- Chief Michael Turner presented Life Saving Awards to Sergeant Tyler Third and Officer Corey Johnson.
- Mayor Moran read Public Hearing procedures.
- The City of Hiram held a public hearing for the purpose of receiving public comment regarding a proposed text amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Hiram.
- City Manager Jody Palmer presented the staff recommendation of adoption of the text amendments.
- R. Sarah Carson spoke on behalf of a developer.
- The Public Hearing was closed.
- Approved minutes from the May 3, 2022 Regular Session; May 14, 2022 Budget Work Session; and the May 31, 2022 Work Session.
- Approved the Consent Agenda:
 - a) Approving contract with JusticeONE for the migration of data from the existing police records management system.
 - b) Authorizing surplus and disposal of Police Department mobile thermal printers.
- Adopted Ordinance 2022-04, text amendments to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Hiram.
- Authorized purchase of a Ford Explorer as the replacement police vehicle, previously authorized as a Ford F-150 on December 7, 2021.
- Adopted Ordinance 2022-06, FY23 Budget.
- Authorized the Mayor to enter into agreements for the disbursement of hotel motel excise tax with 20% going to the Paulding Chamber of Commerce and 20% going to the Hiram Hospitality League.
- Discussed replacing fence around the water tower.
- Authorized replacement of the fence around the water tower in the amount of \$15,718.00, by First Fence of Georgia, to be funded by Water Capital Outlay.
- Authorized broadcasting of Council meeting videos on TV23, the City website and youtube.
