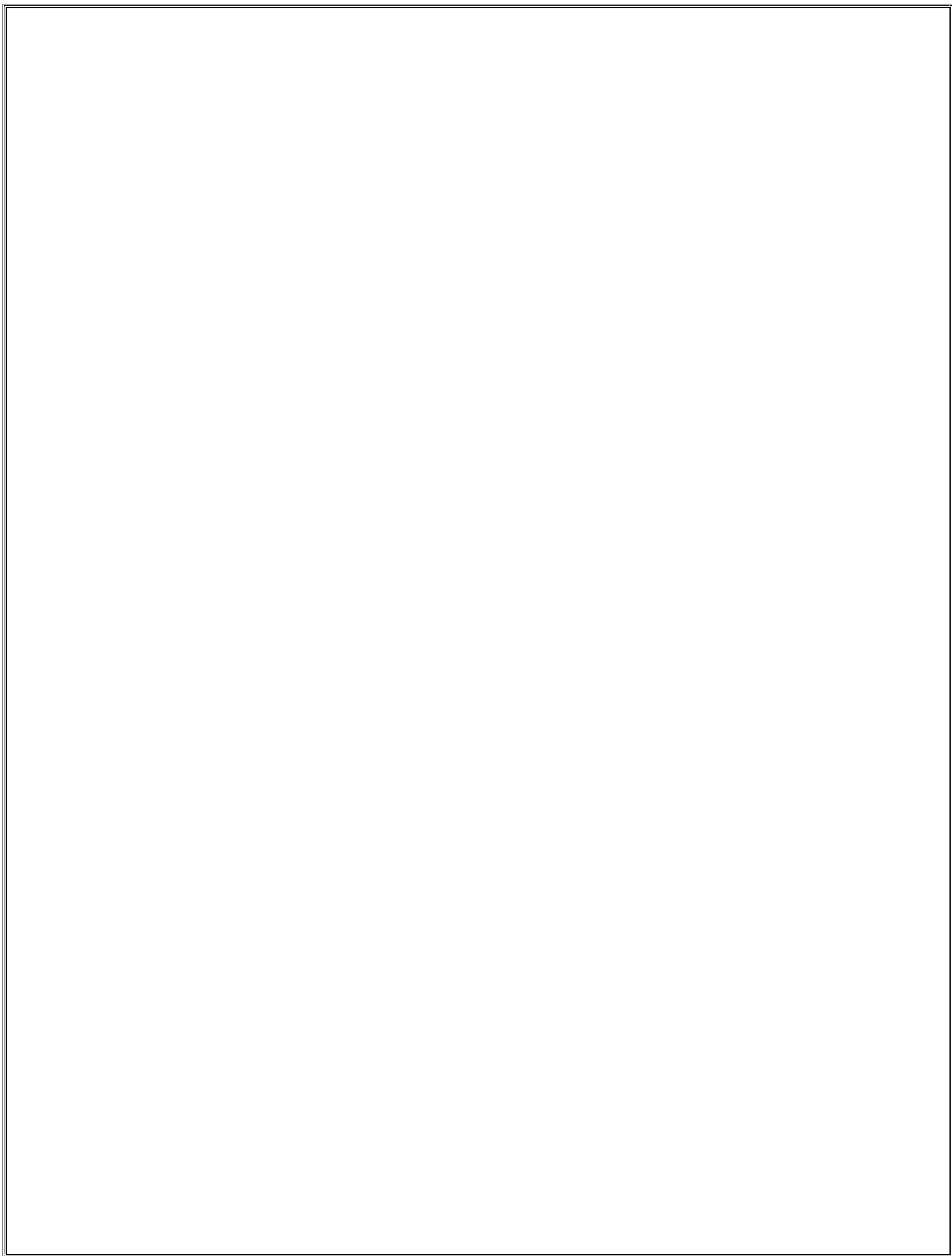

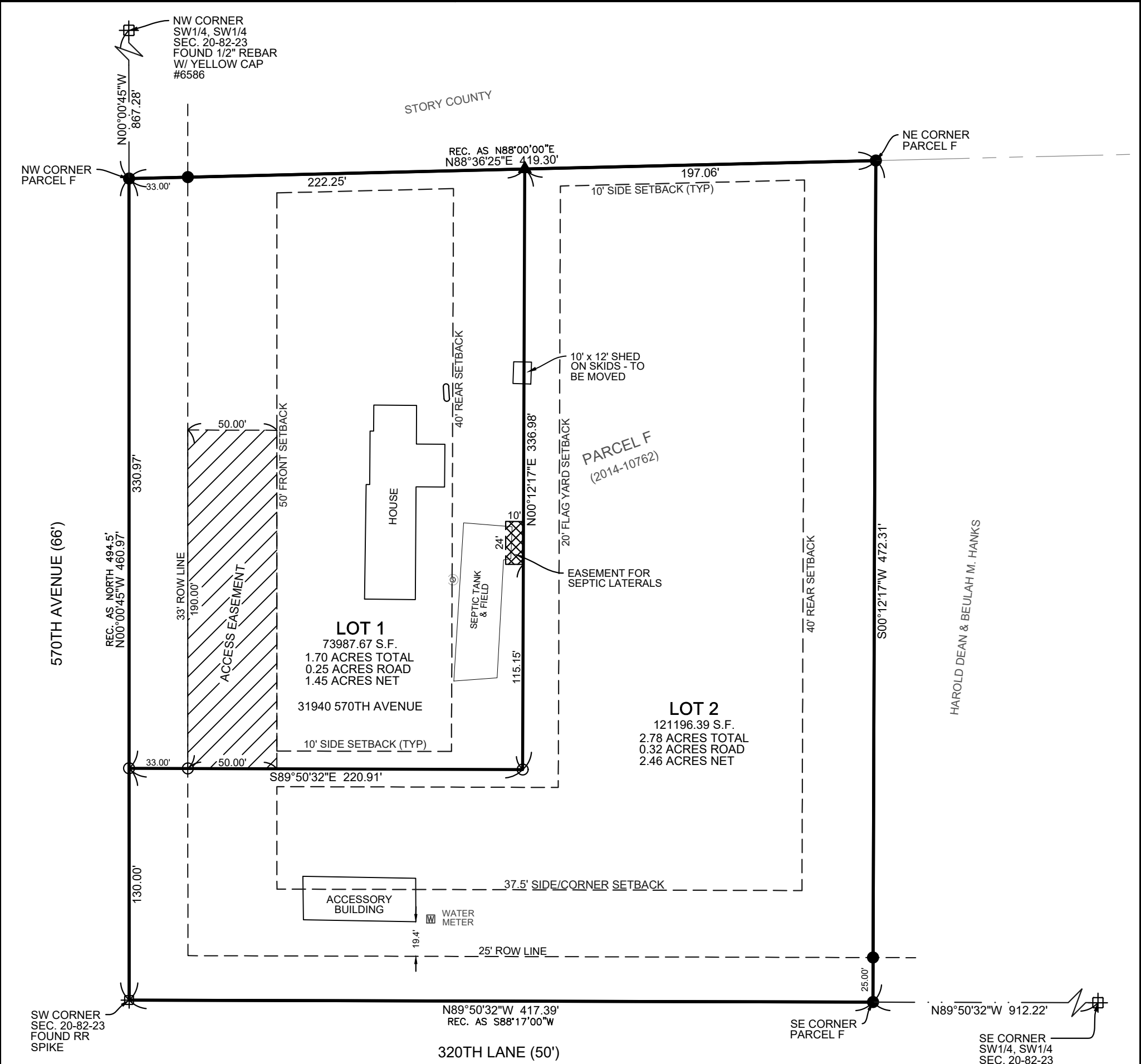

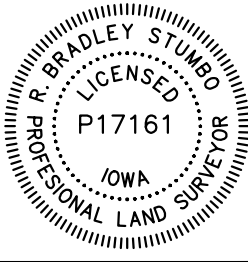

All new lots shall require an E911 address for inhabited structures, including residences and businesses, telecommunications towers and facilities, and for any public assembly area including open-air, outdoor activities. E911 addresses shall be assigned by Story County at the request of the property owner.

## **SYNOPSIS:**

On the October 27 Council agenda are four items for Council's information. A brief summary of each is provided below.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- Story County Economic Development Project Application (SCEDG). Included in Council materials is an application for \$2500 in grant funds for a Downtown Assessment to be conducted by the Downtown Resource Center at the Iowa Economic Development Authority. The first step of a planning initiative for the revitalization of the Main Avenue Corridor. A committee of stakeholders is in development and Main Street Iowa is being consulted for potential programs and resources. Business owners, building owners, residents, AEDC and HDC participation.
- As part of the Huxley Library's Strategic Plan Process, a community survey was conducted by phone. The survey developer was able to include a variety of questions that expanded to other aspect of life in Huxley. The results are included with Council packet materials and Director Van Maanen will provide detail at the meeting.
- Council requested an incident report that identified calls for Huxley Fire and Rescue within Huxley and outside of Huxley. The report is included with packet materials and Chief Moomaw will provide detail at the meeting. Staff has been in discussion in 2020 on possible opportunities to explore regionalization of service conversations with other South Story County communities.
- Three consultants have been contacted for detailed discussions and questions on conducting a goal setting/strategic planning process for the City of Huxley. They are the University of Northern Iowa Institute for Decision Making (this entity conducted an Economic Development Planning Process for the City, HDC and other stakeholders in 2015), Callahan Municipal Consultants (this entity conducted the City Administrator search in 2019) and Iowa State University Extension-Community and Economic Development. Each entity has conducted these types of processes over multiple years. Brief discussion Tuesday night on which process is the one that's most beneficial and applicable to where the City is and what is being sought.....

The City of Huxley is a municipal organization providing services to the public including water, wastewater, streets, stormsewer, fire/EMS, police, library, parks & recreation, community development and management of the City's budget, finances, annual reporting and tax dollars. The City was founded in 1882 and incorporated in 1902. The City is actively working to attract additional jobs and commercial/business development in the community to provide more service options for residents and diversify the tax base, including promoting the revitalization and rehabilitation of existing real estate and encouraging infill development .

Describe the project for which financial assistance is requested (including address if applicable):

In 2018, the City organized an initial meeting to include property owners and other stakeholders to develop plans and strategies for the Main Avenue-Old Towne area. The area includes some key infill development vacant sites, underutilized buildings, damaged buildings, opportunities for regional trail connectivity, placemaking and returning the area to one of vitality and commerce/mixed use. New street level businesses with the potential for residential uses above would maximize the density of the area and the ability to attract patrons and new business owners, in addition to supporting the businesses that are already there. The initiative would include re-engaging stakeholders, connection with the State of Iowa Main Street program for resources including plan development, evaluation of existing inventory, facilitation and other partnerships. The efforts would expand to incorporate additional areas of the Main

Avenue Corridor. The local business community is eager to re-energize these efforts and there is also a new development proposal that would serve to develop a key infill site currently housing the Ballard School District bus barn and some older recreational space that would be enhanced through the project, providing even more ability to attract activity to the area.

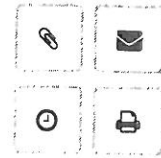
