Whereas, the Department of Transportation has notified the County Clerk that funds estimated to be in the amount of \$838,900 will be made available to Juneau County for county transportation expenditures for the year 2012 under the provisions of sec. 86.30 and 20.395 Wisconsin Statutes, and

Whereas, said funds will be used for the county trunk highway system in accordance with priorities established by the Public Works Committee, Public Works Director and the County Board;

Therefore be it resolved, that the Public Works Committee is authorized and directed to expend above referenced funds to the extent required to match and supplement federal aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any federal projects located on the County trunk highway system in Juneau County, which are not recovered from federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing and maintaining the county trunk highway system and bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal, as directed in sec. 83.015 Wis. Stats., and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to sec. 83.01 (6) Wis. Stats., and

Be It Further Resolved that the following categories of expenditures be authorized, appropriations made and taxes levied as itemized below:

Whereas, certain additional highway improvements in the county trunk highway system are necessary and warranted;

Therefore be it resolved by the County Board of Supervisors that the following appropriations are authorized for the purposes itemized below, including construction, maintenance, operating expenses, equipment purchases and supervision:

1. The sum of \$432,488 for highway administration with offsetting revenue of \$177,450, for a levy of \$255,038.
2. The sum of \$109,800 for State supervision with offsetting revenue of \$99,000, for a levy \$10,800;
3. The sum of \$9,000 for radio maintenance with offsetting revenue of \$2,200 and a levy of \$6,800.
4. The sum of \$36,465 for general public liability with offsetting revenue of \$14,000, for a levy of \$22,465;
5. The sum of \$24,056 for the Truck Wash Center;

6. The sum of \$1,387,363 for CTHS maintenance with offsetting revenue of \$838,900 for a levy of \$548,463;
7. The sum of \$674,997 for snow removal on the county trunk highway system;
8. The sum of \$1,236,920 for improvement of the county trunk highway system, with offsetting revenue of \$1,108,270, for a levy of \$128,650, as far as said sum will construct;
9. The sum of \$18,600 for bridge construction;
10. The sum of \$397,875 for lease and debt payments, with offsetting revenue of \$79,599, for a levy of \$318,276;
11. The sum of \$135,500 for capital outlay;

Whereas, the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making an appropriation;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board of Supervisors does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement, after the same shall have been completed, may be used by the Public Works Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the highway budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year; and

Whereas, the exact amount of funds that will become available in 2012 from the State of Wisconsin for highway purposes in Juneau County under Sec. 20.395 and 86.30 Wis. Stats., will not be known until on or after December of any given year;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as herein itemized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purpose for which appropriated, and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Sec. 20.395 and 86.30 Wis. Stats., and



RESOLUTION # 11 - 54

DATE: November 8, 2011

INTRODUCED BY: Highway and Public Works Committee

SYNOPSIS: Authorizing All Terrain Vehicle Policy and ATV Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Highway and Public Works Committee of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors has considered and approved the attached Juneau County Policy for All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Routes on the County Trunk Highway System (consisting of 4 pages, including a proposed form application); and

WHEREAS, the Highway and Public Works Committee of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors has considered and approved the attached Agreement between the Juneau County Highway Department and the Juneau County ATV Council, Inc., regarding ATV Routes on County Highways (consisting of 1 page); and

WHEREAS, the proposed new section 7.17 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances, entitled All-Terrain Routes and Operation has been approved and recommended by the Highway and Public Works Committee and is being taken under consideration for enactment on the same date as this resolution is under consideration;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, in the event the aforesaid Ordinance Section 7.17 is enacted by the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, said Board shall and hereby does approve and adopt said proposed Juneau County Policy for All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Routes on the County Trunk Highway System and further shall and hereby does authorize County Board Chairperson Alan K. Peterson to sign and enter into the said Agreement with the Juneau County ATV Council, Inc. as the official act of Juneau County.




