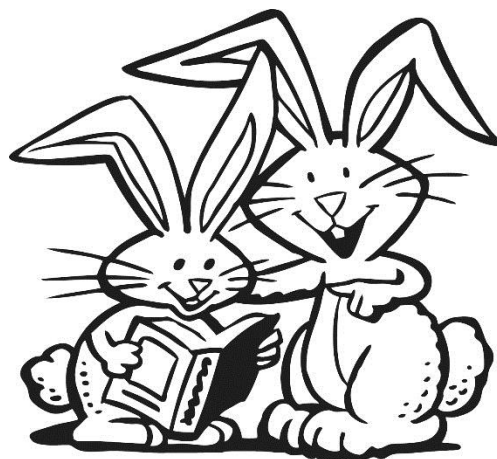


# **YOUTH ENRICHMENT**
