Council Minutes
August 21, 2023

The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Members present were President Doris Kemner, Carl Habrick, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, Greg Michalak and Bill Sherman.

The Village filed an appeal with EGLE regarding its notice of violation over some low phosphate test results in January. Even though some of the well head tests came back low, the system results were within normal range. It turned out the testing meter was starting to fail. The Village replaced the testing meter and the results are all within range.

Village Manager provided an update on the EGLE Carbon Capture and Sequestration letter.

Village Manager provided an update on the Electric Substation Construction Project. The contractor is working on their final items and the project is still slightly under budget.

Motion by Michalak seconded by Sherman to adopt the 2023 Employee Compensation Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

The Harvest Drive bridge is near the end of its useful life. Instead of replacing the wood structure, it is more cost effective to construct a sidewalk. The work is tentatively scheduled for 2024.

Village Manager provided an update on the Carriage Hills subdivision. The builder is considering submitting a formal site plan for the project in the near future. Once the Village receives an official application and site plan, there will be a formal review process.

Motion by Sherman seconded by Sines to award the sale of the two 1960 transformers sale to T & R Electric Supply. Motion carried unanimously.

Village Manager provided an update on operational changes at HMI Hardwoods.

Council Member Peters commented there was a wonderful turn out at Music on the Porch to see Pickin' Roots put on a great show.

President Kemner provided an update on Fall Festival and still needs volunteers to help with the event.

Motion by Habrick and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
