POLICE

Written quarterly report was submitted with verbal review by Mrs. Robertson.

Mayor Maisel informed the Board that Trekk completed the traffic study that was done through a MoDot grant. This study was for the area around the elemiddle school and how to handle the traffic issues. The new design for pick up and drop off is working to elevate some of the problems. Trekk has some other items that may help: Upgrading signage, adding a crosswalk at Maple and Brown, and change the speed limit on Snowdrop to 30 mph.

Clerk is to work with City Attorney to get a speed limit ordinance for Snowdrop and an ordinance to allow the school authority to close Public Ave for school buses in the morning and afternoons.

ADMIN

Alderman Schmidt submitted Bill 19-2021 that will amend Title II Health and Public Safety: Article XII – Offenses concerning tobacco, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products. Discussion was held on this ordinance and its clarity with state and federal laws. Discussion on if it would or could be enforced and prosecuted within the city.

Priebe made the motion to send Bill 19-2021 to the City Attorney for review. Larson 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

Discussion was held on the step-up program and continuing to partner with ShowMe Christian County. Andrea Sitzes, President & CEO of ShowMe Christian County along with Mayor Clint Ellingsworth of Highlandville were present to inform and answer any questions. Mrs. Sitzes explained what SMCC does and what they have done for Clever to date. Mayor Ellingsworth informed the Board how SMCC is helping Highlandville obtain a sales tax bases business to their city who otherwise was not going to have the resources and funding mechanisms to do so. It was asked on why the increase and where that money would be going. Mrs. Sitzes stated that the regular budget has been met and so this extra income would be going to marketing to draw businesses to Christian County.

Priebe made the motion to approve the Step-Up program pledge form and go from \$2,500 to \$5,000.00 for 5 years with ShowMe Christian County. McPhail 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

Clerk informed the Board that it is time to bid out all professional services.

McPhail made the motion to allow the Clerk to bid out all applicable contract services. Larson 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

Board has discussion on the current dog licensing application and process. Board would like to repeal and amend this ordinance to go back to the way it was only to have a picture of the animal. Board would also like to see the garage sale ordinance repealed and amended to back the way it was but to make the city wide exempt.

With the uprise in Covid-19 cases the Board is wanting to put a policy in place to amend the sick policy to allow for time off for the pandemic.

McPhail made the motion to temporarily amend the City's sick leave policy written after the City of Battlefield model to expire January 31, 2022. Priebe 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

Mayor Maisel informed the Board that it was brought to her attention that a citizen was upset because they were told the restrooms within city hall are not open to the public. This was done when all the security

upgrades were made. There is no point for the security if anyone is allowed in and out of the building. Alderman McPhail stated that his opinion is that only official business needs to be conducted passed the front office. Alderman Priebe was worried about the backroom and restrooms would not be treated appropriately with people back there unattended. Board is of the consensus that only city related business is allowed through the front entry way and no public restrooms.

Aldermen McPhail informed the Board that he would like to attend the MML Conference in September. This is an informative conference and would like to City to cover the hotel and conference fee with already budgeted training expenses.

Priebe made the motion to take a 10–15-minute break. McPhail 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

Priebe made the motion to enter executive session pursuant to section 610.021.3(Personnel) of the revised statutes of the state of Missouri. McPhail 2nd the motion and passed by roll call vote: Priebe – Aye, Larson – Aye, Schmidt – Aye, McPhail – Aye.

Entered back into regular session at 9:40pm. Priebe made the motion to adjourn. McPhail 2nd the motion and passed with 4 ayes.

WATER/ WWTP

Council Report for August 2021

Council,

It has been a very busy month for us.

Water and Sewer

The water system is working as it should with no issues known at this time. Hogan's Inc came in on the week of August 2 and pressured washed inside and out of Tower 1 and done an inspection of it. They did not report any issues. They then came back the next week and started pressure washing the outside of tower 2. They did blow quite a bit of paint off that will have to be touched up. They should be back on the day of council or Wednesday to start touching up the paint and will start on the inside for cleaning and inspection. They did say that next time tower two needs cleaned it would be recommended to sand it down to bare metal and start all over. They think when the tower was originally built that the surface preparation was not down properly, and the paint is not sticking. It should be another 5-10 years before we have to worry about that.

We have been working down at the plant a lot helping Clean Stream with some repairs down there. We have the Clarifier back in service that had a gear box broke on it. We have finally received the check valves for the main lift station, and we have them installed. We have the pumps out and being tested now should have them back the week of council. We can now work on the electrical side of things since it will be in the dry. Hopefully we can have it up and going in another week and get rid of the diesel pump.

I have also been working with the engineers for Kings Gate phase two making sure that the lift stations are going to be sufficient in size with the new construction and so far everything is looking good, as it Kings Gate was already designed for the additional flow.

Streets parks and Grounds,

Mowing has slowed down a bit in the heat. We do have a mower down right now and parts have been ordered. Hopefully by council it will be back up and going. We did a lot of tree trimming down on some of the streets in town. We have more to do and will get it done when it cools down a little bit.

As I am sure you all are aware from the Facebook post, we had some damage done at the park. All the repairs have been made. I am not sure why a person thought the damage was done three weeks ago, but we seen on camera where it was done on 8-6-21 at 4:45 PM. The cameras did cut out for three minutes when the damage was done, so I can't say if it was done on purpose or an accident. I have made contact with the camera company, and they are supposed to come and look and see why the cameras skip like they do.

I have ordered five new metal tables for the pavilion to replace the old wooden ones. I am not sure when they will come in as everything is hard to get at the moment. I am also looking at other equipment to order, I will hopefully have something next month for you all to look at and see what you guys think, I have just not had a chance to look at the moment.

We started refreshing some paint on the crosswalks and stop bars last week. Then our paint striper decided that it wanted to blow paint everywhere. We took it to the shop to be repaired. As soon as we get it back, we will continue to paint. I would like to have all the painting done before school starts.

We also patched some potholes on a few of the streets in town. We had to do a fairly big patch at the end of Robin. I believe it was due to the trash truck turning around in the Cul de Sac. Hopefully are patch will last a while. If not, I'll see what else we can do at the end of that street that may hold up better.

Water and Sewer,

We are still waiting on pumps for the treatment plant lift station. I talked with Bert and he stated that the pumps will hopefully be done this week.

We also got word this week that the CMOM was approved by Missouri DNR.

We are going to start doing the repairs on the sewer clean outs next week.

I meet with the engineer this week and gave him flow numbers for water and sewer for the last 5 years. He is starting to make progress with the beginning stages of the upgrades.

Streets, Parks and Grounds

We was able to get a lot of the crosswalks painted. We painted 15 crosswalks and we are going to be adding some additional ones that was never installed. We ran out of paint and who knew that paint would be affected by Covid also. We should have some more paint by next week.

I ordered all the signs for the new street names, them signs should be coming in any day now and we will get them installed.

Everything seems to be running smoothly with no new issues.

AUGUST SEWER REPORT

Clever Council,

We ran a total of 5,960,000 gallons thru the plant in July, with an average daily flow of 165,000 gallons and a one day peak flow of 184,000 gallons.

The new UV bulbs and racks came in and have been installed bringing the UV system up to 100%

Clarifier number 2 is back in service without the sweeper arm. Since drawings of the arm cannot be acquired due to the age of the clarifiers the arm off of clarifier number 1 will be removed and used for a pattern to be manufactured from a local source. But we will be able to use both of the clarifiers in the mean time.

The last back ordered check valve from Smith and Loveless came in for the influent lift station and all the new gate valves and check valves have been installed in the station. The pumps have been removed and the re wiring can begin now that the leaking into the dry well has been stopped.

The second pump for the Hwy 14 lift station has been returned and re installed by Fluid Equipment. While they were here doing a warranty check on the hoist we purchased last year to be able to pull pumps more safely and efficiently we had them go through the controls as a preventative maintenance measure and they found all to be in good working order. By having them do the control checks while they were already on site reduced the cost from 1800.00 dollars to under 400.00 dollars. They find a check valve that is sticking and we are looking into the most cost effective way to rebuild or replace the check valves in the station since the current ones are almost twenty years old.

I had a brief meeting with Andy Novinger of Anderson Engineering concerning the capacity of hwy 14 and Kings Gate lift stations due to more development and Dozer has met with Brandon of Anderson Engineering more than once on the same subject. And Dozer and I are developing our plan to be prepared for the increased flow to these two stations.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE II OF THE TRAFFIC CODE BY AUTHORIZING THE PLACEMENT OF STOP SIGNS AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF CERTAIN DESIGNATED CITY STREETS

An Ordinance of the City of Clever, Missouri to amend Title III: Schedule II Stop Signs, accepting and approving all changes relating to placement of stop signs at the intersections of certain designated city streets.

- **Section III:** Except as herein amended, altered, or modified, Table I of Schedule II of the Traffic Code of the City, and all subsections, subdivisions and subparagraphs thereof, shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section IV:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage and approval by the Board of Alderman.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 320.030 AND SCHEDULE I OF THE CITY OF CLEVER CODE BOOK.

An Ordinance of the City of Clever, County of Christian, State of Missouri to amend Section 320.030 and Schedule I, accepting and approving all changes relating to the City's speed limits for residential areas.

BE IT ORDAIDNED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF AND FOR THE CITY OF CLEVER, COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflicts with this ordinance are hereby amended or repealed.

SECTION II: No person shall drive or operate a motor vehicle (except emergency vehicles on emergency runs) or any other conveyance on any street, boulevard, thoroughfare or public way in the City at any time at a rate of speed in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour except as a greater or lesser speed is hereinafter specifically provided for with respect to certain streets, boulevards, thoroughfares, areas, public ways or parts thereof as specified in Schedule I hereof. (Ord. No. 102 §7-24, 1-11-82)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLEVER, MISSOURI, AMENDING TITLE II HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFTY; ARTICLE XIII

An Ordinance of the City of Clever, County of Christian, State of Missouri to amend Article XIII: Offenses Concerning Tobacco, Alternative Nicotine Products or Vapor Products.

WHEREAS: The Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act of 1938, 21 U.S.C. §§ 387f (2019) establishes the minimum standards for the sale of tobacco products.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAIDNED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF AND FOR THE CITY OF CLEVER, COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: All parts of Article XIII in conflict with this ordinance are hereby amended.

SECTION II: DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this Article, the following definitions shall apply:

MINOR — A person under the age of twenty-one (21).

SECTION III: NO TOBACCO SALES TO MINORS — ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS, VAPOR PRODUCTS AND NICOTINE LIQUID CONTAINERS — SALE TO MINORS PROHIBITED.

- A. Any person or entity who sells tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products shall deny the sale of such tobacco products to any person who is less than twenty-one (21) years of age.
- C. Alternative nicotine products and vapor products shall only be sold to persons twenty-one (21) years of age or older, shall be subject to local and State sales tax, but shall not be otherwise taxed or regulated as to

SECTION IV: UNLAWFUL TO SELL OR DISTRIBUTE TOBACCO PRODUCTS, ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS OR VAPOR PRODUCTS TO MINORS — VENDING MACHINE REQUIREMENTS.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, provide or distribute tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.
- B. All vending machines that dispense tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products shall be located within the unobstructed line of sight and under the direct supervision of an adult responsible for preventing persons less than twenty-one (21) years of age from purchasing any tobacco product, alternative nicotine product or vapor product from such machine or shall be equipped with a lock-out device to prevent the machines from being operated until the person responsible for monitoring sales from the machines disables the lock. Such locking device shall be of a design that prevents it from being left in an unlocked condition and which will allow only a single sale when activated. A locking device shall not be required on machines that are located in areas where persons less than twenty-one (21) years of age are not permitted or prohibited by law. An owner of an

establishment whose vending machine is not in compliance with the provisions of this Subsection shall be subject to the penalties contained in Subsection (D) of this Section. A determination of non-compliance may be made by a local law enforcement agency or the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control. Nothing in this Section shall apply to a vending machine if located in a factory, private club, or other location not generally accessible to the general public.

C. A person cited for selling, providing, or distributing any tobacco product, alternative nicotine product or vapor product to any individual less than twenty-one (21) years of age in violation of Subsection (A), (B) or (C) of this Section shall conclusively be presumed to have reasonably relied on proof of age of the purchaser or recipient, and such person shall not be found guilty of such violation if such person raises and proves as an affirmative defense that such individual presented a driver's license or other government-issued photo identification purporting to establish that such individual was twenty-one (21) years of age or older.

SECTION V: MINORS PROHIBITED FROM PURCHASE OR POSSESSION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS, ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS OR VAPOR PRODUCTS — MISREPRESENTATION OF AGE.

- A. No person less than twenty-one (21) years of age shall purchase, attempt to purchase or possess cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products unless such person is an employee of a seller of cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products and is in such possession to affect a sale in the course of employment or an employee of the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control for enforcement purposes pursuant to Subsection (5) of Section 407.934, RSMo.
- B. Any person less than twenty-one (21) years of age shall not misrepresent his/her age to purchase cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products.

SECTION VI: Required Sign Stating Violation of State Law to Sell Tobacco Products, Alternative Nicotine Products or Vapor Products to Persons Under Age 21 — Display of Sign Required, Where:

- A. The owner of an establishment at which tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products or rolling papers are sold at retail or through vending machines shall cause to be prominently displayed in a conspicuous place at every display from which tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products are sold and on every vending machine where tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products are purchased a sign that shall:
 - 1. Contain in red lettering at least one-half (1/2) inch high on a white background the following:
 - 1. IT IS A VIOLATION OF STATE LAW FOR CIGARETTES, OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS, ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS OR VAPOR PRODUCTS TO BE SOLD OR OTHERWISE

PROVIDED TO ANY PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF TWENTY-ONE OR FOR SUCH PERSON TO PURCHASE, ATTEMPT TO PURCHASE OR POSSESS CIGARETTES, OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS, ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS OR VAPOR PRODUCTS; and

2. Include a depiction of a pack of cigarettes at least two (2) inches high defaced by a red diagonal diameter of a surrounding red circle and the words "Under 21."

SECTION VII: PROOF OF AGE REQUIRED, WHEN DEFENSE TO ACTION FOR VIOLATION IS REASONABLE RELIANCE ON PROOF — LIABILITY.

A. A person or entity selling tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products or rolling papers or distributing tobacco product, alternative nicotine product or vapor product samples shall require proof of age from a prospective purchaser or recipient if an ordinary person would conclude on the basis of appearance that such prospective purchaser or recipient may be under the age of twenty-one (21).

SECTION VIII: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage and approval by the Board of Aldermen.

LARGE ANIMALS

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 205: ARTICLE II: ANIMAL REGULATIONS

An Ordinance of the City of Clever, County of Christian, State of Missouri to amend Chapter 205, accepting and approving all changes relating to the City's large animal control, regulations, keeping of livestock.

BE IT ORDAIDNED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF AND FOR THE CITY OF CLEVER, COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflicts with this ordinance are hereby amended or repealed.

SECTION II: Definitions.

The following words, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings set out herein:

DOGS — All animals of the canine species, both male and female.

ENCLOSURE — A building or real estate with a properly designed fence to restrict or contain any and all animals as listed in Sections 205.180 — 205.190.

OWNER OR KEEPER — Any person having a right of property in a dog, or who keeps or harbors a dog, or who has it in his/her care or acts as its custodian, or who knowingly permits a dog to remain on or about any premises owned or occupied by him/her.

RUNNING AT LARGE — Allowing a dog to be off the private premises of the owner or keeper, or his/her agent or servant, and not on a leash or confined to the arms, motor vehicle, trailer or other conveyance of the owner or keeper, his/her agent or servant.

SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY — Physical injury that creates a substantial risk of death or that causes serious disfigurement or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any part of the body.

TRESPASSER — A person upon the premises of the owner or keeper of the dog in question without license or privilege to be upon said premises.

UNRESTRAINED DOG — Any dog running at large or a dog on the premises of its owner or keeper but not confined to said premises by a leash, fence, structure, or other means that would prevent the dog from leaving such premises.

VICIOUS DOG — Any of the following dogs:

- 1. Any dog, whether or not running at large and whether or not unrestrained, that without provocation has bitten any person not a trespasser causing serious physical injury to that person.
- 2. Any unrestrained dog, whether or not running at large, that without provocation has attempted to bite any person not a trespasser which would cause serious physical injury to that person.
- 3. Any unrestrained dog, whether or not running at large, that without provocation has placed any person not a trespasser in apprehension of immediate serious physical injury.
- 4. Any dog that has killed another dog or other domestic animal without provocation.

5. Pit bull dogs.

SECTION III: City Registration Required

A. Any person who keeps, harbors or owns any dog within the City shall annually register such dog with the Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee. The registration cost for dogs shall be \$5.00. A replacement tag can be purchased at the cost of \$2.00 per registration tag.

- B. The Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee shall record such information as follows:
- 1. The keeper's, harborer's or owner's name, address and phone number.
- 2. The animal's description with photograph of the animal, gender, and rabies vaccination number with expiration date. Any changes of information are to be provided to the Code Enforcement Officer by the animal owner.
- 3. The name, address and phone number of said animal's veterinarian.
- 4. A City registration number.
- C. The Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee shall also issue a City registration tag for such dog to correspond with the registration number of record.
- D. City registration tag for such dog shall be affixed to the dog's collar. The collar with tag shall be worn, by the dog, at all times the dog is outside of its owner's residence. Failure to comply with this subsection may result in fines or penalties.

SECTION IV: Tags Not Transferable.

All tags required by this Section shall be specific for each dog and shall not be transferable to any other dog.

SECTION V: Running At Large Prohibited - Impoundment

A. It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit the same to run at large within the City of Clever at any time. Any dog found running at large without the registration tag required per Section III, shall be impounded.

SECTION VI: Duty To Impound

- A. Animals Impounded, When. Any dog found at large not displaying the tags required by this Article shall be impounded.
- B. Holding of Impounded Animals. All dogs impounded can be kept in the custody of the City of Clever or its authorized representative, in the City impoundment facility or some other proper place, for a period of not less than one (1) week from the time of the animal's impoundment. Such animals shall be fed, watered, and shielded from the elements in a humane manner.
- C. Upon Code Enforcement Officer discretion, and type of incident, animals can be released with a minimum impound of one (1) day, or a maximum of thirty (30) day time period, with cost incurred.

AN ORDNIANCE OF THE CITY OF CLEVER, MISSOURI, AMENDING TITLE VI BUSINESS AND OCCUPATION; SECTION 605.200 GARAGE SALES

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CLEVER, COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: WRITTEN NOTICE OF SALE REQUIRED

A. No person shall advertise, conduct, carry on or permit any garage, patio, yard or other similar sale upon the grounds of or within any dwelling or accessory structure to a dwelling located in a residential district without first applying for, and obtaining a temporary sales permit from the Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee. The Code Enforcement Officer or his/her designee shall record such information as follows:

- 1. The name of the person holding or conducting such sale.
- 2. The location in which such sale is going to occur
- 3. The dates when such sale is to be held.

B. Signs promoting any garage, patio, yard, estate sale or other similar sale are limited to 4 signs per dwelling address. Property owner permission must be obtained prior to locating a sign offsite. Signs can be no larger than two (2) foot by two (2) foot with a maximum height of three (3) foot from ground level. Placement of signs shall not be allowed within the sight of triangle of an intersection. All signs promoting the sale must be removed immediately after the conclusion of such sale. No signs are permitted on any utility pole.

SECTION II: LIMIT ON NUMBER OF SALES

- A. No person shall conduct or permit more than two (2) sales of the type required to be registered on the same premises within any twelve (12) month period, nor shall any such sale continue for more than three (3) days.
- B. Exemption: Clever Chamber of Commerce City Wide Sale shall not be considered in the allotted two(2) sales allowed.

SECTION III: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.
