President Shawn E. Cadime called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with a moment of silence followed by a salute to the flag and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

A motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira to waive the rules to allow members of the School Committee to speak carried, with Councilor Stephen R. Long opposed. Melissa K. Panchley and Dr. Edward Costar came forward and spoke regarding item 3. Councilor Steven A. Camara requested that the Council President allow the School Committee members to speak for 3 minutes and so they did. The School Committee members delivered remarks in regards to the resolution and expressed that the Elsbree Street location is the best location, that a lot of work has been done over the years to get to this point, and that a comment period has been made widely available to the public throughout the process. Councilor Steven A. Camara expressed that consideration needs to be given to the location of the new building and that not enough due diligence has been made in regards to the new high school as well as the location of the Durfee bells.

PRIORITY MATTERS

1b. Mayor and Chief of Police Employment Agreement for Albert F. Dupere (tabled 10-24-17)

On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to lift the item from the table. Councilor Linda M. Pereira expressed concern with regards to the hiring process for a new Chief. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau explained that the Administration offered a meeting with Councilors and the Chief and that many of the questions would have been answered then. A further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras, failed to carry 4 yeas, 5 nays to waive the rules and Chief Albert F. Dupere to the table, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, Cliff Ponte and Council President Shawn E. Cadime voting in the affirmative. Councilor Cliff Ponte stated he would like to invite the Chief to the table to afford the public the opportunity to address the public with his future plans for the department.

Councilors debated the merits of whether inviting the Chief to the table will be productive or not. A further motion was made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long to move the order of business, but later withdrawn by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell. A further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Steven A. Camara to move the question carried unanimously. On a yet a further motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was voted 9 yeas to adopt the order.

2. Board of Election Commissions – Official results of Municipal Election held on Nov. 7, 2017

On a motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras, it was unanimously voted to accept and place on file.

3. School Department Building Committee consider public hearing to discuss alternatives to Elsbree Street location for Durfee High School

A motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira to grant the resolution leave to withdraw failed to carry 3 yeas, 6 nays, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara, Raymond A. Mitchell, and Linda M. Pereira voting in the affirmative. A further motion was made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira to adopt the resolution but later withdrawn by Councilor Steven A. Camara. A further motion was made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau to amend the resolution by replacing it with an amended version of the resolution, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

A further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara to strike "at a regularly scheduled November election" from the amended resolution and replace with "a Special Election prior to May 1, 2018" received no second and the amendment to the proposed amended resolution was not considered. A further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara to strike "a regularly scheduled November election" from the amended resolution and replace it with "at an election to be held within the state's guidelines" received no second and the further amendment to the proposed amended resolution was not considered. A lengthy discussion was held in regards to the matter. Councilor Steven A. Camara, the sponsor of the resolution, expressed that more public input is needed as it pertains to the building of a new Durfee High School. He would also like to build the new high school in a centralized location and that the Building Committee be more representative of the city's population. He also suggested that the name of the new Durfee be changed to the Fall River High School. Councilors spoke of their support of the project with some highlighting reservations. Councilor Richard Cabeceiras expressed the need for not having a misrepresentation of the facts while ensuring the project can be paid for and that the public will vote yes for the debt exclusion question. Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell highlighted

that it is time to vote because the Building Committee has worked on this matter for several years. Councilor Joseph D. Camara, Co-Chair of the Durfee Building Committee explained that whether the new high school is close to the bike path or not will not have as much of an impact as Councilor Steven A. Camara is expressing because it can't be used year round due to the weather. He also stated that the location was not chosen because it is close to where Councilors and Building Committee members live but because it's the best location and if we don't vote now, fixing the current high school will cost the taxpayers more money. Councilors Cliff Ponte and Council President Shawn E. Cadime stated that more needs to be done with the affordability of the project including how it will be paid so that the taxpayers aren't as burdened. A further motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira to move the question failed to carry, 3 yeas, 6 nays, with Councilors Stephen R. Long, Raymond A. Mitchell and Linda M. Pereira voting in the affirmative. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau stated she cannot support this resolution because the cost for the delay is not worth it but will ask the Building Committee to push out the vote as long as they can while meeting the Massachusetts School Building Authority's deadlines. Councilor Stephen R. Long stated he cannot support the resolution because the vetting process has been completed and it is time to move forward with a vote and educate the public about their needed support. In closing, Councilor Steven A. Camara stated that the Durfee Bells Preservation Society is not in favor of moving the bells. Furthermore, the Durfee Alumni Association has not weighed in on this and if they are consulted he will reluctantly support the Elsbree Street location. A further motion made by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell to reconsider the failed motion to grant the resolution leave to withdraw carried, 8 yeas, 1 nay, with Councilor Steven A. Camara voting in the negative. Councilor Steven A. Camara subsequently withdrew his initial motion to adopt the original proposed resolution, made a motion to move the order of business, and the Council President moved the order of business.

4. HUD conduct audit of funds that were appropriated to the Fall River Office of Economic Development

Councilor Stephen R. Long stated that he would like an audit of the funding that the Fall River Office of Economic Development (FROED) receives through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). He wants to ensure that the funds are being used appropriately and that the Fall River funds are staying in Fall River. Councilor Cliff Ponte stated that if HUD conducts an audit, it will be for the Community Development Agency not just one organization that has not received their CDBG funding. He further stated that FROED has been hurt politically enough and no longer has a role with just the City of Fall River and can go to other communities since they didn't receive the CDBG funding from Fall River. Councilor Steven A. Camara made a point of parliamentary inquiry to determine if a motion was on the floor and since there wasn't one, he moved to grant the resolution leave to withdraw, which was seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and the motion carried 5 yeas, 4 nays, to grant the resolution leave to withdraw, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara, Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, Stephen R. Long, and Cliff Ponte voting in the negative.

On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell, it was unanimously voted to take item 11 out of order.

Street Discontinuance

11. A portion of Davol Street, along its easterly layout line, extending northerly from its intersection with the north line of Turner Street

Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Stephen R. Long and Raymond A. Mitchell abstained and exited the Council Chamber. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by

Councilor Cliff Ponte, it was unanimously voted to accept and place on file, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Stephen R. Long and Raymond A. Mitchell absent and not voting.

On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to take item 20 out of order, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Stephen R. Long and Raymond A. Mitchell absent and not voting.

20. Final Report – A portion of Davol Street, along its easterly layout line, extending northerly from its intersection with the north line of Turner Street

On a motion made by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it was unanimously voted to amend the final report by striking "This council did thereupon and does hereby adjudicate and decree that common convenience and necessity require that the portion of said street or public way called Davol Street, as described in the Discontinuance Description, be discontinued as a street or public way." and insert "This Council did thereupon and does hereby adjudicate and decree that common convenience and necessity require that such a portion of Davol Street as shown on the Application Exhibit Plan be and the same is hereby discontinued as a street or public way and authorizes the City to deed the portion thereof shown on the Application Exhibit Plan to the abutting property owner, BCBBK, LLC, subject however to a utility easement in favor of the City of Fall River." On a further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it was voted 6 yeas to adopt, as amended, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Stephen R. Long and Raymond A. Mitchell absent and not voting.

A recess was taken at 8:32 p.m. The City Council came back to order at 8:39 p.m. All Councilors were present.

Place lien on Fall River Housing Authority properties for any unpaid fees or taxes Councilor Stephen R. Long, the sponsor of the resolution, stated that the Fall River Housing Authority issued a Request for Proposals for properties located in Corky Row to be sold to a private developer. He was never contacted by the Housing Authority in regards to their new plan even after a housing study of the area advising of a different course of action was recommended. Griffin Park was recently rehabilitated and it wouldn't be right to change the housing strategy. Many issues have existed with these properties and no fines issued because they were Housing Authority properties. He would like to see liens in order to stop the closing of the sale of these properties. Councilor Stephen R. Long also stated that he learned today that 150 project based section 108 units will be added and this is contrary to public opinion and the housing policy outlined by the City's Administration. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau agreed with Councilor Long and explained that this will impact three buildings, two with six units and one with three units for a total of 15 units to be rehabbed. A motion was made by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell to refer to the Committee on Human Services, Housing, Youth and Elder Affairs. Councilor Richard Cabeceiras asked if the Housing Authority was a non-profit organization and the Council President explained that they are a governmental organization. A further motion made by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell to strike "or taxes" carried unanimously. On a further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau it was unanimously voted to insert "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council Committee on Human Services, Housing, Youth and Elder Affairs convene with City Administration and Fall River Housing Authority representatives to discuss this issue." On yet a further motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Steven A. Camara, it was unanimously voted to adopt the resolution, as amended.

6. Sidewalks with handicapped accessibility and crosswalks be installed at the SouthCoast Marketplace

Councilor Stephen R. Long, the sponsor of the resolution, stated that due to the construction of the new SouthCoast Marketplace sidewalks and crosswalks are needed in this newly revitalized area. On a motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to adopt the resolution. On a further motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to adopt and refer the resolution to the City Council Committee on Public Safety. Approved, November 30, 2017, Jasiel F. Correia II, Mayor

- 7. Committee on Public Works and Transportation convene to discuss plans for an alternate access road in the area of the Alfred J. Lima Quequechan River Rail Trail

 A motion was made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira to adopt the resolution. Councilors Pam Laliberte-Lebeau and Steven A. Camara stated that this matter has already been discussed by the Council and that the resolution is redundant. Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell, the sponsor of the resolution, explained that although meetings were held not all parties were present, including the property owner of where the easement is located, and would like to afford him an opportunity to come forward so that the easement can be removed. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau expressed that since the Mayor's veto of the order requesting that the Administration instruct Corporation Counsel to petition the Court to nullify the approved easement that crosses the Alfred J. Lima Quequechan River Rail Trail will be on the next meeting's agenda for discussion, it would be best to table this resolution and moved to table the resolution, which was seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira. The motion to table carried with Councilor Joseph D. Camara abstaining.
- 8. Mayor and City Council appoint committee to ensure all aspects of new Charter are followed

A motion to adopt was made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras. Councilor Raymond A. Michell, the sponsor of the resolution, explained that inconsistencies need to be addressed. Council President Cadime explained that the Councilor's resolution had a different intended purpose. As a result, Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell made a motion to strike "aspects of the new charter be adhered to." and insert "aspects of the new charter do not conflict with any state and federal laws as well as city ordinances." but received no second. On a further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Joseph D. Camara, it was voted 8 yeas, 1 nay to grant the resolution leave to withdraw, with Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell voting in the negative.

9. Committee on Real Estate discuss submission of proposals to businesses interested in purchasing large amounts of water

Councilor Richard Cabeceiras, the sponsor of the resolution, stated that all options should be explored to save taxpayers money. A motion was made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras to adopt the resolution. A further motion made by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras and seconded by Councilor Steven A. Camara to amend the resolution by inserting "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Administration discusses plans to create a department that bottles water and distributes it for sale coast to coast and worldwide." carried, 7 yeas, 2 nays, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Raymond A. Mitchell voting in the negative. Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell moved the question and Councilor Richard Cabeceiras seconded the motion. The motion to adopt being on the floor, the

motion to adopt the resolution as amended carried 7 yeas, 2 nays, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Raymond A. Mitchell voting in the negative.

City Council file home rule petition to rename the Veterans' Memorial Bridge the Captain Thomas Hudner Jr. and Ensign Jesse L. Brown Bridge or the Hudner-Brown Bridge A motion was made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras to adopt the resolution. Councilor Steven A. Camara stated that the Veterans Memorial Bridge has been named for all veterans, does not just affect Fall River and as such it is appropriate that it stay that way. Furthermore, a field in the Highlands has been already named after him. Councilor Richard Cabeceiras, the sponsor of the resolution, stated that he is a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient and one of the greatest unknown figures of the civil rights movement. Councilor Stephen R. Long stated that he appreciates the honor and would like to amend the resolution to also name the bridge the Ensign Jesse L. Brown Bridge or the Hudner-Brown Bridge and moved to amend the resolution, which was seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell, even though such language was already included in the original resolution. Councilor Linda M. Pereira expressed concern with taking any action on the resolution until the Town of Somerset is consulted and moved to table the resolution until such input is received. Councilor Steven A. Camara seconded tabling the resolution and the motion to table carried 8 yeas, 1 nay, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras voting in the negative.

10a. Committee on Finance convene to discuss plan for paying for Fall River's portion of the new Durfee High School's debt service

A motion was made by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras to table the resolution. A further motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long to table the resolution carried, 7 yeas, 2 nays, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras and Council President Shawn E. Cadime voting in the negative.

10b. Committee on Finance convene to discuss building management plans Councilor Richard Cabeceiras, the sponsor of the resolution, stated that he would like a discussion in the Committee on Finance to get a handle on the management of municipal buildings before the end of the year. Councilor Steven A. Camara stated that the respective departments already handle these matters, that enough items that don't belong there are referred to the Committee on Finance, and that a new Council is to be sworn in next year. As such, it would be best to table the resolution. On a motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell, it was voted 5 yeas, 4 nays to table the resolution, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, Cliff Ponte and Council President Shawn E. Cadime voting in the negative.

TABLED MATTERS:

1c. Transfers and appropriations (Tabled 11-14-17)

On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was voted to lift the two transfers and appropriations from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras voting in the negative. The transfers were in the amount of \$188,000 to be appropriated to the EMS Capital Outlay Account from the EMS Stabilization Fund and in the amount of \$300,000 to be appropriated to the EMS Capital Outlay Account from the EMS Stabilization Fund. A motion was made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by

Councilor Joseph D. Camara to adopt the transfers and appropriations. A further motion was made by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau and seconded by Councilor Richard Cabeceiras to separate the two orders but later withdrawn. Councilor Richard Cabeceiras read into the record a communication received from a member of AFSCME 1202 raising concerns in regards to the \$188,000 being used for the purchase of a rescue that will be used to transfer an ambulance as a BLS transfer truck when a written proposal has not been presented by the Administration and the union. The union's Executive Board, however, does not oppose the use of the \$188,000 for the purchase of additional needed equipment and vehicles for the Department. A further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell to amend the \$188,000 by striking \$38,000 intended for the purchase of an above ground tank failed to carry, 4 yeas, 5 nays, with Councilors Raymond A. Mitchell, Linda M. Pereira, Cliff Ponte and Council President Shawn E. Cadime voting in the affirmative. On yet a further motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, the motion to adopt the orders as presented carried, 6 yeas, 3 nays, with Councilors Richard Cabeceiras, Cliff Ponte and Council President Shawn E. Cadime voting in the negative.

A recess was taken at 9:40 p.m. and the Council came back to order at 9:43 p.m.

On a motion made by Councilor Raymond A. Mitchell and seconded by Councilor Steven A. Camara, it was unanimously voted to adjourn at 9:43 p.m.

Whereas, a more central location, easily accessible to the Downtown Bus Terminal and the Alfred J. Lima/Quequechan River Rail Trail, which eventually will be connected to other "rail trails" and "bicycle path" throughout the City, would make bicycle transportation as well as SRTA bus transportation a more viable option for students to get to and from Fall River's only "public high school" both for regular school day activities as well as after school "extra-curricular" activities now, therefore,

Be it resolved, that the Fall River School Department reconstitute its Building Committee with Fall River residents coming from all sections of Fall River so that it can be recommend if Elsbree Street should continue to be the venue for Fall River's only public high school and

Be it further resolved, that the 2018 Fall River Government determine that any vote scheduled for the bond issue to fund a "Durfee #3 High School" be held at a regularly scheduled November election, to assure maximum voter participation in the decision relating to this more than a quarter billion dollar public project.

Dear Councilors:

At its November 21, 2017 meeting, the Fall River Historical Commission voted to accept a gift from Mr. Monte C. Ferris, Sr. through his Durfee Trust LLP, for the building located at 80-84 North Main Street. This incredible gift also comes with two (2) additional properties, both parking lots.

The building is historically known as the First National Bank Building, built in 1887 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and located within the Downtown Fall River Historic District. The building was designed by architect George Albert Clough who was also the architect for the old B.M.C. Durfee High School on Rock Street. Mr. Clough was also Boston's first City architect who designed various well known buildings including the Suffolk County Courthouse in Boston, and numerous other buildings around New England.

The terms of the gift as outlined in the attached proposal have also been accepted by the Historical Commission.

Per M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 53A %, the City Council is required to accept this gift with the mayor's approval for the Historical Commission.

The Fall River Historical Commission established under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 40, Section 8D, is authorized to receive "...gifts, contributions and bequests of funds..." for historical preservation purposes.

By providing this most generous gift, Mr. Ferris hopes that his legacy will further the Historical Commission's historical preservation efforts. Such a gift will promote the preservation, enhancement, and sustainable use of our city's diverse historic resources and provide a balance between historical preservation and the revitalization of our neighborhoods.

PROPOSAL

Monte C. Ferris, Sr. through his Durfee Trust LLP, having an address of 75 G.A.R. Highway; Swansea, Massachusetts, gift multiple properties to the Fall River Historical Commission, (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission"). The properties are as follows:

- 1. The property located at 80-84 North Main Street; Fall River, MA 02720, plot number N-10-47.
- 2. The Parking Lot property located on parcel, plot number N-10-42, consisting of 12 parking spaces.
- 3. The Parking Lot property located on parcel, plot number N-10-27, consisting of 21 parking spaces.

As a condition of this "gift", Mr. Monte C. Ferris Sr., will establish a Trust for the purpose of Historic Preservation. Any interest of funds generated from this gift shall remain as part of this gift. There shall be in no instances where funds are to go into the city's general fund. This gift will be subject to the terms of the trust.

At a minimum, on a yearly basis, a grant shall be created from in the name of Monte C. Ferris, Sr., for any preservation purpose. Grants accepted shall include a deed restriction on properties grants are being used to preserve.

Per M.G.L. Chapter 41, Section 45, Monte Ferris will create a board of commissioners of trust funds, consisting of three (3) persons who shall have the management of all trust funds given or bequeathed for the benefit of the Fall River Historical Commission.

Per M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 53A ½, a City Council, with the mayor's approval shall accept this gift on behalf of the Fall River Historical Commission.

The Fall River Historical Commission established under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 40, Section 8D, is authorized to receive "...gifts, contributions and bequests of funds..." for historical preservation purposes.

The Fall River Historical Commission will act as Trustees, will hold and dispose of all property now or later transferred by any person to them as Trustees.

The property at 80-84 North Main Street must be encumbered by a preservation deed.

A minimum of 1,000 sq. ft of space shall be dedicated to the "Preservation Society of Fall River" in perpetuity or until the Preservation Society wishes to vacate such premises. The Preservation Society shall not need to pay any utility fees for heating, plumbing or electrical. There shall be 1 parking space made available to them at no cost.

The Preservation Society may remodel and renovate such space at their own cost.

The Preservation Society will share a common work area with the Fall River Historical Commission. Such areas will be used for research purposes and to further the purpose of preservation in Fall River. This space will also include a Conference Room and an area to be used for public meetings consisting of a minimum of 50 occupants and able to be used for video recordings and presentations.

This space will be known as the Monte C. Ferris, Sr. Preservation Center.

When not in use by the Commission or the Preservation Society, this space may be used by the City for meetings, gatherings or any other special occasion as agreed by the Historical Commission.

The Commission will approval all uses and Tenants within the building, including Tenant fit outs and leasing agreements.

At the lobby of the building a bronze plaque will commemorate the "gift" from Mr. Monte C. Ferris, Sr. to the Fall River Historical Commission to further preservation in the City of Fall River.

The Commission shall prepare a budget and that such budget shall include salaries to employees and building maintenance/renovations etc. All monies as a result of tenant fees that are in access of such budget shall be placed in a trust (to be created by Monte C. Ferris, Sr.) and shall be used to further the Commissions Mission as stated below.

The Commission as one of its highest priorities is to assist the city in the restoration of the Bank Street Armory. The Commission agrees to allow use of its parking lots for special events. Any revenue generated through the use of these parking lots for purposes other than the use of the Commission, Preservation Society or the tenants shall be deposited into a Historical Commission account and be used as needed for the Commission's needs.

The Commission shall work with the local High Schools to create as much as possible a 1:40 scale model of the City of Fall River. The model to be created from basswood and be similar to the Boston Planning & Development Agency's model located on the 9th floor of Boston's City Hall. Model to be used by the Commission in its preservation efforts. The model shall represent the city in its current development and be able to be viewed by the public as allowed per the Commission requirements.

The Commission shall apply for grants, CPA funds and all other forms of funds to allow for the repair, construction, additions or maintenance of these properties. A full listing of these endeavors are listed below in the section called: "Fall River Historical Commission Mission"

The City of Fall River by accepting this gift for the Fall River Historical Commission shall assist in maintaining the building as if it were any city property.

All costs associated with providing power, water/sewer, heating, and accessibility through its elevators shall be provided by the city.

In the event the City of Fall River chooses to sell the property, it must sell it back to the Trust that is being created by Monte C. Ferris, Sr. for a total of one dollar.

The Commission may create a separate Preservation Project fund for all other Historical Commission Business as it chooses. The fund shall be called "The Fall River Historical Commission Preservation Project Fund".

The following guidelines are as follows:

- 1-2. The agreement provides that the commission creates the above named fund with the treasurer as trustee "for the purposes hereinbefore set forth".
 - 3. The agreement authorizes the commission to delegate to any other person, including a non-member, its authority to sign any written instrument or its authority to take any action required by the commission.
- 4. The agreement provides that donations may be made to the fund by the commission or other persons and provides that such donations and "all income therefrom" shall constitute the fund.
- 5. The agreement authorizes the treasurer to make payments only upon and in accordance with the written direction of the commission.
- 6. The agreement authorizes the treasurer to invest funds "as permitted by law".
- 7. The agreement authorizes amendments to the agreement to be made by the commission alone, except that no amendment can permit all or any part of the fund to be administered or distributed other than for the purposes specified in the agreement. The treasurer must also sign amendments which increase the treasurer's duties or obligations.
- 8. The agreement limits the treasurer's liability to negligent and willful misconduct.
- 9. The agreement requires that it be executed in duplicate with each to be deemed the original.
- 10. In the absence of a trust, no agreements made by the Commission with the treasurer may alter or operate inconsistently with such statutory provisions.
- 11. The Fall River Historical Commission will decide which gifts, donation will be provided for this fund. MGL Chapter 40, Section 8D, grants no greater authority to the Historical Commission and clearly provides no specific authority to set up a special fund.

The following is the Mission of the Fall River Historical Commission.

Fall River Historical Commission Mission

- (1) To promote and increase knowledge and understanding of the history of Fall River from the earliest time to the present, including the archaeological, Indian, British, French, Colonial, Underground Railroad and American eras, by adopting and executing general plans, methods and policies for permanently preserving and marking objects, sites, structures and ruins;
- (2) To promote and assist in the publicizing of the historic resources of the city by preparing and furnishing information to public mass media and to governmental agencies charged with publicity and to coordinate any of its objectives, efforts or functions with any agency or agencies of the federal government, of the State of Massachusetts and of other states or local governments having objectives similar or related to those of the commission;
- (3) To accept for renovation, maintenance, restoration, preservation or management and operation any building or site within the City or any agency or subdivision thereof or by the National Trust for Historic Preservation or by natural or corporate persons, public or private, upon such terms and conditions as to the commission shall be deemed in the best interest of the City in conformity with the purposes of this division;
- (4) To acquire, historic structures of paramount or exceptional importance, such as those Fall River landmarks eligible for nomination to or recorded in the National Register of Historic Places; provided, that at least two-thirds of the members of the commission shall vote to acquire such structures by the exercise of this measure;
- (5) To charge admissions at the various buildings and sites under the control of the commission throughout the city and to sell booklets, pamphlets and souvenirs at said locations and to retain and use the proceeds of said sales and admissions for the furtherance of the purposes of the commission as defined by this division;
- (6) To adopt a seal for the commission and to use the same on its brochures, stationery and other official publications and upon its historic site markers;
- (7) a. To acquire, receive and take title to, by purchase, gift, lease, devise or otherwise, and to own, to hold, keep and develop, and to sell, transfer, convey, lease, and assign to any person or otherwise dispose of property of every kind and character, whether real, personal or mixed, whether tangible or intangible, whether in trust or otherwise, together with any and every interest therein, in furtherance of the lawful objectives of the commission:

- b. To administer such property or trusts, whenever any such property is received or held to be used for the benefit of the historical heritage of the City of Fall River, for preservation of historic sites, buildings and objects, or for other lawful objectives of the commission, as it deems in the best interest of historical preservation or in furtherance of the objective for which the property is held or the donation or gift is made; and to convert such property or any portion thereof into securities or other forms of property and use the proceeds therefrom, including any interest on investments, as it deems will best promote the objectives of the commission;
- c. To accept as trustee, beneficiary, or both, any interest in such property, together with any proceeds from its investment, for the benefit of historical preservation or other purposes of the commission, upon such conditions as may be acceptable to the donor and the commission. No such undertaking entered into by the commission or its agent or agents shall bind the city to pay any city moneys to anyone; provided, however, that nothing herein shall prevent the commission from undertaking payments out of the proceeds from such trust funds as a condition of the acceptance of the donation. All trust funds administered pursuant to this act may be required by the commission to pay the expenses of administering the same. Such gifts shall be deductible from the Massachusetts state income tax by the donor or donors;
- d. To convey title or any interest in real estate by deed or other instrument executed by a majority of the commissioners or by agent or agents authorized by a majority vote of the commission; and to convey property other than real estate by agent or agents authorized by a majority vote of commissioners present and voting.
- (8) To maintain an office in a location in the city to be selected by the commission for the use of the executive director, the employees and the commission and to acquire the necessary furniture and equipment therefor;
- (9) To prepare, create, purchase and distribute pamphlets and brochures describing the various historic buildings and sites under the jurisdiction of the City of Fall River or any of its agencies;
- (10) To make and publish a survey of the buildings, ruins and sites of historic, architectural or archaeological significance within the City of Fall River and to make available such survey to individuals, institutions and governmental bodies desiring copies of same;
- (11) To determine from such survey the buildings, ruins and sites listed therein which are considered worthy of permanent preservation, to certify same as being worthy and to publish said list;
- (12) To establish criteria for the certification, selection and acquisition of historic properties for city ownership and for state aid to local historic site projects;


- (13) To nominate selected landmarks with historic, architectural and archaeological significance to the National Register of Historic Places using priorities established by the commission;
- (14) To establish and maintain a Fall River historic preservation depository into which may be deposited antiques, relics, artifacts, mementos, paintings and other objects contributed to or acquired by the city or the commission. The commission shall have the authority to restore these objects and to use them for the furnishing of its own historic buildings and other selected landmarks in Fall River;
- (15) To rent or lease any of its acquisitions to public or private agencies;
- (16) To publish an informational newsletter which shall periodically report on and promote local, regional and state historic preservation activities;
- (17) To produce and publish technical ("how to") manuals on historic preservation;
- (18) To publish and present citations and distinguished service awards to selected private and public organizations and individuals for outstanding achievements in preserving the heritage of Fall River,
- (19) To purchase, produce, sell and distribute historic souvenir items;
- (20) To improve, restore, preserve, renovate, maintain, exhibit, repair, rebuild, recreate and reconstruct its acquisitions, and the commission shall have jurisdiction over the same and the exhibits located thereon;
- (21) To purchase or otherwise acquire and to erect and maintain "historic markers" on such buildings, roads, trails, routes and sites as it shall designate and to cooperate with and assist local, regional and state historical groups in selecting and erecting such markers; and
- (22) To accept the gift of money and real and personal property from any and all public and private sources. Such gifts shall be deductible from the Massachusetts state income tax by the donor.

Finally, by accepting this proposal, the Mayor of the City of Fall River and the City Council agree to accept this gift at one of its next 2017 City Council meetings.







The chair called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio and video and transmitted through any medium.

Agenda:

On a motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to take item 2 out of order.

2. Order – Disposition of former schools – Update on the former Silvia School, 138 Hartwell Street

The Chair allowed citizens to come forward and speak for 3 minutes regarding this matter. CJ Ferry of 300 Buffinton Street stated that he has a problem with how the city handles the sale of city owned property because it takes too long for the city to close on the sales. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long it was unanimously voted to table item 2.

1. Communication – City resident requesting to purchase city owned property adjacent to 270 London Street

Jose Pires of 270 London Street is requesting to purchase a vacant parcel, which abuts his property. When he purchased his house, the area was unkempt and was overrun with rats, trash and uncut grass. The neighbors complained to the Minimum Housing office and even though the property wasn't his he cleaned it up and put up a private property sign to discourage dumping. He is looking to purchase the parcel so he can put up a fence and build a garage.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira inquired whether the parcel was abandoned and Ben Mello, Administrator of Assessing, stated that the vacant parcel is an abandoned portion of Stinziano Street. Therefore, the parcel is not owned by the City. Since the parcel is between two private parcels, it is owned by each of the neighbors. Councilor Pereira would like to know the records of that parcel prior to being abandoned and considered a paper street.

Corporation Counsel Joseph I. Macy explained that Mr. Pires can purchase the other half from his neighbor and that he can look at it in a general sense but since this is not city owned property he cannot offer legal advice to Mr. Pires. Councilor Stephen R. Long sees this matter as a private issue and suggested that Mr. Pires hire an attorney to assist with this matter. The Chair expressed that he would like a standard operating procedure for residents to know the procedure for the purchase of city owned property.

On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long it was unanimously voted to table the item and send a letter to the Corporation Counsel to research whether a portion of Stinziano Street was previously abandoned and to also provide any available background for the parcel adjacent to 270 London Street, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

2. Order – Disposition of former schools – Update on the former Silvia School, 138 Hartwell Street

On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to lift the order from the table. The Corporation Counsel stated that a purchase and sale agreement was signed on June 2, 2017 and that the buyer, David Hebert, has twelve weeks to do a 21E environmental site assessment at his own expense and then decide if he wants to move forward with the purchase of the property. If Mr. Hebert doesn't want to proceed with the purchase, the City will need to place the property on the market again.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira expressed concern regarding the lengthy timeframe for the purchase and sale to be signed, considering the Council order authorizing the sale was adopted on September 13; 2016, and in comparison to the sale of the other former school buildings sold. She is concerned with this property because it is such an eye sore. Corporation Counsel explained that this is a problem site with several environmental concerns above and beyond asbestos in comparison to the other schools. On a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to table the item and place back on the agenda in 4 months.

3. Communication – City Administrator regarding former Police Station
On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R.
Long it was unanimously voted to lift the item from the table. The City Administrator explained that the City has received interest from the Historical Community with interest to renovate the building.

Committee members expressed frustration with the delay in resolving the issues with the Police Station. Councilor Stephen R. Long inquired to the drop dead deadline that had been previously set or the City would move forward with demolition. He feels that a decision needs to be made because it is the City's responsibility to deal with the dilapidated building. The City Administrator explained that the funding to repair the roof may be available through the Community Preservation Committee but was previously denied because they weren't sure that the buyer would preserve the building even though environmental challenges are present on this property.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira inquired whether a structural engineer's report existed and the City Administrator explained that just an environmental report was completed. Chair Richard Cabeceiras stated that a blank Request for Proposals (RFPs) should be issued to garner more interest. If the blank RFP does not work, then he would be satisfied with demolition. The City Administrator stated that as the Custodian of Tax Possessions she is willing to do an RFP and bring the results back to the Real Estate Committee. Lastly, Councilor Linda M.

Pereira stated that since parties have expressed interest in the property, the City should entertain the current interested parties and make a decision within the next three months. On a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was voted to table the communication for three months, with Chair Richard Cabeceiras opposed.

4. Resolution - Discuss inventory of city owned property for sale On a motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to lift the resolution from the table. The City Administrator explained that a full list of city owned properties exist as well as a second list of properties in tax title. Fifty three percent of tax title properties are in land court, which is a close step to the foreclosure process. A number of property owners do end up coming in and paying the taxes before it moves to the foreclosure process. Most available lots are non-buildable small undersized parcels, which may be of interest only to abutters. In terms of the King Philip Mill, an RFP process was attempted and no interest was received. Therefore, the City is moving forward with an auction on June 22, 2017 with a suggested minimum bid of \$585,000. The ad was placed last week and a mandatory site visit was held today with three interest parties. A mandatory meeting will take place on June 15, 2017 with the South End Neighborhood Association to allow for input from the neighborhood. The successful bidder will need to do the pre-demolition audit prior to the closing and will be responsible for the security of the property. A zoning change will be required as the property is zoned for Industrial use only.

Councilor Stephen R. Long inquired whether the purchase and sale agreement would be subject to a variance and the City Administrator said no. It is an as is purchase but the City is going to pursue Housing Development Incentive Program (HDIP) funding and will need the City Council's assistance with creating a HDIP Zone. A deed restriction will be added with a prohibition against non-market rate housing (low income subsidized housing).

Chair Richard Cabeceiras expressed he doesn't like the auction process because it gives the City less control. The City Administrator explained that as the Custodian of Tax Possessions she does reserve the right to accept or reject bids.

Councilor Linda M. Pereira stated that the city should sell small strips of land to interested buyers. Councilor Stephen R. Long asked for a complete list of available properties and the City Administrator stated she will provide an updated list to the Committee of such parcels.

On a further motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Chair Richard Cabeceiras, it was unanimously voted to table the resolution.

On yet a further motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, it was unanimously voted to adjourn at 7:17 p.m.

The chair called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

Agenda:

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau it was unanimously voted to take item 3 out of order, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

3. Resolution – Discuss Shannon Community Safety Initiative and Safe and Successful Youth Initiative grants with Youth Services Coordinator Christian McCloskey, the City's Youth Services Coordinator, provided an overview of the Shannon Community Safety Initiative as well as the Safe and Successful Youth Initiative state grants that he applies for and manages. This is year 12 of the Shannon Grant, which is a gang violence prevention grant, and the City has received \$8.3 million in funding since its inception. Last year the City received \$384,285.07 and Mr. McCloskey expects the same amount this year.

The Safe and Successful Youth Initiative grant focuses on working with young men ages 17-24 who are either victims or perpetrators of violence. The main focus of that grant is education, job training, and health services. Mr. McCloskey is currently working on the renewal grant application and will be submitting it by October 20. This year the City received \$225,000, a 25% reduction from the previous year. Mr. McCloskey partners with many local non-profit and government organizations to enact these grants. For additional information, residents can visit fryouthviolenceprevention.org

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the matter, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. 1. Resolution – Condition of former Abbey Grill located at 100 Rock St.
On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the resolution from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The City Administrator read a memo from the Building Inspector to the property owner, Andrew Lombardi. The memo outlines that an agreement was reached with the property owner to pull a permit to repair the shroud within two weeks. After the work is completed it will be inspected by Mr. Bogle from Geisser Engineering and the Building Inspector. If the repairs are satisfactory, one lane will be opened on Rock Street and one on Franklin Street. The other half of the streets will remain blocked off until permanent repairs are completed on the steeple. The start date of the repairs to the steeple will be April 30, 2018. The Chair asked the City Administrator to confirm the repair date of the steeple with the Building Inspector.

Because of the repairs, the traffic pattern was changed. Meters from Franklin Street to Bank Street on the East side were bagged and Purchase Street was opened. The crosswalks refreshed last week as a result of the change in the traffic pattern. In terms of the streetscapes work to be done on Purchase Street, the City Administrator explained that all the utility work must be completed first and she will notify the Chair regarding the start date of the roadwork to determine if there is any overlap. On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the resolution, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

2. Resolution – Discuss ways to increase Police Department staffing levels
On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam LaliberteLebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift item 2 from the table, with Councilor Richard
Cabeceiras absent and not voting. Lieutenant Paul Bernier explained the Mayor in
conjunction with the Fall River Police Department held a press conference last week
regarding this matter. The City Administrator outlined that the Department activated the
mobile command center, which replicates the substations that were previously in place.
The command center will be moved to different neighborhoods depending on the need.
Four uniformed officers and four special operations officers on a regular shift have been
working with the Major Crimes Division to staff the command center.

The City Administrator stated there were issues with the effectiveness of ShotSpotter. As a result, the Chief along with the Mayor renegotiated the contract at no cost to the City and will be working on addressing the sensitivity to sounds and problems with the software. The Chief is also working on acquiring cameras for the neighborhoods as well. In terms of statistics, since August 28, 2017, Lieutenant Bernier outlined that five illegal handguns, 77 grams of crack, 95 grams of cocaine, 201 bags of heroin, 29 grams of heroin and \$8,600 from illegal narcotic sales were confiscated.

In terms of the staffing levels, the goal is to reach 232 by the spring of 2018. Nine officers have graduated from the academy, five officers will be attending in October and seven officers will be starting in January. After the academy, a training seasoned officer partners up with the new officer for a number of weeks in a sector car. As part of the training process, the training officer wears plain clothing and the new officer in uniform so that the attention is on the new officer. The City Administrator explained that the City is being more proactive and instead of waiting for the retirements to be completed to hire new officers, the Department is sending new recruits into the academy sooner but it still takes six months and a year for an officer to be fully trained. Also, in terms of Sergeant promotions, in order to make space for two additional trainees, the Department promoted two into Sergeants. There was a third promotion after learning a retirement was forthcoming which made room for a third new officer.

In terms of the Police Union contract, the Mayor himself has met with Officer Michael Perreira, President of the Fall River Police Association, and an open dialogue is currently being worked on.

4. Communication – City resident regarding intersection of Meridian and Watkins Streets

On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the communication from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The Director of Community Maintenance, John Perry, said the project was completed by a contractor that donated his time and cut the shrubs down to three feet. Mr. Perry hasn't heard from the residents and is under the impression the issue has been resolved. On a further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to grant the communication leave to withdraw, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.

- Communication Abandoned property located at 213 Weetamoe.St. On a motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to lift the communication from the table, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting. The City Administrator read a memo from the Building Inspector that stated that a Building Permit has been applied for to repair the wall and that stamped plans have been received from an engineer. The engineer will be required to submit weekly reports and that as soon as the Construction Control Affidavit is received from the engineer a Building Permit will be issued. She further explained that the building cannot be demolished. The owner has come forward and will be rehabilitating the property and wall instead. Michael P. Dion, Executive Director of the Community Development Agency (CDA), explained that despite a grant application process with the Attorney General's Office, the Attorney General did not allow the funding to be used for demolition because the funds cannot be used for buildings not city owned. The agency attempted to contact the holder of the mortgage JP Morgan but through the work of an attorney learned that the foreclosure process was not done properly and the property still belonged to the property owner Jose F. Pina of Angola. The property owner has since approached CDA for funding and has requested a building permit to make the needed repairs. In terms of notifying the neighbors with an update, Mr. Dion offered to send a letter, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. On a further motion made by Councilor Cliff Ponte and seconded by Chair Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to table the communication, with Councilor Richard Cabeceiras absent and not voting.
- 6. Discussion re: issues and concerns related to public safety throughout the city *No citizens came forward.*



RE: Council Order November 14, 2017

Dear City Council:

I am disapproving and vetoing the attached order for the following reasons:

It violates the separation of powers between the executive and legislative branches and further violates Fall River Ordinance Sec. 2-527.

The City Council has no power to "order' any administration to take any particular action. Thus, the "order" crosses the boundary between executive and legislative.

This "order" is also prohibited as it violates Sec. 2-527 which provides that the corporation counsel "shall institute any suit or proceeding in behalf of the city which he shall deem the interest of the city requires" (emphasis supplied) While court action may eventually become necessary it is not advisable at this time and is not in the interest of the city.

The "new" charter prohibits this action. Section 2-3 PROHIBITIONS states in 2-3(b) Interference with Administration - Except for employees appointed in accordance with section 2-8 (council staff), the city council or any member of the city council, shall not give orders or directions to any employee of the city, either publicly or privately. The "order" violates said section.

It is important to note that this veto does not preclude the city from bringing an appropriate action when, and if, such becomes necessary.
