

Chairman Rick Combs called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Chris Dennison led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Julia Carney – Deputy Director, Chris Dennison – Deputy Director Trainee, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

**OTHER ATTENDEES:** None.

**MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:**

**2017-133** – Ray Lembke made the motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**ABSENTEE BALLOTS:**

Deputy Director Carney gave the Board the absentee voter report. We fulfilled 6,189 absentee ballot requests and had 5,771 ballots returned. Julia advised the Board of the following ballots that required their review.

**Absentee Ballots to be reviewed by the Board:**

- 25 – refused by nursing home voters
- 1 – no secrecy envelope – voters were contacted and there was no response
- 7 – no valid ID – voters were contacted and the 11-S form was sent and not returned
- 16 – no stub attached
- 1 – blank ID envelope – voter was contacted, signature only
- 1 – returned undeliverable
- 3 – no ballot inside of the envelope
- 54 – Invalid absentee ballots**

**Ballots received after Election Day (invalid):**

- 3 – no postmark date (they were scanned by Beth Hamad-SOS, on November 17, 2017)
- 26 – postmarked day of election or after
- 1 – cannot determine the postmark date or election day postmark
- 30 – additional invalid absentee ballots**
- +54 – previous invalid absentee ballots**
- 84 – Total Invalid Absentee Ballots rejected by the Board**

**2017-134** – Larry Heller made the motion to reject the 84 absentee ballots that should not be counted. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**Ballots received after Election Day (valid):**

- 5 – postmark dates determined by the Board to be valid
- 24 – postmarked before Election Day and received within the 10 day period
- 16 – no date of birth provided – but Voter could be identified
- 1 – UOCAVA received within 10 days after the election
- 3 – 11-S forms received within 7 days after the election
- 2 – voters received incorrect ballots/require duplication
- 51 – Total Valid Absentee Ballots**

**2017-135** – Ray Lembke made the motion to accept the 51 additional valid absentee ballots and add them to the count. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 9:35 a.m., the Board went off the Record for a short break.  
At 9:38 a.m., the Board went back on the Record.

**PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:**

There were 357 provisional ballots cast. The Board reviewed the provisional ballots that required review. Julia brought to their attention a voter that has been voting under his deceased son's record. They have the same name except for the middle initial. We believe he originally voted mistakenly under the son's name and discovered the difference during the November 2016 Election while checking the provisional voters/ballots. He was sent a registration card after the November 2016 Election but has not returned the card. We recommend that this ballot not be counted.

At 10:01 a.m., the Board went off the Record to research information on provisional ballot envelopes.  
At 10:09 a.m., the Board went back on the Record.

Julia advised the Board on the questionable provisionals. On one of the envelopes, the voter put their current address in the former address box. Another voter did not put the correct street number and has the wrong mailing city and zip code. Another voter only provided the street, no street number and the date of birth does not match in our system. Another voter did not provide the date of birth or ID and is registered under another name.  
Larry added that we have identified flaws in the design of the provisional ballot envelope and asked if we should send this information to the Secretary of State. Judy stated that they are aware of it.

**2017-136** – Ray Lembke made the motion to reject the 24 Provisional Ballots that should not be counted. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**2017-137** – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the 333 additional Valid Provisional Ballots and add them to the count. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Julia left the meeting at 10:25

**2017-138** – Larry Heller made the motion to instruct the office staff to proceed with the Official Canvass. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Paul inquired about the difference in the unofficial numbers of the Write-In votes. Judy explained the poll workers were instructed to go through and count the write-in's at the polls on election night. Judy and Julia counted the Write-Ins for the Absentee Ballots. The computer printout is the number of ovals that were darkened for those races. The Election Day and Absentee Ballots with write-ins will be re-counted during certification along with the additional ballots that the Board approved today.

**2017-139** – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve and pay the bills through November 16, 2017 with the exception of Poll Worker Payroll. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**2017-141** – Paul Campbell made the motion to pay the poll workers, which include the conflicts of Larry Heller. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Paul Campbell – “yes”, Larry Heller – “abstain”, Ray Lembke – “yes”, and Rick Combs – “yes”.

**Other Business to come before the Board:**

The Pitney Bowes lease on the postage meter and letter opener was going to be discussed but since Julia had to leave the meeting early, the Board decided to table it until the next meeting

**Board Reconvenes**  
**Certification of the November 7, 2017 General Election**  
**and Regular Monthly Board Meeting**  
**November 28, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.**

Chairman Rick Combs called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Larry Heller led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Rick Combs, Paul Campbell, Larry Heller, and Ray Lembke. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Julia Carney – Deputy Director, Chris Dennison – Deputy Director Trainee, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

**OTHER ATTENDEES:** Beth Hamad – SOS Liaison arrived at 10:09 a.m.

**MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED:**

**2017-143** – Ray Lembke made the motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**Final Test Deck:**

**2017-144** – Larry Heller made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck for the November 7, 2017 General Election. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**Final Election Results:**

Deputy Director Carney reviewed why there are more votes for write-in candidates than the final results. The computer tabulated the ovals that were darkened, but not all of those were valid write-in names. The final results were hand counted for the write-in candidates. Julia also explained that there were two additional ballots added since the opening of the canvass meeting. One Election Day ballot was found in the DS200, and it was discovered that two absentee ID envelopes/ballots were returned in one mailing

envelope. This brought the total ballots cast to 35,472, a 25.69% turnout. There were no changes in the outcome of the election results.

**2017-145** – Larry Heller made the motion to approve and Certify the Results for the November 7, 2017 General Election. Ray Lembke seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Mr. Campbell – “yes”, Mr. Heller – “yes”, Mr. Lembke – “yes”, and Mr. Combs – “abstain”.

**Review Races to determine Required Automatic Recount:**

After checking the election results it was determined, the full term race for the Bethel-Tate Local School – Member of Board of Education qualified for an automatic recount. The Board must set a date (between 6 & 10 days) for the recount, advertise it in the paper, and notify all of the candidates in that race. Monday December 4 is the last day a candidate can request a recount.

**2017-146** – Larry Heller made the motion to set the date for the automatic recount for the Bethel-Tate School Board Member race (full term) for December 5, 2017 at 9 a.m. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**The Board entered into their Regular Monthly Board Meeting**

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

**2017-147** – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve the minutes of the October 26, 2017 Regular Board Meeting. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**APPROVAL OF BILLS:**

**2017-148** – Paul Campbell made the motion to approve and pay the bills as of November 27, 2017. Larry Heller seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”. Upon discussion, Rick inquired about the ES&S bill for \$38,473.06 and Judy explained it was for the cost of the Ballots. The election equipment deployment cost was a little less than originally quoted. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

**Ohio Association of Election Officials (OAE):**

Aaron Ockerman sent an email stating there is legislation to reduce the number of poll workers from four to two per precinct. Judy thinks three might work but not two. Judy also brought up that our State Representatives and State Senator are not contacting us on these issues. We do not know about matters being discussed and we are not being contacted. Several years ago, Mike contacted our Representatives and wanted to discuss the Provisionals. They were not familiar with some of these issues including election equipment. Rick stated the State Representatives and Senators use to meet with the commissioners and talk about concerning issues in the County; many issues are a direct indication of the budget and asked Larry to talk to the Republican Chairman about speaking with those Republican Representatives and we would like them to speak to our Director and Deputy Director. Paul added, with the many years of going to the election conferences he has noticed the complete lack of participation from our Legislators; very seldom do they show. He does not know whether they have been included but thinks they should be required to participate and Aaron Ockerman should be contacting them to attend. Beth Hamad hasn't heard about the State Reps not showing up to the meetings but she will ask about it. Rick asked Beth to find out if the Secretary of State invites them or wants to invite them and email Judy back.

Paul also inquired about the poll workers that were scheduled to work and didn't show up to work: do they still get paid for their training or not if they don't work. Judy stated that they do. He said it is something to think about to not pay them if they do not show up to work. Julia has concerns about the Fair Labor Standards Act. We will look into it with Mary Lynne Birck.

Rick also wanted to check on the vacation time for Leann. Judy was going to meet with Mary Lynne but they have not yet because of Mary Lynne's schedule. We will put it on the agenda for the next meeting.

**DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

After discussing the OAEO Conference January 10-12, Judy suggested sending Leann Helton to the conference in place of Paul Campbell. Julia will have the estimated cost of the convention at the next meeting.

**DEPUTY DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Julia explained the postage machine and letter opener is on the same lease, which is expiring. The current cost is \$350 a month and the new machine "SendPro P1000" and Letter Opener Lease is \$299.28 a month. The lease is for five years with no increase.

**2017-149** – Larry Heller made the motion to replace the letter opener and the Pitney Bowes postage machine with the "SendPro P1000" model for \$299.28 for a five-year lease agreement, no increases on the lease, both are brand new machines. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".
