Section 4. That the form and content of the Purchase Agreement, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference, be and the same hereby is in all respects authorized, approved and confirmed, and the Mayor and the City Clerk be and they hereby are authorized, empowered and directed to execute, attest, seal, and deliver the Purchase Agreement for and on behalf of the City in substantially the form and content now before this meeting, but with such changes, modifications, additions or deletions therein as shall be approved by such officers, and that from and after the execution and delivery of the Purchase Agreement, the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Purchase Agreement as executed.



SYNOPSIS:

On December 10, 2019 by Resolution No. 19-176, City Council approved application to the Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Division (HSEMD) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for funding from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program in the amount of \$335,000. The application acknowledged that the grant is provided under a cost share formula, with Federal share not to exceed 69.7%, State of Iowa share not exceeding 10% and the City's share being a minimum of 20.3% of the total project cost, through cash or an in-kind match. The City's local match under the original agreement was up to \$75,000.

Staff requested a budget increase for the grant following an increase in the originally estimated cost for the project. The amendment has been approved by the Iowa Department of Homeland Security and requires City of Huxley signature to proceed. The City's local match is now \$68,122.

Amending Huxley Ordinance Chapter 69.13 (Parking Enforcement and Payment of Fines) and Chapter 70.03 (Parking Violations)

SYNOPSIS:

Amending Huxley Chapter 69.13 will provide for the 28E agreement between the City of Huxley and the Story County Treasure Office new collection process of delinquent parking fines. The process includes; parking citation not paid within 30-days of issuance will have an hold order on the vehicle registration renewal until citation is paid, allowing vehicle owner 7-days to protest the parking citation and will be issued a court date, and an additional fee of \$5.00 added for processing the hold order at the Story County Treasures Office.

Amending Chapter 70.03 to increase all parking fines \$5.00 except Handicap Space violations will remain at \$100.00. Standard parking violations will be \$10 and Snow Ordinance violations will be \$30.00.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Huxley has never had a way to enforce the collection of parking fines, which most of the fines never get paid. This should not have any cost to the City other then purchasing parking citation from a printing distributor.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The hold order can only be enforced on vehicles registered in Story County.

ORDINANCE NO. 509

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF HUXLEY, IOWA, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 69 (PARKING REGULATIONS)

WHEREAS Iowa Code Section 331.553(8) provides that a County Treasurer may enter into an agreement under Iowa Code 28E to collect or enforce delinquent parking fines on behalf of a City in conjunction with renewal of motor vehicle registrations pursuant to Iowa Code Sections 321.40(4) and 321.236; and

WHEREAS the City and the County have entered into such an agreement for the collection or enforcement of delinquent parking fines owed to the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of Huxley, Iowa as follows:

SECTION 1. AMEND CHAPTER 69 (PARKING REGULATIONS). The Code of Ordinances of the City of Huxley, Iowa, is amended by adding new Section 69.13 Enforcement and Payment of Fines as follows:

69.13 ENFORCEMENT AND PAYMENT OF FINES

- 1. <u>Violations. Violations of this chapter shall result in a fine as set forth in Section 70.3 to this Code of Ordinances.</u>
- 2. Payment of Tickets. Parking citations shall be paid at the office of the City Clerk within 30 days of issue.
- 3. Contesting Tickets. Parking tickets may be contested if the owner of the vehicle files a written protest within seven (7) days of the issuance of the citation. The written notice of protest must include the owner's name and contact information, ticket number, the date of the ticket, license plate number, and the reason for the contest. The written protest shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk and shall stop the running of the 30 day period for payment. If the right to contest the ticket is exercised, the ticket will be filed in with the appropriate District Court as a criminal traffic ticket and will be subject to court costs and surcharges in addition to the fine.
- 4. Failure to Pay or Contest. Failure to pay a parking citation complaint within 30 days of its issuance or timely contest such citation under the provisions of this Chapter shall render the charges contained therein admitted. The fine thereafter shall be increased by five dollars (\$5) and a hold may be placed on the registration of the vehicle until the fine and any additional processing costs are paid.

SECTION 2. AMEND CHAPTER 70 (TRAFFIC CODE ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES). The Code of Ordinances of the City of Huxley, Iowa, is amended by amending the fine amounts set forth in Section 70.3

70.03. PARKING VIOLATIONS: ALTERNATE.

Uncontested violations of parking restrictions imposed by this Code of Ordinances shall be charged upon a simple notice of a fine payable at the office of the City Clerk. The simple notice of a fine shall be in the amount of <u>ten</u> dollars (\$10.00) for all violations except snow route parking violations and improper use of a persons with disabilities parking permit. If such fine is not paid within thirty (30) days, it shall be increased by five dollars (\$5.00). The simple notice of a fine for snow route parking violations is <u>thirty</u> dollars (\$30.00) and the simple notice of a fine for improper use of a persons with disabilities parking permit is one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.







January 2020 Public Works Report

- Still waiting for the new dump truck and plow. Hoping to see delivery in the first or second week of February.
- Used 294 gal of diesel 268 of those were used for snow removal to date.
- Used 53.6 gal of unleaded gas for snow removal to date.
- Put down around 40 ton of sand/salt mix for the snow/ice events we have had.
- We aerated, thatched, and put down 2,300 lbs. of grass seed and 750 lbs. of slow release nitrogen on the soccer fields at Larson Park to try and achieve a dormant jump start for spring.
- A few employees attended the Iowa One Call safety program in Ames.
- Will be sending a letter to homeowners about the upcoming street repairs that we will be doing
 in the spring to notify those that have driveway approach issues that they can contact the
 contractor and see what it would cost them to have the contractor repair them while they are
 doing the streets and curbs. Should be much cheaper while the contractor is on site doing all
 the other repair work instead of them hiring it out to another contractor.
- The following information are the flows from the wastewater plant for your review: The influent flows are what are coming into the plant and the effluent flows are what we are discharging to the receiving stream.

- Bruce Timmons has given us his letter of resignation. His last day will be the 24th of January. We
 have posted the position. We have one of our own staff that is interested in the position and will
 be applying.
- Construction activities are still taking place at the North Lift Station Mitigation project. The
 contractor has pulled off for a couple weeks and should be back on site on the 27th of January to
 resume the work.
- We have had the electrical lines and communication lines that run to the lift station hit twice
 now by the contractor and have made temporary repairs until new wires and conduit can be
 installed. I have instructed the contractors that the lines and conduits will need to be replaced.
 They have not been very receptive to replacing them but after a couple meetings with them I
 think they understand the severity of the problem and the reason that I am wanting them
 replaced.
- We currently are rebidding the initial bids for the North lift station generator. We have been told it will need a 60KW instead of a 50KW, which we have bids for. Also working on bids for reconnecting the electrical and running the gas lines to the new generator since the old one is diesel and we will want to convert to natural gas as its energy source.

- One of the Sand Cherry Lift Station pumps has failed and was sent to the shop to
 determine the cause of the problem. This was the same pump that we just had repaired
 recently. It has been determined that the electrical cord going to the pump is the
 problem and overheated causing the pump to shut down. A new cord will be installed
 into the pump and ran back to the control panel. The pump should be back and
 reinstalled back into the wet well by the end of the week.
- Still working with the property owner on the easement on some wording to be signed for the generator at Oak lift station. The generator is waiting to be ordered and ABC will install the generator and controls.
- Tometich engineering has been out to analyze the settling of the RAS/WAS building at the wastewater plant and will follow up on the current status to see how much it has settled in the last few years since Story Construction did some injection pumping to stabilize it. Bruce and AJ had noticed that the lines and levels that were used to monitor the condition had moved since last time it was looked at and that some six and four inch water lines that failed in the ground had a lot of stress of them when they dug them up and had them repaired that they feel is due to the building still settling.
- The new utility pickup chassis is scheduled to be delivered mid to end of February. Box is to be completed at the manufacturing plant around Feb. 7th. Once the chassis arrives the utility box and accessories will be installed. The truck will then be ready to pick up.
- CMC has been in the process of moving their sampler, so we do not have to use Keystone. We will continue to use Keystone until CMC has completed their work.
- The Biosolids have been drained from the holding tanks at the wastewater plant and the solids have been land applied by the farmers contractor. The biosolids met all the laboratory analysis parameters so the solids could be land applied.
- AJ has passed his Grade II wastewater DNR exams. He has recently submitted the
 paperwork to the IDNR for review and approval to take the Grade II water treatment
 exam. Once approved he will be taking this exam as soon as they assign him a slot and
 time to take the test.
- Jacob Hanks recently passed his Grade II water Distribution and Grade II Water
 Treatment Licenses as well. Kudos to both AJ and Jake on these achievements.
- The Hygienic lab was out last week and did their biannual inspection of our lab and procedures and we passed. This allows us to still do our own testing in house instead of shipping them out to another lab and having to pay someone else to do them.
- We do have to update some of our SOPs and QA book per the lab inspection which will
 not affect the labs passing status and certification. This will be updated in the next few
 days.
- Since the new lean-to has been built over the panel view for the UV process we put the
 UPS back in the UV controls box and so far it seems to be performing without
 overheating and shutting down. We will continue to monitor its performance.

- The original videos of the Kum and Go sewer that was installed by their contractor on the site showed some deficiencies and we had some concerns so we had them re-video it after it was cleaned and we also followed up with our own video to make sure we were comfortable with it before we gave is a passing grade. Seems to be good at this point but we will monitor it in the future just to make sure.
- The wastewater plant has been working very well. The win 911 had a problem and automatic systems fixed if free of charge. We were without our computer for 10 days, but everything is back to normal now.
- Water Plant treated 10,635,000 gallons of water for the month of December 2019.
- We pumped a maximum of 493,000 gallons of water per day in December and a minimum of 251,000 gallons per day.
- This computed out to an average of daily treated water of 343,000 gallons per day.
- Water consumption was up about 3,000,000 gallons compared to last December.
- The new chlorine injection pump that was installed recently has been laser aligned and put back into service. This is a critically tight fit with a very high psi for this pump and needs to be laser aligned so we don't have premature failures.
- Three bids have been received for the removal and installation of new media in the iron filters. Just waiting for V&K to review the pilot study and advise on which media to re-install before we proceed with the purchase of the media and installation.
- Yellowblue Bulb who we contracted with on the purchase and installation of the LED bulbs at the water and wastewater plants has submitted the rebate forms to Consumers Energy for review and approval. We expect the rebates to be forthcoming very soon.
- Will also be sending the Ground Storage inspection report to Forest for his review and
 recommendation. We already have bids for blasting and repainting. Depending on what is
 recommended for the expansion of the plant with the engineers study we are wanting to make
 sure that we figure out what needs to be done now and what we should hold off on until the
 study is completed and what the engineers recommendations will be.
- Meadowlane plat 3 is still in a holding pattern after the grading was completed a couple months ago. They expected to be back on site in November but due to the weather i am assuming they won't start the underground infrastructure until the freezing weather breaks and gives them a window to proceed.
- The contractor on the I35 and Highway 210 project has taking the last week and a half off but should be back on site by January 22nd to start installing more pipe. All the sanitary sewer on the east side of I35 has been installed and connected to the sewer on the Kum and Go site. We still need to install the sanitary on the west side from I35 to the manhole behind CMC to have all the sanitary completed. Currently installing water main on the east side with about a couple thousand feet to go before they can pick up and mobilize to the west side of the interstate to finish the water on that side. All the water has been installed on the Kum and Go site and the bore under Highway 210 for the water has been completed and connected to the Kum and Go water main. The sub-contractor is expected to start the bore for the water main under Interstate 35 starting on January 23rd...

- The Westview project has been on and off due to the weather and the developer's contractor. It believe they are only going to be working when the temperatures are in the upper 30's. They will notify us when they return to the site so we can do the proper inspections.
- Been working with the engineering team on the Westview lift station. We feel that we have a lift station that will be dependable with less maintenance and upkeep in the future due to the quality of the building and pumping system. This station will also have the arc protection that is needed for the operator when working on or checking the controls which is much safer than the older panels in the other stations that we hope to upgrade in the future.
- I have got the final amendment notification from FEMA that we have received the extra money for the North lift Station Mitigation project. We had passed a resolution two council meetings ago that was sent for FEMA for review and final approval. This increases the money amount to \$335,000.00 from \$235,000.00 that we had originally thought the project would have cost until we received the bids that were much higher than the engineers estimate. The only difference in the new amendment is that the percentage to the city increased from 15% to 20.8% and the federal share went from 75% to 69.2%. The adjustment will still save us between \$30,000 and \$40,000.00. Much better than around \$125,000.00 which we would have spent without the additional funds. The state will still share its original 10% of the total.
- There is also a new homeowner on the Southwest corner of Oak Blvd. and Prairie View Drive that is requesting a waiver for the installation of their sidewalk on the North side of their property to be done at a later date if ever needed as requested by the City. I have provided the waiver and a couple maps in the council packet for your review and will be able to explain the situation at Tuesday's meeting if any of you still have questions or concerns. I am good with what they are requesting but I told them that all waiver requests would have to be approved by the council.

- 5. New Business

a. Livability Promotional Discussion

Drew Kamp discussed the upcoming Livability publication. The opportunity to purchase space in the publication is still open. Drew has materials and information if there are questions.

b. Fiscal Year 2021 Budget Discussion

As part of the adopted calendar and bylaws, the SCEDG and Board of Supervisors (BOS) are to meet annually to discuss the ongoing budget. The BOS allocation has increased over the past years, to the current level of \$110,000. Discussion among the group occurred as to whether that amount was adequate to meet the ongoing needs of communities and upcoming projects or whether an increase should be requested to the BOS. The discussion noted that amount was meeting current needs.

c. Review and Approval of FY2020 Project Funds Requests

Kamp reviewed the requests submitted. Communities present provided additional information and/or responded to questions from the group.

Cambridge - Request for \$2,500 for design costs for renovation of Opera House

David Thom reviewed the application. Jennifer Davies asked about ownership of the facility currently and in the future.

Collins – Request for \$2,500 for improvements to the community center and mural walk

Absent. Kamp reviewed the application with the group.

Colo – Request for \$2,000 for engineering costs for housing development

Amy Kohlwes noted the developer is interest in creating 33 lots. Gast asked if the City would own the land. Kohlwes responded that is likely and the sales prices would be form \$20,000 - \$25,000 each, however, all parties are still in discussions as to how to proceed.

Huxley – Request for \$2,500 for community promotion in Livability magazine

Craig Henry stated the opportunities for the use of the funds to promote southern Story County. Lauris Olson asked what message the city was hoping to share/call to action. Henry responded that it will provide opportunities to promote local businesses in the area looking to grown, lots for sale, allow business wanting to move to the community a way to reach potential employees, and give the message that we are in a good location and identify all we have to offer. Davies questioned how the magazine is delivered. Olson commented the price is high for the publication and suggested checking distribution. Dustin Ingram noted the digital marketing component (marketwatch.com). Olson asked if the ranking has to do with businesses and Ingram replied clarified that the ranking is very rigorous.

Roland - Request of \$2,500 for mulch for city parks

Jodi Meredith noted the total project costs will likely be \$8,000.

Zearing - Request for \$2,000 for radio upgrade for Zearing Fire and EMS services

Karin Davis said the amount requested was based on the initial costs from the vendor. Davies asked how many radios will be purchased. Davis responded that the total costs are approximately \$74,000 to cover 16 portable radios and 6 for vehicles.

Motion to approve project requests as discussed by Gast/Thom.

Discussion of the motion

Davies asked the BOS if requests for radios from other communities have been received. Linda Murken commented that the costs related to the StoryCom project remain a moving target at this point so the BOS is not in a position to know what funds may be available to provide financial assistance.

Kamp commented that if more projects had been requested that available funds, he would have concerns with the mulch request from Roland.

John Hall asked whether it would be better to wait until more information is known about the radios and wait until next year to decide such funding, setting aside monies from next year's project funds for that purpose. Murken questioned whether per capita funds could be used for radios. Kohlwes

commented communities are being required to commit by December 31 for the three years at 0% interest opportunity.

Olson commented that BOS may at any time ask the SCEDG to re-define economic development.

Fiscal Year 2019 Funds Awarded

For Fiscal Year 2019, the Story County Board of Supervisors budgeted \$110,000 in funding to the Story County Economic Development Group. These funds are distributed in two ways to eligible Story County communities:

- 1. Annual Allocation: Annually, all eligible Story County communities receive a base amount for attending meetings and being certified with the County, plus a per capita distribution of the funds allocated by the Story County Board of Supervisors.
- Project Funds (formally known as "Pool" funds): Project Funds consist of a maximum of 15% of the total funds allocated annually to the SCEDG from the Board of Supervisors. ۲į

Each eligible community may only submit one application and application requests shall not exceed \$2,500 per request.

These funds can be used to assist eligible communities in Story County with the following initiatives:

- Community marketing and prospecting
- Development of promotional materials
- Consulting and planning services
 - Speculative buildings
 - Financial incentives
- Tourism attractions (which create a major impact on the entire county events are not eligible)
- General community betterment activities
- Main Street projects which are part of a planned community project, including, but not limited to such things as streets aping, facilitators for planning, focus groups, and community-based restoration.
- Welcome signage and community entrance beautification
- Community driven housing promotion, including, but not limited to housings assessments, marketing of housing opportunities, and marketing for recruitment of potential developers
- Industrial park and commercial park preliminary studies
 - Directional and local attraction signage,



BYLAWS OF THE

STORY COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GROUP

ARTICLE 1: NAME AND PURPOSE

<u>Section 1.01. Name</u>. The name of the organization is the Story County Economic Development Group, herein after referred to as the "SCEDG."

<u>Section 1.02. Purpose</u>. The purpose of the SCEDG is to encourage economic development in Story County through joint efforts of Story County and the incorporated areas of Story County.

- Secure Story County (herein after referred to as "County") funding and to oversee the distribution of County funds annually budgeted by the Story County Board of Supervisors (herein after referred to as the "Board of Supervisors").
- Develop proposals for County funding of economic development initiatives and recommend funding to the Board of Supervisors.
- 3. Establish guidelines to administer the SCEDG County Funding Program (herein after referred to as "Program"). A copy of the Program Guidelines shall be attached to these bylaws, and by this reference, is made a part of these bylaws. The following initiatives are areas in which members of the SCEDG may use the Program, if deemed eligible:
 - a. Economic development staff and administration
 - b. Community marketing and prospecting
 - c. Development of promotional materials
 - d. Consulting and planning services
 - e. Speculative buildings
 - f. Tourism attractions (which create a major impact on the entire county)
 - g. Commercial development
 - h. General Community betterment activities (excluding general infrastructure)
 - i. Main Street projects which are part of a planned community project, including, but not limited to, such things as streetscaping, facilitators for planning, focus groups, and community-based restoration.

- j. Welcome Signage and Community Beautification
- k. Community-driven housing promotion, including, but not limited to housing assessments, marketing of housing opportunities, and marketing for recruitment of potential developers.
- I. Industrial and commercial park preliminary studies.
- m. Directional and local attraction signage.

Section 1.03. Membership. Every Community located in Story County, lowa, is eligible for membership provided each has executed an Appointed Representative Form which is attached to these bylaws, and by this reference, is made a part of these bylaws (herein after referred to as the "Form") and submitted said Form annually to the Board of Supervisors on or before January June 1st of the fiscal year in which they wish to participate. The appointed representative, or alternate(s), from each community may be from city staff or council, an economic development group, or a volunteer for said community; may not be a representative of the County in any manner; and may only represent one community from within Story County. The appointed representative and all alternates from each community may attend any and all meetings; however, each community will only have 1 voting representative. A representative of both the Story County Conservation Board and Story County Planning and Zoning Commission may serve as a non-voting ex-officio member.

Section 1.04. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year under which the SCEDG operates is from July 1st to June 30th.

ARTICLE 2: OFFICES

<u>Section 2.01. Principal Office</u>. The principal office of the SCEDG shall be as follows: Story County Economic Development Group, Story County Administration, 900 6th Street, Nevada, Iowa 50201. The mailing office for the SCEDG may change within Story County as may be necessary based on the Chairperson of the SCEDG.

<u>Section 2.02. Website</u>. The official website for the SCEDG shall be part of the Story County website, registered as <u>www.storycountyiowa.gov</u>.

ARTICLE 3: OFFICERS

<u>Section 3.01. Officers</u>. The officers of the organization shall be a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson and shall be known as the Executive Board of the SCEDG. The same person shall not hold more than one office concurrently.

<u>Section 3.02. Election and Term of Office</u>. The officers of the SCEDG shall be elected on even calendar years by the membership at the first regular meeting of that fiscal year. Each officer shall serve a two (2) year term, from July 1st through June 30th. Each officer shall hold office until his or her successor is elected.

<u>Section 3.03. Duties and Authority of Officers</u>. Each officer has the authority and shall perform the duties set forth in the bylaws.

<u>Section 3.04. Officer's Authority to Execute Documents</u>. Instruments in writing shall be authorized by the membership for signature by the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, or other member so authorized to sign documents.

<u>Section 3.05 Chairperson</u>. The Chairperson must be a voting representative from the member organization, shall set the agenda and preside at all meetings of the SCEDG. Except as authorized by the SCEDG, the Chairperson shall sign all instruments on behalf of the SCEDG. At each meeting, the Chairperson shall submit information related to the business affairs and policies of the SCEDG.

<u>Section 3.06. Vice-Chairperson</u>. The Vice Chairperson must be a voting representative from the member organization and shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the absence or incapacity of the Chairperson. In the case of resignations or death, the Vice Chairperson shall perform such duties as are imposed on the Chairperson until such time that the SCEDG shall elect a new Chairperson.

<u>Section 3.07. Failure to Perform Duties</u>. If an officer is unable or unwilling to perform his or her duties as outlined in this Article, the membership will hold a special meeting to elect a replacement officer.

ARTICLE 4: MEETINGS

<u>Section 4.01 Public Meetings</u>. The meetings of the SCEDG shall be public meetings and meet requirements of Chapter 21 of the Code of Iowa, as amended.

<u>Section 4.02. Regular Meetings</u>. The SCEDG shall generally meet quarterly at such time and place as may be designated by the Chair, and said meeting shall be known as a regular meeting of the SCEDG.

<u>Section 4.03. Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the SCEDG may be call by or at the request of the Chair.

<u>Section 4.04.</u> Notice of Meetings. Public notice will be given of the time, date, and place of the meeting and its tentative agenda. Reasonable notice of the meeting will be given to the media and posted on the official bulletin board at the County Administration Building in Nevada, lowa. All documents will be available to the public in compliance with the lowa Public Records Law outlined in Chapter 22 of the

Code of Iowa, as amended, in accordance with the adopted Story County Open Records Policy and Procedure, adopted by reference in these bylaws. This shall be accomplished by submitting all minutes and supporting documentation to the Story County Board of Supervisors for approval.

<u>Section 4.05. Quorum</u>. A majority of the membership of the SCEDG shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; but if less than a majority are present at the meeting, a majority of the membership present may adjourn the meeting without any further notice.

<u>Section 4.06. Minutes of the Meetings</u>. Minutes of the meeting shall be taken by a Story County Administrative staff member which shall be appointed by the County Board of Supervisors. Said staff member shall post the agendas; ensure all notices are provided in accordance with the provisions of theses bylaws or as required by law; prepare the minutes of each SCEDG meeting, verify their correctness, and file them with the County Board of Supervisors for their approval.

ARTICLE 5: VOTING AND RULES OF ORDER

<u>Section 5.01. Voting.</u> The voting on all financial matters coming before the SCEDG shall by roll call vote, and the ayes and nays shall be entered upon the minutes of such meeting. The voting / election of officers shall be by ballot. All other matters shall be by voice vote. No proxy voting shall be allowed.

<u>Section 5.02. Procedures</u>. All procedures in all meetings of the SCEDG shall be conducted according to the latest edition of Robert's Rule of Order, except where such rules are in conflict of the SCEDG's bylaws or its rules, regulation, or policies. On questions of parliamentary procedure not covered in these bylaws, a ruling by the Chairperson shall prevail.

<u>5.03.</u> Presumption of Assent. A member who is present at a meeting of the SCEDG at which action on any matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless dissent is enter in the minutes of the meeting or unless a written dissent to the action is filed with the person keeping minutes of the meeting before the adjournment of the meeting or forwards a dissent promptly after the adjournment of the meeting.

ARTICLE 6: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

<u>Section 6.01. Conflict of Interest</u>. Whenever a member has a financial or personal interest in any matter coming before the SCEDG, the SCEDG shall ensure that:

- 1. The interest of such member is fully disclosed to the SCEDG.
- No interested member may vote or lobby on the matter or be counted in determining the existence of a quorum at the meeting of the SCEDG at which such matter is voted upon.
- Any transaction in which a member has a financial or personal interest shall be duly approved by members of the SCEDG not so interested or connected as being in the best interests of the organization.
- 4. Payments to the interested member shall be reasonable and shall not exceed fair market value.
- 5. The minutes of meetings at which such votes are taken shall record such disclosure, abstention, and rationale for approval.

ARTICLE 7: COMPENSATION

<u>Section 7.01 Compensation</u>. Members of the SCEDG shall not receive any stated salaries or compensation from the SCEDG for his or her services.

ARTICLE 8: COMMITEES AND STAFF ASSISTANCE

<u>Section 8.01 Committees</u>. The SCEDG may designate committees with duties assigned by the SCEDG Membership of such committee(s) shall be comprised of members of the SCEDG.

<u>Section 8.02 Staff Assistance</u>. The County may provide staff assistance to provide technical assistance to the SCEDG.

ARTICLE 9: AMENDMENT PROCEDURES

Section 9.01. Amending Bylaws. The bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the members of the SCEDG at any regular or special meeting provided the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Executive Board and its recommendation presented to the members in writing. As amendments to these bylaws are adopted, the bylaws shall be revised to reflect that amendment and the date the bylaws were amended. Revised bylaws shall be submitted to the County within sixty (60) days from their passage and effective date.

<u>Section 9.02. Amending County Funding Program</u>. The Program may be changed, from time to time as conditions warrant and for the good of the organization, separate from the amendments made to these

bylaws. Amendments to the Program shall first be considered by the SCEDG subject to the approval of a majority vote of the membership who, in turn shall recommend actin action to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors shall consider the amendments at a regularly-scheduled meeting. The decision of the Board of Supervisors will be communicated in writing to the SCEDG within thirty (30) days from the date of consideration. Any approved amendments shall be documented in writing by the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors, signed and dated, and attached to the bylaws by the appointed County staff. Original documents shall be kept on file in the office of the Story County Auditor's Office.
