Economic Development Director Cathy Hamilton gave an update on the Fire and Police Pension Funds. Hamilton stated that the State Statutory requirement to be 90% funded by 2040 was the first goal of the Mayor and Council. She added that working with actuarial and investment experts has provided the city options and structure for repaying the debt to make the City compliant by 2040. Hamilton, advised the City had received updated numbers from Lauterbach and Amen that show, after the \$60,000,000 dollar infusion into the funds and the April 2025 payment, the city will be projected to be 81% funded in the Police Pension Fund and 71% funded in the Fire Pension Fund. Hamilton, advised the next critical step for the Council is to pass a protection Ordinance that ensures that the next Mayor and City Council carry fourth meeting the funding goal by 2040.
