

Village of Clinton
Council Minutes
January 3, 2024

The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Members present were President Doris Kemner, President Pro-Tem Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, Bill Sherman and David Clark. Greg Michalak was absent.

Motion by Sherman seconded by Peters to approve the regular Council minutes dated December 4, 2023, and the two closed session minutes dated December 4, 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Sean McNatt asked questions about the draft DDA Marketing Plan.

Motion by Sines seconded by Peters to approve the checks written for period ending December 31, 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Peters seconded by Sherman to appoint Kevin Cornish as the Village's designated representative and Leslie Owens as the alternate for the Michigan Municipal Electric Association (MMEA). Motion carried unanimously.

Village Manager provided an update on the Village's CAT capacity and backup generator. The goal is to have it operational in late June 2024.

Village Manager provided an update on the Water Distribution System Material Inventory Plan submitted to the state.

Village Manager provided an updated list of Village Priority Projects.

Village Manager provided an update on EGGLE's Compliance Evaluation of the WWTP.

Village Manager provided an update on WWTP Ground Water Testing.

Village Manager provided an update on the Currier Street stop sign request. The council is supportive of the Police Chief's recommendation to install a cross walk sign on south bound Currier Street at Kehoe Road.

Motion by Sines seconded by Peters to receive and file the Council Information Package. Motion carried unanimously.

Village Manager comments: The Community Center stairway project is nearing completion. The Village will publish public notices for February 5, 2024, electric rate public hearing. Staff and engineers are still working on the construction, grant and finance details for the Sunset Drive Construction Project. The Village would like to include E. Franklin and Colebrook in that project if funding is available. It may be beneficial to have a second January Council meeting to start discussions on the Carriage Hills Subdivision. The Village Manager provided a brief update on the 2003 Act 7 Agreement with the Township for utilities west on Michigan Avenue.

Council Member Sines commented that the utility accounts did well last month.

President Kemner raved about the number of residents who decorated their homes for the holiday season this year and how much it brightened the Village.

Motion by Sines and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
