

"Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington, Miles Davis and Their Contributions to Jazz" presentation with Dr. Yiqun Chen

This presentation will provide an overview of the development of jazz music in the United States and highlight specific contributions by Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington and Miles Davis.

"Within our Gates" film screening and "Oscar Micheaux: From Homesteading to Hollywood" presentation with Marthetta Watson following



The 1920 Oscar Micheaux film, "Within Our Gates," tells the story of an educated Black woman with a shocking past who dedicates herself to helping a near bankrupt school for impoverished Black youths after she is abandoned by her fiancé (description adapted from IMDb).

Watson's presentation will introduce Oscar Micheaux, a Black homesteader from Gregory County, SD who became known as the first Black filmmaker. She will discuss how many of his experiences on the prairie influenced the subjects of his numerous novels and movies.

This visual presentation will introduce the artist Aaron Douglas, the "Father of Black Art." Douglas was the first Black graduate of the University of Nebraska Lincoln Department of Art. His work is a celebration of Afrocentric Modernism, with which he established one of the earliest affirmative depictions of Black identity, history, and experience.


