Lecture with Dr. Michael Nagy

Duplicitous Deities and their Mythological Function: Old Norse-Icelandic Poems of Wisdom and Learning

Join us on Thursday, July 23rd at 6:30pm on Facebook Live to hear Dr. Michael Nagy, Associate Professor of Medieval English literature, discuss Norse mythology and the genre of wisdom poetry. This lecture will examine Old Norse-Icelandic wisdom poetry and the mythological function of the duplicitous gods that one finds therein. It will also explore what implications, if any, this duplicity has on Ragnarök, or the Doom of the Gods, and reflect on directions for further research in this area.

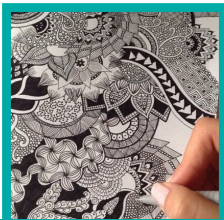
