I have put out the pressure washing on the water towers bid. Bids are due back in February for the council meeting.

We have been assisting Bert at the plant do some maintenance that needs to get done like replacing some underground wiring and working on a Clarifier.

The water system is in great shape. We have no leaks to report for the past month which is a great thing.

Streets, Parks, and Grounds,

We have been preparing for winter and getting everything in shape for the cold weather. We should be set for winter and should have enough salt to last the year. Both plows and salt spreaders are working great ready to be used.

We replaced the front door at the shop. The old door was really rusty and coming apart. So we got it put on.

Shaffer and Hines has a design drawing of the intersection of Public Ave and Little St to widen that out a little bit and fix the sidewalk walk that has been broken several times. They have sent that off to MoDot to see if they will approve Clayton's plans. If MoDot approves I will get council a copy of the design to let them approve or disapprove. They are also moving forward with the Kennedy Ave widening and Elm Ave overlay. Again once this is all drawn up it will go to council for approval.

As you all are aware the City Hall remodel is coming along and is almost complete. Once that gets complete we will have some drainage issues to fix in the park. We are going to have to grade a swell out at the end of the parking lot out to the ditch to let water off the parking area so it does not hold water anymore.

#### DECEMBER SEWER REPORT

Clever Council.

We ran a total of 5,150,000 gallons thru the plant in December, with an average daily flow of 166,000 gallons and a one day peak flow of 641,000 gallons. Estimates show we received approximately 1,000,000 gallons of I and I over a three day period down almost 2,500,000 compared to similar rain events from the past year.

An electrical conduit in the WWTF we assume was damaged by heavy equipment several years ago was discovered when a wire to one of the rotors shorted out. City employees used the cities backhoe to dig the conduit up and repair it and we replaced all the wires since all had been damaged or at the very least stressed.

Kings Gate lift station was found tripped out and both pumps were pulled and cleaned.

A wasting line in the WWTF froze but was thawed with damage and able to be used as normal.

The winch we purchased for the Hwy 14 lift station has had a recall on it and representatives of the company are scheduled to be here in January to perform the warranty work.

The WWTF achieved a 99% removal rate this month of both BODs and Total Suspended Solids, Although the plant almost always has a removal rate in the high 90s we felt like both of those parameters being over 99% percent was worth mentioning.

We are working on a list and a schedule to have a certified control panel technician spent 2 days in town going through a list of concerns or questions and making some repairs to lift stations. This seems to be a more efficient way to finish up some work that is beyond our level of experience without calling an electrician in each time.





The following is a written report to the City of Clever, City Council for the month of December 2020.

#### Building Inspector:

During the month of December, I received six (6) application for building permits. I issued four (4) permits for Remodels/ Renovations and have two (2) application pending review and approval of planning and Zoning Department. I also issued two (2) Certificates of Occupancy for new home construction and a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy to the Christian County Library.

#### Animal Control:

Fourteen (14) 2021 dog licenses were issued during the month of December. Animal Control is currently not excepting/ receiving animals. The animal control Facility is pending further renovations to obtain licensing from the Missouri Department of Agriculture.

#### Code Enforcement:

During the Month of December, one (1) notice of violation letter was mailed for grass violation. The case is still open, and a second letter was sent on 01-13-2021. In addition, there are two (2) cases still open from November. One is pending review from Planning and Zoning Department, the second is set for court appearance in February.

#### Things to come:

Work with Planning and Zoning to create a revised code for fencing ordinance.

Propose a revised burning ordinance and animal regulation to City Council.

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLEVER, MISSOUR, DEFINING AND REGULATING OPEN BURNING WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CLEVER

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CLEVER, COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

#### SECTION I: GENERAL

A person shall not cause or allow any open burning unless approved in accordance with this code and Section 215.010 of the City of Clever Code (Nuisances Affecting Health).

#### SECTION II: DEFINITIONS

**Open Burning** - the burning of any materials in which air contaminants are emitted directly into the air without first passing through a stack or chimney.

**Recreational Burning** - campfires, bonfires, fires for outdoor non-commercial preparation of food, and other fires for ceremonial occasions.

Waste / Combustible - Magazines, books, trimmings from lawns, trees or flower gardens, leaves, pasteboard boxes, rags, paper, straw, sawdust, packing materials, shavings, roofing materials, waste oil, cooking oils, storage of all materials, boxes and all rubbish and refuse that will ignite through contact with flames at ordinary temperatures.

Yard Waste - trees, tree leaves, brush, or other vegetation

#### SECTION III: BURNING OF WASTE MATERIALS

Burning of waste materials is a violation of the code. Waste materials such as, but not limited to tires, carpet, used oil, asphalt roofing material, rubber products, hazardous materials, Styrofoam<sup>TM</sup>, plastics, petroleumbased products, durable goods, treated wood, and any asbestos-containing material may not be burned. The burning of insulation from wiring containing metals such as copper and aluminum, whether obtained legally or illegally, shall be considered a violation of this code.

#### SECTION IV: BURNING OF VEGITATIVE WASTE

Burning of yard waste is allowed, if the yard waste is from the sites provided it originates and is burned on the same premises. Yard waste includes trees, tree leaves, brush, or other vegetation. Materials such as tires or used oil may not be used to start the fires or be burned in the fires. The burning of yard waste shall not take place on a city street or any sidewalk. Burning of vegetative waste shall not be conducted within 100 feet of a structure or combustible material. Burning of vegetative waste shall meet all other requirements set forth in this code for outside fires, to include a means of extinguishment, appropriate distances from structures, wind speed less than 15 miles per hour, and a responsible adult supervising the entire duration of the burn.

#### SECTION V: RECREATIONAL PURPOSES

The City shall allow campfires, fire pits, and other fires for outdoor non-commercial preparation of food. Campfires and other fires for ceremonial occasions shall meet all other requirements set forth in this code for outside fires, to include a means of extinguishment, appropriate distances from structures, wind speed less than 15 miles per hour, and a responsible adult supervising the entire duration of the burn.

**A. BONFIRES** - A bonfire shall not be conducted within 50 feet of a structure or combustible material. Conditions which could cause a bonfire to spread within 50 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition.

**B. BONFIRE MATERIALS AND SIZE** - A bonfire shall not be more than 5 feet by 5 feet by 5 feet. Fuel for a bonfire shall consist only of seasoned dry firewood. Bonfires shall meet all other requirements set forth in this code for outside fires, to include a means of extinguishment, appropriate distances from structures, wind speed less than 15 miles per hour, and a responsible adult supervising the entire duration of the burn.

#### SECTION VI: TIME OF OPEN BURNING

In no event shall open burning take place between sunrise and sunset, except that the Code Enforcement Officer may authorize open burning different from the above standards when they find the public health and safety will not be endangered. Open burning shall meet all other requirements set forth in this code for outside fires, to include a means of extinguishment, appropriate distances from structures, wind speed less than 15 miles per hour, and a responsible adult supervising the entire duration of the burn.

#### SECTION VII: WIND SPEED

In no event shall open burning take place during sustained wind speeds of fifteen (15) miles per hour or higher.

#### SECTION VIII: OPEN BURNING OF TRADE WASTE

The open burning of untreated wood waste from trade, construction, and demolition waste must be burned between sunrise and sunset, be supervised at all times, occur at least 200 yards away from the nearest structure not owned by the party conducting the burning unless an Air Curtain Incinerator is used and a waiver is obtained from the owner or occupant of the structure or the local fire department provides approval. Waiver from the fire department to the owner of the Air Curtain Incinerator should be in writing. Any person burning more than 80 cubic yards of this untreated wood waste per week at a single location must use an Air Curtain Incinerator. When an Air Curtain Incinerator is required or used, please reference the Air Curtain Incinerator requirements of state rule 10 CSR 10-6.045 (3)(F). Prior to commencing construction of a stationary Air Curtain Incinerator, submit a notification of intent to construct and operate to the Air Pollution Control Program staff director, the planned initial startup date, and the types of materials to be burned using the Air Curtain Incinerator. The state rule also requires initial and annual opacity testing and emission limitations. Each test is required to be submitted to the Department within sixty days of conducting the test.

#### SECTION IX: PERMIT FOR BURNING TRADE WASTE

The open burning of trade wastes shall be permitted only when it has been shown that such open burning is reasonably necessary for disposal and that the disposal will not unreasonably affect the public health, safety, or welfare. Any person contending that such is the case and desiring to engage therefor in open burning shall file a request to do so with the Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee. The application shall state the following:

- The name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the application.
- The type of business.
- A description of the proposed equipment and operating practices, the type, quantity and composition of material to be burned, and the expected composition and amount of air contaminants to be released to the atmosphere, where known.
- The schedule of burning operations.
- The exact location where the open burning will occur.
- The reasons why open burning is reasonably necessary for disposal and will not unreasonably affect public health, safety, and welfare.
- Evidence that the proposed open burning has been approved by the Code Enforcement Officer and is not in violation of the fire code of the city.

If the Code Enforcement Officer shall find upon examination of the application that the open burning proposed is reasonably necessary for disposal and that it will not unreasonably affect the public health, safety or welfare, they may grant a permit to conduct such open burning, subject, however, to the provisions of any other law or ordinance of the city and also upon such conditions as the ordinance officer may impose so as to limit the open burning to meet the standards established in this chapter.

#### SECTION X: BURNING BAN

The mayor or chief official of the tax supported fire protection district (as defined by RSMo 321.010), and/or their appointed designee, may issue a temporary burning ban if the safety of the public is in danger when a combination of dry fuels and weather conditions support an extreme fire danger. This encompasses climatological induced conditions such as but not limited to drought and high winds. The burning ban will stay until removed by the mayor or the Chief Official of the tax supported fire protection district, and/or their designee.

#### SECTION XI: VIOLATIONS

If a person violates the Fire Code, or if a notice of violation is not complied with within the time specified by the Code Enforcement Officer, the Code Enforcement Officer may cause a municipal court summons to be issued and the City Attorney may, at the Code Enforcement Officer's request, institute a court proceeding to obtain an injunction to restrain, correct or abate such violation, or to require removal or termination of the provisions of this code or of any order or direction made pursuant thereto.

Any person, violating any provisions of the Fire Code this ordinance, or failing to comply with any order issued pursuant to any section thereof, shall be in violation of a municipal ordinance and upon conviction

thereof shall be punished as provided in Article III Section 100.220 of the City of Clever General Penalty Code.

Any person who shall continue any burning after they have been served with a stop letter, could be found guilty of violating the City of Clever Fire Protection Code. Which could be punished as provided in Article III Section 100.220 of the City of Clever General Penalty Code.

Each day a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.

#### Chapter 205

#### **ANIMAL REGULATIONS**

#### Authority of Animal Control Officer to Quarantine Animals.

Whenever the Animal Control Officer shall deem it necessary because of the prevalence of rabies among the animal population of the City, County or State, strict quarantine may be placed on all domestic animals in any designated area of the City. This proclamation shall be construed to mean that all domestic animals shall be confined in the owner's home, or in a secure, indoor facility, under the direct physical control of a person at least seventeen (17) years of age. Any domestic animal found otherwise during such a quarantine shall be impounded or disposed of in a humane manner.

#### Suspected Rabid Animals.

A. Any domestic animal which exhibits clinical symptoms suggestive of rabies may be impounded at a veterinary clinic, licensed by the State, and located within Christian County, for clinical observation for ten (10) days. If after the observation period, the animal is alive it may be picked up by the owner.

B. If such animal shall die during the observation period, regardless of the location, the head shall be removed and submitted to a qualified official laboratory for examination.

#### Animals Exposed to Rabies.

A. Any dog, cat or domestic animal which has been exposed to rabies should be immediately destroyed, unless otherwise provided. If the owner is unwilling to do this, one (1) of the following alternatives shall be followed:

- 1. Strict isolation in a kennel or animal hospital for six (6) months and vaccinate with Animal Rabies Vaccine licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture and administered by a licensed veterinarian if no previous vaccination has been given in the past three (3) years.
- 2. If the animal exposed to rabies has been vaccinated against the virus within the last three (3) years, the animal must be re-vaccinated at once with Animal Rabies Vaccine licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture and administered by a licensed veterinarian and be isolated and observed for ninety (90) days.

#### Report of Rabies.

All veterinarians in the City shall report at once all cases of clinical rabies to the Animal Control Officer.

#### Delivery of Dogs or Cats to Animal Control Officer Required.

No person shall refuse to deliver his/her dog or cat to the Animal Control Officer when requested to do so under the provisions of this Chapter.

#### Right of Entry of Animal Control Officer.

The Animal Control Officer or his/her duly appointed representative shall have the right of entry to any property or premises for the purpose of examining and impounding any dog or cat exposed to or exhibiting clinical symptoms of rabies.

#### Restriction of Number of Dogs or Cats Kept, Maintained or Harbored in Residentially Zoned Districts.

It shall be unlawful for the occupant or occupants of any dwelling unit located in an area zoned "Residential" as defined in Chapter 405 of this code, to keep, maintain or harbor more than four (4) dogs or cats over the age of six (6) months on or about the lot or premises which comprises such dwelling unit.

Persons found to be in violation will be required to relocate animals to become compliant with this code ,and with all expenses shall be borne by the owner of such animal.

Any person, violating any provisions of the this ordinance, or failing to comply with any order issued pursuant to any section thereof, shall be in violation of a municipal ordinance and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as provided in Article III Section 100.220 of the City of Clever General Penalty Code.
