





Since we weren't able to hold our Spring Friends of the Library Book Sale, our storage space is at capacity! We are not accepting book donations until further notice. Please do not put donations in the book drop or leave them outside the front doors. Thank you!

Computer Lab Appointments

We are offering access to the computer lab through appointment only. Limited spots are available Monday-Friday, 9:30am-12:00pm, 1:00pm-4:30pm. To schedule a computer lab appointment, please call us at 605-692-9407 during regular weekday hours. There are a few rules to keep in mind:

- Limit one 45-minute session per week
- Ages 16 and older only
- Only one person per appointment will be allowed in the building
- If a parent or guardian must bring minor children along, children must stay with the parent or guardian in the computer lab, and maintain social distancing from others using the computer lab.
- You will be required to wear a mask for the duration of your visit. The Library will have disposable masks available for those who do not have their own.
- You must use the provided hand sanitizer upon entering the building.
- Physical browsing of the Library's collection is not allowed during this time.
- Please wait at the South-facing doors of the Library entrance at your scheduled time. Library staff, wearing masks, will escort you to the computer lab
- Printing is available for printing (\$0.10/page black and white, \$0.25/page color).
- Available computers will be spaced out to promote social distancing and will be disinfected between each appointment.

The Friends of the Brookings Public Library are collecting Hy-Vee receipts for the Hy-Vee receipt program! For every \$150,000 in receipts we collect, Hy-Vee will donate \$1,000 to be used for library programming and collections. Receipts can be dropped off in the book drops while we are closed or at the circulation desk once we reopen.

2020 Children's Summer Reading Program

- To sign up for the Reading Program, fill out the online form on our website under the "Library Services > Children > Summer Reading Program Registration" tabs. Then swing by the Library the next day to pick up your reading materials.
- You may register up to 5 children on the same form. Make sure to select the proper Reading Club for each child.
 - Knights Reading Club Kids from preschool (3+) age to entering 5th grade can join the Reading Knights. They will get a reading log and activity quest sheet. Knights will be able to show off their hard work with a reading Brag Tag. Knights can earn beads by reading or reading with someone throughout the summer. There will be weekly prizes and a grand prize drawing September 1.
 - Little Squires Reading Club Kids under 3 will be able to join the Reading Squires. They will earn prizes by completing early literacy activities.
- Knights and squires will be able to pick up their beads and prizes at the Prize Bazaar, outside the library (See calendar for schedule, outside only)!
- When you have completed the form, hit the submit button.
- Stop by the library the during the next curbside pickup day (Monday-Friday 9:30-12, 1-4:30) to pick up your bag(s) with reading log and information.
- Please call the Library at 605-692-9407 when you arrive. Please tell us your name and that you are here to pick-up your materials. Please remain in your vehicle.
- Library staff will set your materials on the sidewalk by the West doors. Please remain in your vehicle until the staff member has returned inside the Library.
- Start logging your reading on June 1st.
