IN ATTENDANCE:

Council President Cliff Ponte was in attendance but did not participate

Vice-President Pam Laliberte-Lebeau called the meeting to order at 7:20 p.m. with a moment of silence followed by a salute to the flag and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

PRIORITY MATTERS

 Mayor and veto of proposed ordinance to limit number of marijuana licenses (Laid on the table in accordance with Sec. 3-7 of the City Charter)

On a motion made by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier, it was unanimously voted to lift the matter from the table, with Councilor Stephen R. Long absent and not voting. Councilor Shawn E. Cadime stated that he does not need to recuse himself because the accusations in the veto letter are untrue and he further stated that he has not taken any kickbacks. He also stated that he feels it is time to pause and review all marijuana licenses. Vice-President Pam Laliberte-Lebeau requested the City Clerk read the Mayor's Veto letter dated August 19, 2019. Councilor Leo O. Pelletier stated that he requested that the number of marijuana licenses be capped at 8, and then it was increased to 11, because the Mayor had issued 11 letters of nonopposition. Now there are 14 letters of non-opposition that have been issued and he then stated that 11 is more than enough and we need to put a limit on the number of marijuana licenses available in the City of Fall River. He then stated that he would like the City Council to forward a letter to the Cannabis Control Commission requesting that they investigate all applications that were received for Fall River. Vice-President Pam Laliberte-Lebeau requested that a letter be composed for after the agenda. Councilor Derek R. Viveiros stated that he was not in favor of putting a limit on the number of marijuana licenses, but now given the circumstances he will not be supporting the veto tonight. Councilor Leo O. Pelletier asked how many votes are needed to override the Mayor's Veto. Vice-President Pam Laliberte-Lebeau stated that 6 votes are needed. On a further motion made by Councilor Shawn E. Cadime and seconded by Councilor Bradford L. Kilby, it was voted 6 yeas, 1 nay to override the veto of the Mayor, with Councilor Steven A. Camara voting in the negative and Councilor Stephen R. Long absent and not voting.

Members of the Cannabis Control Commission:

At a meeting of the City Council held on September 24, 2019, the Fall River City Council voted to override the Mayor's veto of an ordinance to limit the number of marijuana licenses available at any one time in the City of Fall River to be limited to 20% of off-premise liquor licenses or 11, whichever number is greater.

With that vote they are limiting the number of licenses because they feel no more licenses are needed in the City of our size and because of the recent information learned in regards to how some of these licenses were obtained with letters of non-opposition allegedly received because of bribes given to our current Mayor.

As a result, we ask you to thoroughly investigate all applications and any company found to have taken part in these bribes to receive a favorable letter.

If these companies are found to have given bribes, their applications should be void and/or their licenses be rescinded. In light of the vote to limit the number of licenses, we further request that the Cannabis Control Commission also limit the number of issued licenses to no more than 20% or 11, whichever is greater as outlined in the ordinance.

Thank you for your consideration of the matter.

Dear City Council:

I am disapproving and vetoing the attached order for the following reasons:

A serious question exists as to whether the City Council, or any municipal authority, can legally limit the number of "marijuana licenses" as that appears to be within the exclusive statutory authority of the Cannabis Control Commission. Thus, the ordinance, as written, may expose the City to unnecessary litigation by future permit seekers.

By unilaterally and arbitrarily attempting to limit the number of licenses the ordinance eliminates competition, artificially inflates the value of licenses already issued, removes the legal sale of marijuana products from market forces and eliminates a valuable source of additional revenue to the City.

In addition, a sitting councilor voted inappropriately to limit the number of licenses available in Fall River while serving as Town Administrator of Seekonk a community which, itself, is in the process of granting marijuana permissions. In limiting the number in Fall River he advantages the Town by which he is employed by eliminating competition and disadvantaging this City.

For the above reasons and the councilors failure to recuse himself I must veto this order in the best interests of this City.



Street Opening Request for Pavement Less Than Five Years Old

The Engineering Division has received a request for a road opening to install utilities at 807 Plymouth Avenue. Plymouth Ave. between Pleasant St. and Slade St. was paved in 2015. The improvements are within the moratorium at 5 years old.

The Engineering Division recommends approval of the request subject to the following conditions for pavement restoration in streets less than five years old:

- 1) The work is intended to be executed using trenchless technology. In the event that trenchless construction is unsuccessful, then standard trench construction will be employed, and the final repair shall be a 9' wide mill and overlay from curb to curb.
- 2) All work shall meet or exceed the "Standards Employed by the Public Utility Operators When Restoring Municipal Streets" (the Standards) as published by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Telecommunications and Industry and with the requirements of the Fall River City Council;
- 3) All excavated material shall be removed from the site and appropriately disposed of;
- 4) All backfill materials shall be clean sand or sand and gravel mixtures meeting USCS classifications of GW, GP, SW, or SPC, free of silt, clay, and organic silts or soils, with 100% passing 3" sieve;
- 5) Backfill shall be executed in lifts not to exceed 6", and compacted between lifts;
- 6) Pavement restoration shall meet or exceed the existing pavement thickness;
- Type I binder course(s) not to exceed 2" shall be placed and thoroughly compacted to within 1.5" of finished grade;
- 8) The existing pavement edge shall be tapered into the patch area to increase the surface binding area between the existing and new pavement;
- 9) The patch area shall be heated using infrared to a surface temperature sufficient to allow remixing asphalt without oxidation or burning, but in no case shall the surface temperature exceed 350 degrees F;

- 10) A Type I surface course shall be placed with a minimum thickness of 1.5";
- 11) The surface shall be compacted using a steel drum roller, resulting in a smooth, tight, pavement surface which matches the grade of the existing pavement;
- 12) Sand should be evenly distributed over the surface to fill small voids and absorb excess sealant if surface sealant is applied;
- 13) The repaired area shall be allowed to cool to 175 degrees F before opening to traffic.

Prior to opening the street, the applicant shall provide to the City Engineer a copy of the contract for any subcontractor providing work covered by this application. A minimum of 24-hours in advance of excavation, the contractor must call the Engineering Division at 508-324-2512 to request inspection services. Material specifications shall be provided to the City Engineer for all materials brought to the site for use as backfill, base course, and surface course.

RE: Gas Service Request for #807 Plymouth Avenue (the "Property").

Dear Mr. Frey:

Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp.'s (the "Company") through its Gas System Enhancement Program is scheduled to perform main replacement along 2nd Street (between Morgan Street and Plymouth Avenue) this construction season. Part of the efforts included with this main replacement program, is to replace existing steel services with new plastic (polyethylene) services, along with associated meter efforts (i.e. relocating inside meter sets to outside).

There is an existing gas service that feeds an existing structure on Plymouth Avenue (specifically Structure #807), which this service comes off of 2nd Street and travels through abutting properties to its ending point on the backside of the existing structure. Representative of the Company's Construction & Maintenance Dept. conducted their initial site evaluation in anticipation of the replacement efforts and have determined, that replacing this gas service within the same alignment will be infeasible, while maintaining gas service to the occupants of the structure in question.

As a result of this evaluation, the Company is seeking approval to relocate the gas service to this existing structure. The proposed service would come off of the existing gas main located along Plymouth Avenue. The Company acknowledges that Plymouth Avenue falls within the 5-year street moratorium identified on the City of Fall River 5-year road moratorium list provided by the City Engineering Office (dated March 26, 2018).

The Company would minimize disturbance to the paved surface of the roadway, by utilizing trenchless technology for the crossing of Plymouth Avenue.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW

LY 2018

Library Assistant Dylan Arruda started July 2nd in the adult services section. He has been a welcome addition to the library staff. Assistant Library Administrator Kate Kulpa, Section Head of Technology Robert Jordan and I met with Dr. Henry Vaillancourt to discuss the library doing pop-up libraries and basic computer classes at Senior Centers. The first basic computer classes at the North End Senior Center started August 15. Reference Librarian Taylor Silva represented the library at the North End Senior Center where we began offering biweekly pop-up library services starting August 8th, alternating with the pop-up library at Government Center as well. Children's Supervisor David Mello did an outreach at the 9th Street Daycare.

The library started offering a new resource this month: HOOPLA digital titles! Hoopla content is accessed via the Hoopla website, or Hoopla's Android or iOS mobile apps. You can also find titles right in our library catalog! Just register for a free Hoopla account to download free movies, music, comics, and e-books. This service has already proven very popular in the year we have offered it.

The SAILS Library Network introduced a mobile app that allows patrons easy access to their library account to search for books, check on holds and loans, download books, find out what's happening at the library, and much more.

July 17th was the start of our adult basic computer classes which ran in a four week series, being offered one afternoon and one evening each week on the same topic. The classes continue, with the South Branch now part of the rotation for a total of three classes per week. The first series of classes covered the very basics from how to use a mouse and keyboard to internet searching and databases, setting up an email account, and internet safety and security.

Podcasts on meditation led by Library Assistant David Raymondo and podcasts on pop culture by Reference Librarian Taylor Silva and Library Assistant David Moquin are now available on our website. The library has a page on Soundcloud, a podcast host site, where all our podcasts are available. You can visit and listen at https://soundcloud.com/usor-847440800. We hope to expand these podcasts to include storyhours and interviews of local celebrities.

A second Library Foundation letter was sent for the Second Century Campaign, encouraging donors to participate in the Campaign and inviting donors to participate in the Campaign and inviting donors to attend the catered reception for

contributors on September 30th, featuring the vocal stylings of Taylor Cormier throwing it back with songs of Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Tony Bennett and more.

On three occasions Animal Control was called because of seagulls. Twice, baby seagulls were trapped in the Administrative Office's fireplace after falling down the chimney, and another baby seagull either fell or blew off the roof or tried to fly off. The first seagull was taken to be checked out by a wildlife rehabilitator, and the second two were placed back on the roof by the Animal Control Officer. We are hoping to get the chimney opening blocked off by a wire mesh so birds cannot fall through.

AUGUST 2018

Reference Librarian Taylor Silva continued doing pop-up libraries at the North End Senior Center and Government Center. Mr. Silva also represented the Library at the Talbot Middle School, the Henry Lord Middle School during their family orientation night, and at Heritage State Park. Technology Supervisor Robert Jordan started basic computer classes at the Senior Centers and weekly classes at the Main Library.

Children's Supervisor David Mello represented the library at the Police-A-Palooza held at Britland Park. He entertained kids with a book and a puppet story and promoted the library services.

The Main Library hosted a month-long display from the Commonwealth Museum called "Food for Thought," on the role of food in Massachusetts history and culture. We met with Fall River Community Media to discuss a collaboration, making plans to film various events at the library such as upcoming book talks, storytimes, and David Mello giving a guided tour of the Main Library. All of these will be linked to the library's website home page for all to view.

Starting in August, the library began offering time-slots for scanning old photos or VHS tapes to a digital format. We asked interested patrons to contribute their own old photos of Fall River for our digital collection. Mr. Jordan worked one on one with patrons to teach them how to scan

As of August, we had a series of six podcasts on meditation led by Library Assistant David Raymondo and two podcasts on pop culture by Reference Librarian Taylor Silva and Library Assistant David Moquin available on our website. The library has a page on Soundcloud, a podcast host site, where all our podcasts are available. You can visit and listen at https://soundcloud.com/user-847440800. We hope to expand these podcasts to include storyhours and interviews of local celebrities. Jeff Grandmason, David Mello and David Moquin began working on a pop culture display for the library.

The Library's Annual Report Information Survey (ARIS) report was filed with the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. The library had a delayed opening on August 10th so that Library staff could attend an Active Shooter Training Workshop. The library opened at 11 a.m. I met with a store manager from SAVERS to collaborate with them in supplying the library with items for our Breaker Space Program and our Pinterest Program as well.

On behalf of the Friends of the Library the Fall River Rotary Club awarded a \$1,000 grant for the purchase of 3-D pens for the Children's Room. This will enable the library to offer in-house programs and accommodate individual requests to use the 3-D pens for children and adults. The 3-D pens are specially designed for young creators, so they are a great and less expensive way to start experimenting with 3-D printing. The 3-D pens have no hot parts, so they are completely kid safe. These are ideal for building essential STEM skills.

A second set of Library Foundation invitations was sent for the Second Century Campaign Thank You Reception on September 30th.

SEPTEMBER 2018

Children's Supervisor David Mello and Reference Librarian Taylor Silva represented the library at the Atlantis Charter School. Mr. Silva did a pop-up library at the North End Senior Center and continued to do the pop-up library at Government Center as well, Mr. Silva also represented

the Library at Heritage State Park. Technology Supervisor Robert Jordan offered basic computer classes at the North End Senior Center and the Main Library.

A number of people started using the library's new service of scanning old photos or VHS tapes to a digital format. We continued to add new episodes to our podcast library. The library has a page on Soundcloud, a podcast host site, where all our podcasts are available. You can visit and listen at https://soundcloud.com/usec-847440800; or follow the link from our web site.

The Library's Municipal Appropriation Requirement (MAR) report was filed with the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. We made plans to apply for a waiver, due by November 2nd.

On behalf of the Friends of the Library, I applied to the Fall River Cultural Council for a grant to have the Delvena Theatre Company perform their Julia Child show in Spring 2019. We have written two letters of support for artists that are applying for a Cultural Council Grant, one for a "Pottery Demonstration & Hands On Workshop" and one for "Jumpin Jubá," a blues/American roots music group to perform an outdoor concert in May 2019. I will also be applying for a Cultural Council Grant on behalf of the Library Foundation to have the "Moldy Suitcases," a 1920's jazz group meets a jug band full of rock musicians, for an outdoor concert in May 2019.

Approximately 100 people attended the Library Foundation's Second Century Campaign Thank You Reception that was held on September 30th, featuring the vocal stylings of Taylor Cormier singing classic tunes by Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Tony Bennett and more. The event was enjoyed by all.

I am pleased to announce that our design project was selected by the Design and Research team at Roger Williams University CPC. We were assigned to have three students (Project Manager Emeline Young, Jamie Valway and Jack Bourre) work on our project for the Fall 2018/Spring 2019 academic year. The team's assignment was to design from existing space a family restroom, so that we have a starting point for applying for grants.

The Fall River local cable TV filmed Children's Supervisor David Mello promoting the Zombia Night program that took place on October 18th. Trustees were given the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners Trustee Pocket Guides; the Child Protection Agency nominated the Children's Room Staff to receive an award for the children's literacy contribution in the city; and an online site, Winnie, awarded the library several Winnie Family Favorites Awards as well, including Reading is Fundamental Award for Best Public Library and Best Family Destination.

OCTOBER 2018

The Library's Municipal Appropriation Requirement (MAR) waiver was filed with the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. As mentioned last month, our family restroom project was selected by the Design and Research team at Roger Williams University CPC. The assigned team of students met with the city's plumber and Head of Community Maintenance and toured the library to look at existing infrastructure.

After discussions with other public libraries that offer passport services, the library took the first steps toward becoming a Passport Acceptance Facility. We talked with the state passport agency and three librarians attended a passport training held in Providence.

The library initiated automatic renewals for library materials that can be renewed. This service has helped with increasing our circulation as well as benefiting our library patrons from accumulating late fees.

In other news: the library continued to add new podcasts to its website; two Cultural Council grant applications were filed on behalf of the Friends of the Library and the Library Foundation, and the two artists applying for Cultural Council grants asked for letters of support, which the library provided.

NOVEMBER 2018

Regarding the status of the Main Library roof, I received an email from the Fall River Community Preservation Committee (CPA) asking if this project should be considered an emergency. This email was forwarded to Chris Gallagher and Tammy Moutinho, both from Department of Community Maintenance, which is the department that applied for funding from this agency. I also forwarded the email to Mary Sahady, city finance officer. The roof continued to leak and each time a new leak or new damage appeared, I sent a work order and photo to Chris Gallagher, Head of Community Maintenance.

Children's Supervisor David Mello did a performance of "The Raven" that was filmed at BCC for local cable.

The library continued to add new podcasts to its website, including a podcast featuring 15 minutes of local history. The library was also regularly featured on radio station WSAR and on local cable.

I am pleased to announce that the Greater Fall River Child Protection Council recognized the Children's Room staff for their outstanding service to families in the community. An awards dinner honoring them was held at the Eagle Event Center on November 7th.

Our new service of offering a photo to be uploaded to our patron's profile in the library system was well received. This added service helps prevent fraud (someone using another patron's card), and it also keeps patrons from claiming someone else checked items out on their card to avoid paying fines. Since their photo would have displayed when they checked the items out, library staff would have noticed if it was another person using the card. The only person sceing the photo will be the staff member checking items out.

I reached out to Dimán Regional Vocational Technical High School to see if the students could restore two of our museum quality display units that need renovation (wood refinished, locks

replaced, and new liners installed.) I received an email from a librarian in Attleboro complimenting Dylan Arruda in circulation services for the "polite, professional and helpful" service he provided her. A library patron also complimented the library for a recent Facebook post and newsletter article about a Veteran's Day Story: "That's great that you were able to assist with information and his picture. You are a treasure to the Fall River community". A photo of our new Pop Culture display in the Fell Room was distributed: This display also appeared in a front-page article in the *Herald News*.

I informed the Board that the Library received a lawsuit for falling paint chips. The client claimed to sustain "personal injuries" from "the ceiling collapse" on October 18th. She was using a computer when paint chips from the ceiling fell onto the desk and did not indicate or complain of any injury at the time. The whole incident was recorded on the library's security cameras and turned over to the city lawyer. This incident only stressed the need to have the roof replaced sooner rather than later. The ceiling in that room was scraped of loose paint after this incident, but within weeks, because of the continuance of the roof leaking, the paint was peeling again and three of the public computer workstations had to be closed off so that paint chips would not fall on our patrons.

Trustees unanimously approved to renew Library Administrator Liane Verville's contract for another year at the amount agreed upon at their December 14, 2016 meeting. The contract voted upon was for a period of one year starting January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019 with a pay increase to start July 1, 2019.

DECEMBER 2018

On December 1st the police were called to remove an intoxicated patron who couldn't walk and was being belligerent to others; on December 4th a patron overdosed in the restrooms and police administered Narcan and he was removed by EMTs.

The roof continued to leak in the Reference Room. A number of the water damaged areas had the paint scraped off by the city painter to prevent it from falling on library patrons.

I received notification from the Mass Cultural Council that the Library Friends and Library Foundation's grant applications were approved. The Foundation was approved to hold an outdoor jazz concert in May with The Moldy Suitcases, and the Friends were approved for a "Meet Julia Child" performance by the Delveua Theatre Company in April.

The "Kindred Spirits" film crew came to the Fall River Room at the Main Library on December 17th to film Lizzie Borden books, photos, and other items in the library's collection. This is not the first time this film company has filmed in the Main Library.

The library partnered with Burbio, an online calendar, to have our events listed with them, and they generated 2,399 views of our events in the first 30 days of the partnership. Reference Librarian Taylor Silva visited the Atlantis Charter School's Lower School to bring a Pop-Up Library to them, then visited the Upper School for a Pop-Up Library there. The Pop-Up program has been extremely successful, with the Children's Department having a significant amount of library card signups of students from the school. A total of 116 students visited the Pop-Up Library, with 128 items checked out. Taylor also visited the Niagara Senior Center to continue our Pop-Up Library program there. Four books were checked out on this date, and 5 people came to the table. On the same day he visited Mass Hire Youth Connection to touch base with Tina Sherette, one of the community outreach staff members. Their meeting was extremely productive, and Taylor was able to connect with several individuals in Fall River who work with teens, with the ultimate goal of creating more opportunities to spread the word about our teen programs at the library.

Technology Supervisor Robert Jordan has been covering at the South Branch Library during the absence of Library Assistant Debra Baptista due to her illness. Two computer classes were offered this month on how to buy/sell on eBay.

Children's Supervisor David Mello represented the library at the Lafayette-Durfee House on December 15th, telling Christmas stories. He also hosted successful programs at the library, including a Christmas with Pete the Cat event and a 50th anniversary party for The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

As reported in previous months, we continued to add to the podcasts available on our website. The newest addition was a local history podcast about Saint Anne's Cathedral.

Library Chairman Ronald Caplain and I were asked to write letters of support for the Department of Community Maintenance supporting their grant application to the Community Preservation Committee stressing the urgency of funding for the Main Library's roof repair. The roof continued to leak and a number of different contractors came to the library to assess it.

JANUARY 2019

The Library Board of Trustees January meeting was canceled due to a lack of a quorum. Three of the board member's terms were not renewed; one board member had not attended a meeting in over a year and another Board member's term had expired. With only three Board members appointed, meetings were put on hold until new Board members were appointed.

The Herald News featured the main library's roof leak in the paper on January 9, 2019 and stated that the Department of Community Maintenance (DCM) was asking for funding from the Community Preservation Committee (CPC) for the roof replacement. The roof continued to leak and a number of different contractors were here to assess it. Mr. Gibney and myself went before the CPC on January 28th to answer questions they had regarding library funding resources. I'm happy to report that the CPC Board agreed to fund the replacement of the roof plus the repair/painting of the Reference Room ceiling. Much was discussed by them about

their disheartened feelings towards the city not contributing to this project. The next step was for City Council to approve the acceptance of the funds.

I met with Emergency Management Director Richard Aguiar to develop an Emergency Evacuation Plan for the Main Library. No evacuation plan was currently in place, so we made plans to both develop a written Evacuation Plan and schedule a practice evacuation drill. Evacuation floor plans will be placed on every level clearly marking the proper way to exit the building in an emergency. We also determined to work on an evacuation plan for the South Branch as well.

The Legislative Breakfast at the Foxborough Public Library was very successful with a number of State Representatives there. Fall River was one of the libraries that had a chance to showcase unique items available at their library. We had a display of our 3-D pens along with samples that were created with the pens. Some of the other items on display: a Karaoke machine as well as the DVDs to go along with it, microscopes, telescopes, woodburning tool, metal detector, a robotic kit, and a negative/photo/slide conversion unit.

The following Library Board of Trustees terms expired and were not renewed: Richard Wolfson and Robert Kerr. Ms. Nancy C. Fell was renewed with a term expiring January 15, 2022 and Donna Williams was appointed to the Board with a term expiring January 16, 2021. Donna Williams was appointed to the Library Board of Trustees effective January 24, 2019.

FEBRUARY 2019

At the City Council's February 5th meeting they unanimously rejected using \$375,050 in Community Preservation Act emergency funding to replace the Main Library's roof and instead asked city administration to find the money for the repairs in the city's general funds. At the City Council's February 19th meeting Mr. Caplain and Mr. Gibney spoke at the City Council's Citizens input about the need for a new roof at the Main Library. Mrs. Clarkin and Mrs.

Williams also attended the meeting in support of the new roof. At this meeting the City Council referred its funding back to the city to be discussed at City Council's Committee on Finance for further review. They felt that the city should not be using Community Preservation Committee (CPC) funds for the replacement of the roof, but that the city should use city funds. The roof continued to leak both when it rained and when the snow melted. There were a number of roofers that came in to look at the roof and make recommendations to Chris Gallagher, Department of Community Maintenance, but as of the end of the month no progress had been made.

The Library closed early at 6 p.m on February 12th due to snow.

Starting February 25th, the Main Library became a Passport Acceptance Facility. This service quickly became popular in our community.

I reported to the Library Board that I was in the beginning stages of seeking information on re-establishing a bookmobile in Fall River. A number of staff members volunteered to work with Kate and me on gathering information and I planned to present my findings to the Mayor in March.

Members of Fall River Pride spoke with us about presenting a Drag Queen Storyhour here on June 1st during Pride Month.

The library reached out to the Stanley Street Treatment & Resources about their mental health first aid training to see if they would be willing to offer this course at the Library for staff, and they agreed. A number of library staff members signed up to take part in this 8-hour training workshop in June.

Trustees unanimously approved a motion made by Mr. Gibney and seconded by Ms. Clarkin to renew Assistant Library Administrator Kathryn Kulpa's contract for another year with a 3% pay increase.

The library held its first of many 3-D pen workshops, which was very successful. The participants, young and old, created wonderful art pieces. David Mello, Supervisor of Children's Services, planned to offer this program as a monthly workshop.

MARCH 2019

We hosted a representative from the US Census Bureau for a recruiting event for census workers on Thursday, March 28. We will have other recruiting events, and the census workers will use the library for training in July and August.

Members of the Friends of the Library Fran Rachlin, Angie Gastall, Cheryl Costa, Keith Costa and myself attended the Library Legislative Day at the State House on March 5th. We were able to meet with State Representatives Alan Silva and Carol Fiola as well as a representative from Senator Rodrigues' office.

As mentioned at the previous month's Board of Trustees meeting, we had been looking for a way to recognize Mr. David Mello for all that he does. The Massachusetts Library Association has a Paraiibrarian Award for Outstanding Library Staff that Kate and I filled out on behalf of the Library Board of Trustees.

The library closed on Saturday, March 2nd due to snow.

The Main Library roof replacement was stated for discussion at City Council's Committee on Finance on April 1st for further review. The City Councilors felt that the city should not be using Community Preservation Committee (CPC) funds for the replacement of the roof, but

instead should use city finds. As the month ended, the roof continued to leak from rain and snow melt, but no progress had been made on repairs.

APRIL 2019

As mentioned last month Mr. David Mello was recommended for the Massachusetts Library Association's Paralibrarian Award for Outstanding Library Staff. I received notice that he was a nominee for the award and that the recipient of the award would be announced at the Massachusetts Library Association Conference on May 21st.

The Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners notified us that the library would be issued a second and final State Aid to Public Libraries award in the amount of \$76,493.51. This payment gave us a total of \$149,327.80 in FY2019 State Aid to Public Libraries funds.

Regarding the status of the Main Library roof, Mr. Caplain and I attended the City Council's Financial Sub-committee meeting, where Mr. Caplain spoke of the urgency for a new roof. The sub-committee voted to accept Community Preservation Committee (CPC) money for the replacement of the roof. The vote was then scheduled to go before the full city council at their next meeting.

The Board discussed the three vacancies it currently had. Mr. Caplain asked anyone who knew of any possible candidates that would like to serve on the Board to notify Liane. Three recommendations were made: Ann Rockett-Sperling, Robert Kerr, and Angie Gastall. Ms. Rachlin said she thought that Ms. Gastall was on another committee that meets at the same time as the Library Board.

Trustees unanimously approved Mrs. Verville and Mr. Mello to attend the Massachusetts Library Association conference on May 21st.

The Library Foundation sent their first 2019 fundraiser letter for the Second Century Campaign, encouraging donors to participate in the Campaign.

MAY 2019

The library added a new database for those that like DIY projects called Creativebug which can be accessed with a Fall River library card. It was also noted that a patron overdosed in the restroom on Saturday, May 4th; that the Swansea Public Library went fine free as of May 1st, and that I was in the process of setting up a Paypal account for the Library Foundation to make it possible for people to donate online to the fundraising campaign.

The May update regarding the status of the Main Library roof was that Mr. Chris Gallagher, Head of Community Maintenance, notified me that he was working with an architect to develop the bid package and it should be going out for a Request For Proposal (RFP) within the month.

Trustees unanimously approved a motion made by Ms. Rachlin and seconded by Mrs. Clarkin authorizing the appointment of Mr. Ronald Caplain as Chairperson of the Library Board of Trustees and Mr. James Gibney as Vice-Chairperson of the Library Board of Trustees.

Mr. Caplain and Mr. Kerr volunteered to serve on the Library's Three Year Long Range Plan committee. Trustees were given a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) Analysis Worksheet for input for the Long Range Plan. The SWOT Analysis will be used to determine how our patrons view the library and were we need to improve.

I acknowledged Children's Supervisor David Mello for coordinating a very successful Comic. Con as well as to thank all of those that volunteered their time to help make it such a success. Approximately 350-400 people attended the Comic Con program. Every section of the library was bustling with activities: photo opportunities with a number of characters; balloon sculptures; face painting; comic book giveaway; comic book authors and illustrators in the meeting room. There were a number of patrons that came in costume, which added to the festivities.

Children's Supervisor David Mello represented the library at the Fonseca Elementary School the 9th Street Day Nursery, Lafayette Durfee House, and at Bristol Community College for a senior program. I am pleased to say that despite all the contentious publicity the Drag Queen Storytime received, it was a huge success, with approximately 400 people in attendance. It was so well attended that we had to do three separate storytimes to accommodate those that wanted to hear the stories read by Naomi Chomsky (drag queen). This event received news coverage from: Channel 10, Fox News, the *Providence Journal, The Herald News*, and other media. Red Sox pitcher Curt Schilling tweeted a negative post nationally and it was picked up on radio talk shows. I received over 100 calls asking that I cancel this event Most of the callers were due to a Christian group from the Massachusetts Family Institute asking people to contact me and the Mayor, and to attend a sit-in in opposition. Pastor Michael Johnson from Fall River also notified the Police Department that he would be here protesting with approximately 50 people (approximately 20

showed up) to protest on the front lawn. They sang hymns and read from the bible while holding a sign that says: "Dear God: Let NOT the little children be perverted by Drag Queen Story hours!" In light of all that, I also received calls and emails of support and it was supporters that packed the room for each of the readings.

By striking out Sec. 22-71 in its entirety, and inserting in place thereof, the following new section:

Section 22-71 Permit required for connection to Municipal or Private Alarm System. No building in which an automatic sprinkler system is required in accordance with Section 22-78 and no building required to be supervised by 527 CMR or MGL 148 shall be connected to the municipal fire alarm system either directly or by other system accepted in accordance with NFPA Standard 72 without a permit for such installation or connection from the head of the Fire Department. Prior to the approval of any such permit, an acceptance and performance test shall be performed by the head of the Fire Department or his designee to ensure performance, reporting and verification requirements in accordance with NFPA Standard 72. The verification process must not take longer than 90 seconds from the time the alarm signal is received at the supervising station until the time that the retransmission of the verified alarm signal is initiated. (NFPA Standard 26.2.3.1 (4) Failure of such test must be remedied and a re-test passed within seven business days or no permit shall be issued. Any permit issued must be annually renewed with payment of the required fee. The fees for such permit and annual renewal shall be as provided in Chapter A110, Fee Schedule, of the City Code.

Section 2.

By striking out Sec. 22-76 in its entirety, and inserting in place thereof, the following new section:

Section 22-76 Installation Standards.

Installation of all fire alarm boxes, supervisory systems or protective systems to be connected to the municipal fire system by any means shall be in conformity with all applicable standards of the National Fire Protection Association and with the Massachusetts Electrical Code.

By striking out Sec. 22-82 in its entirety, and inserting in place thereof, the following new section:

Section 22-82 Maintenance of Fire Alarm Systems.

The owner of a fire alarm system shall be responsible for proper installation and maintenance of such fire alarm system to ensure it's proper functioning and in order to prevent such fire alarm system from activating false alarms, becoming a public nuisance, or endangering public safety. Fire alarm systems supervised by private alarm monitoring companies that fail any annual performance, reporting or verification test set forth in Section 22-71 shall be given seven business days to pass the same. Upon the second failure of the required test the owner shall pay a fine of \$100 per day (MGL Chapter 148, Section 33) until such system is fully compliant or may, at its option, connect to the municipal system at its expense.



Dear Taxpayer Representative:

I am enclosing copies of my correspondence with the Police Department regarding the charges for an officer to reply to residential false alarms. I am also enclosing, for your quick reference, copy of section 22-33 which describes the charges for false alarms.

I believe that most taxpayers are law abiding citizens and have no choice but to abide by the city's rules. False alarms are "accidents" and if a taxpayer is not charged a fee for an officer to respond to an automobile accident, which is much more labor and time intensive, I do not understand why the false alarm payment schedule is not more generous.

I hereby petition the City Council to raise the minimum false alarms to a more reasonable level such as four or six per year before a charge is levied to the taxpayer.
