  - Order scheduling a Special Municipal Election a.

A motion was made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby and seconded by Councilor Stephen R. Long, to adopt the order, as amended. The amendment was made at the meeting of January 9, 2018, which changed the name of the school from Durfee High School to BMC Durfee High School of Fall River on the order. On a further motion made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to waive the rules to allow the Administration to answer questions. The City Administrator gave a brief overview of the process of the Special Election and placing the question on the ballot. A copy of the ballot question is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. A further motion was made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier, to move forward with a new Durfee High School building project to be bonded and funded within the City's tax levy. Councilor Stephen R. Long stated that a debt exclusion to fund the new BMC Durfee High School of Fall River is better because this will eventually be paid off and the charges will cease. If the City were to pay for this by an override of proposition 2 1/2 that increase would be forever. Councilor Bradford L. Kilby requested that his motion be voted on first. The Council President stated that the second motion made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime would be voted on first. Councilor Leo O. Pelletier then withdrew his second to the motion that was made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime. Councilor Steven A. Camara asked what the anticipated costs to residents would be. The Director of Financial Services stated that the average cost would be approximately \$100.00 to \$130.00 per year additional on an average tax bill. Councilor Steven A. Camara asked why this question was not placed on the November ballot. The Superintendent of Schools stated that the final figures were not available at that time. On a roll call vote taken on the motion to adopt the order, as amended; it was voted 7 yeas, 2 nays with Councilors Shawn E. Cadime and Steven A. Camara voting in the negative.
