Huxley City Council,

In your packet, you will find the Gap Financial Assistance for Restoration/Redevelopment application and matrix that we discussed at your previous meeting. Since then, we have incorporated the feedback that each of you shared. Changes include specific language to define terms per your Code of Ordinances, basic formatting, a sources and uses table to indicate the company/owner's contribution, clarity in the scoring section on infrastructure, and the addition of Story County's overall and manufacturing wages.

On process, once the City of Huxley receives a full application, the Huxley City Council will be notified, and the Gap Financial Assistance Review Group will meet to score the application. Each of the three members of this group, comprised of representatives from the Huxley City Council's Economic Development Subcommittee, the Huxley Development Corporation, and the Ames Economic Development Commission, will perform scoring. If the applicant passes, this group will deliberate and provide you with a letter detailing the nature its discussion, impact on the City of Huxley, and a recommended award amount if one exists. This letter will serve as a recommendation to either approve or disapprove of the application.

While we hope the city will appreciate the efforts of this group, the recommendation will not bind the City Council. The final decision rests with you, no matter the score or recommendation. As such, if you adopt the application and matrix, I would encourage the Mayor of Huxley to establish this three-person group by allowing the City of Huxley, Huxley Development Commission, and Ames Economic Development Commission to each identify a representative.

While affordability is a separate question, it is a related and important one. If this process is adopted, I would encourage the City of Huxley and Gap Financial Assistance Review Group to demonstrate affordability on a case-by-case basis. Over several months, if you think that this tool works well, I would encourage you to entertain a yearly conversation on affordability during your annual budget sessions.

Please note that this is simply a process for you to consider business recruitment projects. As Huxley grows, we anticipate that you will continue to receive interest in existing buildings, and this tool will provide you with a path to do so. Still, a vote for or against any application is entirely up to your own judgment and discretion. If adopted, these documents and the process described will only formalize your business development and recruitment efforts.

 - (9) Multiple tube devices under this paragraph (b) that are manufactured in accordance with APA 87-1, Section 3.5.
 - C. "Second-class Consumer Fireworks" means the following Consumer Fireworks, as described in APA 87-1, Chapter 3:
 - (1) Cone fountains.
 - (2) Cylindrical fountains.
 - (3) Flitter sparklers.
 - (4) Ground and hand-held sparkling devices, including multiple tube ground and hand-held sparkling devices that are manufactured in accordance with APA 87-1, Section 3.5.
 - (5) Ground spinners.
 - (6) Illuminating torches.
 - (7) Toy smoke devices that are not classified as novelties pursuant to APA 87-1, Section 3.2.

- (8) Wheels
- (9) Wire or dipped sparklers that are not classified as novelties pursuant to APA 87-1, section 3.2.
- D. "Display Fireworks" means those fireworks as defined by Iowa Code Section 727.2(1)(b).

Regulations.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or explode any explosive, explosive material or First-class Consumer Fireworks and Second-class Consumer Fireworks within the corporate limits of the City.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail, or use or explode any explosive, explosive material or First-class Consumer Fireworks and Second-class Fireworks within the corporate limits of the City unless granted a permit as provided in Huxley Municipal Code. Sales of Display Fireworks may be made for that purpose only.
- C. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or explode any Display Fireworks within the corporate limits of the City unless, upon application in writing, the City has issued a permit to a City agency, fair association, amusement park or other organizations or groups of individuals approved by City authorities to display fireworks and such display will be handled by a competent operator.

(Ord. 463 - Apr. 18 Supp.)

3. Exceptions. This section does not prohibit the sale by a resident, dealer, manufacturer or jobber of such fireworks as are not prohibited; or the sale of any kind of fireworks if they are to be shipped out of State; or the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or theatre, or for signal purposes in athletic sports or by railroads or trucks for signal purposes, or by a recognized military organization. This section does not apply to any substance or composition prepared and sold for medicinal or fumigation purposes.

We have recently received and reviewed comments from the City of Huxley regarding the previous submittal. Revisions and responses, written in bold type, are as follows:

City Comments

1. The detention basin berm needs to have a side slope of 4:1 or flatter in accordance with SUDAS Design Manual Section 2G-1.F.1.a. The slopes on Sheet No. C2.1 and C2.3 are labeled as being 3:1 (33.33%).

Detention basin berm grades have been revised to show 4:1 slope.

2. The overflow spillway on the north side of the detention basin needs to be dimensioned and spot elevations provided on Sheet No. C2.1.

Spillway has been dimensioned and spot elevation are shown on Sheet C2.1.

Please dimension and show the easement for the sewer and water that will be public along the east side of the plat on Sheet C3.

The public Water/Sanitary easement has been added and labeled on Sheet C3.2.

4. The 8" water main needs to be ductile iron with gas resistant gaskets. Same for the 6" water service. Please modify flag note 10 on Sheet C3.1 accordingly.

Water main flag notes on Sheet C3.1 have been modified to specify the material to be ductile iron with gas resistant gaskets.

5. Change the blow off to a fire hydrant at the south end of the 8" water main. Change the label on Sheet C3.2 from "Propose Blow-Off" to flag note 17.

The blow off has been replaced with a fire hydrant and the label has been replaced with a flag note on Sheet C3.2.

6. The 8" sanitary sewer pipe material is not specified beyond just pvc on Sheet C3.2. Please change the pipe material for the 8" sanitary sewer to pvc truss pipe.

All pipe labels have been modified to specified the material to be "PVC TRUSS PIPE".



Project Description:

Existing Site Conditions

The Kum & Go site is located east of the I-35 ramp intercepting IA-210 in Huxley, lowa. The existing site constist of 4.30 acres of land utilized for agricultural purposes (row crops) and is slated for a commercial use as a Kum & Go. Refer to the existing drainage map and Hydraflow Hydrographs for detailed analysis of the existing site conditions.

Proposed Site Conditions

The site will be developed as a new 5,975 sf Kum & Go convenience store with a detached gas canopy and associated access drives, parking and utilities. Proposed storm water detention will be provided in a dry bottom detention basin west of the proposed building. (Refer to the Post-Developed Drainage Map and hydraflow hydrographs).

Storm Water Analysis:

Storm Sewer Analysis

Storm sewer pipes were designed to convey the 100-year post-developed storm event at all critical locations and overflow paths have been provided. The Rational Method was used to determine the flow rate for each drainage area and the Manning's equation was used to size the pipes.

Detention Analysis

Detention for the Kum & Go site will be provided in one dry bottom detention basin located on the west side of the property. The pond was designed with Hydraflow Hydrographs which utilizes the SCS Unit Hydrograph Method for computation of hydrographs. The drainage basin was analyzed for the 2, 5 and 100-year rainfall events. Runoff curve numbers used to determine peak flow rates are listed in the assumptions. The detention basin was designed to limit the 2 and 5-year post-developed runoff to the 2 and 5-year existing peak runoff rate and to limit the 100-year post-developed release rate to the 5-year existing release rate.

I have reviewed and have gone over the information that Mat has been working on for the purchase of the new equipment for the dump truck new chassis that he has ordered. I agree with his recommendation and would approve the equipment purchase from Henderson Equipment. Henderson is a reputable manufacturer and installer of this type of equipment and have been a very loyal and respectable company for the City over the years. Several years ago we contracted with a distributer of Henderson products from Des Moines that installed some snow plow equipment on one of our trucks and it failed after a few snow removal operations. We called the installer from Des Moines to have the truck repaired and asked for the damaged equipment to be replaced and the equipment reinstalled but they resisted and said that it was not their problem and they would not repair or reinstall the equipment without us having to pay them to do so. After several attempts with the company and no progress I called Henderson about the installation and the problems that we had with the representative and they sent out a technician right away to look at the problem. By the end of the day after they meet us on site to look at the damages they arranged for the truck to be delivered at their shop the very next day and replaced all the damaged parts with new equipment and beefed up the chassis and reinstalled it all that was far superior then what we had from their representative all at no charge which would have been several thousands of dollars. They do stand behind their products and are always checking on us to see how everything is going. Just can't say enough about their commitment to customer satisfaction and support. All in all and with the consideration in difference in the amount of the bid from Aspen I would recommend that we use Henderson on the equipment purchase and installation. Henderson also has a lot of other options that Aspen is not providing that Mat will be able to explain at the council meeting.

Plow Truck Equipment Memo

I have gotten three bids from the following companies for the equipment to be put on our plow truck.

Henderson Products

- Option #1 DOT style brine tanks with tailgate spreader \$88,368.00
- Option #2 Hi-Tech wedge tank spreader assembly \$98,188.00

Aspen Equipment

All Henderson Products w/spreader only \$87,513.00

Truck Equipment Inc.

Flink Products and Flink liquid application system \$88,502.00

After looking at all the equipment options and considering the needs for our growing community, I think the best fit for us would be to go with the Henderson Products option #2 for several reasons

- The Hi-Teck is a durable stainless-steel unit w/stand that slides into the back of the truck with quick and easy hook-up which would make for easy removal for the need to haul snow out of cul-de-sacs and parking lots. Yeah it cost more but it will make the truck more versatile.
- 2. The DOT style brine tank system would be more of a hassle to take out of the truck to haul snow, and they have to drill more holes in the box which would make it easier for it to rust.
- 3. Working with Henderson directly would ensure that all equipment would be installed correctly and would eliminate the need for a middle man such as Aspen Equipment. In the past we had a company that was a Henderson rep and had installed the Henderson equipment wrong and did not stand behind their work after it broke and damaged the truck. We tried several times to get them to fix it and they would not, so we contacted Henderson directly and after their engineer looked at the truck, they said that their product was not installed right or to their specs. They then took the truck to their shop and installed the plow correctly and we have not had any trouble with it since.
- 4. I feel that the Flink Products would not be a great fit for our needs. The last Flink plow we had we always had to work on it, and it cost us a lot of down time.

In the end the best bag for buck is going to be the Henderson Equipment for the total truck cost of \$186,359.00






