

#### ORDINANCE NO.

#### AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRICT PARKING AT 3095 JILL AVENUE

**WHEREAS**, the City of Granite City is a home rule unit pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois State Constitution of 1970; and

**WHEREAS,** the Granite City City Council received complaints about parking at 3095 Jill Avenue, in the corporate limits of Granite City, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Granite City City Council hereby finds the 3095 Jill Avenue is immediately across St. Clair Avenue from an Elementary School teaching, Kindergarten through Eighth grade; and

WHEREAS, 3095 Jill Avenue is otherwise on a residential block; and

WHEREAS, St. Clair Avenue is a busy public right-of-way; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-80-2, the corporate authorities of the City of Granite City may regulate the use of streets; and

**WHEREAS**, the Granite City City Council hereby finds it will benefit the public good and promote the public health, safety, and welfare, to restrict parking at 3095 Jill Avenue during peak times for pick up and drop off of students.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND DECREED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANITE CITY, in the County of Madison and State of Illinois, that weekday parking of motor vehicles on Jill Avenue, at 3095 Jill Avenue, is hereby prohibited from 7:30 A.M. to 8:30 A.M., and from 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. The Granite City Public Works Department is hereby directed to place one or more signs at 3095 Jill Avenue prohibiting parking on weekdays from 7:30 A.M. to 8:30 A.M., and from 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. Any person parking or otherwise operating a motor vehicle in violation of this Ordinance is subject to a fine up to \$750.00 per

violation. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense. Any person possessing, holding title to, or otherwise owning a motor vehicle parked or operated in violation of this Ordinance is subject

to a fine up to \$750.00. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and may be published in pamphlet form by the Office of the City Clerk. Should any Court of competent jurisdiction rule any term or provision of this Ordinance to be unenforceable, each term of this parking Ordinance shall be deemed severable, leaving the rest of this Ordinance in full force and effect. Any prior Ordinance inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby amended

so as to conform to the expressed terms of this Ordinance.

## A RESOLUTION TO REIMBURSE AMERICA'S CENTRAL PORT FROM THE FUNDS OF THE CHAIN OF ROCKS HARBOR INDUSTRIAL PARK CONSERVATION AREA

WHEREAS, the City of Granite City is a Home Rule unit pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois State Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, THE City of Granite City approved the Tax Increment Financing District and Redevelopment Plan known as the Chain of Rocks Harbor Industrial Park Conservation Area in Ordinance Nos. 7880 through 7883, and Ordinance Nos. 8182 and 8183, on or about February 7, 2006; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the creation of that TIF District, the City of Granite City entered into a redevelopment agreement with America's Central Port District, then known as Tri-City Regional Port District, in December, 2011, per Ordinance No. 8284; and

WHEREAS, America's Central Port submitted documentation of reimbursable costs, more fully described in the attached correspondence date June 14, 2024; and

WHEREAS, America's Central Port District reports it spent approximately \$909,000.00 in said TIF District but is willing to accept 95% of the total TIF funds currently available, approximately \$70,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, at the April 23, 2025 meeting of the joint review board of said TIF District, the City of Granite City advised the affected taxing units the TIF fund balance in said TIF District, at the end of the fiscal year, was \$69,509.00; and

WHEREAS, the Granite City Council finds it will benefit the public good, be in the best interest of the City of Granite City and its residents, and demonstrate compliance with the intergovernmental agreement between the City of Granite City and America's Central Port dated December, 2011, to reimburse America's Central Port in the sum requested.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Granite City, in the County of Madison, and State of Illinois, that the Office of the Mayor, with the assistance of the Director of Finance, is authorized to tender to America's Central Port the one-time payment of the total

sum of \$70,000.00, in settlement of all claims of America's Central Port for TIF reimbursements to date relating to the redevelopment project in the Chain of Rocks Harbor Industrial Park Conservation Area.

The Office of the Mayor is authorized to execute all documents reasonable and necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution.

This Resolution shall become effective upon passage and may be published by the City Clerk in pamphlet form.

RE: Chain of Rocks TIF; Request for reimbursement of TIF funds for engineering expenses

Dear Ms. Hamilton:

America's Central Port District, in supporting its goal of promoting economic development and transportation in Southwestern Illinois, is currently starting on its next phase of improvements to the general cargo dock at the Granite City Harbor. The continued operation and expansion of this facility promotes resiliency for the City's economy in the face of shifting industry trends and industry presence, as demonstrated through the volume of goods handled at the dock, the variety in commodities and customers, and the connection to local companies. In 2023, over 700,000 tons of goods moved through the facility, including commodities such as fertilizer; grain and grain byproducts; steel coils; steel scrap, other metals, and inorganic dry products; and wood and wood byproducts. Local companies such as U.S. Steel, Friedman Industries, Heidtman Steel Products, Precoat Metals, American Colloid, and Granite City Terminal were among those shipping products through the facility.

The Port has had success in securing state and federal grants to invest in the dock, yet must contribute a local match to the grants and pay engineering expenses associated with each phase. Two completed and two planned phases at the facility represent \$10,445,504 in total construction cost, for which the Port has committed approximately \$1.7 million in local match and will have paid \$800,000 in engineering costs by project completion. An executive summary of the past and planned phases of this project is attached to this letter.

Pursuant to the 2011 Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Granite City and the Port regarding the Chain of Rocks TIF, the Port would like to bring to your attention the fourth phase of its general cargo dock improvements, which will construct a new heavily reinforced concrete surface for the expanded dock and reconstruct the railroad track serving the dock. The Port was awarded a grant from the Illinois Department of Transportation in 2023 which will cover 80 percent of construction costs. The Port will pay the remaining 20 percent of construction costs, an expense of \$909,000. Should the City deem this project significant and beneficial, as the Port believes it is, the Port requests your consideration for reimbursement from the Chain of Rocks TIF for the engineering costs the Port will incur related to this project, estimated to be \$350,000. The Port requests the lesser of this expense or 95 percent of total TIF funds available, at this time believed to be approximately \$70,000.

# Granite City Harbor General Cargo Dock Phases of Improvements, 2019-2025

#### Phase I (completed 2019)

Resurfacing the general cargo dock and enhancing the drainage system where cargo is transferred between barges, railcars, and trucks with a reinforced concrete pavement to meet the needs of overweight intermodal cargo transfers. # AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 10225, ESTABLISHING SALARIES FOR APPOINTED CITY OFFICIALS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNITS

WHEREAS, the City of Granite City is a Home Rule unit pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois State Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, Granite City Municipal Code Section 2.0.440 authorizes the Mayor of the City of Granite City to appoint individuals to certain positions of employment by the City; and

WHEREAS, said Mayoral appointees should be compensated for their services rendered, to help assure those appointees will devote their best efforts to their duties and to the public good, in the City of Granite City; and

WHEREAS, the Granite City Council finds Mechelle Smith, the Mayor's administrative assistant and appointee, should have her 2024-2025 compensation adjusted to more closely align with the compensation of a G-4 rated employee in the PB&PA White Collar Collective Bargaining Unit; and

WHEREAS, the Granite City City Council further finds said adjustment in the compensation of Mechelle Smith should be retroactive to and effective on the date of May 1, 2024, the start of the last fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED AND DECREED by the City Council of the City of Granite City, in the County of Madison and State of Illinois, that the compensation of Mechelle Smith shall be increased, to the annualized compensation of \$52,962.02. The Granite City City Council further ordains and decrees that said adjustment in her salary, an increase from the annualized total compensation of \$45,110.84 under Ordinance 10225, shall be retroactive to and effective on, May 1, 2024.

Ordinance 10225, adopted April 16, 2024, is hereby amended to conform to the terms of this Ordinance. Ordinance 10225 otherwise remains in full force and effect.

This Ordinance may be published in pamphlet form by the Office of the City Clerk. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
