Deputy Director Dennison confirmed that the bids are for all elections in calendar year 2024, and that our ballots will be black and white 17" (14" plus 2 stubs). Upon request, both vendor representatives in the meeting provided information about other counties with whom they have contracts. The only issue was perforations in the ES&S ballot stock (used by all the ballot printing vendors), which made the stubs hard to tear.
