The Regular Session for February 1, 2022 was called to order by Mayor Frank Moran at 6:03pm in the Municipal Annex.

- Invocation and pledge of allegiance by Reverend Derek Berry, Police Department Chaplain and Pastor of Tabernacle Baptist Church.
- Chief Turner presented Jacob Richardson with a certificate of appreciation for his craftsmanship on City projects such as the Trunk or Treat and Christmas parade.
- Chief Turner presented Code Enforcement Officer Alexis Cooper with a certificate of appreciation for her community involvement.
- Chief Turner presented Life Saving Awards to Officer Morrison, Officer Johnson and Officer Bartlett.
- Chief Turner presented 2021 Officer of the Year Ribbons to Detective McCloud and Corporal Simpkins.
- Approved minutes from the January 4, 2022 Regular Session and the January 25, 2022 Work Session.
- Approved the Consent Agenda:
 - Authorizing the installation of security fencing around the Public Works building located at 83 Duncan Circle, by Contractors of West Georgia, in an amount not to exceed \$77,860.75, to be paid for by Street SPLOST.
 - Authorizing the use of Gray's Mill Park for the 2022 Faith and Blue Weekend, October 7 - 9, 2022.
 - Authorizing the City Manager to authorize use of Public Property for filming activities.
 - Authorizing contracting with Atwell, LLC to design the Parking Lot and Veterans Memorial area behind City Hall, in an amount not to exceed \$3,850.00, to be funded by Street SPLOST.
 - Authorizing the surplus and trade of the Ford Econoline Van and Transit Van, to Wade Green Ford (State Contract Vendor), at a value of \$37,000, to be applied toward the purchase and outfitting of a 2022 Ford Explorer from Wade Green Ford, with the remaining balance of outfitting to be paid for by General Fund, not to exceed \$5,000.00.
 - Authorizing the Mayor to enter into a lease of 531 Seaboard Avenue with butter'd udder ice cream and coffee shop.
- Mayor Moran introduced the owners of butter'd udder.
- Authorized sponsorship of the Paulding Education Foundation's Casino Night in the amount of \$500.00.
- Voted to leave sanitation rates the same, remove recycling, explore other options for sanitation services, staying with GFL until new method is implemented.
- Moved the February Work Session to February 21, 2022 at 6pm.
- No Visitor Business.
- Mayor Moran announced that February is Black History Month.
