President Pam Laliberte-Lebeau called the meeting to order at 7:49 p.m. with a moment of silence followed by a salute to the flag and announced that the meeting may be recorded with audio or video and transmitted through any medium.

Camara and Bradford L. Kilby absent and not voting.
9. Committee on Public Works and Transportation convene to discuss ways to keep residents informed of daily street closures
On a motion made by Councilor Andrew J. Raposo and seconded by Councilor Michelle M. Dionne, it was unanimously voted to waive the rules to allow the City Administrator to answer questions, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Bradford L. Kilby absent and not voting. Councilor Linda M. Pereira stated that she has received numerous calls from bus drivers stating that there should be some type of notification system so that buses can plan to take detour routes, to allow students to be delivered to school on time. Councilor Shawn E. Cadime stated that dispatch for the Police, Fire and EMS Departments notifies those departments daily on detours and street closures. He then asked if dispatch could also notify the School Department so that they could notify all school transportation services. The City Administrator stated that an award letter was drafted yesterday to upgrade the City website. Councilor Linda M. Pereira stated that the new website should be user friendly and the City Council should have some input in the process. On a further motion made by Councilor Michelle M. Dionne and seconded by

Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to adopt the resolution, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Bradford L. Kilby absent and not voting.

10. Committee on Public Safety convene to discuss ways to improve safety in the area of the Hudner Building

The City Administrator stated that he is aware that the owner of the property has been in contact with the Chief of Staff regarding some issues in the area. He then stated that he has researched the matter and did not find any calls to the Police Department regarding any complaints. He also mentioned that trash in that area has been a constant severe problem. On a motion made by Councilor Linda M. Pereira and seconded by Councilor Leo O. Pelletier, it was unanimously voted to adopt the resolution, with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Bradford L. Kilby absent and not voting.

11. Administration appoint a "Veterans' Advisory Board" in accordance with M.G.L. Section 115, Chapter 12

Councilor Shawn E. Cadime stated that if the board is just advisory, then it will not need to adhere to the open meeting law when sensitive conversations need to take place. Councilor Leo O. Pelletier stated that he had been made aware of numerous issues in the Veterans' Department. On a further motion made by Councilor Andrew J. Raposo and seconded by Councilor Linda M. Pereira, it was unanimously voted to adopt the resolution, as amended with Councilors Joseph D. Camara and Bradford L. Kilby absent and not voting.

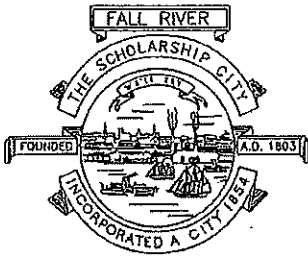

**RESOLUTION OF LOCAL GOVERNING BODY AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION
OF THE CITY OF FALL RIVER YEAR THREE ANNUAL ACTION PLAN
WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT**

WHEREAS, the City of Fall River Consolidated Plan integrates and has simplified the planning, application and reporting requirements for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Programs; and

WHEREAS, the overall goal of the Consolidated Plan programs and activities is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate-income persons; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fall River estimates that entitlements from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will be \$2,982,352.00 under CDBG, \$249,879.00 under ESG and \$1,052,327.00 under HOME; and

WHEREAS, the Year Three Annual Action Plan provides the necessary assurances and/or certificates of compliance with applicable Federal regulations and requirements of the CDBG, ESG and HOME Programs; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Paul E. Coogan must be authorized to submit the Year Three Annual Action Plan to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to accept and/or execute the Grant Agreements.

Hoyle, Tanner & Associates, Inc. (Hoyle Tanner) is working with MassDOT to evaluate rehabilitation or replacement options for the existing Jefferson Street Bridge over Sucker Brook in Fall River, Massachusetts. The enclosed project information is provided to initiate early consultation with the appropriate representatives of local government and to solicit input and comments on the proposed project.

The bridge superstructure was constructed circa 1930 and is a single-span structure comprised of steel rolled beams with a timber deck. The substructure was constructed circa 1872 and consists of masonry stone abutments with a concrete cap. The stone masonry abutments are in fair condition and are skewed to the roadway by approximately 40 degrees. The bridge is adjacent to a buried culvert on the east side, which extends under a parking area and commercial building. The west side of the bridge is lined with masonry stone retaining walls. The bridge provides an overall roadway width of 19'-0", with no sidewalks, and an out-to-out deck width of 23'-0".

The bridge is located among the complex of buildings that compose the Fall River Bleachery that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as a Multiple Resource Area/Multiple Property Submission and District (MRA/MPS; 83000667; 2/16/1983). Though the bridge is located within the boundaries of the Fall River Bleachery area, it has not been inventoried and is not mentioned as a contributing element in documentation on the Bleachery.

Jefferson Street and Jefferson Street Extension are dead-end roads that service an industrial park via three entrance drives that each cross over Sucker Brook (one of those being the access road carried by the subject bridge); however, despite the other access roads/bridges that provide similar connection to the industrial park, the City desires to keep this bridge as a serviceable access. Since the superstructure is in poor condition, a superstructure replacement project, at a minimum, is required for the bridge to remain in service for its current function (supporting vehicular traffic). The scope of proposed improvements will be determined through the engineering evaluation and stakeholder coordination being conducted during this phase of the design process.

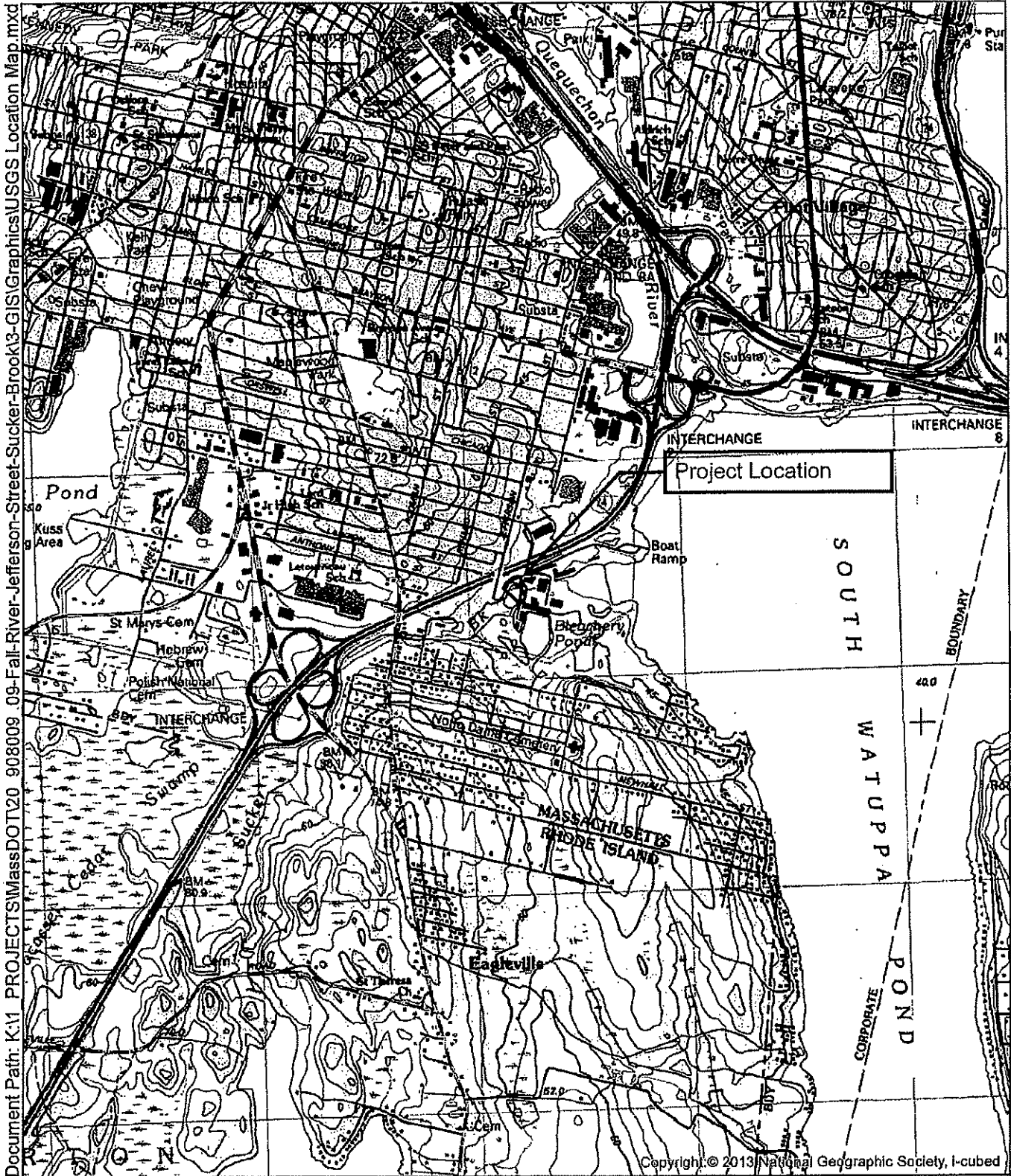

Any change in use or alteration of any structure or fill not authorized by this license may render this license void.

- (g) a clear statement of the facts which are the grounds for the proceedings, the specific objections to the MassDEP's written decision, and the relief sought through the adjudicatory hearing, including specifically the changes desired in the final written decision; and
- (h) a statement that a copy of the request has been sent to the Applicant and the Municipal Official of the city or town where the project is located.

Dismissal of request

The request for appeal will be dismissed if the filing fee is not paid, unless the appellant is exempt or is granted a waiver.

Exemptions

The filing fee is not required if the appellant is a city or town (or municipal agency), county, or district of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or a municipal housing authority.

Waiver

The Department may waive the adjudicatory hearing filing fee pursuant to 310 CMR 4.06(2) for a person who shows that paying the fee will create an undue financial hardship. A person seeking a waiver must file an affidavit setting forth the facts believed to support the claim of undue financial hardship together with the hearing request as provided above.

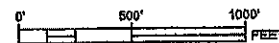

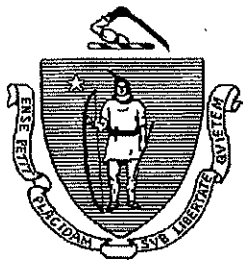

Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities on its own Motion into the role of gas local distribution companies as the Commonwealth achieves its target 2050 climate goals.

On October 29, 2020, the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") voted to open an investigation into potential policies that will enable the Commonwealth to reach its goal of net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 and the role of Massachusetts gas local distribution companies ("LDCs") in achieving that goal. Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities on its own Motion into the role of gas local distribution companies as the Commonwealth achieves its target 2050 climate goals, D.P.U. 20-80, Vote and Order Opening Investigation at 7 (October 29, 2020) ("Order"). The Department docketed this matter as D.P.U. 20-80.

In its Order, the Department directed the LDCs to initiate a joint request for proposals ("RFP") for an independent consultant to conduct a study and prepare a report ("Report") within the parameters discussed in the Order. Order at 4. The resulting Report is to inform and support separate proposals from each LDC that include the LDC's recommendations and plans for helping the Commonwealth achieve its 2050 climate goals ("Proposals"). Order at 6. On March 18, 2022, the LDCs submitted the Report and their Proposals.

Due to certain ongoing safety measures and precautions relating to in person events as a result of the COVID19 pandemic, the Department will conduct two virtual public hearings to receive comments on the Report and the Proposals. The Department will conduct two public hearings using Zoom videoconferencing:

- Tuesday, May 3, 2022, beginning at 7:00 p.m.
- Thursday, May 5, 2022, beginning at 2:00 p.m.

Alternately, any person interested in commenting on the LDCs' Report and/or Proposals may submit written comments to the Department no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on Friday, May 6, 2022. To the extent a person or entity wishes to submit comments in accordance with this Notice, electronic submission, as detailed below, is sufficient. The Department will consider all comments submitted, but specifically requests comments focused on the following: (1) the developed pathways set forth in the consultants' final Report together with the assumptions and analysis underlying the consultants' final Report and the LDCs' specific Proposals; (2) the regulatory framework necessary to support the equitable and safe transition to net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050; and (3) immediate changes that could be implemented by the LDCs toward decarbonization.

At this time, all filings will be submitted to the Department only in electronic format, consistent with the Department's June 15, 2021 Memorandum addressing continued modified filing requirements. Until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version of the filing and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary.
