





Ghana, eighteenth century: two half sisters are born into different villages, each unaware of the other. One will marry an Englishman and lead a life of comfort in the palatial rooms of the Cape Coast Castle. The other will be captured in a raid on her village, imprisoned in the very same castle, and sold into slavery.






Homegoing follows the parallel paths of these sisters and their descendants through eight generations: from the Gold Coast to the plantations of Mississippi, from the American Civil War to Jazz Age Harlem. Yaa Gyasi's extraordinary novel illuminates slavery's troubled legacy both for those who were taken and those who stayed—and shows how the memory of captivity has been inscribed on the soul of our nation.







# Karen Land, Noggin, and the Iditarod

The book is told from a multicultural perspective and provides historical context for race relations in South Dakota and elsewhere while also encouraging civil and thoughtful dialogue as readers reflect on the three main characters' attempts to understand each other.

#### Earth as Art Exhibit and Talk

Brent Yantis from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Regional Application Center (RAC) will be bringing the *Earth as Art* exhibit to the Brookings Public Library from **June 15—July 22**, and will be giving a talk on the out-of-this-world exhibit on **June 18 at 7:00 pm**. The RAC is made up of geospatial scientists who work to gather and share satellite and remote sensing imagery that is used in emergency response, coastal restoration, the transportation industry and precision agriculture. The *Earth as Art* gallery exhibit features remarkable images of the surface of the Earth that have been captured by remote sensing devices aboard Landsat and other satellites. The exhibit is presented by the University of Louisiana at Lafayette RAC and the LouisianaView program.
