REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL

President Cliff Ponte called the meeting to order at 7:41 p.m. with a moment of silence followed by a salute to the flag and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

PRIORITY MATTERS

1. Mayor – Requests for confirmation of reappointment to the following:
 - a. Debbie Pacheco – Commission on Disability
 - b. Cathy Ann Viveiros – Commission on Disability

On a motion made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to confirm the reappointment of item 1a.

On a motion made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier it was voted to confirm the reappointment of item 1b. Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau stated that she was seeking clarification as to having a city employee sit on the Disability Commission which is a requirement of their board, while the City Charter states that that is not allowed.

On a motion made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier, it was unanimously voted to waive the rules and have City Administrator Cathy Ann Viveiros answer questions on behalf of the Administration. Mrs. Viveiros stated that the Charter has a provision in which the Mayor has the ability to issue a waiver to allow a city employee to sit on a board once the appointment is approved by the City Council.

On a motion made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby to table the item pending the waiver, there was no second made, the motion failed to carry.

Councilor Shawn E. Cadime requested to see the provision in the Charter to which Mrs. Viveiros is referencing. A recess was taken at 7:46 p.m. to obtain the City Charter and reconvened at 7:51 p.m. Council President Cliff Ponte read aloud the section 9-12 of the City Charter, Limitations of Office Holding. Councilor Shawn E. Cadime stated that he interprets the provision as stating that no one employee can hold two jobs in the city for example a police officer cannot also be employed

as a custodian. He further stated that he felt that an appointment to a board was not, in his opinion a form of employment. Councilor Bradford L. Kilby asked if a petition has been filed, which the City Clerk stated that the only item filed was the reappointment letter.

On a motion made by Councilor Steven A. Camara and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier, to accept the letter of appointment by the Mayor.

Councilor Steven A. Camara stated that he feels that it is the Councils position to either confirm or not confirm the appointment, then the Mayor can submit a waiver based on the Councils decision.

Councilor Bradford L. Kilby responded by stating his interpretation is that a waiver should have been filled with the appointment letter, although he will support the reappointment he feels that the waiver needs to be filed first.

On a motion made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby and seconded by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime it was voted 4 yeas, 5 nays to table the item, the motion failed to carry with Councilors Shawn E.

Cadime, Bradford L. Kilby, Pam Laliberte-Lebeau and Council President Ponte voting in the negative.

Councilor Joseph D. Camara stated that if the city ordinance states that a city employee is required to sit on a board, it is the job of the City Council to uphold both city ordinances as well as the Charter and to follow the procedure to vote whether or not to approve the appointment and then have a waiver issued based on the vote.

On a roll call vote on the first motion to confirm the appointment Cathy Ann Viveiros to the Commission on Disability, it was voted 8 yeas, 1 nay, with Councilor Shawn E. Cadime voting in the negative.

Council President Cliff Ponte stated that he received a communication from a resident at 115 Anawan Street requesting to be removed from the waterfront renewal plan. Councilor Joseph D. Camara stated that he feels there may be many residents that are effected by the renewal project that may be unaware of the details of the project. Councilor Steven A. Camara went on further to say that if the item is referred to committee that he would recommend all property owners effected by this project be invited to attend the meeting for more information. The City Clerk informed Councilor Steven A. Camara that the property owners were notified to attend a previous meeting held by the Planning Board On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby, it was unanimously voted to refer both items a and b to the Committee on Economic Development and Tourism.

8. Planning Board recommendation for the acceptance of streets as follows:

On a motion made by Councilor Stephen R. Long and seconded by Councilor Pam Laliberte-Lebeau, it was unanimously voted to waive the rules to allow the City Planner Bill Roth to answer questions. Mr. Roth explained that the portion of Kennedy Street is an accepted way but is unimproved. The neighbors are requesting to have it discontinued due to mischievous activity and illegal dumping of trash. Mr. Roth stated that it is the recommendation of the Planning Board to grant the discontinuance. The City would still continue to have ownership to the right of way for utility needs and the remaining area incorporated into the abutting properties. Councilor Stephen R. Long stated that he was under the impression that the City still owns the street but as a paper street and wanted to consult with Corporation Counsel. On a motion made by Councilor Joseph D. Camara and seconded by Councilor Stephen A. Camara it was unanimously voted to table the matter.

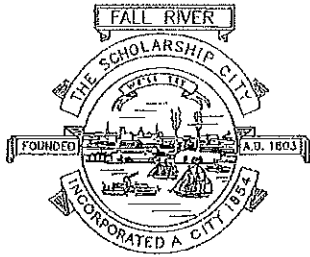

These are two distinct projects that will work in conjunction. The Public Safety Communication Network is the infrastructure (Backbone is required) that the Video Surveillance Network project will on top of.

Microwave Technology is a line-of-sight wireless communication technology that uses high frequency beams of radio waves to provide high speed wireless connections that can send and receive voice, video, and data information.

Microwave links are widely used for point-to-point communications because their small wavelength allows conveniently-sized antennas to direct them in narrow beams, which can be pointed directly at the receiving antenna. This allows nearby microwave equipment to use the same frequencies without interfering with each other, as lower frequency radio waves do. Another advantage is that the high frequency of microwaves gives the microwave band a very large information-carrying capacity; the microwave band has a bandwidth 30 times that of all the rest of the radio spectrum below it.

Microwave radio transmission is commonly used in point-to-point communication systems on the surface of the Earth, in satellite communications, and in deep space radio communications. Other parts of the microwave radio band are used for radars, radio navigation systems, sensor systems, and radio astronomy.

The higher part of the radio electromagnetic spectrum with frequencies are above 30 GHz and below 100 GHz, are called "millimeter waves" because their wavelengths are conveniently measured in millimeters, and their wavelengths range from 10 mm down to 3.0 mm. Radio waves in this band are usually strongly attenuated by the Earthly atmosphere and particles contained in it, especially during wet weather. Also, in wide band of frequencies around 60 GHz, the radio waves are strongly attenuated by molecular oxygen in the atmosphere. The electronic technologies needed in the millimeter wave band are also much more complex and harder to manufacture than those of the microwave band, hence cost of Millimeter Wave Radios are generally higher.

This public safety infrastructure upgrade will end the reliance on the publicly switched network for public safety radio traffic. The public telephone physical network is aged and becoming unreliable. During severe weather the publicly switched network that supports Fall River's public safety radio system frequently fails at various sites. When a receive site is down, it causes communication difficulties for public safety personnel patrolling or responding to public assistance calls.

The advent of a City of Fall River Public Safety microwave network will improve the Motorola life safety radio system by improving audio quality and site up time. The main transmitter location at Cardinal Mederios will be linked by dual trunked microwave paths. This will maintain communications to the system in the event of a link failure. There will also be a dual redundant link from Mederios to Barressi Heights. This site is important to police channel 2 operations.

The proposed microwave network will consist of 18GHz licensed microwave radio links. These links will be capable of 100Mb of data bandwidth Full duplex. A vlan will be configured for the radio traffic. The radio traffic will have the highest priority on the network.

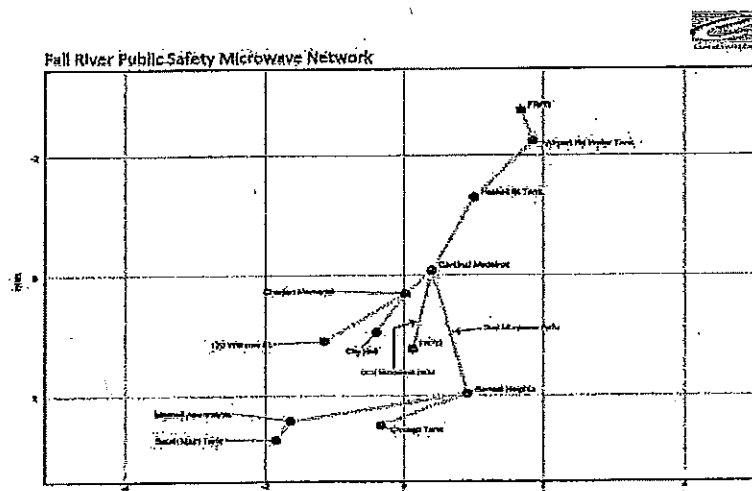
The microwave network will utilize the following locations. The south Main St. water tank, Mitchell Apartments, Chicago St. water tank, Barresi heights, 170 Williams St. City Hall, Police HQ, Charlton Memorial, Cardinal Medeiros, Haskell St. water tank. Airport Road water tank, Fire HQ. The locations indicated allow for clear unobstructed line of sight for the proper operation of the network.

At the Police & Fire communications sites a multiplexer will be installed along with the microwave network equipment. The multiplexer will connect to the Motorola radio equipment and the existing telephone circuits will be removed. At police HQ a core multiplexer will be installed and connected to the Police & Fire radio systems comparator.

The equipment in the 18GHz microwave network is covered by manufacturers warranty. The RAD multiplexers are covered for 5 years. The HP switches have a life time warranty. The Dragon Wave microwave radios are covered for one year.

Optional extended coverage up to 5 years is available for an additional cost per microwave link. This proposal does not include Dragon Wave extended warranty coverage. A more economical solution is to have a spare link. This proposal includes a spare link. The spare MW link will cover every radio in the 18GHz microwave network.

Performance to South Main Tank

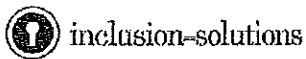


Performance to Mitchell Apartments



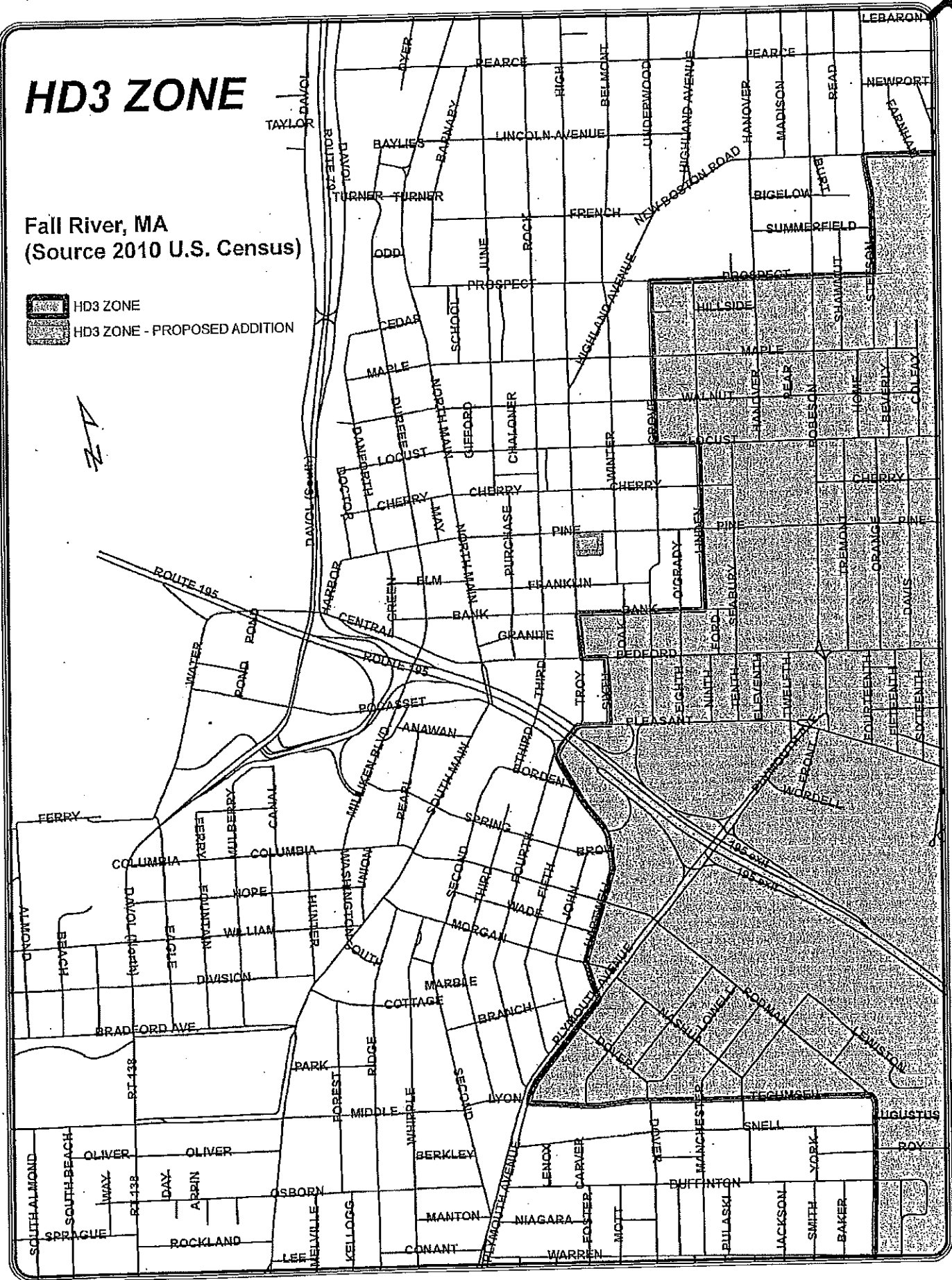

Improved water and storm water facilities are also included in this Scope of Work. All are designed to better serve the community.

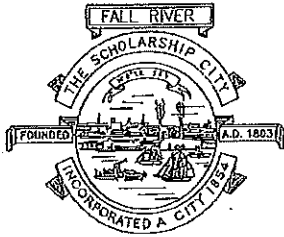



**AGREEMENT FOR DAM SERVICES AND RAW WATER PURCHASES
BETWEEN
THE CITY OF FALL RIVER, MASSACHUSETTS
AND
THE STONE BRIDGE FIRE DISTRICT IN RHODE ISLAND**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of _____ 2018, by and between the City of Fall River, a Municipal Corporation within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in the County of Bristol, acting through its Watuppa Water Board hereinafter called the "City", party of the first part, and the Stone Bridge Fire District, a Rhode Island Corporation created by Chapter 2320 of the Acts of 1936, a Special Act of the Rhode Island General Assembly, hereinafter called the "District", as party of the second part;

WHEREAS, the City owns and operates a dam on Stafford Pond in order to control the levels and outflow of said Pond, and

WHEREAS, the District intends to continue to remove raw water from Stafford Pond into the District's treatment facility for use of treated water in their water distribution system, and

WHEREAS, there is a "Compromise of Claims and Settlement Agreement" that is scheduled to expire on April 30, 2025, and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and mutual benefits to be derived by the parties hereto, an Agreement is prepared in the following form:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1.1 "Shall" is mandatory; "may" is permissive.
- 1.1.2 "Raw Water Charges" shall mean a charge levied on the District by the City for the cost of water withdrawn from Stafford Pond.
- 1.1.3 "District Flow" means the amount of average daily flow of water flowing into the District from the Stafford Pond.
- 1.1.4 "GPD" means gallons per day.
- 1.1.5 "MGD" means million gallons per day.

SECTION 2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY

Section 2.1

The City shall own and operate the Stafford Pond dam and is solely responsible for its future operation and maintenance. The City will comply with Rhode Island General Laws, Chapters 46-18 et seq. and 46-19 et seq. governing the operation of a dam in Rhode Island. The City has no responsibility to provide water to the watershed and pond to maintain levels once below the set and agreed upon control level. Said control level shall be determined by mutual agreement between the City and District as soon as practicable after completion of the Stafford Pond dam rehabilitation project. (See section 6.3.) Low water levels due to weather conditions (drought) and/or withdrawal volumes by the District are not the responsibility of the City.

Section 2.2

The City agrees to work cooperatively with the District related to any infrastructure (i.e. water mains or service connections; streams, culverts and/or dam related structures.) that may cross Town boundaries both in land agreements (i.e. easements) and access for maintenance.

SECTION 3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT

Section 3.1

The District shall own and maintain their existing water treatment and distribution facilities within the District. The District shall be responsible stewards of the watershed and shall maintain adequate levels in the pond during drought events as reasonably as possible.

Section 3.2

The District shall make monthly payments to the City in accordance with the terms in Section 6.

Section 3.3

The District agrees to work cooperatively with the City related to any infrastructure (i.e. water mains or service connections; streams, culverts and/or dam related structures.) that may cross Town boundaries both in land agreements (i.e. easements) and access for maintenance.

Section 3.4

The District shall be responsible for any permits or issues related to water withdrawals from Stafford Pond including but not limited to safe yield of the Pond.

SECTION 4. TERM

Section 4.1

The term of this Agreement shall continue from the date of execution to June 30, 2043. At the end of the term, the agreement shall continue from year to year thereafter. Provided, however, that either party may terminate the same on December 31 of any year by giving written notice on or before June 30 of such year.

Section 4.2

This agreement shall replace the Compromise of Claims and Settlement Agreement dated September 26, 1990 and any prior agreements.

SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTATION

Section 5.1

The City agrees to allow the District continued raw water withdrawals from Stafford Pond for the District's use. The raw water withdrawal capacity limit shall be 2.5 million gallons per day. Charges for raw water use are delineated in Section 6.

This capacity limit can be modified by mutual agreement and addenda to the agreement.

Section 5.2

The City and the District agree to share the capital cost of the rehabilitation of the Stafford Pond dam. Charges are delineated in Section 6. As stated in Section 2.1, the City is solely responsible the future maintenance costs of the dam.

SECTION 6. PAYMENTS

Section 6.1

In the first full month after execution of this agreement between the City and the District, the fee for raw water withdrawal from Stafford Pond shall increase to \$2,500 per month for the remainder of the calendar year. The fee shall then increase by 10% each calendar year through 2022.

From 2023 through 2043 the fee shall increase or decrease each year equal to the per cent increase or decrease of the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U); U.S. city average, by detailed expenditure category of water and sewer and trash collection services. This

shall be applied starting January 1, 2023, utilizing the prior year unadjusted percent change of January 2021 to January 2022; and repeated each ensuing year adjusting the dates accordingly by one year. If such CPI-U becomes unavailable the parties shall meet to determine a reasonable alternative. Monthly payments from the District to the City shall be made on the 10th of each month.

This fixed monthly sum covers any raw water withdrawals up to the maximum of 2.5 MGD.

Section 6.2

The District shall submit a monthly report of the volume withdrawals from Stafford Pond including the measured pond level.

Section 6.3

The District shall make monthly payments to the City for the amortized cost of the agreed share of the rehabilitation cost for Stafford Pond dam at fixed monthly sum of \$730 due and payable on the 10th of each month. Said fee is determined by the total dam rehabilitation cost to the City with half committed to the District. Any grant funds shall be directly applied to the total cost and only the actual direct pay costs shall be included in the final calculation. This direct pay cost can be increased or decreased depending on the final construction cost and any applicable grants. The District share shall be amortized by the City at 0% interest over 20 years.

Estimated Cost and Calculation:

\$350,000	Expected Total Cost.
<u>2</u>	Divide by two for 50% share of City and District.
\$175,000	Cost for Each Party.
<u>20</u>	Divide by 20 Years
\$ 8,750	District cost per year.
<u>12</u>	Divide by 12 months.
\$ 730	District cost per month (rounded).

Final cost calculation shall be determined at the completion of the dam rehabilitation project expected to occur in 2018-2019. Monthly payments shall start on January 10, 2020 or at the substantial completion of the dam rehabilitation project if it occurs later than January 10, 2020.

SECTION 7.

This agreement replaces the prior "Compromise of Claims and Settlement Agreement" dated September 26, 1990.

This agreement repeats and accepts the language in the prior agreement that "no representations are given hereby that all persons who may have riparian rights in Stafford Pond or the waters flowing therefrom consent to this Compromise".

SECTION 8. RECORDS AND ACCESS

Section 8.1

The City and District shall maintain complete and accurate books and records concerning all matters relative to this Agreement. Such records shall be open for inspection and making copies or extracts thereof to accountants and other duly authorized representatives of the other party.

Section 8.2

Both the City and the District agree to make available to representatives and agents of the other for purposes of inspection all facilities and equipment related to the water system of each in relation to this agreement.

SECTION 9. SEPARATE AGREEMENTS

Any separate agreements relating to water supply between the District and adjacent municipalities which would result in additional flow from the Stafford Pond must be reviewed and approved by the City. In any event, the District shall in the aggregate be restricted to the approved water flow, and any increase must be formally contracted for between the District and City.

SECTION 10. NOTIFICATION OF CHANGE

The District agrees to notify the City in writing as far in advance as possible of anticipated or planned significant increases or decreases in the quantity of the water utilized from Stafford Pond.

SECTION 11. TERMINATION

Section 11.1

For any material breach of this Agreement, continued for three months after notice thereof in writing by the other party, either party may terminate this Agreement. Upon receipt of said

notice, both parties will enter into discussion within thirty (30) days to assure proper termination of the Agreement. If any time during the term of this Agreement either party determines that the other party has breached the terms of this Agreement by failing to perform its obligations in accordance with all of the terms and provisions contained in this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall notify the party in breach in writing stating therein the nature of the alleged breach and directing the party in breach to cure such breach within ten (10) days. If the party in breach fails to cure said breach within ten (10) days, the non-breaching party may, at its election at any time after the expiration of said ten (10) days, terminate this Agreement by giving written notice thereof to the party in breach specifying the effective date of the termination, said date to be no less than ninety (90) days from the date of notice of breach. Upon the date specified in the notice of termination, this Agreement shall terminate. Such termination shall not prejudice or waive any rights or action which the non-breaching party may have against the party in breach up to the date of such termination.

In the event that there is an issue of non-compliance of applicable regulations by either the City or the District, both parties agree that as long as the offending party is making reasonable efforts to return to or achieve (in the case of new regulations) compliance that it shall not be considered a breach of the agreement.

Section 11.2

There shall be no circumstances under which the City will be obligated to return to the District any portion of the District's capital investment.

SECTION 12. QUALITY

The City assumes no responsibility, obligation or liability to the District with regard to water quality from Stafford Pond.

SECTION 13. HOLD HARMLESS

The City shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District, and its agents, Board Members, and employees, from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, losses and expenses including without limitation including attorney's fees and costs of any kind arising out of or resulting from, directly or indirectly: the City's ownership of, operation of, or maintenance of the Dam, or the existence of the Dam, including but not limited to floods, emergencies, damage to the

Dam, personal injury to anyone injured at the Dam, and potential property damage at, around or downstream of the Dam.

The District shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City, and its agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, losses and expenses including without limitation including attorney's fees and costs of any kind arising out of or resulting from, directly or indirectly: any property or personal damages caused as a result of the use of the water flowing from the Dam by any persons in the District or by the District.

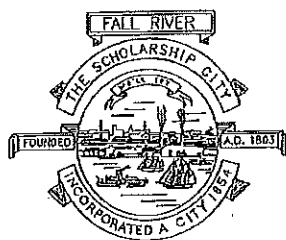

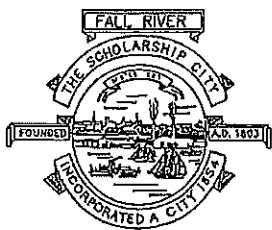

1. Describe the project.

The Bristol County Second District Courthouse (Courthouse) is listed in the Fall River Register of Significant Structures published by the Fall River Historical Commission. Since purchasing the building in 2015, RE-CREATION has completed approximately \$500,000 in repairs to the original portion of the facility, including lead paint removal, painting, rebuilding walls, and purchasing a sprinkler system (partially funded by Fall River CPA in 2016) as well as critical repairs to the roof, windows, and masonry, which have secured the building's envelope from weather damage. However, this portion of the building remains vacant pending installation of the fire suppression sprinkler system, which is underway, and installation of a new heating system. RE-CREATION requests \$70,000 from the CPA to purchase and install a new steam boiler to replace the existing steam boiler, which has failed due to age. The proposed project is part of an ongoing renovation and rehabilitation plan (total estimated cost - \$1,035,000) for the facility. The newer side of the building is being used for programs and activities as part of the City's first Community & Wellness Center, which provides vital services, such as HiSET classes, employment opportunities, health services, and life-skill sessions. While we have made significant progress in renovating the original portion, work remains to help us realize our goal to have the Greater Fall River RE-CREATION Community & Wellness Center in full operation by 2019. These improvements, when complete, will protect this historically significant structure and prepare it to house organizations and programs that serve low-income adults and youth.

2. Goals:

a. What are the goals of the proposed project?

RE-CREATION requests funding from the CPA to purchase and install a boiler system prior to the start of the winter season to ensure that we will be able to regulate and maintain the building's temperature to prevent any damage and to render the original, historic portion of the building fully operational.

b. Who will benefit and why?

The mission of RE-CREATION is to provide programs and services for residents of all ages to thrive, with a focus on socially and economically disadvantaged and at-risk youth. RE-CREATION provides free or low-cost, year-round recreational, educational, and developmental programs for residents of the Greater Fall River Area. The Agency serves approximately 1,500 people annually through direct services and approximately 50,000 through special events. More than 86% of the youth served come from households of low or extremely low income, 26% are minorities and 60% are from households headed by single females. Those served span the racial, ethnic, linguistic, socio-economic and age spectrum. Since purchasing the new facility at 45 Rock Street the Agency has experienced an increase in program participation and, during the past year, participation has increased significantly due to an influx of people from Puerto Rico following the devastating hurricane in 2017. In addition, the facility serves as the City's first Community & Wellness Center, which houses other social service agencies and programs, i.e., Family Service Association's Family Resource Center and Long-Term Services and Supports Program (both State-funded) and YouthBuild. In summary, the Community & Wellness Center serves as a "one stop" resource center offering recreational, educational and wellness services and programs for residents of all ages in the Greater Fall River community many who would not otherwise have access to these services.

3. Criteria:

How does the project fulfill the General and Specific Criteria of the Community Preservation Committee Guidelines? (Refer to the specifications in the Guidelines)

- The proposed work will protect this historically significant structure from further deterioration, complete rehabilitation, and preserve it for full operation.
- The Courthouse will house organizations and programs that serve low-income adults and youth.
- The proposed project is feasible and cost effective. Preservation, rehabilitation and restoration treatments for this project will focus on repairs to the interior to ensure preservation of the building's historic integrity.
- RE-CREATION has received funding from local sources and foundations to complete renovations and upgrades needed at the facility and continues to conduct fundraising; additional tenants will be recruited, which will provide a sustainable revenue stream.

a. How does the community benefit from this project?

The Agency provides year-round recreational, educational, and developmental programs that help combat delinquent and risky behaviors by keeping youth busy and off the streets with after-school, evening, and weekend programs. RE-CREATION continues to serve as the hub of the City's Youth Outreach Program that provides youth violence and gang activity prevention and intervention services, such as counseling, education, employment, and pro-social activities, to at-risk youth. The goal is to provide a safe alternative for the youth to make positive changes in their lives.

RE-CREATION is home to the City's first Community & Wellness Center. The Agency and its Community & Wellness Partners provide programs and activities that strengthen individuals, families, and communities. In addition to these year-round programs, which include tennis, baseball, basketball, gymnastics, cheerleading, crafts, dance, music, computer classes, and theatrical/musical performances, RE-CREATION sponsors the USDA's Summer Food Service Program. This past summer, approximately 49,000 lunches were served to disadvantaged children who might not otherwise have had a nutritious lunch.

RE-CREATION is also the lead partner in the community-wide health initiative, the Greater Fall River Fitness Challenge, which began in 2008. Participants in this annual event take part in programs designed to help them learn to eat well, lose weight, get fit and prevent illness at fitness centers throughout the city for little or no cost. When renovations are completed, and the Community & Wellness Center is fully operational, these and other critical programs and services will serve the City's vulnerable population.

The Bristol County Second District Court was built on the site of the Horatio Gunn House (later known as Exchange Hotel) on the corner of Rock & Bedford Sts. It was started June 24, 1908 and completed in 1910. The district court system as it is known today was established in 1874. Prior to this date municipal and police courts were used. The first police court was held in the Hathaway Block on Market St. In 1858 the city erected a new building on the southwest corner of Purchase & Granite Sts. which served as a fire station, police station & courthouse. This structure was demolished in 1916 when the new police station at Bedford & High Sts. was built.

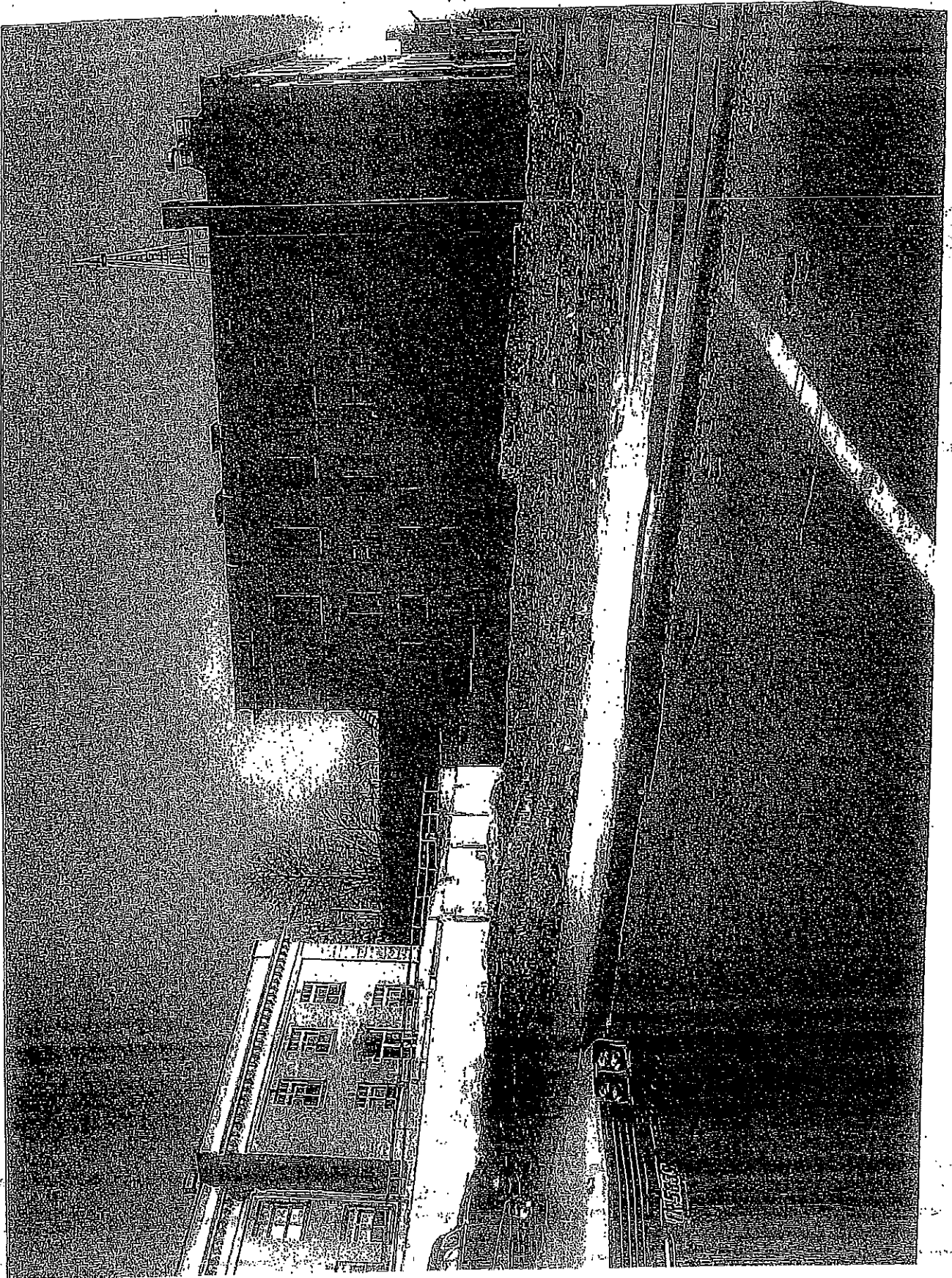
Second Floor Back Stairway
Showing Damage on North Wall

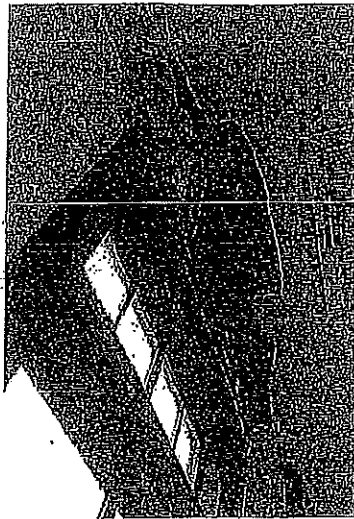

SIMPLE CEREMONIES MARK OPENING OF NEW COURT HOUSE.

The new District Court House on Rock Street was formally opened this morning with simple ceremony, prayer being offered by Justice John J. McDonough in the presence of a large number of members of the bar and spectators. Everyone in the court room stood with bowed head during the invocation. Following the offering up of the prayer the usual session of court was held, Justice John J. McDonough, Special Justices Benjamin K. Lovatt and Benjamin Cook, Jr., presiding. Justices Lovatt and Cook sat on either side of Judge McDonough.

Long before the appointed hour of opening, a large crowd gathered at the public entrance on the north side of the building. Shortly before 9, the police patrol was backed up opposite the Granite Street entrance of the Central Station and the prisoners directed aboard. The patrol went over Bank Street and down Rock to the court. There were two baskets of flowers on the judge's bench from friends of Judge McDonough, while there was also a bouquet on the desk of Clerk Leonard. The spectators' gallery was filled in a very few minutes, and it was found necessary to being in long settees to accommodate all that desired to be present.

In openings proceedings, Judge McDonough said:

"It is proper that the first session of court in this new court house should be characterized by the public invocation of divine aid and to that end, for obvious reasons, I shall offer prayer myself.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, Amen."

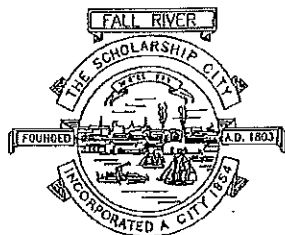

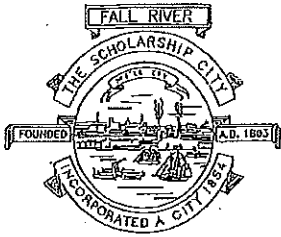



Date: September 20, 2018

On December 31, 2018 the new state law regarding the sale and use of tobacco and vaping products will go into effect. There are several changes to the existing state law, outlined below.

There have also been several changes to the City of Fall River's Tobacco grant from the MA Dept. of Public Health for the coming years.

- o Change in the amount of funding;
- o Reduction in number of communities covered.

I am respectfully requesting an opportunity to appear before the Finance Committee:

*to educate both the Council and the residents as to how the changes will affect not only the tobacco retailers in Fall River but also residents and business owners; and

*to explain the changes in the state law;

- o Change in Minimum Legal Sales Age, with 'grandfather' clause;
- o Prohibition of sale of tobacco/vaping products in establishments with a pharmacy;
- o Prohibit parents/guardians to provide tobacco/vaping products to their own children;
- o Include vaping products in the Smoke Free Workplace Law;
- o Include Private/Parochial/Vocational schools in the ban on smoking on school grounds.

*to advise the Council where there are options for them to take action before the state law takes effect.



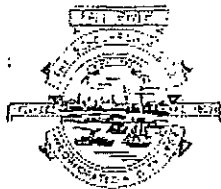

I am providing you with this Notice of Injury on behalf of Mr. Paul V. Castro of 78 Foote Street, Fall River, Massachusetts, whom I represent.

On Friday, August 17, 2018, at approximately 10:15 P.M., Mr. Castro was caused to fall when he tripped over a hose connected to a fire hydrant located on the sidewalk at the west side of Davol Street, Fall River, Massachusetts. The fire hydrant is located near the east side of the sidewalk at where what appears to be a vacant pier extends from the west side of Davol Street into the area of the Taunton River. This is the structure, extending into the Taunton River, located north of the pier where is currently located the Cove Restaurant at 392 Davol Street. The hose leads from the hydrant, across the width of the sidewalk towards the area of the boardwalk adjacent to the sidewalk and west thereof. The hose, then runs under the boardwalk, and extends into the said vacant pier. Mr. Castro fell after tripping on the hose where it was situated across the sidewalk. Please note that at the time of the incident, the orange cones shown on the photograph were not in place. Immediately preceding the fall, Mr. Castro was walking on the sidewalk heading in a northerly direction.

The presence of a hose across the sidewalk could not have been reasonably anticipated by a pedestrian using the sidewalk and there were no signs posted or other sufficient means taken to caution the public against the obstruction on the sidewalk.

As a result of the fall, Mr. Castro sustained personal injuries including a laceration to his lower lip, an abrasion to his left knee and a serious bruise to his upper right arm. In addition, he suffered a loss of motion to his right upper arm and shoulder and has been experiencing pain and discomfort to his right shoulder.

Mr. Castro first sought medical treatment on the evening of the incident at St. Anne's Hospital, Fall River, Massachusetts. Due to the persistent pain, discomfort in and loss of function of his right arm and shoulder he has sought further treatment. He has been seen by Dr. Scott Lauermann, who suspects that Mr. Castro may have suffered a rotator cuff tear from the fall. Further diagnostic testing and appropriate treatment is being sought by Mr. Castro.

On behalf of Mr. Castro, claim is hereby made against the City of Fall River for the injuries and damages suffered by Mr. Castro as a result of the incident described above, which incident was caused by the negligence of the City of Fall River causing and allowing to exist a defect in a way, all as described above.
