A General Election to select a Councilmember for each of the four wards of the Town of Colmar Manor will be held on Tuesday, May 3, 2016.

**Election:** Tuesday, May 3, 2016 - 10:00 AM - 8:00 PM

Colmar Manor Town Hall, 3701 Lawrence St., Colmar Manor, MD.

Candidates: Must be a least 21 years of age

Must have resided within Colmar Manor for one full year prior to the election and reside

within the ward for which they are a candidate

Must be a registered voter and be eligible to vote in Colmar Manor

Petitions and endorsements from at least 10 registered voters must be received at Colmar

Manor Town Hall by 5:00 PM Friday, April 1, 2016 (candidate petitions available March 1)

Must comply with Federal/State/local ethics ethics laws Councilmembers of Colmar Manor serve a four year term

Voters: Must reside in Colmar Manor and be registered with the Prince George's County Board of

Elections. Voter registration applications are available at Colmar Manor Town Hall, the Motor Vehicle Administration and the Prince George's County Board of Elections (by phone / on-line / by mail - call 301-341-7300 for more information). **Voters must be registered** 

with Prince George's County Board of Elections by April 1, 2016.

Anyone interested in serving as an Election Judge please contact TownHall by February 1, 2016. The next election for Mayor is in May 2018.

The Colmar Manor Mayor & Town Council meet for a Worksession on the first Tuesday of each month and a General Session on the second Tuesday of each month. Meetings begin at 7:00 PM and are held at the Town Hall. Residents are encouraged to attend. #### **Crime Issues**

**Residential Burglary**- 4300blk. Monroe St., Wednesday, October 28, 2015, 11:45AM, witness called 911 and advised a H/M, black hair, early 20's, had attempted to break into neighbor's house. Police responded and arrested suspect leaving the area. The suspect was known by the victim. Report was taken by PGPD.

**Commercial Robbery-** KFC, 4021 Bladensburg Road, Sunday, November 29, 2015, 10:10PM, victim reported that the suspect, B/M, wearing dark colored North Face jacket, purple pants, and latex gloves armed with a silver and black handgun walked into the business and demanded money from register. Victim gave money to suspect who then fled area in unknown direction. Officers searched area for suspect which was negative.

Attempt Commercial Robbery- Port Towns Shopping Center, 3800blk. Bladensburg Road, Tuesday, December 15, 2015, 10:21PM, victim advised known acquaintance and suspect, H/M, short, grey hoodie, blue jeans, and white tennis shoes displayed a handgun and demanded money from him in the parking lot near Pincus Liquors. The victim fought the suspect who then fled the area towards the Burger King. Officers located the handgun which turned out to be a BB gun. No money was taken from the victim during the altercation only an attempt to steal the bank deposit. The suspect turned himself into the Cottage City Police Department the next day. Suspect was charged by PGPD CID Robbery Section for the crime.

#### **Driving Safety Tips for Winter**

Even though the weather has been spring like for December we will have a winter before we know it, here are some driving safety tips:

Avoid driving while you're fatigued. Getting the proper amount of rest before taking on winter weather tasks reduces driving risks. (cont'd next page)

Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage.

Make certain your tires are properly inflated.

Never mix radial tires with other tire types.

Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid gas line freeze-up.

If possible, avoid using your parking brake in cold, rainy and snowy weather.

Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface (wet, ice, sand). Always look and steer where you want to go.

Use your seat belt every time you get into your vehicle.

#### **Code Enforcement**

<u>Open Storage</u>: Porches, deck patios, and carports in the Town of Colmar Manor may not be used for the storage of the following materials fiber or paper products, building supplies or materials, flammable materials, (such as paint or solvents), vehicle parts, appliances, or household furnishings. Also note stuffed fabrics such as sofas, love seats, chairs on open & exposed porches are subject to small animal & rodent infestation. Patio furniture is alright to store in the above locations as noted.

Inspection and enforcement will start at the beginning of the New Year for open storage throughout the commercial and residential areas in Town due to several non-compliance issues noted in town after warnings were issued.

The Mayor and Town Council are looking for three members of the town who are interested in being a member of this board.




### How to Create Rain Gardens that Delight Your Customers and Your Bottom Line


