

A local law regulating the use of public water facilities and the furnishing of water to consumers of Water Districts No. 1 and No. 2 of the Town of Huron

ARTICLE I
RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 1. REGULATIONS AS PART OF CONTRACT. A. The following rules and regulations, as established by the town board of the Town of Huron or as hereafter amended or modified, are hereby made a part of any and all agreements or contracts with each consumer, taker or user of water furnished directly or indirectly from the mains of Water Districts Nos. 1 and 2 of the Town of Huron.

B. Each and every consumer, user or taker of water from the water system of the districts shall be in all respects bound by, and shall be considered to have agreed to, the rules, regulations, requirements and schedules of water rates and other charges as herein set forth or hereafter amended or modified by the town board, as a condition precedent to the right of service from said water system.

ARTICLE II
CONNECTIONS TO THE SYSTEM

Section 1. PERMANET CONNECTIONS. A. Those desirous of making permanent connections to the mains of the water system of Water District No. 1 shall make application to the town clerk and upon payments of the tap charges hereinafter established and after approval of the application by the water superintendent, the town employees shall tap the water main, run pipe to the curb line, install a curb box or shut-off and install a meter any place acceptable to the water district, inspect the service installation and connection to the public system.

B. Those desirous of making permanent connections to the water supply system of Water District No. 2 shall make application for permission therefor to the town clerk and upon approval thereof, the applicant at his own expense shall tap the main, run pipe to the curb line and shall install a curb box or shut-off and the Water District employees shall install a meter in a place acceptable to the Water District.

C. All work incident to the digging of the trench, the laying of pipe and backfill in making connections from the shut-off shall be at the sole expense of the applicant and must be installed to the satisfaction and under the supervision of the water superintendent or his representative.

D. No person or persons shall make any connections to the mains of the water system of said districts except by permit issued by the town clerk.

E. All water services shall be of copper, iron or plastic pipe from the curb box or shut-off valve to the water meter with such check valves as shall be directed by the water superintendent and all pipe shall be installed at a depth approved by the water superintendent and maintained in a satisfactory condition to prevent leaking and freezing. If plastic pipe shall be used, the same shall be made from virgin ultra strength polybutylene plastic, ASTM material designation PB2110. This is Type II, Grade 1 polybutylene plastic, with a hydrostatic design stress of one thousand (1,000) pounds per square inch for water at seventy-three and four-tenths degrees Fahrenheit (73.4°F). Pipe shall be rated for one hundred sixty (160) pounds per square inch working pressure at seventy-three and four-tenths degrees Fahrenheit (73.4°F) for water.

F. Unless otherwise approved by the town board, a separate tap and service shall be installed for each residence or building located on a street in which there is a district water main and no consumer will be allowed to supply water to another person or parcel except that buildings which do not have a water service and which do not have road frontage may connect into the water line of a building having water service providing that application is made to the town clerk for a permit to do so and a separate meter is installed for each such building.

G. The standard size service pipe to be installed shall be three-quarter (3/4) inch diameter and standard three-quarter (3/4) inch meters will be furnished by the water district. Larger meters shall be furnished by the customer at his expense but the same must be satisfactory to the water superintendent.

H. No connection of any kind shall be made to the service pipes between the main and the meter except as permitted by the water superintendent.

I. Where an application is made for a connection for which an existing service is already provided to the curb box or shut-off, all work shall be performed in accordance with these rules and regulations so far as they are applicable, except that connections shall be made at the curb box or shut-off instead at the main. It shall be the duty of the applicant to determine that the portion of the connection previously installed is in satisfactory condition or to make any repairs thereto which may be required by the water superintendent, all of which shall be at the expense of the applicant. Methods of connection to the existing service pipe shall be in accordance with the instructions of the water superintendent.

Section 2. TEMPORARY CONNECTIONS. Those desiring the use of water for temporary purposes shall make application therefor to the town board setting forth in detail the reasons therefor and the exact use which is to be made of the water, and the board may issue the necessary permit under such terms and conditions as it may determine.

ARTICLE III
GENERAL REGULATIONS

Section 1. PERMIT REQUIRED TO USE HYDRANTS. Except in cases of fire, no person or persons shall take water from any fire hydrant of the said districts for any purpose whatsoever without having obtained a special permit from the town board which permit shall be conditioned in accordance with the circumstances involved and at the discretion of the board.

Section 2. WORK PERFORMED ONLY BY TOWN. No work shall be performed upon the water mains or upon the services connected thereto within Water District No. 1 between the main and the curb box and water shut-off except by employees or agents of the town.

Section 3. OWNER TO REPORT DAMAGE OR LEAKS. The consumer is required to notify the water superintendent of any leak occurring in, or damage to, the service line, in which case the water will be turned off at the curb stop and remain turned off until the leak is repaired or the damage restored to the satisfaction of the water superintendent. All repairs to the service line between the curb stop and the meter shall be made by the consumer at his own cost and expense. The repairs to the service line between the main and the curb stop shall be made at the expense of the district. In all cases, repairs shall be made in conformity with the specifications for new services insofar as they may be applicable.

Section 4. ABANDONED SERVICE. In case it is desired to abandon a service, the town clerk shall be notified and the service will be disconnected at the main. The work shall be performed at the expense of the owner. No new service will be provided for an applicant while a discontinued service is not disconnected in accordance with this provision.

Section 5. CURB STOP CONTROL. Service shall be controlled at the curb stop and shut-off valve and water will be charged for so long as the curb stop or shut-off valve is open. The water shall be turned off and on only by employees of the town and only upon filing proper notice with the town clerk.

Section 6. CHECK AND RELIEF VALVES. In cases where boilers or other coils or devices are installed, either for domestic heating or domestic hot water or where other special equipment is supplied with water, suitable check and relief valves must be installed at the expense and peril of the consumer between the meter and the source of heat to prevent collapse, or explosion, in case the water is shut off for any reason. The town board assumes no responsibility for the proper operation or function of said valves.

Section 7. CONTROL OF WATER SUPPLY. BOARD NOT LIABLE FOR SHUT-OFF OF WATER. The town board and the water districts shall not be liable for any damages which may result to consumers pipes, appliances or other fixtures due to the shutting off of water mains or service pipes for any purpose whatsoever, whether previous notice has been given or not. The town board shall not be held liable for any damage sustained by reason of its failure to supply water to any consumer at any time or for any cause. The town board does not guarantee service from the street main to the meter or through the house or through any piping, valves or connections therewith. The town board reserves the right, at any time it is considered necessary, to prohibit the use of water for sprinkling of lawns or gardens or for any other purpose. No deductions from the minimum service charges will be made for periods when the service is shut off.

Section 8. INTERPRETATION OF RULES. The town board shall be the sole judge as to the meaning of these rules and regulations. Its interpretation shall be final and binding upon all applicants for water service, and upon all takers and users of water.

ARTICLE IV METERS

Section 1. METERS REQUIRED. All consumers owning or occupying premises located within the water districts must have water meters installed. Meters to be used within the limits of the districts shall be furnished by the district and shall remain the property of the district. The purchase cost of any meters required which are larger than three-quarters (3/4) of an inch shall be charged to the user.

Section 2. LOCATION OF METERS. A. The service connection and the plumbing in the building to be served shall be so arranged that the meter can be placed in a horizontal position not more than three (3) feet from the point of entering the building. The owner shall install suitable stop valves between the point of entry and the meter and all piping to the meter must be within clear view at all times.

B. Where meters are installed at a point other than in a building, the owner will construct at his own expense a suitable meter pit in accordance with the standards established by the town board.

C. Employees or agents of the town may enter the premises of the consumer at reasonable times to examine the meter and its connections and to read the same.

Section 3. DAMAGE TO METERS. Damaged meters shall be repaired by the district at the expense of the consumer except where the damage is caused by ordinary wear and tear.

Section 4. INTERFERENCE WITH METERS. All persons are forbidden to interfere with, or remove, a water meter from any service.

Section 5. REPAIR OF METERS. A. Where repairs to meters are necessitated by the normal deterioration of the meters through use, the cost of repairing such meters shall be borne by the water districts.

B. Where repairs to meters are necessitated by neglect on the part of the consumer, such as damage done by freezing, or by hot water backing through the meter, or actual breakage, the consumer shall be charged for the cost of the repair.

Section 6. FAULTY METERS. If there shall be a malfunction of a meter, or a faulty registration of the quantity of water consumed for any current period, the correct amount shall be taken to be that of the registration plus the deficiency or less the excess, equal to an average of the prior and subsequent readings of the meter. If it be found that the meter is stopped or failed to register, the quantity of water consumed shall be taken to be the average of the quantity consumed during the proceeding and subsequent periods during which such meter was operative.

ARTICLE V

FROZEN WATER SERVICES

Section 1. RESPONSIBILITY. The town board does not assume responsibility for frozen services, notwithstanding the fact that the installation of any service which may subsequently become frozen had been installed and/or approved by the water superintendent or his representative.

ARTICLE VI
BILLS AND PENALTIES

Section 1. TAP CHARGES. Upon application for water service, the application shall pay to the town of Huron the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the tap of the water main, the service pipe to the curb box or shut-off and installation of the water meter.

Section 2. WATER BILLS. Water bills will be rendered quarterly to all individual users using standard meters and monthly to industrial and institutional users with large meters. Such bills shall include the charge for water consumed as well as any other charges incurred by the consumer.

Section 3. RESPONSIBILITY FOR PAYMENT. The responsibility for payment of all bills rests upon the owner of the premises, and he shall be liable for all charges when due and payable and such charges shall be a lien upon the premises until fully paid and may be added to the tax levy against the property owner.

Section 4. PAYMENT OF WATER BILLS. All bills for water consumed will be mailed on or about the first of the month in which they are due and will be due and payable on or before fifteen (15) days after the date of mailing. After the 15th day, ten percent (10%) will be charged additional on all unpaid water bills. Any consumer whose bill is not paid by the last day of the month in which rendered will be subject to having the water service shut off and disconnected until the bill is paid, in which event the charge of Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$7.50) will be made for restoring water service in addition to the ten percent (10%) penalty for late payment.

ARTICLE VII
WATER RATES AND CHARGES

Section 1. MINIMUM CHARGE. A. The minimum charge for each water service in the districts shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

B. Any building containing more than one living unit that is supplied with water but does not have separate water systems and separate meters shall pay the minimum charge for each living unit, the excess charge to be made to the owner or to the main apartment unless all parties concerned agree otherwise and notify the town clerk of such agreement. If any tenant or occupant is in default in payment, the entire service will be subject to discontinuance and shut off until all charges are paid.

Section 2. QUARTERLY WATER RATES.

0 to 10,000 gallons (minimum charge)	\$25.00

ARTICLE VIII
PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

Section 1. Upon any violation of any of the rules and regulations contained herein, the town board, by its agent, may, upon 24 hour notice to the owner, agent or occupant of the premises affected, discontinue the supply of water and such supply shall not be made available until all such rules and regulations are complied with and until all unpaid charges are paid in full.

B. Service of any notice authorized or directed by or on behalf of the town board may be made upon the owner or occupant personally or by leaving the same at the premises where water is supplied or by sending the same, by mail to such party at the last address furnished to the town clerk.

ARTICLE IX
EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 1. This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the office of the Secretary of State and in the office of the State Comptroller.
