**HIGHLIGHTS OF THE DECEMBER 3<sup>RD</sup>, 2013  
COLMAR MANOR WORKSESSION MEETING**

Motion made by Council Member Jackson to introduce and adopt Resolution R-5-2013 Designation of the Port Towns as a Sustainable Community. The motion was passed with a vote of 4-0. Council Member Epps was absent.

Motion made by Council Member Blue to approve the Engagement Agreement between the Town and G.S. Proctor in the amount of \$28,000 for the period of 11/1/13 to 6/30/14 and authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement. The motion was passed with a vote of 4-0. Council Member Epps was absent.

Motion made by Council Member Blue to allocate \$28,000 to Revenue Account Donation and to appropriate \$28,000 to Expenditure account Lobbyist. The motion was passed with a vote of 4-0. Council Member Epps was absent.

Motion made by Council Member Blue to introduce and adopt Resolution R-6-2013 Support Prince George's County Municipal Collaboration FY2014 MEA EmPower Grant. The motion was passed with a vote of 5-0.

Motion made by Council Member Jackson to approval the proposal from Associated Appraisers in the amount of \$5,800 for appraisal of investment property. The motion was passed with a vote of 5-0.

Motion made by Council Member Blue to accept proposal from Rufus Auto Parts and Restoration in the amount of \$750 to repair interior of '98 Ford Truck. The motion was passed with a vote of 5-0.

Motion made by Council Member Blue to accept proposal in the amount of \$2,350.00 for light dimmers in the auditorium. Motion was passed with a vote of 5-0.

## *A few notes of information.....from the desk of the Chief of Police,*

### **Crime Issues**

**Theft from Auto-** 3800blk. Kearney Road, Wednesday, January 1, 2014, 7:00PM, through Thursday, January 2, 2014, 9:10AM, victim reported unknown suspect broke out the passenger door window of their parked white, Ford Expedition and stole their car stereo system.

**Vandalism-** 3600blk. 39th. Avenue, Monday, January 27, 2013, 11:00AM, victim was advised by neighbor when she arrived home tonight that they had seen 3 B/M's juveniles, dressed in all black clothing trying to remove screens from exterior windows of residence. The neighbor advised suspects fled the area after their failed attempts in removing the screens, but the police were not called. Our officer was advised by PGPD officer that they had arrested the suspects at 1:00PM, in Brentwood for the same offense with two being released to their parents' custody and one taken to Cheltenham Youth Facility. PGPD officer responded to our incident to handle the report and charged suspects with additional criminal charges.

**Commercial Burglary-** Ihop Restaurant, 3600blk. Bladensburg Road, Thursday, February 6, 2014, 11:00PM, through Friday, February 7, 2013, 6:30AM, unknown suspect stole cash register containing unknown amount of U.S. currency. There were no signs of forced entry into the building. PGPD Northern Regional Investigation Section is handling the investigation. The report was taken by PGPD.

### **Parking Complaints**

There have been citizen complaints on the parking of commercial and out of state vehicles in town. Officers have been enforcing the town ordinances and state laws in relation to these complaints and have been issuing citations. These are the following local ordinances and state laws associated with the above violations:

**Out of State Tags-** an MVA warning notice will be issued first which the vehicle owner must respond within 30 days by mailing it back to the MVA with required documentation. After 60 days with no response to MVA warning or non compliance, a state citation will be issued for **\$290** for violating Maryland Traffic Article 13-403, "Owner failure to apply to Administration for registration of vehicle subject to registration."

There are some exemptions to this law which allow full time students attending a local college in Maryland or a bordering state, or serving in a medical internship, full-time nonresident members of the Armed Forces of the United States or of the United States Public Health Service, and visitors not residing for more than 30 days from registering their vehicles in Maryland. If you are not a resident of Maryland and are here temporarily, you may qualify for a Nonresident's Permit based on certain criteria by calling the MVA at 1-800-950-1682 or visiting there website, [www.maryland.mva.gov](http://www.maryland.mva.gov) for further information.

**Commercial Vehicles-** No commercial vehicles are allowed to park within the residential area of town between the hours of 6:00PM and 6:00AM on a public street or property. A town parking citation will be issued for **\$100**.

### **Fire Prevention**

As you may be aware we experienced two house fires during the last few months and we encourage everyone to contact your local fire department, Bunker Hill Fire Station, 301-985-5405, [www.bhvfrc.com](http://www.bhvfrc.com) for assistance with fire prevention inspections. Prince George's County Fire Department offers free smoke detectors to residents in the county, so please call the 24/7 hotline, at 301-864-SAFE (7233), [www.pgfdfire.com](http://www.pgfdfire.com) to request one and for installation assistance.

### **Code Enforcement**

#### **Pet Waste**



We have also received complaints regarding owners not picking up after their dogs. Animal owners must pick up after their dogs, cats, etc. on public and private property as required by the Town Code. Fines are **\$50** for first offense, and **\$100** for repeat offenses. Pet waste signs are posted throughout the town on the streets and in the parks to help enforce this issue.

### **Spring Clean and Protect Your Home**

To get your attention I will be using the “**DID YOU KNOW**” method:

#### **DID YOU KNOW!**

- Any construction without permits shall be fined and consulting with other agencies (D.E.R.) for additional fines and structure may be destroyed.
- Sump Pumps shall discharge on its own property and not effecting others
- All rooming houses shall have county inspections and permits. Every “Rooming House” shall be licensed through D.E.R. please call 301-883-6100.
- Rats and mice breed fast. A mouse can have several young when she is two months old. Then, two months later, her young will breed. In the mean time, the mother will produce another litter. **KEEP YOUR PROPERTY CLEAN-** Take away their food, destroy their homes, close their holes and entryways.
- Storage on porches, patios is illegal- also this is a breeding ground for rodents.
- Lumber, old logs and old mulch piles may have **snakes** lurking beneath them. FYI, [www.CopperheadSnake.com](http://www.CopperheadSnake.com) .
- Dogs, cats, ferrets, shall have proper licenses/ shots and documentation available upon request from Police/Inspector.

- Animals shall always be on a leash, and properly curb by its owner/ controller. Rats are drawn to Dog “POOP”, in turn the snakes are drawn to the rats. Keep your yard clean and free of the Dog waste (Health Hazard).
- Bed bugs have become a major threat for residential and commercial property owners in Maryland. These pests were dormant in the past 60 to 70 years due to the widespread use of DDT but resurgence has taken off since the late 1990’s. Entomologists speculate that the reemergence of bed bugs may be due to increase international travel and ban on DDT.
- Stink Bugs- are rapidly becoming an alarming problem for home and business owners across the state of Maryland specifically, the **Brown “MARMORATED”** stink bug was first ID in Pennsylvania in 1996. Today its sighting developed into a seasonal phenomenon. Stink bugs seek to enter homes at the first sign of cooler weather as they are unable to survive the elements. Are though they are harmless to humans, occasionally stink bugs will cause damage to household plants. Keep rooms free from food and water, when threaten the bug give off a foul order, and lives up to its name. Treat your home with a pest control contractor.
- To avoid fines, put your bulk trash or items out on the curb at the proper date and time, correctly secured/ tied up, and appliances such as refrigerators should have doors removed, no exceptions.
- Illegal Dumping (environmental) such as anything other than plain water down the storm drain, construction material in the water way or the woods, contamination of soil and or releasing of fumes hazardous material in nature to the air.. The code will be enforced, as well as contacting the proper county, state, federal agency for notification, enforcement and clean up.
- Vacant Homes shall be registered with the town, if not a lien will be placed on the property. Contact the Town Inspector on the process of registration for your property.
- Unmaintained properties that are vacant or occupied will be abated and lien placed on property.
- Commercial structures- This town adopts The Life Safety codes of subtitle 11, Fire Code, and will be enforced. Some things to look at- what’s the status of your access to exit, exit, exit discharge, can customers walk freely through the store (are the pathways clear). Are Fire Extinguishers up to date, and access clear. All exits shall not be block and locked at any time when occupied- NOTE Immediate Fines will be issued at **\$ 100.00** or greater per infraction and fire investigators notified.
- Unsafe property will be fined and process started for razing of the property with assistance of Prince George’s County Department of Environmental Resources.
- **“On your property, off your property”** unregistered vehicles, will be stickered and towed after 48 hours of notification.
- Old cars, auto parts, tires, and rims in the yard are not allowed. Property will be fined, abated, or lien placed on property.
- **No one is above the Law, the Code!** There are court hearings and town appeals process.

Last year, these grants allowed **twenty-five (25) residents** in our town to obtain complete Home Energy audits on their homes at no cost and retrofits that gave the most “Bang for Buck” which was likely the sealing of windows and insulation in attics at **no cost to the homeowner!** The total amount of modifications received in our Town passed \$139,000.00.

We would like to offer this service again this year, hopefully helping more residents than last year. In order to qualify, the home owner must meet certain requirements to be eligible. If you wish to be considered, please call the Town Hall at (301) 277-4920.

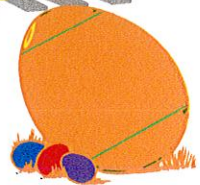
