

**Start of Official Canvass for the
November 2, 2010 General Election**

November 15, 2010, 9:00 a.m.

Chairman Tim Rudd called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: None.

TEST DECK:

Director Miller provided the Board with the Test Deck. Dave and Rick observed Nick Sommer (ISD) run the Test Deck ballots thru the 650 scanners. Tim and Dave compared the results with the previous Test Deck results and found them to match.

2010-133 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Director Miller reported to the Board that there were 1,416 Provisional Ballots Cast.

INVALID PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Judy explained the 129 invalid Provisional Ballots. There were 2 voters (husband & wife) that voted provisional ballots twice. They voted in the office (as provisionals because they had moved), later they thought they should have had a school issue on the ballot so they went to the polls on Election Day and voted provisional again. Dave Lane was in the office when the voters came in (after the Election) and witnessed their confusion and explanation. Dave believes there was no intent to vote twice. The ballots that were voted first (in office) will be the ballots that are counted. The second set of ballots (voted at the polls) will not be counted.

Judy added that the staff tried to contact the voter to correct any errors when applicable and for those that were not registered we mail them registration cards.

2010-134 – Paul Campbell made the motion, as recommended by the staff, to reject and not count the 129 invalid provisionals ballots. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Judy explained that there were 7 provisional voters at the polls that voted in the wrong precinct and 3 provisional voters that received the incorrect precinct in the office. The latest "Homeless Directive" states, if a voter votes in the wrong precinct but correct polling location and only gives the last 4 of their Society Security number as their ID, their ballot counts (but must be duplicated to correct precinct). If they had used a Driver's License then we could not count the ballot. Tim wanted to clarify that there were not any of these in the previous invalid provisional and Judy stated that there were not.

2010-135 – Rick Combs made the motion to duplicate the 10 Provisional Ballots identified by the staff that voted in the wrong precinct (but correct polling location) and only used their Social Security Number as identification. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

Judy advised the Board that there were 1,277 valid Provisional Ballots cast.

2010-136 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the 1,277 valid Provisional Ballots. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

Judy added that the total valid Provisional Ballot count including the 10 duplicated ballots is 1,287.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

Judy reminded the Board that Absentee Ballots must be postmarked no later than the day before (11-1-2010) Election Day to be valid.

INVALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS-RECEIVED AFTER ELECTION DAY:

Judy reviewed the invalid Absentee Ballots.

56 - received after Election Day, 11-2-2010 (postmarked on or after 11-2-2010)

2 - voters dropped voted absentee ballots at polling location

24 - voted ballots returned- they were missing ID envelopes, ID or signature-these voters were contacted to correct the errors

68 - no postmark or illegible postmark

1 - deceased voter- ballot returned to Board unvoted

1 - voter returned an unvoted ballot to Board and then voted a provisional ballot at the polls

55 - ballots mailed and returned undeliverable (52 military & civilian overseas)

26 - ballots e-mailed to military & civilians overseas & not returned

40 - ballots requested by nursing homes residents that refused to vote

2 - received Federal Write-In ballots-no previous Federal Postcard or application

Judy advised the Board of a new HAVA requirement (starting with this election) regarding any military or civilian overseas. We can receive their absentee application by email, fax or mail and they advise us if they want to receive their ballot by mail, email or fax. The SOS gave us equipment for this process however the SOS computer could not handle the attachments to the email. We did not find this out until after we sent out the information to the voters. We had to send the information from an office computer.

Also, all of this had to be logged on daily spreadsheets. The entire process takes a large amount of time for each voter, which is a good idea but the technology needs to catch up with the process. Rick recommended that this be addressed to Jean Schmidt, John Husted, Rob Portman, Jennifer Brunner and Sherrod Brown, and that it is a major problem. Judy will let the Board know when these letters are mailed.

2010-137 – Paul Campbell made the motion to reject and not count the 275 invalid Absentee Ballots. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all members voted “yes”.

VALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS RECEIVED AFTER ELECTION DAY:

Judy reviewed the 46 valid Absentee Ballots.

40- ballots received after November 2, 2010 with valid postmarks (on or before November 1, 2010)

2- ballots returned with no date of birth (dob is not required, name, signature & ID is required)

3- military & overseas ballots emailed and returned-requires duplication

1- board office issued wrong precinct ballot- voter was notified but did not come in the office to vote correct precinct (requires Board approval)

2010-138 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the additional 46 Absentee Ballots, duplicate those that require duplication and add them to the Absentee Count. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board that the staff has a lot of provisional and absentee ballots to sort, to determine if they require Board review. The Board will review these for over votes, write-ins and double bubbles.

2010-139 – Rick Combs made the motion to instruct the Office Staff to proceed with Official Canvass. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all members voted “yes”.

The Board will remain in Session but stands at Recess and will reconvene tomorrow (11/16/2010) at 10:00 a.m.

Board Reconvenes
November 16, 2010, 10:00 a.m.

At 10:00 a.m. November 16 2010 Chairman Tim Rudd reconvened the Opening of Canvass Meeting. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking Record. There were no other attendees.

Director Miller brought to the Boards attention an Election Day Ballot that requires duplication. At Union-U precinct a ballot was left in the M100 scanner (the ballot was rejected, the voter walked off leaving without accepting it or getting a new ballot leaving the ballot in the M100 machine). Per a note from the poll workers, they took the ballot, tore it up and put it in the soiled envelope. When the books were balanced this precinct was off one ballot.

2010-140 – Dave Lane made the motion to duplicate and count the UN-U Election Day ballot. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

The Board reviewed the Provisional Ballots that contained over votes, write-ins and double bubble ballots and stray marks. They determined those ballots that required duplication.

2010-141 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the staff’s recommendation on Provisional Ballots and duplicate as necessary. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

The Board reviewed one absentee ballot and determined it to be a true over vote and determined that the ballot should run as is.

Judy advised the Board that the Governor will fill the vacancy for the Municipal Court Judge that was held by Thomas R. Herman, who was the single candidate for Common Pleas Court Judge at this election.

The Board stands in Session for Final Canvass and will Reconvene November 23 at 10:00 a.m. to Certify the Election and the Regular Board Meeting.

Certification and Regular Board Meeting
November 23, 2010, 10:00 a.m.

In Chairman Tim Rudd’s absence Rick Combs was acting Chairman and called the meeting to order at 10:03 p.m. Paul Campbell led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board members present were Dave Lane, Rick Combs and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Joe Glasgow – Dayton Legal Blank

TEST DECK:

Nick Sommer (ISD) provided the Board with the Final Test Deck. Dave and Rick observed him run the ballots thru the 650 scanner. Rick compared the results and found them to match.

2010-142 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Dave Lane – “yes”, Paul Campbell – “yes” and Rick Combs – “yes”.

Judy advised the Board that there were some adjustments in the final numbers of the Provisional Ballot count. The final number of provisional ballots cast is 1,410. Ten provisional ballots were added twice.

- 130 – invalid Provisional Ballots – not to be counted
- 1,280 – valid Provisional Ballots (10 of these had to be duplicated)
- 1,410 – total Provisional Ballots cast

The double bubble and write-in’s had to be manually updated.

CERTIFICATION OF ELECTION:

2010-143 – Paul Campbell made the motion to Certify the Results of the November 2, 2010 General Election. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all members present voted “yes”.

Judy stated that there are no automatic recounts that need to be conducted.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2010-144 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the Minutes from the October 21, 2010 Regular Board Meeting. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members present voted “yes”.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

Judy brought to the Board’s attention the entry for Commercial Works (deployment of voting equipment-partial payment). When Commercial Works returned the grey metal M100 cans 4 or 5 cans were damaged. Mike is placing a claim with the company at the advice of the person we contracted with. We don’t know if they need to be replaced or repaired. The cost of a new can is \$1,080 and a refurbished is \$850. The entry for \$4,250.00 does not reflect the compensation for the damages. We can pay the \$4250.00 and they will reimburse us the damage costs.

2010-145 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept and pay the November bills with the exception of the Commercial Works bill for \$4,250.00, pending satisfactory resolution of the claim for damaged M100 boxes. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

OPENING OF BIDS FOR PRINTING OF BALLOTS FOR 2011 ELECTIONS:

Judy reported to the Board that there was only one vendor to submit a bid. Dayton Legal Blank submitted bids for 2011:

- *General Elections - single 14 inch ballots- 0.26 each, - two sheets 14 inch ballots- 0.28 each
- *Special Elections - single 14 inch ballots- 0.28 each,
- *If required folded Absentee Ballots will be an additional 0.03 per ballot
- * Absentee Ballots will be tri-folded and boxed, not wrapped, in precinct order using white storage boxes
- *Election Day Ballots will be shrink wrapped by precinct, ballot style and labeled with quality and precinct
- *If required additional color identification will be an additional 0.04 each
- *the cost printing prefilled Test Deck ballots will be identical to those of the ballots of each election, there are no additional file charges for the Test Deck files
- *the cost for printing Sample Ballots will be identical to that of the ballots of each election, no additional charges for sample files
- *Since Clermont County will be supplying print ready files DLB can not be held responsible for delays created beyond our control, it will be our intention that Absentee Ballots will be delivered within 12 days or sooner and Election Day Ballots within 20 days or sooner after receipt of files from the County.
- *Proofs if required would be delivered within 7 days.
- *pre-filled-in Test Deck Ballots would be delivered within 7 days.

DLB only prints M100 ballots on ES&S ballot stock

All prices are FOB Batavia, Ohio.

Bond was attached and appeared to be in order.

2010-146 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the Bid for printing of Ballots for Elections in 2011. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon discussion the Board stated they have always been pleased with DLB service, we have not had any problems with the company, they have always been very professional. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Director Miller reported on the OAEO January 26-29, 2011 Conference and stated the reservations are due by 11/30/2010. The costs are \$135 per participant and hotel rooms are \$149 per night. Judy feels with having a new Secretary of State we should participate in the conference. She would like to send 2 clerks

(Edna Owens-D, and Becky Rudd-R) as well as herself and Mike attending. Paul Campbell also wants to attend.

2010-147 – Paul Campbell made the motion to allow the Director and Deputy Director to determine who will be attending the 2011 OAEO Conference in Columbus Ohio at the Hyatt Hotel. Dave Lane seconded the motion.

Judy gave the Board Members a copy of the 2011 Appropriations that she received from the Department of Budget and Management and our 2011 Estimated Expenses. The Commissioners added \$50,000 into our regular salary budget for our new IT person and took that amount away from ISD’s budget. Rick inquired about the ES&S entry for \$69,025 and doesn’t think that we can get the ideal IT person that we

need for \$52,000. He also inquired about the new employee entry. Judy is looking forward to the 2012 Presidential Primary and General Elections and would like to have 2 full-time and 2 permanent part-time persons. Rick will leave it up to Judy and Mike to work with the County Administration on adding employees. Judy added with the additional requirements on military and overseas absentees that alone is a full time job. Judy stated the new full time persons would not be needed until August 2011. Rick stated that a full Board should be in attendance before we hire employees. Paul suggested hiring the IT person first and then look at this situation. Mike stated that they were looking for direction from the Board to proceed since the Budget has not been set yet and they could go into the meetings with the Board's approval to hire new employees in the future. Paul suggested telling the Administration that we need 2 full-time employees in August (in preparation of the 2011 elections) and do they want to put it in budget now or come back later after we have hired the employees and pay it.

2010-148 – Dave Lane made the motion for the Board to direct the Director and Deputy Director to convey to the County Administrator that the Board intends to hire 2 new employees in advance of August 2011 in recognition of the additional work load. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Dave Lane-“yes”, Paul Campbell-“yes”, Rick Combs-“no”.

Dave Lane would like to know the outcome when the information is relayed to the Administrators Office.

Todd Mullen inquired if he should come back and talk with the Board and Judy told him she felt it wasn't necessary. ES&S has readjusted the proposal on the automarks. They are going with an additional feature for a preventative maintenance on the automarks. Judy would like a formal proposal from ES&S.

On November 2, 2010, Clerk Ruth Ann Werner reached her 25th year of service. She receives an extra week of vacation (she had 2 years prior before BOE employment).

We received a letter from the Ohio League of Women's Voters advising us that we our county has been selected to have an Observer (Janet Yvette Duguay) here during the Post Election Audit. We are waiting on a Directive from the Secretary of States Office advising us of the date and procedures for conducting the Audit.

Judy gave the Board a copy of the “Request to Redact Address” form. An Ohio Supreme Court Case mandated this request form. Per Mary Lynne Birck (Prosecutor's Office) we must use this form because we put the walking list on the internet. We are sending it to the Administrators of both Courts. The original law didn't include judges but now there is a court opinion to include judges. It is the person's responsibility to contact us if they want a redaction. Judy contacted Tim Murawski (DIMSNNet) about a program for persons with redacted information.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Deputy Director's report was the damaged M100 cans by Commercial Works.

RESOLUTIONS: None.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: None.

2010-149 – Dave Lane made the motion to move the December Regular Monthly Board Meeting to Thursday, December 16, 2010 at 2:00 p.m. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board that the Office Holiday Lunch will begin at noon.


