PERMIT REQUEST – Wiregrass Honor Flight “Ruck March”


Council Members reviewed a request from Wiregrass Honor Flight to obtain a permit to hold the “Ruck March – Sweat for Vets” on Saturday, November 11, 2023, from 7:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. Police Chief Michael Moore expressed his support for the event but raised an issue about the unbudgeted cost to the city for two additional officers needed due to the length of time for the event. He asked the Council for their input on the matter. Council Members had a brief discussion and agreed that the organization should cover the cost due to the extended duration of the event.
