A motion was made by Council Member Padgett, seconded by Council Member Johnson, to adopt Resolution 12-20-22-D. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Johnson – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried and Resolution 12-20-22-D duly passed and adopted.

### APPROVE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PORTIONS OF STREETS (East Brunson, Hollis & Swenson)

The President called for a motion to approve the temporary closure of portions of East Brunson Street, Hollis Street, and Swenson Street as per the maps attached to Resolution No. 12-20-22-B, 12-20-22-C, and 12-20-22-D. The request is related to the demolition and construction preparation for the new Recreation and Aquatic Center. The temporary closures will stay in effect until such time as the portions of those streets are permanently vacated.

A motion was made by Council Member Rich, seconded by Council Member Goolsby, to approve the temporary closure of portions of East Brunson Street, Hollis Street, and Swenson Street as submitted. The vote being: Rich – Aye; Goolsby – Aye; Padgett – Aye; Johnson – Aye; Townsend – Aye. The President declared the motion carried.

### AUTHORIZE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AGREEMENT (McKee & Associates/Pickleball Court Design)

The President called for a motion to accept the proposal from McKee & Associates Architects, Inc. for professional services related to a new pickleball complex and further authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement with review from the City Administrator and City Attorney. The agreement is for 7.6% of construction cost, not to exceed \$45,600.00, and includes design, bidding, construction administration, and project closeout phases for eight (8) new pickleball courts to be constructed at the Enterprise State Community College campus.

### **AUTHORIZE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AGREEMENT (Continued):**

A motion was made by Council Member Johnson, seconded by Council Member Rich, to accept the proposal from McKee & Associates Architects, Inc. as submitted, and further authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement with review from the City Administrator and City Attorney. ### AUTHORIZE MAYOR TO EXECUTE LIGHTING SERVICES AGREEMENT (Alabama Power Company/Central Fire Station)

The President called for a motion to authorize the Mayor to execute a five-year agreement with Alabama Power Company to provide eight (8) LED fixtures, poles, wiring, energy, and maintenance at Central Fire Station at a monthly cost of \$432.80.

A motion was made by Council Member Goolsby, seconded by Council Member Padgett, to authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement with Alabama Power Company as submitted. ### REQUEST PERMISSION TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT (Polaris Utility Vehicle/Parks & Recreation)

The President introduced and called for consideration of a request from Billy Powell, Director of Community Services and Recreation, to purchase one (1) Polaris 570 Utility Vehicle from Dowling Tractor Company at a cost of \$14,350.00. The equipment is a budgeted item in the FY23 budget.

#### ORDINANCE 12-06-22 ANNEXATION AND ESTABLISH ZONING

An ordinance relating to the Municipality of Enterprise, Coffee and Dale Counties, Alabama, to alter, rearrange and extend the boundaries and corporate limits of Enterprise:

WHEREAS, the City Council received a petition dated October 31, 2022 which was filed with the Planning Commission and signed by the following property owner, to wit: Billy Cotter Construction, Inc., seeking the annexation of real estate owned by them and better described in the survey attached to the petition, and the petition was ordered to be filed in the Minute Books of the City Council.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and being advertised as provided by law.







### ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT AMENDING TABLE 4-1 TO ADD ALLOWED USE IN COMMERCIAL DISTRICT, B-2

#### BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

Whereas, the City enacted Zoning Ordinance 06-05-12, as amended, and previous zoning ordinances, to include regulations related to location of minor shopping centers in various zones;

Whereas, in the interests of assisting the growth of the City of Enterprise for the economic vitality and general welfare of its citizens, the City Council finds it proper to enact this Zoning Ordinance Amendment, amending Ordinance 06-05-12, as amended, and amending any other existing and applicable ordinances of the City (all collectively, referred to herein as the "Zoning Ordinance"), to provide for "shopping center, minor" use within a B-2 Commercial District Zone under Table 4-1 of the Zoning Ordinance:

Now, therefore, let it be ordained and enacted as follows:

Section 1. Table 4-1 of the Zoning Ordinance is amended to reflect that in addition to the uses as now shown in said Table 4-1 under "B-2" District, the following use, to wit: "Shopping Center, Minor," is allowed in said District, and as set out on Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out herein. A new Table 4-1 (which is Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated by reference), is adopted to show said new, additional or different use.

Section 2. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any section, subsection or provision shall be declared to be invalid or unconstitutional by judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment or decree shall not affect any other section, subsection or provision of this Ordinance. All existing ordinances, or portions thereof, which may conflict with this ordinance are superseded by this ordinance.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the City Council, or upon its otherwise becoming law, but shall nevertheless be published as required by law.

By this agreement made and entered into on the 21 day of Dec. . 2022, by and between CITY OF ENTERPRISE, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor," and ENTERPRISE RESCUE, INC., hereinafter referred to collectively as "Lessee," Lessor leases to Lessee the premises commonly known as the old terminal building located at the Enterprise Municipal Airport for a term of approximately one year (1) year, to commence on the day of 23rd day of November, 2022, and to end on the 31 of October, 2023.

#### AGREEMENT

The parties to this agreement, in consideration of the following mutual covenants and stipulations, agree as follows:

#### SECTION ONE RENT

Lessee agrees to pay, without demand, to Lessor as rent for the demised premises the sum of ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1,800.00) per month, in advance, due no later than the 1st day of each calendar month. No rental will be charged for the month of November, 2022.

### SECTION TWO USE OF PREMISES

- A. The demised premises shall be used and occupied by Lessee exclusively as building to support operations related to helicopter medical evacuations.
- B. Lessee shall comply with all the sanitary laws, ordinances, rules, and order of appropriate governmental authorities affecting the cleanliness, occupancy, and preservation of the demised premises, and the sidewalks connected to the demised premises, during the term of this Lease.

### SECTION THREE CONDITION OF PREMISES

Lessee stipulates that it has examined the premises, including the grounds and improvements, and that they are, at the time of this lease, in tenantable condition and the Lessee agrees to accept the leased premises in "AS IS" condition without any warranty, either express or implied or any other representations related to condition.

### SECTION FOUR ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING

Without the prior, express, and written consent of the Lessor, the Lessee shall not assign or sublet this Lease.

### SECTION FIVE ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS

Lessee shall make no alterations to the buildings on the demised premises or construct any building or make other improvements on the demised premises without the prior, express and written consent of the Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld.

All alterations, changes and improvements built, constructed, or placed on the demised premises by the Lessee, with the exception of fixtures removable without damage to the premises and movable personal property, shall, unless otherwise provided by written agreement between the Lessor and the Lessee, be the property of the Lessor and remain on the demised premises at the expiration or earlier termination of this lease.

### SECTION SIX DAMAGE TO PREMISES

If the leased premises should be damaged by the wrongful act/omission of Lessee or that of Lessee's employees, agents, contractors, clients, customers, invitees, licensees, clients, customers, or visitors, Lessee shall be responsible for all such damages.

#### SECTION SEVEN UTILITIES

Lessee shall be responsible for arranging and paying for all electricity and other utility services required on or in the premises.

### SECTION EIGHT MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

Lessee will, at its sole expense, keep and maintain the leased premises and appurtenances in good and sanitary condition and repair during the term of this lease, including, but not necessarily limited to, repairs to the windows, interior walls, fixtures, plumbing, heating and cooling units, and electrical systems. If replacement of any said windows, interior walls, fixtures, roof, plumbing, heating and cooling units and electrical systems becomes necessary, Lessor shall make such replacements, provided those replacements are not due to the wrongful actions or omissions of Lessee's employees, agents, contractors, clients, customers, invitees, licensees, clients, customers, invitees, licensees, or visitors. Similarly, unless caused by the wrongful actions or omissions of Lessee, or Lessee's employees, agents, contractors,

clients, customers, invitees, licensees, clients, customers, invitees, licensees, or visitors, Lessor shall make all required repairs to the exterior walls and roof of the premises, subject to Section 18 below.

#### SECTION NINE RIGHT OF INSPECTION

Lessor or its agents or contractors shall have the right at all reasonable times during the term of this lease to enter the demised premises for the purpose of inspecting the premises and all buildings and improvements on the premises, including the right to inspect the completed repairs performed by Lessee to ensure they were completed satisfactorily.

#### SECTION TEN HOLDOVER BY LESSEES

Should Lessee remain in possession of the demised premises with the written consent of the Lessor after the initial term of this lease, a new tenancy from month to month shall be created between the Lessor and the Lessee which shall be subject to all of the terms and conditions of this lease agreement but shall be terminable on thirty days' written notice served by either Lessor or Lessee on the other party.

### SECTION ELEVEN SURRENDER OF PREMISES

At the expiration of the lease term (whether initial term or extended term by virtue of Section 10, Lessee shall quit and surrender the demised premises in as good state and condition as they were at the commencement of this lease, reasonable use and wear and damages by the elements excepted.

### SECTION TWELVE DEFAULT/TERMINATION

If any default is made in the payment of rent, or any part of the rent, at the times specified in this lease, or if any default is made in the performance of or compliance with any other term or condition of this lease, the lease, at the option of the Lessor, shall terminate and be forfeited as of the date of written notice by Lessor to Lessee is delivered to the premises, and Lessor may re-enter the premises and remove all persons and personal property from the premises.

SECTION THIRTEEN INDEMNIFICATION; INSURANCE

Lessee agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless the Lessor of and from all fines, suits, claims, demands and actions of any kind of nature, including, but not limited to, as to any personal and bodily injury (including death) of anyone or property damage as to anyone, by reason of any wrongful act, breach, violation or non-performance of any condition hereof on the part of Lessee, or Lessee's employees, agents, contractors, clients, customers, invitees, licensees, or visitors. Lessee shall keep and maintain general/public liability insurance related to the premises and Lessee's uses, operations, and business associated therewith in an amount of at least \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence. Lessee shall name Lessor as additional insured on said insurance policy and provide proof of such to Lessor upon request. Further, Lessee shall cause the helicopter evacuation entity which Lessee is associated with to keep and maintain such insurance, in such amounts as stated above, as to that entity's operations at the Enterprise Municipal Airport and to also name Lessor as additional insured on its policy(s), and Lessee shall provide proof of such upon request.

### SECTION FOURTEEN BINDING EFFECT

The covenants and conditions contained in this lease agreement shall apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the parties, and all covenants are to be construed as conditions of this lease.

### SECTION FIFTEEN TIME OF THE ESSENCE

It is specifically declared and agreed that time is of the essence of this lease agreement.

### SECTION SIXTEEN ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This lease agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this lease agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this lease agreement.

### SECTION SEVENTEEN MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT

Any modification of this lease agreement shall be binding only if evidence in a writing signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.

### SECTION EIGHTEEN DESTRUCTION OR DAMAGE BY CASUALTY

Should the premises be destroyed by fire, storm or other casualty outside the control of

Lessee during the lease, or suffer damages due to fire, storm or other casualty outside the control of Lessee in an amount exceeding \$25,000.00, this lease shall automatically terminate. Should the premises be partially damaged during the lease term such that damages are less than \$25,000.00 and the premises becomes uninhabitable, then Lessor shall promptly repair the damages and rent shall abate during the time of said repairs and this lease will continue subject to its terms. Otherwise, if such damages are less than \$25,000.00 and the premises are not uninhabitable, then Lessor shall repair the premises and rent and this lease shall continue subject to its terms.

### SECTION NINETEEN VENUE OF ANY DISPUTES

Any disputes arising from or related to this lease which necessitate court action shall be brought exclusively in the state courts of the Enterprise Division of Coffee County and the parties hereto consent to the jurisdiction and venue of said courts.
