

**Start of Official Canvass for the
November 8, 2016 General Election**

November 19, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.

Chairman Rick Combs called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Paul Campbell led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, Julia Carney – Deputy Director Trainee, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: None.

MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:

2016-150 – Ray Lembke made the motion to Adopt the Agenda as Presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

Judy told the Board that Beth Hamad (SOS Liaison) came in yesterday to scan the bar code on absentee ballot envelopes that did not contain or have a readable postmark.

Judy advised the Board of the following ballots that required their review.

INVALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Absentee Ballots to be reviewed by the Board:

- 22 – refused by nursing home voters – requested by not voted
- 41 – no secrecy (ID) envelopes – letters go to voters advising them to bring it in
- *11 – no valid ID – (11-S Form sent) – voters were contacted
- 147 – no stub (137 by mail & 10 in office)
 - 3 – no signature on secrecy envelope – (voters contacted - 11-S Form sent)
 - 8 – absentee ballot returned to the polls
- 44 – mailed absentee ballots returned as undeliverable
 - 2 – no ballot – envelope returned empty
 - 4 – moved out of county – returned the ballots to void
 - 3 – ballots returned unvoted – deceased
 - 4 – ballots returned and voided – went to polls and voted provisional
- 54 – postmarked Election Day or after
 - 4 – no postmark – no ID tag bar to scan
 - 4 – processed before Close of Registration – voter re-registered in another county by Oct 11th deadline
 - 1 – voter re-activated in error and sent an absentee ballot
- 1 – returned late
- 353** – Total to be reviewed
- 3 – *adjustment made because the Board determined 3 of the 11 did have valid ID
- 350 – Total Absentee Ballots Rejected by the Board**

2016-151 – Ray Lembke made the motion to reject and not count the 350 regular absentee ballots that were determined to be invalid. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS

- 3 – valid that did have ID inside their ID secrecy envelope – (added from the invalid list)
- 2 – medical emergency – voted Election Day
- 5 – no date of birth but can identify voter

272 – postmarked before Election Day and received within the 10 day period

282 – Valid Absentee Ballots to be added to the count

2016-152 – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the 282 additional regular valid absentee ballots and add them to the count. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 11:00 a.m. the Board went off the Record for a short break.

At 11:05 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

UOCAVA BALLOTS:

INVALID UOCAVA BALLOTS

Judy reminded the Board that the UOCAVA voters must meet the same standards as regular absentee voters. They also have a way to track the status of their application and ballot (CBTS – Central Ballot Tracking System).

- 2 – FPCA (Federal Post Card Application) – not registered (received past registration deadline)
- 2 – FWAB (Federal Write-In Ballot_ - not registered
- 4 –FWAB – did not send absentee request
- 2 – FWAB – late absentee request
- 4 – Returned ballot but did not include ID Statement of Voter - (Re-sent & not returned)

14 – Total Invalid UOCAVA Ballots

2016-153 – Ray Lembke made the motion to reject the 14 UOCAVA absentee ballots that should not be counted. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID UOCAVA BALLOTS

29 – UOCAVA – valid

3 – FWAB – properly registered and absentee request timely submitted

32 – Total Valid UOCAVA's

2016-154 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the 32 UOCAVA valid absentee ballots and add them to the count. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Judy advised the Board that there were 2,314 provisional ballots issued.

We introduced the “any-line any-time” procedure for voters to sign-in at the polling locations where there were multiple precincts. The tablets were linked to each other via a router. It appears that this caused problems at a few polling locations; one Provisional Clerk registered all of the provisional voters within that polling location at the one precinct. This is going to require us to duplicate any valid provisionals within those polling locations.

INVALID PROVISIONALS

- 1 – returned a valid voted absentee to the office, then voted a provisional at the polls
 - 4 – no ID on envelope (voters did not cure their envelope)
 - 3 – no signature on envelope
 - *4 – no date of birth or incorrect date listed
 - 9 – incomplete or no current address
 - 16 – new address in another county – did not vote in both counties
 - 71 – voted wrong precinct/wrong polling location
 - 155 – not registered in Ohio
 - 263 – total to be reviewed
 - 1 – *adjustment – 1 provisional was determined to be valid
- 262 – Total Invalid Provisional Ballots**

At 11:27 a.m. the Board went off the Record while Judy checked on information regarding the provisional envelope.

At 11:29 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

Judy advised the Board that the provisional voter must provide/write on the envelope their ID information; they cannot just show the clerk their ID and just check the box.

At 11:42 a.m. the Board went off the Record while Judy checked on information regarding an address on a provisional envelope.

At 11:43 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

Judy reported to the Board that if the date of birth is blank on the provisional envelope the ballot is not to be counted, if the date of birth field is filled but transposed, inverted digits or used the current year instead of the voters birth year and if at least three Board Members agree that the voter can be identified the ballot can be counted.

2016-155 – Larry Heller made the motion to reject the 262 provisional ballots that should not be counted at the direction of the Director and Deputy Director. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID PROVISIONALS

2016-156 – Ray Lembke made the motion to accept the one (1) valid provisional ballot that did have an acceptable date of birth on the provisional envelope and should be counted. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

157 – voted right polling location/wrong precinct (will be duplicated to correct precinct)

110 – APRI – cancelled in 2007, 2009 & 2011 supplemental

1,789 – valid provisionals – no visible problems

2,056 – Valid Provisional Ballots

+1 – Valid Provisional Ballot (previously accepted)

2,057 – Total Valid Provisional Ballots

2016-157 – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the 2,056 valid provisional ballots and add them to the count. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon discussion Paul inquired about the single valid provisional ballot. Paul Campbell amended the motion to include the one additional valid provisional ballot for a total of 2,057 valid provisional ballots. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

2016-158 – Larry Heller made the motion to instruct the Director and Deputy Director and office staff to proceed with the Official Canvass. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

OTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2016-159 – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve and pay the bills to date. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon discussion Rick inquired about the precinct bags and what was in them, they include materials needed by the poll workers at the polls such as the clerk’s books, posters, pens, etc. Rick also asked about the poll booths and thought we were trying to replace them through the years. Mike agreed that we had been; we are replacing as needed. Ray wanted to confirm that the advertisement for tax levies was charged back to the local entity and Judy stated we do. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy stated the only potential recount that we have is the Bethel-Tate Local School District Tax Levy; we will know Tuesday if it is a recount. We won’t know if there is a statewide recount until Wednesday or later.

POST ELECTION AUDIT:

Judy explained if there are no recounts, the earliest we can start the Post-Election Audit is November 30th and it must be completed no later than December 13th. Judy would like to have the regular December Board meeting on December 13 and the Certification of the Audit.

2016-160 – Ray Lembke made the motion to Reconvene Tuesday, November 22, 2016 at 9 a.m. to Certify the General Election. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Chairman Combs called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. Larry Heller led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller, and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, Julia Carney – Deputy Director Trainee, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Cindy Shepherd, Melissa Kircher, Karen Royer, Lois Dennis.

MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:

2016-161 – Ray Lembke made the motion to Adopt the Agenda as Presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

FINAL TEST DECK VERIFICATION FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 GENERAL ELECTION:

2016-162 – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck that were run prior to commencing with the Official Count and after the Official Results were recorded (as verified by the Director and Deputy Director) and that the computer was counting accurately. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

FINAL ELECTION RESULTS:

Judy went over the final election results with the Board.

The final number on the absentee votes was 32,416, during canvass we reported 272 absentee ballots with a post mark before Election Day and returned within the 10 day period the correct number was 270.

The final number on the provisional votes was 2,055. There was a typo in the previous report of 1,789 and the correct number is 1,784 and found 3 that we thought were entered in the system but were not (ballots were counted) and since have them entered.

Judy added that the staff did a very good job with the short time frame, shortened by a week that we had to put this together. Mike stated that it went smooth.

2016-163 – Paul Campbell made the motion to Certify the Results of the November 8, 2016 General Election and provide the reporting forms to the Secretary of State and other Counties, Offices and Divisions. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy also advised the Board that after reviewing the results no races qualified for an automatic recount.

At 9:08 a.m. the Board entered into their Regular Monthly Board Meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2016-164 – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve the minutes from the October 27, 2016 Regular Board Meeting. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

2016-165 – Ray Lembke made the motion to accept and pay the bills. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Judy expressed to the Board how well everything went considering the huge election. We had a great staff of part-time workers and our regular staff is exemplary as usual. We don’t know if there is going to be a recount for the Supreme Court Justice between Fisher and O’Donnell. If we don’t have a recount we can move forward with the Post-Election Audit, but can’t start before 6 business days after Certification (11-29-2016). Judy would like to start the audit on December 1st at 9:00 a.m. The last day to certify is December 13th and she would like to hold it that day and also have the regular board meeting.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Deputy Director Keeley did not have a report.
Julia Carney did not have anything to report.

Larry asked if the driver’s license swipe attachment on the EPB worked during the election. Judy stated the comments she heard were all positive and very advantageous. Paul asked if there were any problems. Judy thought the “any-line any-time” surprised voters and would have been better to introduce at smaller election. It was successful, but a bit confusing especially for the provisional clerks and voters. We need to focus on the street guide within the tablet and use it more. Some voters still think the screen on the DS200 is a touch screen voting system and end up sending an un-voted ballot into the machine. We might have a special election in May 2017 which gives the poll workers added use on the tablet. Rick stated that “Everyone did a good job on the election, excellent work as usual and thank you. It came off without an issue.” The other Board Members agreed.
