WHO IS THE YAB?

The first Youth Advisory Board for the City of Des Moines was established July 18, 2005, and later became inactive.

With a renewed interest in incorporating youth voices in the city, the Youth Advisory Board Task Force (YABTF) was created in the winter of 2021. The YABTF consisted of 12 youth, aged 14-24 from all over Des Moines.

The YABTF were asked to: review the existing YAB ordinance, research best practices from other boards, and to make recommendations for the renewed board.

The YABTF held bi-weekly meetings from June through October of 2021. In this time, they collaborated with many similar boards and task forces across the nation to learn about their duties and how they approach the work.

The current Des Moines Youth Advisory Board (YAB) was reestablished January 24, 2022. A total of 14 youth in our community were appointed to serve on the board.

YAB is tasked to coordinate with and advise the City's departments, boards, and commissions about issues concerning youth in the city. The board works with local agencies as needed and when deemed appropriate by the board to deliver services to youth and to advise youth of service providers. In addition, the board oversees in a responsible manner all programs and events sponsored by the board. Part of the boards' duties is to deliver an annual report.


By ordinance they are responsible to create and share an annual report in August of each year to inform the public of board progress, and regularly share information on decisions, events, and efforts led by the board.
