The undersigned, legal voters of the City of Fall River, respectfully represent that common convenience and necessity require that a portion of the street or way called **Davol**Street, along its easterly layout line, extending northerly from its intersection with the north line of Turner Street, all as further shown on the plan accompanying this application entitled "Exhibit Plan to Accompany Petition for Roadway Discontinuance" by Prime Engineering dated August 4, 2017 ("Exhibit Plan") be discontinued for use of said City; and they petition that you cause the same to be done.

The request is made for the following reasons:

The referenced portion of Davol Street as it has been improved, maintained, and used for over forty years, is not consistent with the legal layout of Davol Street according to the City's records. The City's records show that the sections of Davol Street to which this application refers have been built upon and used by and in association with the abutting properties for buildings, parking areas, and ingress and egress, all as shown on the Exhibit Plan. The discontinuance of this section of Davol Street will align actual use and occupation with legal ownership, and will require no relocation of municipal utilities, all of which will remain and be subject to the usual municipal easements. This portion of Davol Street has been abandoned and unused for ordinary travel for over forty years, and convenience and necessity no longer requires that it be maintained for travel, and the undersigned petition that same be discontinued.







WHEREAS, within the Fall River School Department there is initial progress toward building an estimated two-hundred sixty million dollar (\$260,000,000) "Durfee #3 High School" on Elsbree Street and

WHEREAS, there is growing concern about the City of Fall River's taxpayers and rent payers being able to produce the revenue to meet this additional financial obligation and

WHEREAS, a major concern when the Elsbree Street location was selected for "Durfee #2 High School", currently serving the students at what is officially named "B.M.C. Durfee High School of Fall River" that it was not located in a central location, more equally accessible to students living in the Maplewood, South End and other neighborhoods that are away from the population center of Fall River and moreover, are away from the Elsbree Street location and

WHEREAS, a more central location, easily accessible to the Downtown Bus Terminal and the Alfred J. Lima Quequechan River Rail Trail, which eventually will be connected to other "rail trails" and "bicycle paths" throughout the City, would make bicycle transportation as well as SRTA bus transportation a more viable option for students to get to and from Fall River's only "public high school" both for regular school day activities as well as after school "extracurricular" activities now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fall River School Department's Building Committee considering a "Durfee #3" put a "moratorium" on its plans until a full and well-publicized public hearing and presentation is provided to the City Council and at the City Council to the entire City of Fall River so that it can be determined if Elsbree Street should continue to be the venue for Fall River's only public high school and





The chairman called the meeting to order at 5:59 p.m. and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

Agenda:

1. Communication from Mayor and proposed ordinance and order re: definition and fee structure for dog kennels

The City Clerk stated that there are nine dog kennel licenses and two of those are shelters. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Steven R. Long, it was unanimously voted to recommend the proposed ordinance be passed through first reading. On a further motion made by Councilor Steven R. Long and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to recommend the order to accept the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 140, Section 139 which section pertains to fees for service dogs and dogs owned by persons aged 70 or over be adopted.

2. Communication from Mayor requesting authorization to proceed with permitting process for eight proposed billboards

The City Administrator stated that all the land leases will need to come before the City Council for approval, but at this time the Administration is looking for preliminary approval to allow them to seek state approval.

On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it was unanimously voted to recommend the City proceed to seek approval from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

3. Proposed Ordinance – Wage Theft

James Pimental stated that there are many workers that are cheated out of wages that are due to them, every day. This involves regular hourly wages and also overtime wages. Daniel Rego stated that an employee not getting paid properly is an epidemic lately, not just in construction but also in restaurants and hotels. Overtime needs to be paid after forty hours of work per week and a thirty minute break after 6 hours of work. He also stated that many other cities and towns are working to implement an ordinance similar to this one. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau requested copies of ordinances from other cities and towns and James Pimental stated that he will provide them. Councilor Joseph D. Camara stated that he would like more time to review this matter, since the Responsible Employer Ordinance (REO) cost the City thousands of dollars in lawsuits.

Corporation Counsel stated that he would like more time to review this proposed ordinance. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau would like to receive an opinion from Corporation Counsel prior to voting on this proposed ordinance. On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was voted 4 yeas, 1 nay to table the matter with Councilor Cliff Ponte voting in the negative.

- 4. Resolution Discuss how Sober Houses are being addressed regarding licensing and zoning by other cities and towns in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

 The Chair stated that the Director of Code Enforcement and the Planning Director were unable to attend tonight's meeting due to prior commitments. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it was unanimously voted to table the matter.
- 5. Resolution Discuss parameters of bonding
 Mary Sahady stated that since she has been the Director of Financial Services she has been
 reviewing the useful life of items that are bonded for and the length of those bonds. On a
 motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it
 was unanimously voted to recommend the resolution be granted leave to withdraw.

The chair called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio and video and transmitted through any medium.

Agenda:

On a motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to take item 2 out of order.

2. Order – Disposition of former schools – Update on the former Silvia School, 138 Hartwell Street

The Chair allowed citizens to come forward and speak for 3 minutes regarding this matter. CJ Ferry of 300 Buffinton Street stated that he has a problem with how the city handles the sale of city owned property because it takes too long for the city to close on the sales. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long it was unanimously voted to table item 2.

1. Communication – City resident requesting to purchase city owned property adjacent to 270 London Street

Jose Pires of 270 London Street is requesting to purchase a vacant parcel, which abuts his property. When he purchased his house, the area was unkempt and was overrun with rats, trash and uncut grass. The neighbors complained to the Minimum Housing office and even though the property wasn't his he cleaned it up and put up a private property sign to discourage dumping. He is looking to purchase the parcel so he can put up a fence and build a garage.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira inquired whether the parcel was abandoned and Ben Mello, Administrator of Assessing, stated that the vacant parcel is an abandoned portion of Stinziano Street. Therefore, the parcel is not owned by the City. Since the parcel is between two private parcels, it is owned by each of the neighbors. Councilor Pereira would like to know the records of that parcel prior to being abandoned and considered a paper street.

Corporation Counsel Joseph I. Macy explained that Mr. Pires can purchase the other half from his neighbor and that he can look at it in a general sense but since this is not city owned property he cannot offer legal advice to Mr. Pires. Councilor Stephen R. Long sees this matter as a private issue and suggested that Mr. Pires hire an attorney to assist with this matter. The Chair expressed that he would like a standard operating procedure for residents to know the procedure for the purchase of city owned property.

On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long it was unanimously voted to table the item and send a letter to the Corporation Counsel to research whether a portion of Stinziano Street was previously abandoned and to also provide any available background for the parcel adjacent to 270 London Street, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

2. Order – Disposition of former schools – Update on the former Silvia School, 138 Hartwell Street

On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to lift the order from the table. The Corporation Counsel stated that a purchase and sale agreement was signed on June 2, 2017 and that the buyer, David Hebert, has twelve weeks to do a 21E environmental site assessment at his own expense and then decide if he wants to move forward with the purchase of the property. If Mr. Hebert doesn't want to proceed with the purchase, the City will need to place the property on the market again.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira expressed concern regarding the lengthy timeframe for the purchase and sale to be signed, considering the Council order authorizing the sale was adopted on September 13; 2016, and in comparison to the sale of the other former school buildings sold. She is concerned with this property because it is such an eye sore. Corporation Counsel explained that this is a problem site with several environmental concerns above and beyond asbestos in comparison to the other schools. On a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to table the item and place back on the agenda in 4 months.

3. Communication – City Administrator regarding former Police Station
On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R.
Long it was unanimously voted to lift the item from the table. The City Administrator explained that the City has received interest from the Historical Community with interest to renovate the building.

Committee members expressed frustration with the delay in resolving the issues with the Police Station. Councilor Stephen R. Long inquired to the drop dead deadline that had been previously set or the City would move forward with demolition. He feels that a decision needs to be made because it is the City's responsibility to deal with the dilapidated building. The City Administrator explained that the funding to repair the roof may be available through the Community Preservation Committee but was previously denied because they weren't sure that the buyer would preserve the building even though environmental challenges are present on this property.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira inquired whether a structural engineer's report existed and the City Administrator explained that just an environmental report was completed. Chair Richard Cabeceiras stated that a blank Request for Proposals (RFPs) should be issued to garner more interest. If the blank RFP does not work, then he would be satisfied with demolition. The City Administrator stated that as the Custodian of Tax Possessions she is willing to do an RFP and bring the results back to the Real Estate Committee. Lastly, Councilor Linda M.

Pereira stated that since parties have expressed interest in the property, the City should entertain the current interested parties and make a decision within the next three months. On a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was voted to table the communication for three months, with Chair Richard Cabeceiras opposed.

4. Resolution - Discuss inventory of city owned property for sale

On a motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to lift the resolution from the table. The City Administrator explained that a full list of city owned properties exist as well as a second list of properties in tax title. Fifty three percent of tax title properties are in land court, which is a close step to the foreclosure process. A number of property owners do end up coming in and paying the taxes before it moves to the foreclosure process. Most available lots are non-buildable small undersized parcels, which may be of interest only to abutters. In terms of the King Philip Mill, an RFP process was attempted and no interest was received. Therefore, the City is moving forward with an auction on June 22, 2017 with a suggested minimum bid of \$585,000. The ad was placed last week and a mandatory site visit was held today with three interest parties. A mandatory meeting will take place on June 15, 2017 with the South End Neighborhood Association to allow for input from the neighborhood. The successful bidder will need to do the pre-demolition audit prior to the closing and will be responsible for the security of the property. A zoning change will be required as the property is zoned for Industrial use only.

Councilor Stephen R. Long inquired whether the purchase and sale agreement would be subject to a variance and the City Administrator said no. It is an as is purchase but the City is going to pursue Housing Development Incentive Program (HDIP) funding and will need the City Council's assistance with creating a HDIP Zone. A deed restriction will be added with a prohibition against non-market rate housing (low income subsidized housing).

Chair Richard Cabeceiras expressed he doesn't like the auction process because it gives the City Iess control. The City Administrator explained that as the Custodian of Tax Possessions she does reserve the right to accept or reject bids.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira stated that the city should sell small strips of land to interested buyers. Councilor Stephen R. Long asked for a complete list of available properties and the City Administrator stated she will provide an updated list to the Committee of such parcels.

On a further motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Chair Richard Cabeceiras, it was unanimously voted to table the resolution.

On yet a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to adjourn at 7:17 p.m.

The chair called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

Agenda:

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau it was unanimously voted to take item 3 out of order, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

3. Resolution – Discuss Shannon Community Safety Initiative and Safe and Successful Youth Initiative grants with Youth Services Coordinator Christian McCloskey, the City's Youth Services Coordinator, provided an overview of the Shannon Community Safety Initiative as well as the Safe and Successful Youth Initiative state grants that he applies for and manages. This is year 12 of the Shannon Grant, which is a gang violence prevention grant, and the City has received \$8.3 million in funding since its inception. Last year the City received \$384,285.07 and Mr. McCloskey expects the same amount this year.

The Safe and Successful Youth Initiative grant focuses on working with young men ages 17-24 who are either victims or perpetrators of violence. The main focus of that grant is education, job training, and health services. Mr. McCloskey is currently working on the renewal grant application and will be submitting it by October 20. This year the City received \$225,000, a 25% reduction from the previous year. Mr. McCloskey partners with many local non-profit and government organizations to enact these grants. For additional information, residents can visit fryouthviolenceprevention.org

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the matter, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. 1. Resolution – Condition of former Abbey Grill located at 100 Rock St.

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the resolution from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The City Administrator read a memo from the Building Inspector to the property owner, Andrew Lombardi. The memo outlines that an agreement was reached with the property owner to pull a permit to repair the shroud within two weeks. After the work is completed it will be inspected by Mr. Bogle from Geisser Engineering and the Building Inspector. If the repairs are satisfactory, one lane will be opened on Rock Street and one on Franklin Street. The other half of the streets will remain blocked off until permanent repairs are completed on the steeple. The start date of the repairs to the steeple will be April 30, 2018. The Chair asked the City Administrator to confirm the repair date of the steeple with the Building Inspector.

Because of the repairs, the traffic pattern was changed. Meters from Franklin Street to Bank Street on the East side were bagged and Purchase Street was opened. The crosswalks refreshed last week as a result of the change in the traffic pattern. In terms of the streetscapes work to be done on Purchase Street, the City Administrator explained that all the utility work must be completed first and she will notify the Chair regarding the start date of the roadwork to determine if there is any overlap. On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the resolution, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

2. Resolution – Discuss ways to increase Police Department staffing levels
On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam LaliberteLebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift item 2 from the table, with Councilor Richard
Cabeceiras absent and not voting. Lieutenant Paul Bernier explained the Mayor in
conjunction with the Fall River Police Department held a press conference last week
regarding this matter. The City Administrator outlined that the Department activated the
mobile command center, which replicates the substations that were previously in place.
The command center will be moved to different neighborhoods depending on the need.
Four uniformed officers and four special operations officers on a regular shift have been
working with the Major Crimes Division to staff the command center.

The City Administrator stated there were issues with the effectiveness of ShotSpotter. As a result, the Chief along with the Mayor renegotiated the contract at no cost to the City and will be working on addressing the sensitivity to sounds and problems with the software. The Chief is also working on acquiring cameras for the neighborhoods as well. In terms of statistics, since August 28, 2017, Lieutenant Bernier outlined that five illegal handguns, 77 grams of crack, 95 grams of cocaine, 201 bags of heroin, 29 grams of heroin and \$8,600 from illegal narcotic sales were confiscated.

In terms of the staffing levels, the goal is to reach 232 by the spring of 2018. Nine officers have graduated from the academy, five officers will be attending in October and seven officers will be starting in January. After the academy, a training seasoned officer partners up with the new officer for a number of weeks in a sector car. As part of the training process, the training officer wears plain clothing and the new officer in uniform so that the attention is on the new officer. The City Administrator explained that the City is being more proactive and instead of waiting for the retirements to be completed to hire new officers, the Department is sending new recruits into the academy sooner but it still takes six months and a year for an officer to be fully trained. Also, in terms of Sergeant promotions, in order to make space for two additional trainees, the Department promoted two into Sergeants. There was a third promotion after learning a retirement was forthcoming which made room for a third new officer.

In terms of the Police Union contract, the Mayor himself has met with Officer Michael Perreira, President of the Fall River Police Association, and an open dialogue is currently being worked on.

4. Communication – City resident regarding intersection of Meridian and Watkins Streets

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the communication from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The Director of Community Maintenance, John Perry, said the project was completed by a contractor that donated his time and cut the shrubs down to three feet. Mr. Perry hasn't heard from the residents and is under the impression the issue has been resolved. On a further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to grant the communication leave to withdraw, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

- Communication Abandoned property located at 213 Weetamoe St. On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the communication from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The City Administrator read a memo from the Building Inspector that stated that a Building Permit has been applied for to repair the wall and that stamped plans have been received from an engineer. The engineer will be required to submit weekly reports and that as soon as the Construction Control Affidavit is received from the engineer a Building Permit will be issued. She further explained that the building cannot be demolished. The owner has come forward and will be rehabilitating the property and wall instead. Michael P. Dion, Executive Director of the Community Development Agency (CDA), explained that despite a grant application process with the Attorney General's Office, the Attorney General did not allow the funding to be used for demolition because the funds cannot be used for buildings not city owned. The agency attempted to contact the holder of the mortgage JP Morgan but through the work of an attorney learned that the foreclosure process was not done properly and the property still belonged to the property owner Jose F. Pina of Angola. The property owner has since approached CDA for funding and has requested a building permit to make the needed repairs. In terms of notifying the neighbors with an update, Mr. Dion offered to send a letter, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. On a further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the communication, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

This Council having on the 13th day of November, 2017 received a petition signed by Robert Karam and others that an easterly portion of the street or public way (**Davol Street**) along its easterly layout line, extending northerly from the north line of Turner Street, be discontinued as a public way, therefore, the same was considered and on the 28th day of November, 2017 it was:

ORDERED: That a meeting of the City Council be held at One Government Center on the 28th day of November, 2017 at 5:45 P.M. to hear all parties interested and wishing to be heard on the subject of discontinuing a portion of the easterly side of the said street, and that the City Clerk notify the several owners of land over and besides which it is proposed to discontinue the layout of the said street or public way, of the said meeting, and the intention of this Council to discontinue the same.

The requisite notice having been given, this Council met at the time and place named, and an opportunity was given to all parties interested and wishing to be heard.

This council did thereupon and does hereby adjudicate and decree that common convenience and necessity require that the portion of said street or public way called **Davol Street**, as described in the Discontinuance Description, be discontinued as a street or public way.

The description of the street layout and the plan annexed are hereby made part of this report.

Said street or public way passes beside or over land supposed to belong, now or formerly to: BCBBK LLC, and 713 DAVOL STREET, LLC.

This council considers and decides that no damage is sustained in any of the aforementioned owners' property or by any other persons by the discontinuance of that portion of Davol Street.



Dear City Council:

I am disapproving and vetoing the attached order for the following reasons:

It violates the separation of powers between the executive and legislative branches and further violates Fall River Ordinance Sec. 2-527.

The City Council has no power to "order' any administration to take any particular action. Thus, the "order" crosses the boundary between executive and legislative.

This "order" is also prohibited as it violates Sec. 2-527 which provides that the corporation counsel "shall institute any suit or proceeding in behalf of the city which he shall deem the interest of the city requires" (emphasis supplied) While court action may eventually become necessary it is not advisable at this time and is not in the interest of the city.

The "new" charter prohibits this action. Section 2-3 PROHIBITIONS states in 2-3(b) Interference with Administration - Except for employees appointed in accordance with section 2-8 (council staff), the city council or any member of the city council, shall not give orders or directions to any employee of the city, either publicly or privately. The "order" violates said section.

It is important to note that this veto does not preclude the city from bringing an appropriate action when, and if, such becomes necessary.
