lines or notified you that they have no buried lines in the area. Call center agents are available 24/7/365.

EPA WATER REPORT NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) requires all communities to provide to their consumers a Consumer Confidence Report on the quality of their system's drinking water. This report summarizes the quality of water that we provided during the last year. Barrington meets the USEPA standards for water quality and now is only required to analyze lead and copper quantities once every three years, rather than twice a year.

Included in the report are details about where your water comes from, what it contains and how it compares to standards set by regulatory agencies. Also included is a Source Water Assessment Summary. Community water supplies are required to report a summary of their source water susceptibility determination, which were compiled by the IEPA.

The Annual Water Quality Report for the period of January 1 to December 31, 2018 is intended to provide you with important information about your drinking water and the efforts made by the Barrington water system to provide safe drinking water. The source of drinking water used by Barrington is ground water. *Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre el agua que usted bebe. Tradúzcalo ó hable con alguien que lo entienda bien.*

Pitch In to Conserve Water

Now that summer is here, additional water is being used by residents to maintain lawns, gardens, and trees, which places a higher demand on our water system. 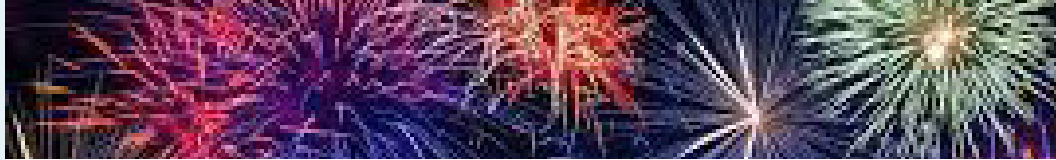

FIREWORKS BY THE NUMBERS

>> Fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires per year, including 1,300 structure fires, 300 vehicle fires, and 16,900 other fires. These fires caused an average of three deaths, 40 civilian injuries, and an average of \$43 million in direct property damage.

>> In 2017, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 12,900 people for fireworks-related injuries; children younger than age 15 accounted for more than one-third of those injured.

NEW COMMUTER PARKING PROGRAM

Changes Coming to Both North and South Commuter Lot Parking October 1

Due to increased demand for commuter parking, the Village of Barrington has added 67 additional commuter spaces to our commuter parking. Beginning October 1, there will be several changes to the Commuter Lot parking program, including the addition of new guaranteed-space Premium Parking near the train depot. Also, daily fee parkers

will now be able to park in either the North or South Lots. The daily fee will increase to \$3.50 per day, with discounted quarterly passes available for \$200.
