ORDINANCE #11 - 02

**DATE: July 19, 2011** 

INTRODUCED BY: Public Peace and Good Order Committee

SYNOPSIS: Amending Subsection 9.05(9) of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances (the Howling Animal Ordinance)

WHEREAS, the provisions of Juneau County Code of Ordinances § 9.05(9), the ordinance that is intended to control offensive noise from animals, are outdated and antiquated, and neither Juneau County nor the State of Wisconsin issue licenses for kennels or the like, as they used to do but have not done for many years; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of Juneau County that there be an effective ordinance to address the problem of animals that are disturbing the peace without proper control by their owners or handlers;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does amend Juneau County Code of Ordinances § 9.05(9), to read as follows:

"(9) Howling Animals. No person shall own, keep, possess or harbor any animal within the County which by frequent or habitual howling, yelping, barking or wailing disturbs other persons, provided that the provision of this section shall not apply to agricultural livestock operations or licensed animal hospitals operated for the treatment of animals, to humane societies, licensed kennels or to the premises used and occupied by the County or its designee for impounding animals."

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that said Ordinance, as amended, shall become effective the day after it is ordained and enacted by the Board of Supervisors.

WHEREAS, the Human Services Fund has a deficit from operations for 2010 of \$215,705 and Aging and Nutrition Fund has a surplus balance of \$65,262; and

WHEREAS, the Finance and Computer Committee recommends that a total of \$45,262 be transferred to the General Fund from the Aging and Nutrition and that \$200,000 be transferred from the General Fund to the Self Insurance Fund and \$300,000 be transferred from the General Fund to the Human Services Fund, at the end of 2010, and

WHEREAS, the Finance and Computer Committee recommends that the General Fund surplus be closed to the fund balance and that any other fund not mentioned above shall carry their surplus or deficit forward at the end of 2010;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE JUNEAU COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MET IN REGULAR SESSION, that the above recommendations are approved for the closing of the 2010 budget year.

INTRODUCED BY: Highway and Public Works Committee

SYNOPSIS: Approval Of An Expansion Of The New Lisbon Sports Club Building And A New 30 Year Lease For The Premises.

WHEREAS, the New Lisbon Sports Club, Incorporated, a Wisconsin nonprofit corporation, currently occupies and maintains the County-owned building located on the Juneau County Landfill property near the demolition landfill site, pursuant to a long-term lease agreement with the County, as its club headquarters and activities center; and

WHEREAS, the New Lisbon Sports Club intends to build as soon as possible an addition of 31 feet 9 inches by 23 feet onto the existing structure of 23 feet 9 inches by 23 feet 9 inches, at its own expense, and to donate said addition to Juneau County in perpetuity, in return for a new lease of thirty (30) years to the Club from the County; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid proposal is in the best interests of the residents of Juneau County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the County Board of Supervisors of Juneau County shall and hereby does approve of (1) the aforesaid plan by the New Lisbon Sports Club to build at its own expense an addition of 31' 9" by 23' onto the existing building as soon as possible and (2) the granting of a new lease from the County to the Club for the use and maintenance of the entire building for a period of thirty (30) years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the County Board shall and hereby does authorize County Board Chairperson Alan K. Peterson and County Clerk Kathleen C. Kobylski to sign the written lease agreement as the official act of Juneau County, as soon as it is drafted and/or approved by Juneau County Corporation Counsel David E. Lasker.

INTRODUCED BY: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

INTENT: Oppose Trust Land Status for Ho-Chunk Land Purchases in Town of Kildare and Town of Lyndon

SYNOPSIS:

FISCAL NOTE: None

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation has acquired certain real estate in the Town of Kildare and the Town of Lyndon, and has asked the Bureau of Indian Affairs to approve placement of that land in trust, which will mean that the land will become tax-exempt and immune to many state, county and local regulations;

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk have already acquired a large amount of real estate in Sauk County, and own a great deal of land in Juneau County, which is already in trust status and exempt from taxation and regulation;

WHEREAS, it is unnecessary and inappropriate for the federal government to grant additional tax exemptions to the Ho-Chunk nation;

WHEREAS, it is contrary to the public interest for the Ho-Chunk to be granted status on scattered parcels of land through the vicinity, which will have the effect of causing jurisdictional confusion and inconsistent regulation of land use, water quality and public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, that the County of Juneau hereby opposes placing the Town of Kildare and Town of Lyndon lands acquired by the Ho-chunk Nation in trust;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Juneau County Board urges the United States Congress and President to enact legislation that would provide for a payment in lieu of taxes to the state, county, school and local taxing districts to replace taxes lost on all land that is placed in trust for Indian tribes.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to The United States
President, United States 3<sup>rd</sup> Congressional District Representative, United States Department of Interior – Bureau of
Indian Affairs, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, President of the Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin, Division of
Natural Resources Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin, Chairman of the Town of Kildare, Chairman of the Town of
Lyndon.

Whereas, Juneau County has developed an All Hazards Mitigation Plan consistent with local plan criteria contained in 44 CFR Part 201, as authorized by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and current Wisconsin Emergency Management guidelines, and the Plan identifies both likely hazards faced by municipalities in the County and how vulnerable those municipalities are to each hazard; and

Whereas, Juneau County and participating municipalities must adopt the plan in order to have a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)-approved hazard mitigation plan so as to be eligible for funding through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, the Flood Mitigation Assistance Program, and the Repetitive Flood Claims Program; and

Whereas, the current All Hazards Mitigation Plan is a proper update of the original All Hazards Mitigation Plan first adopted by the County on January 20, 2004, and has undergone maintenance and revision as originally designed into the Plan through the efforts of Juneau County's business and public outreach, county departmental. involvement, emergency management research, coordinated analysis with state and local agencies, and lessons learned from exercises and actual events occurring in the County;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does approve and support implementation of the updated Juneau County All Hazards Mitigation Plan.


