## Symbolism: Triangles

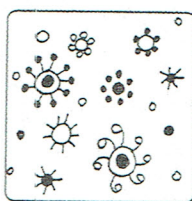
The double triangle, forming a six-pointed star, represents fulfillment and harmony. The upward triangle represents the fire of creative life force, while the downward triangle symbolizes water and potential. Because triangles rotate on a center point, they also indicate change.



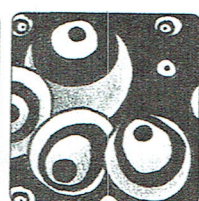
