#### **MONDAY, NOVEMBER 2- 6:30PM** COLIN MUSTFUL- "THE U.S. - DAKOTA WAR OF 1862: A HISTORICAL CONTEXT"

On December 26, 1862, thirty-eight Dakota men were hanged in Mankato, Minnesota, in the largest mass execution in United States history. This event was the result of the U.S. - Dakota War of 1862. But, what was the U.S. -Dakota War and how and why did it happen? Author Colin Mustful will trace the history of the U.S. - Dakota War beginning in 1805 and the unfortunate outcomes.

#### JACE DEC PHILOSO Jace DeCory

#### MONDAY, NOVEMBER 9- 6:30PM JACE DECORY- "TRADITIONAL LAKOTA PHILOSOPHY"

Jace DeCory will share the history and philosophy of her Lakota people and discuss its relevance for today. DeCory taught American Indian Studies classes at Black Hills State University, but now, in retirement, she helps others to better understand Lakota cultural ways as a community elder. Her goal is to build bridges and encourage folks to communicate better with one another.

#### MONDAY, NOVEMBER 16 - 6:30PM V.R. JANIS- "TRADITIONAL PARENTING"

V.R. Janis will discuss the cradleboard, a traditional baby carrier, as well as traditional discipline and her personal experience as a mother of three. Janis is an author, artist, and owner of Inked Scroll Creatives, a mother/daughter art business where they share their art and creativity on their YouTube channel and podcast. Janis is also an Indigenous Librarian for the Woksape Tipi Library.

#### MONDAY, NOVEMBER 30-6:30PM ROD BROWN- "CULTURAL CHANGE: BEADS AND BUFFALO"

Tribal cultures experienced incredible and dislocating change from the arrival of Lewis & Clark (1804) to the 19th century decimation of the buffalo herds that once spread across the South Dakota prairie. Brown focuses on the transition from quillwork to beadwork and loss of the buffalo, and examines both voluntary and forced cultural change.




