If you are not already a Friend of the Library, simply purchase your membership at the door to get an early look at the variety of books that are for sale. Did you know? You can renew your items online! Simply go to www.brookingslibrary.org and click *Log In To Your Account* to access your account using your library card number and password, which is your last name in lowercase. If your last name is longer than 8 letters, it's the first 8 letters of your last name. Click on the *Your Account* looks like this: Ashia's Account | Log Out

This will bring you to your account page. Click the Account Activity button.

This will bring up a list of all the books you currently have checked out. Click the *Renew Loan* button to renew your book for another 4 weeks.

Renew Loan

Books can be renewed one time. If Renew Loan is not available, you have either renewed the item once already or someone else has a hold on it.

Ashia's Book Recommendation: *Burn for You*, by J.T. Geissinger. Jackson "The Beast" Boudreaux is rich, gorgeous, and unbelievably rude to the staff at Chef Bianca Hardwick's New Orleans restaurant. Bianca would sooner douse herself in hot sauce than cook for Jackson again, but when he asks her to cater his fund-raiser, Bianca can't refuse, knowing the cash will help pay her mother's medical bills. Then Jackson makes another outrageous request: *Marry me*. The unconventional offer includes an enormous sum—money Bianca desperately needs, even if it does come with a contract—and a stunning ring.

The heir to a family bourbon dynasty, Jackson knows the rumors swirling around him. The truth is even darker. Still, he needs a wife to secure his inheritance, and free-spirited, sassy Bianca would play the part beautifully. Soon, though, their simple business deal evolves into an emotional intimacy he's built walls to avoid. "My name was Salmon, like the fish; first name, Susie. I was fourteen when I was murdered on December 6, 1973."

So begins the story of Susie Salmon, who is adjusting to her new home in heaven, a place that is not at all what she expected, even as she is watching life on earth continue without her -- her friends trading rumors about her disappearance, her killer trying to cover his tracks, her griefstricken family unraveling. Out of unspeakable tragedy and loss, *The*

Lovely Bones succeeds, miraculously, in building a tale filled with hope, humor, suspense, even joy.

Next month the book club will be reading and discussing the book *Five Quarters of the Orange* by Joanne Harris.

The Long Haul : A Trucker's Tales of Life on the Road by Finn Murphy More than thirty years ago, Finn Murphy dropped out of college to become a long-haul trucker. Since then he's covered more than a million miles packing, loading, and hauling people's belongings all over America. Known by his trucker handle - U-Turn - he spends his days, and many of his nights, in a 53-foot eighteen-wheeler he calls Cassidy.

Through it all, Murphy tells poignant, funny, and often haunting stories of the people he encounters on the job. These experiences inspire Finn's memorable reflections on work, class, and the bonds we form with the things we own and the places we live.

Next month we will be reading Neil de Grasse Tyson's book *Astrophysics for People in a Hurry*. Dr. Judy Vondruska of SDSU will be joining us to help answer questions.

Monthly Puppet Shows


There are monthly puppet shows at the library on a **Thursday night @ 7 pm**. The September puppet show will be held **Thursday, September 20**.
