The Regular Session for May 3, 2022 was called to order by Mayor Frank Moran at 6:00pm in the Municipal Annex.

- Invocation and pledge of allegiance by Clifford McGrady, Hiram Police Department Chaplain.
- Mayor Moran read and presented the Clerk Week proclamation to City Clerk Melissa Chosewood.
- Mayor Moran read the facts of the appeal hearing for An Chi Health Center, LLC, doing business as Escape Spa of Hiram, Xiaoling Chi, Licensee, located at 4484 Jimmy Lee Smith Parkway, Suite B102.
- Evidence heard by the City Manager, along with a copy of his written decision, were previously provided by the City Clerk to the Mayor and Council and also the Counsel for Escape Spa of Hiram.
- Mr. Badeaux, attorney for Escape Spa of Hiram, made a statement on his client's behalf.
- Council voted to affirm the City Manager's decision to revoke the massage establishment license for An Chi Health Center, LLC, doing business as Escape Spa of Hiram, Xiaoling Chi, Licensee, located at 4484 Jimmy Lee Smith Parkway, Suite B102.
- Approved the minutes from the April 12, 2022 Regular Session and the April 26, 2022 Work Session.
- Authorized extension of the mowing contract with Outdoor Solutions until February 28, 2023, in an amount not to exceed \$31,590.00, to be paid from Public Works M&O.
- Pastor Hines spoke in opposition to the creation of a cigar specialty shop category for a consumption on the premises alcohol license.
- Angel Jackson spoke in support of the creation of a cigar specialty shop category for a consumption on the premises alcohol license.
- Adopted Ordinance 2022-05, creating a cigar specialty shop category for a consumption on the premises alcohol license, with a prohibition against Sunday alcohol sales.
- A motion to authorize live streaming of City Council meetings, including a cost not to exceed \$8,000.00, to be funded by Elected Officials Video Services expenditure account failed due to lack of a second.
- Tabled the decision to authorize live streaming of City Council meetings, including a cost not to exceed \$8,000.00, to be funded by Elected Officials Video Services expenditure account, to explore other options.
- Approved the Settlement Agreement with Zayo Group, LLC, regarding utility right of way auditing, in the amount of \$4,367.77.
