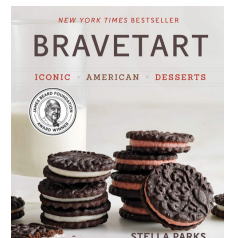
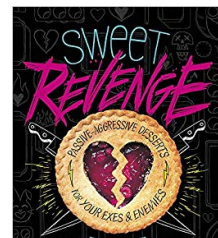
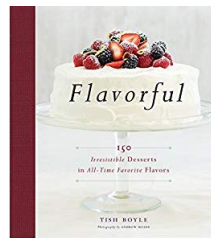
Cookbook Club

Here are the rules:

1. Open to youth in kindergarten through 5th grade. No adults.
2. Entries must be on 8½x11 or 9x12 paper; only one (1) entry per person.
3. Please include the following:
 - Title of Book (on the illustration side)
 - Name, Grade, School's Name, Teacher's Name (on back side)
 - (Home schooled students should use their address & phone number in place of the school and teacher's name.)
4. Entries must be original. No plagiarizing!
5. Books based on animated films are not permitted.
6. Any type of media - colored pencils, crayons, markers, paint, collage or mixed may be used.
7. Submission deadline is 5 pm on Sunday, March 1.
8. Winners will be chosen in three categories:
 - K-1st grade, 2nd-3rd grade, and 4th-5th grade.
9. Winners will be announced by Friday, March 13. All contestants are invited to attend the awards ceremony on Saturday, April 25 at 2 pm where the winners will be recognized.
