Make Summer Safe for Kids

Summer is a great time for kids to enjoy different indoor and outdoor activities. Whether they are young children or teens, learn ways to keep your kids safe and healthy while they enjoy the summer fun.

Water safety

Drownings are the leading cause of injury death for young children ages 1 to 4, and three children die every day as a result of drowning. (cont'd)

Always supervise children when in or around water. A responsible adult should constantly watch young children.

Teach kids to swim. Formal swimming lessons can protect young children from drowning. Learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Your CPR skills could save someone's life.

Beat the heat and sun

Heat-related illness happens when the body's temperature control system is overloaded. Infants and children up to 4 years of age are at greatest risk. Even young and healthy people can get sick from the heat if they participate in strenuous physical activities during hot weather. For heat-related illness, the best defense is prevention.

Never leave infants, children, or pets in a parked car, even if the windows are cracked open.

Dress infants and children in loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing.

Schedule outdoor activities carefully, for morning and evening hours.

Stay cool with cool showers or baths.

Seek medical care immediate if your child has symptoms of heat-related illness.

Just a few serious sunburns can increase you and your child's risk of skin cancer later in life. Their skin needs protection from the sun's harmful ultraviolet (UV) rays whenever they're outdoors.

Cover up. Clothing that covers your and your child's skin helps protect against UV rays.

Use sunscreen with at least SPF (sun protection factor) 15 and UVA (ultraviolet A) and UVB (ultraviolet B) protection every time you and your child go outside.

Keep mosquito's and ticks from bugging you this summer

Protect yourself and your family by preventing bites and diseases, like West Nile virus and Lyme disease, which can be transmitted by insects.

Use an effective insect repellent while playing outdoors.

Make your backyard a tick-safe zone.

Check yourself and your children for ticks. Ticks are easy to remove.

Stop the violence

Kids can use electronic media to embarrass, harass, or threaten their peers. Take steps to prevent electronic aggression, a term that captures all types of violence that occur electronically. As teens develop emotionally, they are heavily influenced by their relationship experiences, including teen dating. Protect your children from teen dating violence. Nearly one in 10 teens reports having been hit or physically hurt on purpose by a boyfriend or girlfriend at least once over a year's time.

FOURTH OF JULY CHECK LIST:

Fireworks are illegal in Prince Georges County

Town of Colmar Manor adopts Subtitle 11 Fire Code, which embraces other State and Federal Codes pertaining to this concern.

Fireworks are most dangerous part of Independence Day celebration.

Every year, hundreds of adults and children are injured and some killed. Fireworks that misfire can destroy property and endanger everyone in the vicinity. Many communities and states have laws restricting or prohibiting fireworks.

Be sure that every member of your family obeys these laws, and share these guidelines with them.

- Go only to legal fireworks displays.
- Hold small children by the hand while watching the display.
- Don't get too near the display.
- If you see illegal fireworks being used, stay away.
- Never hold fireworks in your hand.
- Remember that even though sparklers have a reputation of being safe, they can burn and can start fires.

DID YOU KNOW – That professional fireworks 2" mortar and greater in size have enough explosive power when fired out a tube can go through a section of plywood, can you imagine the damage to the human body. Stay safe go to legal display.

DID YOU KNOW – SMOKE KILLS- don't be complacent, FIRE produces toxic fumes that can kill you with just a few breaths. The fumes tend to rise, so danger increases at higher levels in the room.

If you are ready to start Composting – please help the Planet and start composting at home. We still have 8 great composters and you can put in your kitchen and yard waste – growing your own COMPOST! The composters would cost as much as \$100 elsewhere but we have a \$20 deal (with support from a grant and the Town kicked in too). Come buy them in the Town Hall. You can be saving on trash costs, saving our planet and growing your own dirt! The workshop we had during the winter is up on the town website – composting is easy and fun.

Pesticide Free! Our Town Council passed the Bee Friendly legislation at their June meeting. Our town joins Takoma Park as the 2nd municipality to regulate pesticide usage. Please don't use Round-Up https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Roundup or other glyphosate poison. They are banned in many other countries – and are being implicated in loss of bees and other pollinators. The new law is in the education phase now and we will be telling

you more about why this is dangerous. We can offer you more natural alternatives – which work – just ask us. Remember that 1 bite in 3 of what we eat is pollinated – we need bees!

The town still does some spraying for mosquitos – if you don't want your house sprayed, notify the Town Hall to ask for a no spray area around your house. Meanwhile, don't let there be any standing water around your house – mosquitos can breed in a tiny bit of water – turn those saucers under outdoor pots upside down during rain storms, rinse the birdbath every 3 days!



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
