





Author Talk with One Book SD Author, Megan Phelps Roper

Monday, August 10 @ 6pm via Zoom

In the 2020 One Book South Dakota selection, "Unfollow: A Memoir of Loving and Leaving the Westboro Baptist Church," author Megan Phelps-Roper demonstrates the power of civil conversation. A former member of the extremist Westboro Baptist Church, Phelps-Roper now lives in Clark, S.D. Her book is a statement for change, as it proves to readers the value of civility, of practicing critical thinking skills and applying them to interpersonal relationships. The Library will host a discussion with Phelps-Roper about her book and experiences via Zoom on Monday, August 10 at 6pm.
