Spring has sprung and we are trying to adapt to unsure times. Thankfully, the staff at the Brookings Public Library is ready to take on the challenge.

Fistly, we will be closed through mid- to late May. Curbside pick up will be available Monday through Thursday. For more details, see page 2. Fines will be waived on any items that were due March 16th through May 3rd. Any items due after this time will incur late fees.

Even though we aren't open, there are opportunities to check out both physical and digital books! To log into most of our services, use your <u>library</u> card number as your username, and your last name, lowercase (up to 8 letters) as the password.

If you do not have a library card with us, we are offering the option for Brookings county residents to sign up for a card remotely. Visit bit.ly/getmeacard. Fill out all of the required sections and upload a photo ID that shows your current address. If your ID is not updated, please upload a piece of mail that shows your name and Brookings County address. We will respond with your card number and credentials as soon as we are able to during regular 8am-5pm hours, Monday-Thursday. Physical cards can be picked up once the Library is open again.

We are offering book clubs again and are looking into providing opportunities for live-streamed events and takeaway activities. From time to time, we also offer fun diversions to keep your mind occupied on our Facebook page. Check out the following pages to see what we're offering for all ages.






