



# The City of Halsey

Yes, we are an economic resource to you! We are partnered with all the mentioned organizations in this toolkit, and then some. We have a vested interest in making Halsey a great place to do business, and we are here to support anyone who has or would like to have a business in town.

### How We Help

**Funding Opportunities:** Through our partnerships, there are several grants and financial incentives available to businesses residing in Halsey. These opportunities include:

- **Building Restoration Grants:** The Oregon Main Street (OMS) Project offers grants for façade restoration, structural repairs, and code compliance. OMS does not accept applications directly from individual businesses. All applications must be submitted to the City of Halsey first to be considered.
- **Clean Energy Incentives:** The Energy Trust of Oregon offers reimbursements for qualifying clean energy installments. This includes new energy-efficient equipment and insulation.

Please contact City Hall to learn more about these funding opportunities and information on how to apply.

**Business Permits:** All businesses operating in Halsey should get a permit from City Hall. Business Permits are free!

**Advertising:** The city's website has a commerce page that lists local businesses in town. This service is also free to all businesses operating in Halsey.


#### How We Help
