PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (Persons allowed 3 minutes to address the Council)

Julie Mills and Joey Barrett, speaking on behalf of pickleball enthusiasts in the audience, outlined the benefits of the sport and asked Council to include a free-standing outdoor pickleball complex in the city's Parks and Recreation plan.

Todd Boland, representing Longleaf Properties, urged Council to consider other proposals he has emailed them as alternatives to the previously denied annexation and zoning request.

Lister Reeves, citing his belief in personal property rights, questioned the need for a two-mile airport zoning jurisdiction.

Ben Goldman, Attorney, Hand Arendall Harrison Sale, speaking on behalf of Longleaf Properties, expressed concern with Ordinance 04-05-22-A, specifically, the second whereas clause and the city's ability to reach a compromise with Longleaf Properties, if included. Mr. Goldman requested Council to strike the clause and/or table the ordinance until the May 3, 2022 meeting to give Council Members the opportunity to review the proposals.

STAFF REPORTS

City Attorney Rainer Cotter requested Council to authorize the Mayor to execute an agreement related to the alleged overpayment involving USAA and their business license taxes. A motion was made by Council Member Goolsby, seconded by Council Member Johnson, to authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement as requested. All Council Members – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

Human Resources Director Christina Meissner provided information on the Retiree Bonus Bill, which would give retirees \$2 per month for each year of service if the city chooses to pass it.

OLD BUSINESS

REVIEW & CONSIDER ORDINANCE 04-05-22-A (Establish Airport Zoning Commission)

The President called for consideration of Ordinance 04-05-22-A, establishing an Airport Zoning Commission which will be the Enterprise Planning Commission to engage in and make recommendations as to zoning rules and regulations, including, the setting of initial zoning within two miles of the Enterprise Municipal Airport. It is the Ordinance's intent to establish the mechanisms for such zoning and the Council will await further recommendations of the Planning Commission.

A motion was made by Council Member Johnson, seconded by Council Member Rich, to adopt Ordinance 04-05-22-A. Council President Townsend addressed Mr. Goldman's concerns and clarified that if passed, the ordinance would establish an airport zoning commission and regulate the property adjacent to the airport. It does not address any specific development. City Attorney Rainer Cotter agreed, stating that nothing in the proposed ordinance would hinder the city's ability to compromise with Longleaf Properties if the Council chose to do so. Following a lengthy discussion, the consensus of the Council was to proceed with the adoption of the ordinance. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Johnson – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 04-05-22-A duly passed and adopted.

REQUEST PERMISSION TO SEEK BIDS (CDBG Demo Project/LR-CE-PF-21-002)

The President introduced and called for consideration of a request from City Engineer/Public Works Director Barry Mott to seek bids for all phases of the 2021 CDBG Demolition Project. Bids will be advertised and conducted by Ewing-Conner & Associates and will take place in phases. Up to 45 houses will be demolished as part of this process, with each demolition phase to have 5 to 10 properties. CDBG grant funds will be used to pay for the cost of this work.

A motion was made by Council Member Johnson, seconded by Council Member Rich, to approve the request to seek bids as submitted. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Johnson – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

REQUEST PERMISSION TO SEEK BIDS (Asbestos Inspection & Testing/CDBG Demo Project)

The President introduced and called for consideration of a request from City Engineer/Public Works Director Barry Mott to seek bids and procure asbestos inspection and testing services for properties slated for demolition and clearance under the 2021 CDBG Demolition Project. Bids will be advertised and conducted by Ewing-Conner & Associates. The cost of these services will be paid for with CDBG grant funds.





RESOLUTION 05-03-22-G

Whereas, the City Council desires to approve and authorize the City to provide resources and services and authorize the Mayor to execute a Development Agreement with the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs, Coffee County, the Water Works Board of the City of Enterprise, and the Industrial Development Board of the City of Enterprise, all related to the new \$80,000,000 Bennie G. Adkins State Veterans Home (sometimes referred to as the "VA Home" or "Project") located in Enterprise, Alabama; and,

Whereas, the City Council finds the provisions of resources and services related to the VA Home, and the said Development Agreement, will contribute to and is in the public interest of the citizens of Enterprise, including, but not limited to, the promotion of economic development, industry and business, the establishment of housing and services for the community's veteran population, and promotion of the general welfare of the City and its citizens;

Now, therefore, let it be resolved, ordained and approved as follows:

- 1. The City, through its Mayor and various departments, is authorized do the following: To improve, widen, pave and/or perform other improvements associated with Dozier Road, Hickman Road, and a road which will bi-sect the VA Home property (which is intended to originate from Highway 167 and run through the Project site to Highway 51), and the paving of the turn lane for Highway 51 entrance to the Project, and maintain said roads as City streets. The City will maintain certain unimproved natural areas of the grounds at or around the VA Home. The City and/or the ID Board will cause sanitary sewer service to the Project site and the City shall be authorized to acquire sewer easements for said purposes, whether solely or in conjunction with the ID Board. The City will pay to ADVA a total of \$6,000,000.00 upon request by the ADVA but not before the Project architect certifies in writing that the Project is at least one-half complete, provided that the City's engineer confirms such certification is made in good faith, but subject to set-offs from said amount based on the following: The City or ID Board, as determined between said entities, will cause site work and road work up to \$250,000.00 of actual costs to be expended related to the Project Site; and, installation of required water, and sewer infrastructure, related to the Project Site, along with installing taps and meters, up to \$1,000,000.00 in actual costs, all as determined through certification by the City's or ID Board's engineer, with any amounts expended over said amounts by the City or ID Board, which neither shall have any obligation to do, shall be credited off the said amounts owed to ADVA. As to the public access road from Highway 167 to Highway 51 as referenced above, the City or ID Board is authorized to cause the paving of said public access road; however, if ADVA paves the said public access road, the pure paving costs will be owed by the City to ADVA. Any costs incurred by the City or ID Board, which costs must be mutually agreed upon between the City and/or ID Board, over and above the cost to acquire land for said road and the pure paving costs, will be credited against the said amount owed to ADVA. The City will not charge sanitary sewer service fees to ADVA for 30 years from the date such sewer service is established. Also, potentially, the City may assist in providing fire suppression water service to the Project depending on mutual agreement between ADVA and City. All of the above items and obligations to be carried out in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of the Development Agreement.
- 2. The Mayor is authorized to execute the Development Agreement on behalf of the City.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This Development Agreement is hereby made and entered into on this 5th day of May 2022 ("Effective Date"), by and among the City of Enterprise, Alabama ("City"), The Industrial Development Board of the City of Enterprise, Alabama ("ID Board"), The Water Works Board of the City of Enterprise, Alabama ("Water Board"), Coffee County, Alabama ("County"), and The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs ("ADVA"). The ADVA, the City, ID Board, Water Board and County may from time to time be referred to individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties." The ADVA, City, ID Board, Water Board and County may from time to time be referred to collectively as the "Public Entities."

Whereas, the site for the new veterans home, named the Command Sergeant Major Bennie G. Adkins State Veterans Home in Enterprise, Alabama (said home and improvements known as the "Project," as more fully defined in this Agreement) having been chosen, the Parties desire to set out each side's obligations in this Agreement as to the development and construction of the Project; and,

Now, therefore, upon and in mutual consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, adequacy and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 "ADVA" means The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 1.2 "City" means the City of Enterprise, Alabama.
- 1.3 "County" means Coffee County, Alabama.
- 1.4 "ID Board" means The Industrial Development Board of the City of Enterprise, Alabama.
 - 1.5 "Water Board" means The Water Works Board of the City of Enterprise, Alabama.
- 1.6 "Preliminary Rendering" means the preliminary rendering of the Project provided by the ADVA set forth in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference;
- 1.7 "Project" means the design, development and construction of a veterans' home, which will provide approximately 174 beds in a skilled nursing facility to eligible veterans, which costs approximately \$80,000,000.00 to construct, and which will be located on the Project Site and

located in the City and County.

- 1.8 "Project Site" means the real property upon which the Project will be constructed, which real property is described on Exhibit "B", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and depicted as the highlighted portion of Exhibit "C", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, bordered by Highway 51, Dozier Road, and Hickman Road.
- 1.9 "Public Access Road" means the roadway connecting Highway 167 and Highway 51 which will bisect the Project Site as depicted on Exhibit "D" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

ARTICLE II THE PROJECT

2.1 <u>Design, Construction, and Development of the Project.</u>

- (a) Subject to the requirements set forth herein, the ADVA shall, at its costs and expense, design, construct, develop and operate the Project and comply with and fulfill all of the terms and conditions contained in this Development Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and ordinances. The ADVA agrees to design and construct the Project such that it shall be substantially as set out per the definitions of the Project and Preliminary Rendering.
- (b) The Parties hereby agree and the ADVA hereby acknowledges that neither the City's, the Water Board's, the ID Board's nor County's execution of this Agreement, or review of the plans, specifications, Preliminary Rendering or drawings of the Project amounts to an approval of the Project's conformity with applicable building codes or other inspection approvals by the City or County related to new construction and the ADVA agrees to obtain all necessary approvals, permits and inspections for the Project from any person or entity as required by law and the plans and specifications of the Project.
- (c) The ADVA agrees that it will begin construction of the Project ("begin construction" shall mean construction of the primary building for the Project) no later than nine (9) months from the Effective Date, and will complete the Project as expeditiously as possible and will use its best efforts to substantially complete the Project within two (2) years of beginning construction, subject to delays incident to strikes, riots, acts of God or the public enemy and other causes, including financial delays, beyond the reasonable control of the ADVA.
- (d) The Parties agree to cooperate with each other and any third parties to bring about the successful acquisition, design, construction and operation of the Project.
- (e) The ADVA shall comply in material respects with all federal, state, local and other statutes, ordinances, judgments, rulings and regulations relating to environmental pollution or environmental regulation or control and shall cause the Project Site and the Project to be operated and maintained in accordance with all such statutes, ordinances, judgments, rulings and

regulations.

- The ADVA hereby acknowledges that the ID Board will convey the Project Site to the ADVA for the construction of the Project. The ADVA agrees it will earnestly and in good faith begin construction of the Project (which in this instance, shall mean the beginning of construction of the primary building of the Project) no later than nine (9) months from the Effective Date, and will complete the Project as expeditiously as possible and will use its best efforts to substantially complete the Project within two (2) years of beginning construction, subject to delays incident to strikes, riots, acts of God or the public enemy and other causes, including financial delays, beyond the reasonable control of the ADVA. If the ADVA determines it will not construct the Project or has not begun construction or substantially completed construction of the Project as described above, the ADVA agrees that it will, upon request by the ID Board or the City, reconvey good and marketable title to the Project site to the ID Board or City free of any liens or encumbrances. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the conveyance of the Project Site to the ADVA. The ADVA further acknowledges that the provisions of this paragraph may be enforced by the ID Board or City, jointly or severally. Further, the deed conveying the Project site shall state on its face in conspicuous terms and in a conspicuous place that the conveyance is "SUBJECT TO THE RIGHT OF REVERSION IN FAVOR OF THE GRANTOR OR ITS ASSIGNS PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 2.1(f) OF THAT CERTAIN DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT DATED May 5, 2022, EXECUTED BY, AMONG OTHERS, THE ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND ID BOARD.
- (g) The Id Board and/or City agree to confer in good faith with ADVA regarding any plans, including new businesses, regarding the development of the area along the access road connecting Highway 167, Highway 51, and the Project.
- 2.2 <u>Maintenance of the Project</u>. Following the completion of construction of all, or portions as construction proceeds, of the Project, the ADVA will be solely responsible for maintaining the Project and keeping the same at all times in good condition and repair, and fully insured against casualty and builder's risk, in keeping with acceptable facility standards and in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and ordinances. However, the City or ID Board will maintain the unimproved grounds as required to exceed the City's minimum standards as defined by ordinance, see Exhibit "F", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and will maintain the public access road once released to the City or ID Board, see Exhibit "D".

2.3 Infrastructure improvements and delivery of incentives.

- (a) Subject to the requirements set forth herein, the County agrees to pay to ADVA a total of \$2,000,000.00 as soon as the Project architect certifies in writing that the Project is at least one-half complete, provided that the County's engineer confirms such certification is made in good faith.
- (b) Subject to the requirements set forth herein, the ID Board will convey the Project Site to ADVA by mutually approved statutory warranty deed, with reservations as to road rights of way

and easements for utilities related to provision of maintenance as to certain roads, sewer and water services which the City and Water Board, as the case may be, will be providing pursuant to this Agreement. See Exhibit "E", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. A fifty foot (50') strip of land, with additional footage for flares at intersections, shall be reserved from the conveyance from the point at which Hickman Road intersects with Highway 51 all the way around Hickman Road and Dozier Road to the point at which Dozier Road intersects with Highway 51 and shall be retained by the ID Board for purposes of the City establishing expanded width public streets and as may be necessary for utility installation. In an addition, ADVA agrees that it shall grant such easements to the City or Water Board as are necessary to provide for utility services such as sewer and water service to the Project. Also, ADVA agrees that it shall grant an easement to the City, noted on the deed, for the public access roadway for purposes of City maintenance of the same prior to the Project being substantially complete.

- (c) Subject to the requirements set forth herein, the City hereby agrees to pay to ADVA a total of \$6,000,000.00 upon request by the ADVA but not before the Project architect certifies in writing that the Project is at least one-half complete, provided that the City's engineer confirms such certification is made in good faith, but subject to the following set-offs from said amount based on the following:
- (i) The City or ID Board, as determined between said entities, will cause site work and road work up to \$250,000.00 of actual costs to be expended related to the Project Site; and, installation of required water, and sewer infrastructure, see Exhibit "E", related to the Project Site, along with installing taps and meters, up to \$1,000,000.00 in actual costs, all as determined through certification by the City's or ID Board's engineer, provided the ADVA's Project Architect confirms such certification is made in good faith, and any amounts expended over said amounts by the City or ID Board, which neither shall have any obligation to do, shall be credited off the amount owed as set out in paragraph 2.3(c). The water and sewer infrastructure, along with the installing of the taps and meters, shall be completed within ten (10) months of the Effective Date. The City or ID Board's engineer shall certify to the ADVA as to said amounts to be credited as referenced in this paragraph. Note: The City, Water Board or ID Board (as agreed between themselves) is only obligated to bring sewer and water lines, as the case may be, to the Project Site and the ADVA understands that it is responsible to run and connect the sewer and water lines that lie within the Project Site. See Exhibit "E".
- (ii) The City or ID Board has or will acquire an approximate ten (10) acre parcel of land which adjoins State Highway 167 North at no cost to the ADVA, see Exhibit "C", and shall cause the paving of the public access road from Highway 167 to the Highway 51, provided the City and/or ID Board and the ADVA mutually agree in writing as to the design and location of said road. See Exhibit "D". Any costs incurred by the City or ID Board, which costs must be mutually agreed upon between the City and/or ID Board, over and above the cost to acquire said parcel and the pure paving costs, i.e., actual cost to be expended for heavy-duty flexible pavement including the binder surface, tack coat & wearing surface, will be credited against the amount owed in paragraph 2.3(c). Further, the City will cause what is now known as Dozier Road to be improved, at a minimum, between Highway 51 and what is now known as Hickman Road, to meet

current subdivision regulations or their equivalent as to specifications for roads/streets and the City shall also cause the paving of the turn lane for Highway 51 entrance. See Exhibit "D". It is agreed that the City, ID Board and ADVA will coordinate with each other as to the paving of the new public access road connecting Highway 167 and Highway 51 to allow, if permitted by law, a single entity to conduct the paving. If ADVA paves the public access road, the pure paving costs, as described above, will be owed by the City to ADVA. This does not include those portions of the public access road, if any, within the Alabama Department of Transportation right-of-way. All road work, including paving work, shall be completed as described above prior to the Project reaching substantial completion.

- (iii) The Water Board will provide potable water, and not water for irrigation which will be separately metered from potable water, and the City will provide sewer service at no charge to the ADVA, for 30 years from the date such water and sewer service is established. It is understood and agreed that providing "potable water" does not include fire suppression water service which shall be provided and paid for by the ADVA. Alternatively, if mutually agreed upon in writing between the City and the ADVA, the City may provide for the establishment of fire suppression water service to the Project and the ADVA will then pay the customary, established, and recurring monthly charges for potable water instead of being provided such at no charge for 30 years. It is further understood and agreed upon by the ADVA that the ADVA shall be responsible for any repairs to the water service and sewer service at the Project and Project site which may be occasioned by some act or omission which is not attributable to the City or Water Board, as the case may be, including clogs to the sewer lines related to the ADVA's operations.
- (d) Upon completion of the construction and installation of the public access road from Highway 167 to Highway 51 and public infrastructure completed up to the boundaries of the Project site, the City agrees that it will assume the future maintenance, control, management, supervision and repair of the public access road, upon release by the ADVA, and infrastructure associated with said road. The ADVA agrees that it shall be responsible for the maintenance, control, management, supervision and repair of driveways and infrastructure within the Project site. See Exhibit "F".

ARTICLE III REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

3.1 Representations by the City, ID Board, Water Board, and County.

- (a) The City, ID Board, Water Board, and the County hereby represent and warrant to the ADVA, as of the Effective Date of this Development Agreement:
- (i) The City, ID Board, Water Board, and County have full power and authority to enter into this Development Agreement and to perform and observe its/their obligations hereunder and thereunder.
 - (ii) By proper action, the City, ID Board, Water Board, and County have duly

authorized the execution and delivery of this Development Agreement.

- (iii) The City, ID Board, Water Board, and County have obtained all consents, approvals, authorizations and orders required to be obtained by the City, ID Board and County as a condition to the execution and delivery of each of this Development Agreement.
- (iv) The Development Agreement constitutes the legal, valid and binding obligation of the City, ID Board, Water Board, and County and is enforceable against the City, ID Board, Water Board and County in accordance with its terms, except insofar as the enforceability thereof may be limited by (I) bankruptcy, insolvency, or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights and (ii) general principles of equity, regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding at equity or at law.

3.2 Representations and Warranties by the ADVA.

- (a) The ADVA hereby represents and warrants to the City, ID Board, Water Board, and County, as of the Effective Date of this Development Agreement:
- (i) The ADVA has full power and authority to enter into this Development Agreement and to perform and observe its/their obligations hereunder and thereunder.
- (ii) The ADVA has the power and authority to consummate the transactions contemplated by the Development Agreement.
- (iii) By proper action the ADVA has duly authorized the execution and delivery of the Development Agreement to which it is a party and the consummation of the transactions contemplated therein.
- (iv) The ADVA has obtained all consents, approvals, authorizations and orders of governmental authorities that are required to be obtained by it as a condition to the execution and delivery of each of the Development Agreement.
- (v) The execution and delivery by the ADVA of the Development Agreement and the consummation by the ADVA of the transactions contemplated therein will not conflict with, be in violation of, or constitute (upon notice or lapse of time or both) a default under its articles of incorporation, its bylaws or any agreement, instrument, order or judgment to which it is a party or is subject.
- (vi) The Development Agreement constitutes the legal, valid and binding obligation and is enforceable against the ADVA in accordance with the terms of he Development Agreement, except as enforcement thereof may be limited by (i) bankruptcy, insolvency, or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights and (ii) general principles of equity, regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding at equity or at law.

ARTICLE IV MISCELLANEOUS

- 4.1 Conditions to Enforceability of Agreement. This Agreement shall become legally binding and enforceable upon satisfaction of all of the following conditions: (I) this Agreement has been signed by authorized representatives of the ADVA, the City, ID Board, Water Board, and the County; (ii) the approval of the City Council of the City has been obtained; (iii) the approval of the board of directors of the Water Board has been obtained; (iv) the approval of the County Commission has been obtained; (v) the approval of the Board of Directors of the ID Board, and, (vi) the approval of the governing body of the ADVA has been obtained.
- 4.2 The City, ID Board, Water Board and the County do hereby ascertain, determine, declare and find that development and implementation of the Project with the assistance of the City, ID Board, and the County are in the best interest of the City, ID Board, and County and will serve a public purpose and further enhance the public benefit and welfare by, among other things: promotion of local economic development and the stimulation of the local economy, including, but not limited to, the establishment and development of other businesses and industries; increasing employment opportunities in the City and County; increasing the City's and County's tax bases, which will result in additional tax revenues for the City and County; and promoting the development of infrastructure at appropriate locations. The City, ID Board, and the County find that the above-cited items constitute important public benefits to City, the County and their citizens.
- 4.3 **Assignment.** The ADVA cannot assign this Agreement to a third party except with the approval of the City, ID Board, Water Board and the County.
- 4.4 **Counterparts**. This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and it shall not be necessary in making proof of his Agreement to procedures or account for more than one such counterpart.
- 4.5 Governing Law. This governing law of this Agreement shall be the law of the State of Alabama.
- 4.6 Severability. In the event any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
- 4.7 **Notices**. All communications and notices expressly provided herein shall be sent, by registered first class mail, postage prepaid; by a nationally recognized overnight courier for delivery on the following business day; or by telex or telecopy (with such telex or telecopy to be confirmed promptly in writing, sent by mail or overnight courier as aforesaid), as follows:

- 4.8 **Section Titles and Headings**. The section titles and headings are for convenience only and do not define, modify or limit any of the terms and provisions hereof.
- 4.9 Survival of Representations and Warranties. The representations, warrants and covenants made by the City, the ID Board, Water Board, the County, and the ADVA and contained herein shall survive the performance of any obligations to which such representations,

warranties and covenants relate.

- 4.10 **Binding Effect.** This Agreement and all terms, provisions and obligations set forth herein shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the ADVA and its successors and assigns and shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of each of the City, ID Board, Water Board, and the County and their successors and assigns.
- 4.11 Relationship of Parties. The City, ID Board, Water Board, County and the ADVA agree that nothing contained in this Agreement, or any act of the ADVA or of the City, ID Board, Water Board, or County, shall be deemed or construed by either of the Parties hereto, or by third persons, to create any relationship of third party beneficiary hereof, or of principal and agent, or of a limited or a general partnership or of a joint venture or of any association or relationship between the ADVA, City, ID Board, Water Board, and County other than as independent parties in a contract entered into at arm's length as to each other and between each other. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of this Agreement, it is agreed that the City, ID Board, Water Board, and County have no investment or equity interest in the business of the ADVA, and shall not be liable for any debts of the ADVA, nor shall any of the City, ID Board, Water Board, or County be deemed or construed to be a partner, joint venturer or otherwise interested in the assets of the ADVA, nor shall the ADVA at any time or times use the name or credit of the City, ID Board, Water Board, or County in purchasing or attempting to purchase any equipment, supplies or other thing whatsoever. Moreover, notwithstanding anything stated or implied by any term or provision in this agreement, nothing in this agreement shall mean or imply that the City, ID Board, Water Board, or County, as just between those entities, are in any type of principal/agent, partnership or joint venture arrangement or relationship among themselves.

4.12. Compliance with Laws.

- (a) The ADVA shall comply, and shall cause its officers, agents, employees and contractors to comply, with all applicable federal, state and local statutes, regulations, rules, ordinances and other laws applicable to the development and operation of the Project.
- (b) The ADVA shall not enter into, execute, or be a party to any covenant agreement, lease, deed, assignment, conveyance, or any other written instrument, which restricts the sale, lease, use or occupancy of the Project Site, or any part thereof, or any improvements placed thereon, upon the basis of national origin, race, religion, sex or color. The ADVA shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, in effect from time to time, prohibiting discrimination or segregation, and will not discriminate, by reason of national origin, race, religion, sex or color in the sale, lease or use or occupancy of the Project Site.
- 4.13 Entire Agreement Amendment. This Agreement constitutes one entire and complete agreement, and none of the Parties hereto shall have any rights arising from any separate component of this Agreement without complying in all respects with its duties and obligations under all parts and components hereof. This Agreement constitutes and includes all promises and representations, expressed or implied, made by the City, ID Board, Water Board, County and

- ADVA. No stipulations, agreements or understandings of the Parties hereto shall be valid or enforceable unless contained in this Agreement. No oral conditions, warranties or modifications hereto shall be valid between the Parties. This Agreement may be amended only by a written instrument executed by all Parties.
- 4.14 Not to Constitute a Debt of the State. Under no circumstances shall the commitments of the ADVA contained herein constitute a debt of the State of Alabama as prohibited by Section 213 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, as amended by Amendment 26. It is further agreed that if any provision of this Agreement shall contravene any statute or constitutional provision or amendment, either now in effect or which may, during the course of this Agreement, be enacted, then that conflicting provision in the Agreement shall be deemed null and void. The Public Entities' sole remedy for the settlement of any and all disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement shall be limited to the filing of the claim with the Board of Adjustment of the State of Alabama, except (i) as to the Reverter clause referenced in paragraph 2.1(f) which shall be enforced by the Circuit Court of Coffee County (Enterprise Division), Alabama or (ii) a remedy which would naturally require the exercise of equitable judicial powers, which shall be enforced by the Circuit Court of Coffee County (Enterprise Division), Alabama.
- 4.15 Alternative Dispute Resolution Clause. For any and all disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement, the Parties hereto agree, in compliance with the recommendations of the Governor and Attorney General, when considering settlement of such disputes, to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation by and through mediators approved by the State of Alabama or where appropriate, private mediators.
- 4.16 The proposal submitted to ADVA by the City of Enterprise on or about August 15, 2019 related to its consideration for the location of the Project is incorporated herein by reference, however, in the event of any conflict between that proposal and this Development Agreement, the provisions of this Development Agreement shall govern, it being the specific intention of the parties hereto for this Development Agreement to serve as the final agreement between the parties and thereby act to clarify any ambiguities in the said proposal and to express the intentions of the parties as what each side has agreed to perform.
- 4.17 The parties understand that certain circumstances, including, but not limited to, labor and supply availability, may reasonably be beyond the control of the parties. Therefore, the parties agree that reasonable, consistent, and continuing efforts to accomplish the work within the timeframes established herein shall be considered sufficient performance under this agreement.
- 4.18 This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed to be an original, but all of which together will constitute the same Agreement. Any signature page of any such counterpart, or any electronic pdf. or facsimile thereof, may be attached or appended to any other counterpart to complete a fully executed counterpart of this Agreement, and any telecopy, emailed pdf. or facsimile transmission of any signature will be deemed an original and will bind such party.



PROJECT SITE DEPICTION




ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS





