Press Release

On October 30th, 2021 at approximately 4:14am Officers were dispatched to 111 Moore Dr. reference two aggressive dogs attacking an animal in the backyard. Upon Officers arrival they observed lawn furniture knocked over and moved around the backyard and two aggressive dogs fighting over the carcass of a racoon. Officers remained outside of the fence and called for the Dog Warden. The dogs were able to escape the backyard through a pathway at the driveway and Officers lost sight of the animals.

The Officers wanted to keep an eye on the dogs due to their aggressive behavior so the Dog Warden could catch them. Maintaining a distance, the Officers were close to 41 Moore Dr. when they observed the dogs on Moore Dr. and Second St. The dogs observed the Officers and began trotting towards them. Not wanting to agitate the dogs, the Officers slowly walked backwards away from the dogs. The dogs change from a trot to a run directly at Officers. The dog in front, showing teeth and growling was approximately 1 to 2 feet away when the Officer was forced to use his issued duty weapon to stop the dog from an attack. The second dog fled and could not be located.

The Dog Warden showed up later and removed the dog. The report will be forwarded to the Dog Warden for any follow up with the owner of the dogs.
