

**Start of Official Canvass for the  
March 15, 2016 Primary Election**

**March 29, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.**

Chairman Rick Combs called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. Larry Heller led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller, and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller - Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

**OTHER ATTENDEES:** Beth Hamad – SOS Liaison, Mary Lynne Birck – Prosecutor’s Office

**MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:**

**2016-37** – Ray Lembke made the motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:**

**2016-38** – At 9:03 a.m. Ray Lembke made the motion to go into Executive Session for purposes of discussing pending or impending litigation per Ohio Revised Code 121.22(G)(3). Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**2016-39** – At 9:54 a.m. Paul Campbell made the motion to come out of Executive Session. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

After coming out of Executive Session, there was no discussion and no action taken.

Judy addressed the Board regarding the Election Day Ballots cast after 7:30 p.m. and not later than 8:30 p.m. per Court Order by Judge Dlott. There is a Directive stating we are to count the ballots. Some poll workers were instructed to have the Voters sign in the Electronic Pollbook. Some of the Voters who used the Provisional Envelope did not sign in the Electronic Pollbook. Judy verified all late voters had signatures. Three precincts did not have signatures.

Pierce Township M – they had 2 voters (1-D & 1-R) that came in after the equipment and supplies were packed up. They gave the voters the ballots, the voters voted and the ballots were put in a folder and put in the ballot box. With no records of the late voters we can’t verify that they are registered voters or who they are.

New Richmond B (New Richmond Community Center) – they voted 3 late voters that should have been in another precinct within the building. One voter had no signature.

Union Township O – they had 3 voters that are registered but there were not signatures on them.

Board of Elections Office – 3 voters came in the office to vote after 8:30 p.m.

Batavia Township J – did not complete the information on the envelope or signature, could be a poll worker error.

Miami Township S (House of Restoration Church) – 2 voters tried to vote at their polling location but the poll workers had already left. They went to Trinity United Methodist Church polling location (MI-M) and voted there (wrong church-wrong location).

Miami Township C1C – the voter was verified in poll book but not signatures.

**2016-40** – Larry Heller made the motion to not accept the ballots cast at the Board of Elections counter after 8:30 p.m. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**2016-41** – Ray Lembke made the motion to not count the 2 ballots from the unidentified voters in Pierce Township M cast after 7:30 p.m. as we do not have any information to indicate those people are registered voters in the State of Ohio much less Pierce M. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon discussion Paul asked if the poll worker didn’t get any identification on the voter. Judy stated that they did not. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**2016-42** – Ray Lembke made the motion that the 9 ballots/voters that were verified as registered voters and are entitled to vote the ballots that they voted; we just didn't get a signature either on the envelope or poll book that we count those ballots. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon discussion Paul stated that given the confusion of everything it is understandable that something like this can happen and we have always leaned toward those that show up to vote every consideration to be able to count their vote. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

The Board discussed the situation of the MI-S voters going to a different poll location.

**2016-43** – Ray Lembke made the motion to count the ballots of the voters from MI-S that voted in MI-M, given the circumstances and given that their polling place was closed although their polling place should have been open and they didn't vote on anything they shouldn't have and we are confident they are registered voters and they only voted once. Larry asked if we are setting a precedence to allow people to vote at different locations. Ray didn't think so because it is a unique situation. These people were entitled to vote until 8:30 p.m. and their location wasn't open and they found a polling location. Paul added that we try to count everything we can but this is a little past what he is comfortable supporting. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Ray Lembke – "yes", Paul Campbell – "no", Larry Heller – "no", Rick Combs – "no".

At 10:23 a.m. the Board went off the Record for a short break.

At 10:32 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

#### **ABSENTEE BALLOTS:**

Judy reviewed the Absentee Ballots with the Board.

#### **INVALID BALLOTS**

6,871 – absentee ballots requested  
488 – absentee ballots not returned  
6,328 – total received and counted through Election Day

The Board reviewed the following ballots:

2 – no postmark (1 no barcode, 1 with a barcode to be scanned) – Beth Hamad brought a scanner to scan the envelope that does have the barcode to determine the postage date and location.

19 – refused by nursing home voters – requested but not voted

2 – no secrecy envelope – voters contacted

2 – no valid ID – voters contacted

21 – no stub

2 – no signature on secrecy envelope – voters contacted

4 – no date of birth – voters contacted

4 – returned as undeliverable

24 – postmarked the day of Election or after

78

+ 1 – no postmark

79 – total invalid absentee ballots to be rejected

**2016-45** – Ray Lembke made the motion to reject the 79 absentee ballots that were determined to be invalid. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

**2016-47** – Larry Heller made the motion to amend the prior motion of 79 invalid to 82 invalid absentee ballots (2 UOCAVA and 1 absentee ballot just received in the mail). Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

## **VALID BALLOTS**

One ballot required Board review

- 1 – UOCAVA – voter did not include their Clermont County address and emailed Judy advising her of this and she told him it did need to be included. He printed and voted a second ballot with the proper information on the envelope and asked us to disregard the first one and count the second one. We received this information before we received either ballot in the mail. Judy contacted our attorney at the SOS. In their opinion every voter is entitled up to 3 ballots and is leaving this up to the Board.

The Board determined to accept the second ballot.

219 – postmarked before Election Day and received within the 10 day period

8 – UOCAVA - valid  
228 – valid absentee ballots

**2016-44** – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the **(219)** absentee ballots postmarked before Election Day and received within the ten day period at the direction of the staff, Director and Deputy Director to include the **(8)** UOCAVA votes determined to be valid and the **(1)** additional UOCAVA #2 ballot (**total of 228**). Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 10:49 a.m. the Board went off the Record while Beth Hamad (SOS) scanned the bar code to determine the date on the absentee ballot in question.

At 10:57 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

Judy advised the Board the envelope that was scanned, showed that the ballot was processed through the post office on March 10 which makes it a valid absentee.

**2016-46** – Paul Campbell made the motion to amend the number of valid absentee ballots from 228 to **229** (adding the scanned barcode absentee envelope). Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board of 2 UOCAVA and 1 absentee from the mail today, they are invalid. See motion 2016-47 in the Invalid Ballot section.

## **PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:**

Judy reviewed the Provisional Ballots with the Board. There were 905 provisional ballots cast.

## **INVALID PROVISIONAL BALLOTS**

The Board reviewed the following ballots:

- 1 – absentee ballot found inside provisional envelope (voter put his av ballot in with the provisional)
- 1 – no signature on envelope
- 2 – incomplete or no current address listed
- 7 – current address in another county
- 26 – voted wrong church/wrong pew
- 48 – not registered in Ohio
- 85 – total invalid provisionals

Paul inquired why are there so many in the wrong precinct within the same polling location. He advised that it needs to be better. Judy stated that there would be voting location manager changes before the November election.

**2016-48** – Ray Lembke made the motion to reject the list of 85 provisional ballots that should not be counted. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

### **VALID PROVISIONAL BALLOTS**

765 – valid provisionals – no visible problems  
55 – voted right church/wrong pew  
820 – total valid provisional ballots

2016-49 – Larry Heller made the motion to accept and count the 820 valid provisional ballots. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

### **SEVENTEEN YEAR OLD VOTERS:**

Judy reported to the Board that we had 229 registered seventeen year olds. Those that voted were:

2 – absentee/mail  
1 – absentee/walk-in  
151 – Election Day  
154 – total seventeen year old voters

These ballots will be reviewed to make sure there are no votes for State Central Committee Man and Woman, County Central Committee and Questions or Issues.

2016-50 – Larry Heller made the motion to accept and duplicate as needed the 154 seventeen year old voters by the staff. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon discussion Paul clarified that we will count the races that they were eligible to vote on and ignore those that they were not eligible for. Judy stated that was correct. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

### **CURBSIDE VOTERS:**

Judy reported that the curbside voters were counted on Election Night but some of the envelopes with ballots were found in the supply bags when the bags were cleaned after the election. There were 11 additional ballots.

2016-51 – Ray Lembke made the motion to add the eleven additional curbside ballots to the count. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

2016-52 – Paul Campbell made the motion to instruct the office staff to proceed with the Official Canvass. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

## **OTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD**

### **APPROVAL OF BILLS:**

2016-53 – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve and pay the bills received to date. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon discussion Judy stated the cost of the ballots was higher than usual because we had to print four sets of ballots (Democratic, Republican, Green and Non-Partisan); but overall it was fairly reasonable.

(Ray asked if there was an issue raised about poll workers that stayed the extra hour and what are we doing about that. When Judy was asked about it she stated that there were no provisions and no additional monies for it.)

The Chairman called for a vote on the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board that the poll worker payroll was completed, and that the checks were being processed today and mailed out tomorrow.

Judy further addressed the Board regarding poll worker pay. She would like to see an increase in the pay but this must be done by October 1, 2016 and would be effective in 2017. She would like the base to be \$130 (increase of \$25). She said she believes the maximum pay is \$133. Our current base pay is \$105 and training is \$25. She asked Beth Hamad (SOS) to find out what is the maximum amount for poll worker pay is now.



**Summer Conference:**

Judy advised the Board of the dates for the SOS Summer Conference, June 22 & 23 at the Hilton in downtown Cleveland.

**Post Election Audit:**

Judy explained the Post Election Audit to the Board; it is conducted after each Presidential Primary and after each General Election in even numbered years. She would like to start it April 13.

**2016-54** – Paul Campbell made the motion to reconvene on Tuesday, April 5, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. to Certify the Election. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Chairman Rick Combs called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. Paul Campbell led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller, and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller - Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

**OTHER ATTENDEES:** None

**MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:**

**2016-55** – Ray Lembke made the motion to adopt the Agenda as presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**FINAL TEST DECK VERIFICATION:**

**2016-56** – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the Results of the Test Deck that were run prior to commencing with the Official Count and after the Official Results were recorded (as verified by the Director and Deputy Director) and found them to match and that the computer was counting accurately. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**CERTIFICATION OF THE MARCH 15, 2016 PRIMARY ELECTION:**

Judy gave the Board copies of the certified election results. The poll workers did a great job overall. There were some precincts with problems. We had a Voter Turnout of 41.85% .

**2016-57** – Larry Heller made the motion to Certify the Results of the March 15, 2016 Primary Election and provide reporting forms to the Secretary of State and other Counties, Offices and Divisions. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board after reviewing the certified results that no candidates or issues require an automatic recount.

**OTHER OFFICIAL BUSINESS TO BE CONDUCTED**

**APPROVAL OF BILLS:**

**2016-58** – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve and pay the bills as of April 5, 2016. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon discussion Paul inquired if the cost for deployment from Planes Storage and Moving had gone up. Mike stated it had not; it is the same. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**Nominating Petitions Filed by Independent Candidates for General Election:**

Judy reported that the filing deadline for Independent Candidates was March 14, 2016 and only one candidate filed; Tommie W. Bixler for County Commissioner (term commencing 1/3/2017). The signature requirement was 506, he submitted 787. The Board will certify the petitions at the May 26, 2016 Board Meeting.

**2016-59** – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve the First Amendment (renewal) to the ES&S Hardward Maintenance Service and Software Maintenance and Support Agreement, commencing May 1, 2016 and renewing each year for an additional 4 years through April 30, 2020. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”

There is a separate Mainenance contract on the new equipment (DS 200's and DS 850) which will not pick up until after the first year of warrant which will be in August 2016.

**Summer Conference**

Mike reported that the SOS Summer Conference is being held in Cleveland June 22 & 23, 2016. He and Judy would like to send four staff, themselves and any Board Members that want to attend. Due to the early morning scheduling he wants to leave on Tuesday June 21 to go to the conference and leave on Friday June 24 to come home. Judy added the cost of the conference (\$125) may not be refundable if anyone cancels.

**RESOLUTIONS:** None

Judy went over the Official Certification of Results for the candidates in the overlapping counties. We will report our totals for the 12<sup>th</sup> District Court of Appeals to Butler County and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional to Hamilton County. These counties will report the totals to the Secretary of State. Hamilton County is certifying today and will send us their totals for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional race later today.

Rick stated that he has taken phone calls regarding the campaign signs for Greg T. Lang that have not been taken down. Rick was told that Mr. Lang is not going to take the signs down. Judy stated that it becomes a zoning issue. Rick called Miami Township and some officials have met with Pat Manager to take down signs in the right of way. It is unclear if ODOT takes down signs. Rick would like some kind of ruling on this so he can pass on the information.

Judy brought up the fact that Hamilton and Butler Counties have decided to intervene in the appeal of the Judicial Decision of Judge Dlott on Election Night to leave the polls open an additional hour. Hamilton County is paying \$10 to each poll worker where there were voters in those precincts. We had 25 precincts that processed voters.

Ray isn't clear on what position the SOS wants to advocate on this appeal. He understands that what the SOS is primarily concerned about is that the Order was entered into without any notice and opportunity for anyone on the election official side to be heard. The first contact with anyone in the election process was them being informed that Judge Dlott had issued an Order. By taking a step to intervene you are not committing yourself to supporting the SOS position. You are a separate party; we can take our own position.

Judy advised that Matt Damshroder called our office and stated that there is no intention on the part of the SOS to use this as a political vehicle or to embarrass anyone; it is strictly to prevent these types of motions by the courts coming in the midnight hour and trying to make these types of rulings.

Larry doesn't see a benefit to intervene. Paul said the SOS should have stopped it and he said he is on the same page as Larry.

The Board discussed the additional pay for poll workers by Hamilton County Board of Elections. Paul felt that any poll worker who stayed should have gotten the extra pay not just those that processed voters. Larry stated that the poll workers are contracted to work for the day, not just certain hours. Paul stated that these procedures and changes need to be taken up before elections. The Board also discussed raising the poll worker pay. Judy had not heard back from Beth Hamad regarding the maximum poll worker pay.

Rick talked to Mary Lynne Birck regarding the replacement for Mike. She stated not to worry about it (regarding the advertisement). Rick and Larry will work on it and will share it when it is ready.
