# <u>PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ORDINANCE 06-07-22 (Annexation & Zoning/New Enterprise, LLC)</u>

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22, providing for the annexation and zoning of .67 acres of land owned by New Enterprise, LLC into the city limits and to establish zoning of R-75-A. Phillip Santora of Northstar Engineering presented on behalf of M4 Development, LLC. Mr. Santora explained that the development proposed for the property is not an apartment complex but is single family residential. Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, explained that staff had reviewed the request and it does meet the city's minimum requirements; it's aligned with the city's Comprehensive Plan and the requested zoning is contiguous with adjacent zoning. The recommendation of the Enterprise Planning Commission is to approve the request. There being no further comments, the President closed the hearing and called for consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Goolsby, to adopt Ordinance 06-07-22. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-07-22 duly passed and adopted.

#### PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ORDINANCE 06-07-22-A (New Enterprise, LLC Rezone)

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-A, providing for the rezone of 40.13 acres of land owned by New Enterprise, LLC from R-65 (Residential District) to R-75-A (Residential District) located off County Road 711. Phillip Santora of Northstar Engineering presented on behalf of M4 Development, LLC. He explained again that M4 Development has no plans for an apartment complex but plans a development of small individual homes. Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, advised that staff had reviewed the request and it does meet the city's minimum requirements; it's aligned with the city's Comprehensive Plan and the requested zoning is contiguous with adjacent zoning. The recommendation of the Enterprise Planning Commission is to approve the request. Cassie Onorato, a resident of 108 Brookstone Drive, spoke in opposition to the request, citing increased traffic, safety, and diminished property values. Ms. Onorato questioned if there were plans to connect the new development with the dead-end road on Brookstone Drive. Mr. Santora stated at this time, there were no plans to connect the development with Brookstone Drive. There being no further comments, the President closed the hearing and called for consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-A.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Padgett, to adopt Ordinance 06-07-22-A. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-07-22-A duly passed and adopted.

#### PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ORDINANCE 06-07-22-B (Axton Rezone)

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-B, providing for the rezone of 14.19 acres of land owned by Kevin Axton from R-75-A (Residential District) to R-65 (Residential District) located at 2550 Porter Lunsford Road. Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, explained the proposed zoning change from R-75-A to R-65. He advised that staff had reviewed the request and it does meet the city's minimum requirements; it's aligned with the city's Comprehensive Plan and the requested zoning is contiguous with adjacent zoning. The recommendation of the Enterprise Planning Commission is to approve the request. There being no further comments, the President closed the hearing and called for consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-B.

A motion was made by Council Member Goolsby, seconded by Council Member Padgett, to adopt Ordinance 06-07-22-B. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-07-22-B duly passed and adopted.

#### PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ORDINANCE 06-07-22-C (Establish Airport Zoning)

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-C, providing to amend the Enterprise Zoning Ordinance(s) to establish a zoning jurisdiction of the city to include the area lying within two miles of the boundary of the Enterprise Municipal Airport. Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, provided an overview of the proposed ordinance. John Funk, a resident of 117 Pratt Drive, inquired if the new zoning area takes into consideration the FAA safety zones. Public Works Director/City Engineer Barry Mott responded, noting that the city owns and maintains the property for the current safety areas and is in the process of acquiring the land for the new safety areas as the airport goes from a Class B to a Class C airport. There being no further comments, the President closed the hearing and called for consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-C.

A motion was made by Council Member Padgett, seconded by Council Member Rich, to adopt Ordinance 06-07-22-C. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-07-22-C duly passed and adopted.

# <u>PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ORDINANCE 06-07-22-D (Certain Honeybees in Certain Zoning Districts)</u>

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-D, providing to amend Ordinance 10-05-21 and the existing Enterprise Zoning Ordinance(s) to allow for the keeping of certain honeybees in certain zoning districts in the City of Enterprise. Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, explained that proposed Ordinance 06-07-22-D if adopted, provides changes to the existing honey bee ordinance clarifying land size requirements and the definition of bodies of water. Richard Woodham, a resident of 32 Breckenridge Court, spoke in favor of the proposed updates and recommended approval of the ordinance. There being no further comments, the President closed the hearing and called for consideration of Ordinance 06-07-22-D.

A motion was made by Council Member Goolsby, seconded by Council Member Rich, to adopt Ordinance 06-07-22-D. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-07-22-D duly passed and adopted.

#### REVIEW & CONSIDER ORDINANCE 06-21-22 (Set Certain Department Head & Employee Hiring)

The President called for consideration of Ordinance 06-21-22, providing to set procedures for the appointment and hiring of certain department head and city positions.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Goolsby, to adopt Ordinance 06-21-22. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance 06-21-22 duly passed and adopted.

## PUBLIC HEARING & CONSIDERATION/ABC LICENSE REQUEST (Ciscos Bourbon and Cigar Club)

The President called for a public hearing prior to consideration of a request from Dukes Business Group LLC d/b/a Ciscos Bourbon and Cigar Club for a Lounge Retail Liquor – Class 1 license located at 621 Boll Weevil Circle, Suite 25. No comments were offered. The President closed the hearing and called for consideration of the ABC license request.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Goolsby, to approve the ABC license request as submitted. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

#### INTRODUCE PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The President introduced for the record, a letter from the Enterprise Planning Commission that offered no recommendation for or against the following rezone request:

• A request by Boyd Engineering, LLC on behalf of Tony Hundley for the rezoning of 32 acres of land from R-100 (Residential District) to R-75-A (Residential District) and B-3 (Highway Commercial District) located at the corner of Dauphin Street Extension and Highway 27.

#### INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 07-05-22 (Hundley Rezone)

The President introduced Ordinance 07-05-22, providing for the rezone of 32 acres of land owned by Tony Hundley from R-100 (Residential District) to R-75-A (Residential District) and B-3 (Highway Commercial District) located at the corner of Dauphin Street Extension and Highway 27 and called for a public hearing to be held at the regular meeting scheduled for August 2, 2022.

#### INTRODUCE PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The President introduced for the record, a letter from the Enterprise Planning Commission to approve the following request:

 A request by Longleaf Engineering, LLC on behalf of Shang and Faye Howell for the annexation and zoning of 71.85 acres of land to TH-3 (Townhouse District) and 112.23 acres of land to AGRIC (Agricultural District) located off County Road 622 on the south side of the Enterprise Municipal Airport.

#### INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 07-05-22-A (Annexation & Zoning/Howell)

The President introduced Ordinance 07-05-22-A, providing for the annexation and zoning of 184.08 acres of land owned by Shang and Faye Howell into the city limits and to establish zoning of TH-3 (Townhouse District) and AGRIC (Agricultural District) and called for a public hearing to be held at the regular meeting scheduled for August 2, 2022.

#### REVIEW & CONSIDER RESOLUTION 07-05-22 (Create Position of Public Information Manager)

The President introduced and called for consideration of Resolution 07-05-22, providing for the creation of the position of Public Information Manager under the authority of Title 11-43-47, Code of Alabama, 1975, for a term determined at the pleasure of the Mayor.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Goolsby, to adopt Resolution 07-05-22. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Resolution 07-05-22 duly passed and adopted.

#### REVIEW & CONSIDER AGREEMENT (Revize LLC/Website Services)

The President introduced and called for consideration of an agreement with Revize LLC for software, hosting, technical support and maintenance services related to an update of the city's website. The total cost of the four-year agreement is \$30,200.00, with \$17,150.00 to be paid in Fiscal Year 2022, and \$4,350.00 each year for an additional three years. Or the total contract amount can be paid in annual installments of \$8,618.00 the first year, \$8,616.00 for years two and three, and \$4,350.00 in year four.

A motion was made by Council Member Padgett, seconded by Council Member Rich, to approve the agreement with Revize LLC as submitted. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

# <u>AUTHORIZE GRANT APPLICATION & FUNDING (Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program)</u>

The President called for a motion to authorize the City Administrator to submit a proposal to the Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program (DCIP) for improvements and amendments to the Enterprise Community Recreation Center and to apply for assistance in the amount of \$2 million; further, the City Council acknowledges that funding for the city's \$28 million match will be derived from 2021 General Obligation Warrant Series C funds.

Council Member Goolsby motioned to authorize the City Administrator to submit a proposal to the Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program (DCIP) for funding assistance in the amount of \$2 million for amendments and improvements to the Enterprise Community Recreation Center and further acknowledged that funding for the city's \$28 million match will be derived from 2021 General Obligation Warrant Series C funds. Council Member Padgett seconded the motion. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

#### REVIEW & CONSIDER STREET LIGHTING MODIFICATION (Bella Woods Subdivision)

The President introduced and called for consideration of a request from Thomas Hardy, Assistant Director of Engineering, to install the following new street lights at an annual cost of \$1,280.40:

• (10) Aluminum Poles and (10) 45w Colonial LED fixtures at Bella Woods Subdivision

A motion was made by Council Member Padgett, seconded by Council Member Rich, to approve the street lighting request as submitted. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

#### **ORDINANCE 07-19-22**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ENTERPRISE TO ADJUST THE BOUNDARIES OF COUNCIL DISTRICTS FOR THE CITY OF ENTERPRISE PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF SECTION 11-46-23, CODE OF ALABAMA, 1975.

WHEREAS, Section 11-46-23 of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended, authorizes the City Council to alter the boundaries of the council districts; and

WHEREAS, the City of Enterprise is divided into five (5) Council districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, upon reviewing the 2020 Census data, has determined that changes in the population of each district warrant adjustments to the district boundaries to ensure equality in the voting process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has presented to the public a map depicting proposed changes to the district boundaries and has provided the public an opportunity to comment on said changes at a public hearing held on August 2, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has duly considered public comments regarding the proposed changes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ENTERPRISE, ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** Pursuant to the authority contained in Section 11-46-23, <u>Code of Alabama</u>, 1975, the City Council of the City of Enterprise, Alabama, does hereby readjust and reestablish the boundary lines of the five (5) Council Districts of the City and the territory composing each such district for purposes of City Council elections such that hereafter, said districts shall be and are described as follows:

**SECTION 4:** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5:** All sections of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the judgment or decree of any Court or competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance.

City of Enterprise Council Redistricting – Proposed Plan 1

- Proposed Plan 1 changes the districts from a current 26.82% deviation to a 7.68% deviation, which is well within the accepted 10% between the most and least populous districts (District 4 and District 1).
- Proposed Plan 1 keeps incumbents in their district.
- Proposed Plan 1 keeps District 1 a strong majority-minority district.

#### Required changes:

- District 1: Required to add a minimum of 336 people to get district within accepted deviation.
- District 4: Required to add a minimum of 70 people to get district within accepted deviation
- District 5: Required to subtract a minimum of 630 people to get district within accepted deviation.

#### Proposed changes between districts:

• D-1/D-2: Changed three Block assignments in Meadowbrook S/D from D-1 to D-2 and four Block assignments in Meadowbrook S/D and Griffin Heights S/D from D-2 to D-1 for racial demographic purposes as well as switching a couple of Blocks further east along West College Street. Changed three Blocks from D-1 to D-2 between North Rawls Street and North Conner Street. Changed one Block from D-2 to D-1 between Brunson Street and Watts Street. Changed Blocks roughly bounded by Boll Weevil Circle, Geneva Highway, Doster Street, Chambers Street, Bowden Drive, South Industrial Boulevard and Bellwood Road from D-2 to D-1. These changes had relatively minor impact on population and mostly used to strengthen minority population in D-1.

- D-1/D-3: Changed area bounded by Glover Avenue, Lester Drive, Lee Street, Boll Weevil Circle, James Drive, Port Mayaca Drive, Wynn Road, and Everglade Street from D-3 to D-1. This added 303 people to D-1 with a majority-minority population (~60% non-single-race White).
- D-1/D-4: Changed Block bounded by Rucker Boulevard, Villa Drive, Springdale Drive, and Julian Street. This adds 34 people to D-1 with a majority-minority population (~65% non-single-race White). Downside is it splits this small area from D-4. If wanting to be changed back, would have to add population to D-1 from elsewhere.
- D-2/D-3: Moved district boundary from Old Salem Road to Salem Road. Changes 38 people from D-2 to D-3.
- D-3/D-4: Changed part of Valley Hills S/D bounded by Northside Drive, Dauphin St. Ext., Spruce Drive, Red Cliff Cir, Windcreek Way, and Harwood Place from D-4 to D-3. Changes 210 people from D-4 to D-3.
- D-4/D-5: Changed Block bounded by Ozark Hwy, Russell St, and Scott Dr from D-4 to D-5 to "square" off the boundary. Changes 32 people to D-5. Changed area in Foxhill Commons, part of Foxhill S/D, part of Scottdale Heights S/D, and much of Harrand Creek Estates from D-5 to D-4, moving 802 people.


#### Notes:

- I would have liked to have moved the southeast corner of the City (south of East Park/84 and east of Boll Weevil Circle) from D-2 to D-1, but the formation of the Census Block boundaries required the areas further down Hwy 167 to also be in D-1, so that would have more than negated any demographic gains made.
- Census Block boundaries also limited taking other areas out of D-5. There is virtually no way to split the Dale County areas into two districts. There is around 3,000 people east of Ridgeway Drive / Yellowleaf Drive alone.
- D-1 is majority-minority, but I do not know of any way to get D-1 at majority single-race Black/African-American. We ran into the same issue for County D-5. Here are specified numbers for D-1 as detailed as possible showing majority Black/African-American including multiracial respondents.
  - o Total Population: 5,470
  - o Total Black/African-American (All Races): 2,772 (50.68%)
    - One-Race Black/African-American: 2,559 (46.78%)
    - Two-Race White/Black: 114 (2.08%)
    - Two-Race Black/American Indian: 33 (0.6%)
    - Two-Race Black/Asian: 10 (0.18%)
    - Two-Race Black/Hawaiian: 2 (0.04%)
    - Two-Race Black/Other: 31 (0.57%)
    - Three-Race White/Black/American Indian: 13 (0.24%)
    - Three-Race White/Black/Asian: 1 (0.02%)
    - Three-Race White/Black/Hawaiian: 1 (0.02%)
    - Three-Race White/Black/Other: 7 (0.13%)
    - Four-Race Black/Amer. Ind./Asian/Hawaiian: 1 (0.02%)

Again, this is a conversation starter, but should accomplish what is required for population and racial demographics. If the Council desires more substantial changes, I can develop other scenarios.

#### **RESOLUTION 07-19-22**

#### A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF ENTERPRISE TO JOIN THE STATE OF ALABAMA AND OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS PARTICIPANTS IN CURRENT AND FUTURE OPIOID SETTLEMENTS

WHEREAS, the opioid epidemic continues to impact communities in the United States, the State of Alabama, and the City of Enterprise, Alabama.

WHEREAS, the City of Enterprise has suffered harm and will continue to suffer harm as a result of the opioid epidemic;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama and some Alabama local governments have filed lawsuits against opioid manufacturers, distributors, and retailers ("Opioid Litigation");

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has entered into various Settlement Agreements and are likely to enter into additional agreements in the future which include the claims for the State of Alabama's local governments;

WHEREAS, the City of Enterprise finds the terms of the current Settlement Agreements acceptable and in the best interest of the community and anticipates the terms of the future Settlement Agreements to be similarly acceptable;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has prepared and presented Settlement Sign-On Agreements to the local governments and the City of Enterprise finds the terms of the Sign-On Agreement acceptable and in the best interest of the community;

WHEREAS, the current and future Settlement Agreements and Sign-On Agreements will detail the allocation of Settlement Funds, which the City of Enterprise finds acceptable and in the best interest of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ENTERPRISE, ALABAMA,

- Section 1. That the City of Enterprise finds that participation in the various Opioid Settlements, Settlement Agreement and Sign-On Agreement is in the best interest of the City of Enterprise and its citizens because such a plan would ensure an effective structure for the commitment of Settlement Funds to abate and seek to resolve the opioid epidemic.
- Section 2. That the City of Enterprise hereby expresses its support for the Settlement of various Opioid claims and allocation and use of Settlement Funds as generally described in the Settlement Agreement and Sign-On Agreement.
- Section 3. That the City of Enterprise's Mayor ("Mayor") is hereby expressly authorized to execute the Settlement Sign-On Agreements and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any formal agreements necessary to implement the Settlements and plan for the allocation and use of Settlement Funds.
- Section 4. That the Mayor is hereby expressly authorized to execute any formal agreement and related documents evidencing the City of Enterprise's agreement to the settlement of claims and litigation related to the Opioid Epidemic.
- Section 5. That the Mayor is authorized to take such other action as necessary and appropriate to effectuate the City of Enterprise's participation in any Settlement related to the Opioid Epidemic.
- Section 6. This Resolution is effective upon adoption, the welfare of the City of Enterprise, Alabama requiring it.

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR ARFF EMERGENCY SERVICES

#### Arista Aviation Services LLC And Enterprise, AL Fire Department

- 1. <u>Purpose:</u> To prescribe procedures as part of the Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) in the event of a potential or actual emergency on or near the hangar operations of Arista Aviation Services, LLC. at the Enterprise Municipal Airport to the extent possible.
- 2. Procedures: When requested by Arista Aviation Services, LLC. the Enterprise Fire Department will respond in accordance with NAS 3306 and/or request the appropriate assistance/resources from other agencies. All emergency events will operate under the Incident Command System (ICS) incorporated into the National Incident Management System (NIMS). Unified Command Structure will be used; each agency on scene will provide a Command Officer to the Command Post.

#### 3. ARFF Coverage Responsibilities:

#### Arista Aviation Services, LLC.

- a. Arista Aviation Services, LLC. Production Control Office will establish communications first business day of each week prior to scheduling with the Enterprise Fire Department by email direct contact with 1. Chief Davis at <a href="mailto:cdavis@enterprisefd.com">cdavis@enterprisefd.com</a> or Chief's designee to advise and coordinate ARFF coverage for weekly operations as listed-in the paragraph below.
- b. Arista Aviation Services, LLC. Director of Maintenance Office will establish communications each business day as scheduled, event times with the Enterprise Fire Department by direct contact with 1. Capt. Davis 334-406-0245 to advise and coordinate ARFF coverage for operations as listed-in the paragraph below.
- c. The purpose of this communication will be to advise the Enterprise Fire Department of all engine runup activities, any scheduled flights, touch and go landings, or high-speed taxi tests. as well as any hazardous operations.

Hazardous operations include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Hot work on fueled aircraft.
- 2. Atypical fueling/defueling (i.e., fueling after major maintenance/modification, first time fueling on production aircraft, hot-refueling operations. etc.)
- 3. Atypical aircraft engine/APU operations (i.e., initial operations after engine installation/replacement. Operations after major maintenance, etc.)
- 4. Any loading/unloading of hazardous cargo.
- d. In the event of any emergency, Arista Aviation Services LLC will notify the Enterprise, Al Fire Department of the incident by phone by dialing Department of the incident by phone by dialing 911.

#### Enterprise Fire Department

- a. Upon contact with Arista Aviation Services, LLC. Enterprise Fire Department will acknowledge the planned operational schedule proposed by Arista Aviation Services, LLC.
- b. Enterprise Fire Department will provide ARFF services to Arista Aviation Services, LLC. until the operations are completed or they are no longer available to provide services due to Enterprise City operational requirements (i.e., call to another emergency in the city).

## 4. <u>Suspension of ARFF Coverage Responsibilities</u> Enterprise Fire Department

In the event ARFF coverage is no longer available, the Enterprise Fire Department shall notify Arista

Aviation Services, LLC. immediately through the most expeditious means available, and confirm Arista Aviation Services, LLC. acknowledges ARFF services are no longer available.

#### Arista Aviation Services, LLC.

Upon notification the Enterprise Fire Department can longer provide ARFF coverage in accordance with NAS 3306, Arista Aviation Services, L.LC. shall suspend all engine runup activities. any flights, touch and go landings, or high-speed taxi tests, as well as any hazardous operations listed prior in this letter.

#### 5. Resuming ARFF Coverage After Suspension Enterprise Fire Department

Once Enterprise Fire Department has concluded the operations that required suspension of ARFF coverage. the EFD will notify Arista Aviation Services. LLC. that ARFF coverage is once again available.

#### Arista Aviation Services, LLC.

Upon notification the Enterprise Fire Department is once again available to provide ARFF coverage, Arista Aviation Services, LLC. will be able to resume o Peration Services, LC. will be able to resume o Peration Services.
