# POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES OF THE JUNEAU COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

# General Provisions for Committees of the County Board (Including Statutory Boards or Commissions)

1. **General:** The powers of the county are exercised by the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, as a body politic, through the adoption of ordinances, resolutions, or motions. When it will serve the best interests of the county, the county board may delegate authority over the conduct of specific items of business through a committee.

The term "committee" as used herein includes elected committees, statutory committees, standing committees, and boards and commissions.

The county board may, by resolution, establish the purpose, duties and manner of reporting of the committees.

- 2. **Appointment:** Unless otherwise provided, members of committees shall be appointed by the chairperson of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors. All duly elected supervisors shall serve on their current committees until the county board chairperson appoints new committees.
- 3. **Minutes:** Each committee shall prepare and keep minutes of the proceedings of its meetings, and shall provide the Juneau County Clerk with a copy of same.
- 4. **Notice of meetings:** All notices of meetings shall be placed on an information board in the Courthouse and published on the County website at least 24 hours prior thereto. Such notice shall set forth the subject matter of said meeting as required by Wis. Stats. §§ 19.84 and 19.85.

An information copy of the meeting notice shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to the official newspaper of the Juneau County Board, and to all other media outlets requesting such copies, by the sponsoring committee.

The county board by ordinance may establish a separate procedure for convening the county board in a "declared emergency" as defined by county ordinance.

- 5. Schedule: All committees shall meet regularly and as needed.
- 6. **Duties and Responsibilities:** The duties and responsibilities of committees shall be as established by the county board, is-so-far as they are delegable and do not conflict with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
  - a. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to request that the county board acquire and hold, lease or rent real and personal property for public uses or purposes of any nature, within the limits and purposes of their respective department budgets.
    - All purchases made by a committee on behalf of its respective department shall be made by said committee and upon the signature of its chairperson.
  - b. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to terminate, replace, or discontinue personnel in accordance with the Personnel Policy

- of Juneau County, and in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Equal Rights Division of the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development.
- c. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall refer all civil or criminal actions, to which the County is a party, to the corporation counsel or to the district attorney.
- d. Questions regarding policy or the powers or duties of any committee of the county board shall be brought before the board for resolution.
- 7. **Review Responsibility:** Committees shall evaluate programs under their jurisdiction to determine program definition, goals and objectives, costs, efficiency and effectiveness.
  - Committees shall recommend an annual budget for each department under their jurisdiction to the Juneau County Finance & Computer Committee and the county board.
- 8. **Reports:** All committees, or committee members, who attend conferences, conventions, or who represent the County in any type meeting in which the business of the County is affected or discussed, shall make a verbal, or if otherwise beneficial, a written report to the county board at its regular meeting.

#### **ELECTED COMMITTEES**

#### Highway and Public Works Committee.

The highway and public works committee shall consist of five county board members who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the county board for a term of two years to represent the county as follows:

One county board member to represent the northern region; One county board member to represent the southeastern region:

One county board member to represent the southwestern region;

Two county board members elected at large.

The powers and duties of the highway and public works committee shall be to function pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stats. § 83.015, and to report to the county board on matters pertinent to the highway department and the landfill.

#### STANDING AND STATUTORY COMMITTEES

Standing committees are considered to be committees of the county board to which matters brought before the county board are referred to for review, study, recommendation, or action.

Statutory committees may be defined as those which are specified in state law, if the county provides a particular service governed by statute or when a statute mandates a particular committee to be established.

#### General duties of committees, boards, and commissions are as follows:

- a. Review and recommend the annual budget for county departments
- b. Review of department financial reports for each of the county departments within the committee's oversight
- c. Direct and guide policy and accountability of the departments within the committee's oversight

- d. Approve departmental policies
- e. Review and recommend staffing levels and hours
- f. Review and recommend grant applications and acceptances
- g. Approve departmental fee schedules which are not governed by other law
- h. Review and recommend departmental short and long range goals
- i. Approve and bring forth intergovernmental agreements and contracts as necessary or as otherwise authorized by law
- j. Approve and bring forth resolutions and ordinances for action by the county board
- k. Allow any member of the county board to review any county financial record upon request, subject to HIPAA or other confidentiality rules

#### 1. Land & Water Conservation Committee

A committee on land and water resources conservation is authorized to be created by Wis. Stats. § 59.70(19). A land conservation committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. §§ 59.70(19), (20) and 92.06.

This joint committee shall consist of four county board members.

The duties of the land and water resources conservation committee shall be to:

- (1) function in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.56(3) in all matters relating to the personnel, duties and activities of the state agriculture and extension education department;
- (2) serve as members of the land and water resources conservation committee and function in accordance with provisions of Wis. Stats. ch. 92; and
- (3) serve as committee of jurisdiction in matters relating to the Farmland Preservation Law, Wis. Stats. ch. 91.

#### 2. Extension Education Committee

The committee shall consist of four members of the county board.

The duties of the extension education committee shall be to function in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.56(3) in all matters relating to the personnel, duties and activities of the state agriculture and extension education department.

#### 3. Personnel & Insurance Committee

This committee shall consist of four county board members.

- (a) The duties of the personnel and insurance committee in regard to personnel shall be to:
- (1) Recommend to the county board of supervisors the salaries and other compensation to be paid to all county officers and employees.
- (2) Confer with the various committees, offices and departments upon the creation of new positions as well as classification and salary thereof.
- (3) Review requests for position reclassification and make recommendations to the county board for the acceptance, rejection or modification of same.
- (4) Consider and make recommendations to the county board regarding organization of departments, re-organization and staffing levels.

- (5) Hear grievances when authorized by union contracts or by the county personnel policy.
- (6) Establish an employment policy, which conforms to state and federal laws, and provide for the screening, testing and selection of qualified personnel for employment by the county.
  - (7) Develop a code of ethics as may be deemed necessary by the county board of supervisors.

(b) The duties of this committee in regards to insurance shall be to:

- (1) Determine the amount of bonds to be furnished by the various officers to the county, and report on the sufficiency of each bond to the county board.
- (2) Supervise the placing of all types of insurance upon all county buildings and properties required for the protection of the county, with the approval of the county board supervisors.
- (3) Review annually all bonds, liability and all other types of insurance carried by the county and make recommendations to the county board as is deemed necessary.
- (4) Administer a countywide safety program in accordance with prescribed health and safety standards.
  - (5) Monitor the property inventory of the county for insurance purposes.
  - (6) Review all liability claims against the county.

#### 4. Building Committee

The building committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the building committee shall be to:

- (1) Inspect, from time to time, all county buildings, except those under the jurisdiction of another committee, and to ensure the proper repairs and maintenance of such buildings
  - (2) Coordinate the re-allocation of office spacing in county buildings.
- (3) Receive bids, where necessary, or otherwise let contracts on time and materials, using its best judgment, for the proper maintenance and repair of county buildings. All contracts, bids and specifications shall be let in accordance with Wis. Stats. §§ 59.52(29) and 66.0901, where applicable, and when approved by the county board. The original copy of each contract shall be filed in the county clerk's office.
  - (4) Supervise the maintenance staff of buildings not under the jurisdiction of any other committee.

#### 5. Emergency Management Committee

An emergency management committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 323.14(1)(a)3. The emergency management committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure the coordination of efforts with the state office of emergency government and county and local emergency government officials.
- (2) Make recommendations to the county board of supervisors' relative to the county's responsibilities in regard to emergency government in accordance with Wis. Stats. ch. 166, with the assistance of the emergency government director.

#### 6. Executive Committee

This executive committee shall consist of the elected chairperson and two vice-chairpersons of the county board.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Prepare the agenda for each county board meeting.
- (2) Consider and evaluate resolutions to be taken up at the county board meeting.
- (3) Consider and resolve all special problems that may arise between sessions of the county board that do not fall in the province of a regular committee; or to act when the county board has not taken action to appoint a special committee; or to take action on matters of an emergency nature between sessions of the county board.
- (4) Act as the oversight committee for all the elected officials of the county and the corporation counsel.

The chairperson of the county board, or any member of the three-person executive committee of the board, shall be allowed to attend a meeting of any county committee for the purpose of constituting a quorum, allowing for the committee to function and conduct business when it might not otherwise do so because of a member not being present for the meeting.

For the orderly consideration of county business, any person or committee seeking to have a matter considered by the executive committee of the county board at its monthly meeting shall submit the matter to the county clerk no later than the Friday before the executive committee is scheduled to meet; otherwise, the proposed matter may not be approved by the executive committee for inclusion on the agenda of the monthly county board meeting, unless the committee in its discretion determines the matter to be of such importance that an exception shall be made.

For all county committees: As soon as possible after members of a county committee have been appointed by the chairperson of the county board, the appointed or elected chairperson of the committee shall conduct an election in which a majority of the committee members select a committee member who is a member of the county board to be vice-chairperson of the committee to act in the place of the chairperson, when he or she is absent from a meeting of the committee.

#### 7. Finance and Computer Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members.

The power vested in the county board in Wis. Stats. § 65.90 with regard to budgetary policy is delegated in part to this committee, whose duties shall be to:

- (1) Prepare an annual budget for the county, submit same to the county board for its consideration and arrange for its publication and notice of hearing.
- (2) Transfer funds between budgeted items of a county department, if such budgeted items have been separately appropriated, up to \$15,000.00.
- (3) Supplement the appropriations for a particular office, department or activity by transfers from the contingent fund. Such committee transfers shall not exceed the amount set up in the contingent fund as adopted in the annual budget, nor aggregate in the case of an individual office, department or activity in excess of \$15,000.00 of the funds originally provided for such office, department or activity.

- (4) Review and make recommendations to the county board for appropriation to a current year budget for a purpose that was not anticipated in the budget. A vote of two thirds of the county board is required to approve such an appropriation.
- (5) Examine the financial condition of the county on a timely basis and advise departments, and the county board thereof.
- (6) Monitor the investment of the county's funds with the county treasurer, and recommend to the county board such investment procedures and use of depositories as will be most beneficial to the county.
- (7) Select and negotiate a contract for the annual audit of the accounts of county with a recognized independent audit firm, and recommend same to the county board of supervisors.
- (8) Meet with the independent auditor after completion of each annual audit and arrange for the auditor to review the findings of the audit with the county board of supervisors upon request of any county board member.
- (9) Set policy and ensure proper administration and application of computer services in the various departments of the county government.

#### 8. Board of Health

- (1) The board of health as a committee shall consist of five members from the county board of supervisors and four citizens who are not members of the county board.
- (2) Non-supervisor committee members will be selected using the criteria described as follows in the Board of Health composition policy:
  - "[M]embers shall have a demonstrated interest or competence in the field of public health or community health. In appointing the members who are not elected officials or employees, a good faith effort shall be made to appoint a registered nurse and a physician, except that if the appointing authority is unable to locate a willing registered nurse, physician, or both, it shall make a good faith effort to appoint a physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or both. Members of the local board of health shall reflect the diversity of the community..."
  - (3) All members of the board of health have voting rights.
- (4) Non-supervisors are appointed by county board chairperson, cannot serve longer than three consecutive two-year terms without a year break. Terms shall be staggered so that not all experience and historical knowledge is gone every 2 years.
  - (5) All members serve at the pleasure of county board chairperson.
  - (6) Supervisors' terms are two-year terms, concurrent with county board elections.
- (7) Members must attend 75% of meetings in person or by electronic means, unless excused by the county health officer.

- (8) The board shall function within the parameters set forth in the "Powers and Duties of Juneau County Committees," §§ 2-710 and 2-711 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances, and Wis. Stats. § 251.03(1).
  - (9) A vice-chair shall be elected by the board and must be a member of the county board.

#### 9. Industrial & Recreation Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the industrial and recreation committee shall be to:

- (1) cooperate with the industrial development corporations within the county;
- (2) recommend programs to the county board for the improvement and development of recreational sites for the good of the county; and
- (3) perform the duties stated in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.56, 59.57 and 59.71.

#### 10. Land, Forestry, Parks & Zoning Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members.

The duties of the land, forestry, parks and zoning committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure the proper management of all county forest lands, including special use lands, as provided in Wis. Stats. § 28.11, the county forestry ordinance, and the comprehensive ten-year forest management plan.
- (2) Work with the area forester to develop acceptable forestry practices, multiple use projects and outdoor recreational developments.
- (3) Cooperate with the department of natural resources on the conservation aid program and other conservation matters.
- (4) Provide for the appraisal, advertising, sale and closure of sales of all county lands as provided in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.52(6) and 75.35(2).
- (5) Supervise the construction, improvement and maintenance of all county-owned parks and exercise jurisdiction over park personnel, policies and schedules.
  - (6) Coordinate matters of importance with the county surveyor.
- (7) Recommend to the county board the enactment, amendment or repeal of such ordinances as in its opinion are in the best interests of the people of the county in all matters pertaining to zoning.
- (8) Carry out comprehensive plans; perform such additional duties and have such additional authority as the county board of supervisors may confer upon them.
  - (9) Ensure compliance with Wis. Stats. ch. 59, subch. VII.
  - (10) Receive applications for and recommend appointments of the zoning administrator.

(11) To act as called for under §§ 6-75, 6-77(b), and 6-97 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances.

#### 11. Sheriff & Jail Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the sheriff and jail committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure proper supervision of the sheriff's office and make such recommendations to the sheriff and to the county board, as they shall from time to time deem advisable and in the best interests of the county.
- (2) Recommend to the county board the number of deputy sheriffs that should be maintained in the county.
- (3) Review the operation of and establish internal operating policies for the proper administration of the sheriff's department and the jail.
- (4) Review all requests for equipment, services, salaries, wages or other compensations applying to the sheriff's department, the sheriff, the deputies, the undersheriff, and the jail, and approve/disapprove, or make recommendations to the county board on same.
- (5) Regulate and monitor the enforcement of Wis. Stats. ch. 174 pertaining to stray dogs in the county.
- (6) Coordinate the installation, maintenance and operation of the emergency 911 telephone system and tower communication system in accordance with Wis. Stats. §§ 59.54(9) and 256.35 and a rural numbering system in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.54(4).

#### 12. Veterans Committee

The veterans' committee shall consist of three county board members appointed by the county board chairperson.

The duties of the veterans' committee shall be to:

- (1) ensure proper administration of the veteran's service office in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 45.001 et seq.; and
- (2) receive applications for, and recommend appointment of the veteran's service officer to the county board.

#### 13. Local Emergency Planning Committee

The local emergency planning committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 59.54(8).

The membership shall consist of three county board members and twelve non-members.

The powers and duties of the local emergency planning committee shall be as outlined in Wis. Stats. § 59.54(8).

#### 14. Committee on Aging and Disability

This Committee shall consist of twelve members, three of whom are elected members of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, plus at least six but no more than nine citizen consumer representatives.

The governing board of the county office of the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Eagle Country Juneau County Office shall be known as the committee on aging and disability, and it shall consist of twelve persons, three of whom are county board members, also known separately as the aging and disability resource center (ADRC) advisory council. The committee on aging and disability shall enact bylaws consistent with the statutes and regulations applicable to the family care program administered by the state department of health services.

- (a) The members of the committee on aging and disability shall be appointed by the county board at its annual organizational meeting or at time of vacancy for a term ending the following calendar year. At least 51 percent of the committee shall be persons' age 60 years or over and shall be non-elected officials. The committee members shall represent all income levels and minority backgrounds of the older adult population in the county, including at least one public member representing the elderly, at least one public member representing disabled individuals, and at least one public member representing individuals with mental illness.
- (b) The ADRC board's public members shall serve three-year staggered terms. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms.

In addition to its other duties, including duties as prescribed in Wis. Stats § 46.82, the committee on aging and disability shall:

- (1) Develop and implement an annual, comprehensive, coordinated county aging plan for programs for older people.
- (2) Give policy direction to staff for the county aging unit to carry out activities consistent with the purpose of this section.
- (3) Review and approve proposals relating to matters affecting older people that are considered by the county board.
- (4) Identify and encourage the development of opportunities which enable older people to fully contribute to the welfare of the community.
  - (5) Nominate persons to serve on the ADRC advisory council.

The **Nutrition Project Council** serves as a subcommittee under the Committee on Aging and Disability. The Council is comprised of the same three members of the county board serving on the Committee on Aging and Disability plus up to 9 additional non-members serving in an advisory capacity.

The duties of the council shall be to:

- (1) Ensure proper management of the county nutrition sites.
- (2) Coordinate activities with the District 1 Area Agency on Aging, Age Advantage, Madison, Wisconsin.
- (3) Ensure the proper administration of all programs under title III of the Older Americans Act.
- (4) Make timely reports and recommendations to the county board of supervisors on matters of interest to senior citizens of the county.

No supervisor may serve more than three terms on the council.

#### 15. Affirmative Action

The Affirmative Action Officer for Juneau County shall be a county board member whose duties shall be to assure the proper administration of the Juneau County Affirmative Action Plan.

#### 16. Safety and Security Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members, including a member of the Building Committee, a member of the Personnel & Insurance Committee, a member of the Highway & Public Works Committee, and two additional members of the county board appointed by the chairperson of the county board.

The committee shall have regular meetings, and its duties shall be to review and administer all requirements and programs relating to the safety and health of Juneau County employees and members of the public in the county workplace.

- 1. Review and guide policy and accountability relating to the security of buildings, vehicles, equipment, and grounds under jurisdiction of Juneau County Board of Supervisors.
- 2. Review and monitor all security policies and protocols of Juneau County to ensure they are current and updated annually.
- 3. Develop and monitor policies in accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes and OHSA requirements.
- 4. Develop and promote a culture making safety a top priority for all employee's and guests of Juneau County.
- 5. Develop policies and protocols outlining steps to identify and report safety issues and concerns.
- 6. Perform annual audit of buildings and grounds safety and security policies and protocols to ensure compliance.
- 7. Generate quarterly reports to the Executive Committee.

#### 17. Negotiating Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Prepare labor agreement proposals and negotiate same with the represented labor organizations.
- (2) Act as the committee to hear grievances when same is required by a specific labor agreement, or the personnel policy.

#### 18. Land Information Council

The land information council shall consist of three county board members and relevant county department heads.

The duties of the land information council shall be to:

(1) Establish a land information office for the county to develop, implement and maintain a countywide plan for land records modernization.

(2) Make periodic reports to the county board of supervisors on the progress of this program.

#### 19. Peace and Good Order Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Oversee the implementation of the county junkyard ordinance.
- (2) Oversee implementation and administration of the county's adult entertainment ordinance.
- (3) Consider issues where ordinances should be revised, created or eliminated to address changing needs and circumstances in the county.
- (4) Review the provisions of this Code and recommend updates and revisions to the Code as warranted.

#### **BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS**

#### Community Action

This community action committee shall consist of one county board member.

The duties of this committee shall be to attend meetings of the Central Wisconsin Community Action Council and make timely reports to the county board about the various federal programs of interest to the people of the county.

#### Drainage Board

This drainage board shall consist of five persons appointed by the circuit court judge of the county.

The duties of the drainage board shall consist of the responsibilities outlined in Wis. Stats. ch. 88.

#### **Housing Authority**

The county housing authority shall consist of five members. Two members shall be county board members, and three members shall not be members of the county board to be appointed for a term of five years.

The duties and responsibilities of the housing authority shall be as outlined in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.53(22) and 66.1201 through 66.1211.

#### Juneau County Human Services Board

The county human services board shall be and hereby is established in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 46.23(4).

The human services board shall consist of seven members. Four of the members shall be county board members and three of the members shall be non-members of the county board appointed for a term of three years.

The human services board, created by the county board of supervisors pursuant to authority contained in Wis. Stats. § 46.23(4), shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Delivery of human services in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 46.23(3).
- (2) Perform the services required by Wis. Stats. chs. 46, 48, 49 and 51.
- (3) Prepare and submit an annual budget to the county board of supervisors in support of the human services department, and the human services board.
  - (4) Appoint advisory committees to recommend policy to the human services board.

#### Winding Rivers Library Board

This board shall be comprised of representatives of the several counties in the Winding Rivers Library delivery system, of which two members shall be appointed by the county board chairperson to represent Juneau County; one being a county board member, and one being a non-member.

The duties of these representatives shall be to represent the county on the Winding Rivers Library System Board, and to periodically report to the Juneau County Board of Supervisors.

#### **Traffic Safety Commission**

The establishment of a traffic safety commission is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 83.013.

The traffic safety commission shall be composed of the county highway commissioner or a designated representative; the chief county law enforcement officer or a designated representative; the county highway safety coordinator and a representative designated by the county board from each of the disciplines of education, medicine and law, and three representatives involved in law enforcement, highways and highway safety designated by the secretary of transportation.

#### **Zoning Board of Adjustment**

The zoning board of adjustment is created in the Shore Land-Wetlands Zoning Ordinance. See Appendix A, § 14.5, of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances.

This board shall consist of five persons who are not members of the county board, to be appointed by the chairperson of the county board.

#### **Veterans Service Commission**

The veterans service commission shall consist of at least three residents of the county who are veterans, who may or may not be members of the county board, and are appointed for staggered 3-year terms by the county board chairperson.

The duties of the veterans' service commission shall be as prescribed in Wis. Stats. ch. 45.

SYNOPSIS: An Ordinance Establishing New Rules Regarding Speed Limits of ATV/UTV Routes and Road Closures on County Highways

WHEREAS, the Highway and Public Works Committee has determined that it is reasonable and appropriate to allow all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and utility vehicles (UTVs) to use all county highways, except for County Road HH from State Road 82 in the Town of Marion to 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the Town of Kildare, County Road HH from County Road J in the Town of Lyndon to the Juneau County/Sauk County line, and County Road G from St. Mary's Way in the Town of Necedah to Wilson Lane in the Town of Necedah; and

WHEREAS, the Highway and Public Works Committee has determined that it is reasonable and appropriate to raise the speed limit for all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and utility vehicles (UTVs) using county roads from 25 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, the Highway and Public Works Committee also has determined that it is reasonable and necessary to authorize the County Sheriff and/or the County Highway Commissioner to close any county road, or portion thereof as deemed warranted permanently or temporarily;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does ordain that:

- 1. Subsection 32-328(a) of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances shall be and hereby is amended to read as follows:
  - "(a) All UTV/ATV operators shall observe a maximum speed limit of 25 35 miles per hour or as otherwise posted as roadway speed limits for ATV operation, and all county roads shall be open to UTV/ATV use, except for County Road HH form State Road 82 in the Town of Marion to 26th Avenue in the Town of Kildare, on County Road HH from County Road J in the Town of Lyndon to the Juneau County/Sauk County line, and on County Road G from St. Mary's Way in the Town of Necedah to Wilson Lane in the Town of Necedah."
- 2. A new subsection 32-328(g) of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances shall be and hereby is created to read as follows:
  - "(g) The County Sheriff and/or the County Highway Commissioner may close any county road, or portion thereof, as deemed warranted either permanently or temporarily."

Properties are located in: Lyndon Station, Mauston, Necedah (3), New Lisbon, Camp Douglas, Hustler, Elroy (2), Union Center, Wonewoc (2), Wautoma, and Redgranite.

#### ARPA funds request for Bluff Aire II in Necedah:

In March 2021, JCHA acquired Bluff Aire II Apartments (formerly Timberline Apartments) in Necedah. The 2 buildings, 24 units, on this property have 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom family units, is a much-needed asset for Necedah and Juneau County.

Progress has been made in turning these units around but have run into some roadblocks, mainly with the increase in the products needed to get the units rent ready.

JCHA would like to request \$250,000 for the immediate needs of Bluff Aire II Apartments.

**Rehabilitation needs:** JCHA has invested in a 3<sup>rd</sup> party completing a Certified Needs Assessment (CNA) to identify the immediate as well as the long-range needs of the Bluff Aire II property. The CNA also includes the cost for the repairs and replacements.

The ARPA funds would assist in addressing health and safety issues, rehab 8 units to make rent ready, building entry doors, replace damaged fire rated apartment entrance doors, appliances in all units, window treatments, landscaping, exterior lighting, replace parking lots, baseboard units in 16 units.

The Commissioners and Staff at JCHA take pride in the quality housing we provide throughout Juneau County for the elderly and disabled and are carrying this through to the Bluff Aire II family units in Necedah.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation and Wisconsin Farm Bureau, Wisconsin Conservation Congress (2011, 2013, 2021), officially support a Wisconsin Wolf population goal of 350 or less; and

WHEREAS, thirty-six (36) county boards, half the county boards in Wisconsin, from north to south, have passed resolutions that recommend a Wisconsin wolf population goal of 350 or less; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's residents have experienced depredations and threatening incidents involving wolves, including 107 officially listed conflicts in 2021; and

WHEREAS, the high predator population, in particular wolves, has resulted in the reduction of the deer population where wolves are plentiful, reduced hunting opportunities, curtailed livestock and pleasure horse activities, and are a danger to pets and people;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does approve a wolf population goal of 350 or less in the next Wisconsin Wolf Management Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors encourages the WDNR to include elected officials from counties with high wolf conflicts in the DNR Wolf Advisory Committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors requests that WDNR and other partners implement meaningful population controls in the Wisconsin Wolf Management Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors requests that WDNR not relocate problem wolves from other counties in the state into Juneau County; and





ORDINANCE No. 22 - 02

**INTRODUCED BY: Executive Committee** 

SYNOPSIS: An Ordinance Creating Section 4.48 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances regarding regulation of animals in County buildings and facilities.

WHEREAS, there is a need to regulate the presence of animals in County buildings and facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does ordain that:

Section 4.48 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

#### "Sec. 4-48

- "(a) To provide a safe and healthy work environment for all employees, consumers, and visitors, all animals are prohibited from Juneau County buildings with the exception of authorized service animals.
- "(b) While animals can have benefit in bolstering mental health or assisting with a disability, for the safety and well-being of all our consumers, citizens and staff, only bona fide, trained and certified service animals, or ones being properly trained and used for the benefit of one with a disability, are allowed in county buildings, as provided in Wis. Stats. § 106.52. "Emotional support" animals, as well as other pets, do not qualify as service animals.
- "(c) County staff are prohibited from asking an individual what their disability is and from asking for documentation that proves the animal has been trained to be a service animal. If the individual's disability is not readily apparent, staff are permitted to ask if the animal is a "service animal" and what tasks the animal performs for the individual.
  - "(1) If an individual indicates that the animal is an emotional support animal, staff should inform them of Juneau County's Animal Policy.
  - "(2) If an individual states he or she is a "service animal trainer," then it is permissible to require them to produce verification.
  - "(3) At times, Juneau County staff or volunteers may transport consumers along with their service animals, emotional support animals, and/or pets. In these situations, for the safety of everyone in the vehicle, including the animals' safety, all animals are required to be transported in a mobile kennel placed in the back of the vehicle.

- "(4) All individuals entering county buildings and all consumers who are receiving home based services/home visitations are expected to restrain all animals using a harness, leash or other tether. If this is not possible, the service animal must be removed from the county building or the animal must be removed from the area while Juneau County staff/contracted staff/vendors are in the home.
- "(d) A handler may be asked to leave with the animal if the animal is being disruptive or if the animal's behavior poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others. Handlers with animals may also be asked to leave if they are unclean and/or unsanitary.
- "(e) This policy does not apply to Law Enforcement canines."

RESOLVED, that, as soon as possible after members of a county committee have been appointed by the chairperson of the county board, the appointed or elected chairperson of the committee shall conduct an election in which a majority of the committee members select a committee member who is a member of the county board to be vice-chairperson of the committee to act in the place of the chairperson, when he or she is absent from a meeting of the committee.

ORDINANCE No. 22 - 3

INTRODUCED BY: Executive Committee

SYNOPSIS: Authorizing an Amendment to the Juneau County Code of Ordinances and the "Powers and Duties of Committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors" Regarding the Size and Makeup of the Juneau County Board of Health.

WHEREAS, section 251.03(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that, "A local board of health shall consist of not more than nine members," not less than three of whom shall be non-members of the county board that "have a demonstrated interest or competence in the field of public health or community health;" and

WHEREAS, section 2-710 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances currently provides that, "The board of health shall consist of three county board members and three non-members, of which two shall be from the medical profession;" and

WHEREAS, the "Powers and Duties of Committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors" currently provides that, "The board of health shall consist of three county board members and three non-members, of which two shall be from the medical profession," and said rule was enacted when it was the practice in the county to have a board totaling only six members; and

WHEREAS, the current Juneau County Board of Health and the Juneau County Health Officer would like to expand the board of health to consist of a total of nine members, five of whom shall be members of the county board and four of whom shall be non-members, to be selected in conformity with the provisions of Wis. Stats. § 251.03, and the Executive Committee approves of the proposed changes, as detailed below, as being in the best interests of Juneau County and its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does approve and authorize amendments to the language regarding the Board of Health in the "Powers and Duties of Committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors" and in the provisions of section 2-710 of the code of ordinances, so that they provide as follows:

 The Board of Health as a committee shall consist of five members from the County Board of Supervisors and four citizens who are not members of the county board.

Non-Supervisor committee members will be selected using the criteria described as follows in the Board of Health composition policy:

"[M] embers shall have a demonstrated interest or competence in the field of public health or community health. In appointing the members who are not elected officials or employees, a good faith effort shall be made to appoint a registered nurse and a physician, except that if the appointing authority is unable to locate a willing registered nurse, physician, or both, it shall make a good faith effort to appoint a physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or both. Members of the local board of health shall reflect the diversity of the community..."

3. All members of the Board of Health Committee have voting rights.

- 4. Non-Supervisors are appointed by county board chairperson, cannot serve longer than three consecutive two-year terms without a year break. Terms shall be staggered so that not all experience and historical knowledge is gone every 2 years.
- 5. All members serve at the pleasure of county board chairperson.
- 6. Supervisors' terms are two-year terms, concurrent with county board elections.
- 7. Members must attend 75% of meetings in person or by electronic means, unless excused by the county health officer.
- 8. The committee shall function within the parameters set forth in the "Powers and Duties of Juneau County Committees," §§ 2-710 and 2-711 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances, and Wis. Stats. § 251.03 (1).
- 9. A Vice-Chair shall be elected by the committee and must be a member of the county board.

The proposed budget for 2023, as approved by the Finance and Computer Committee is attached. This budget represents the collaborative effort of the Department Heads, their governing committees, and the Finance and Computer Committee to prepare a budget that meets the State of Wisconsin's levy limit law, while providing the highest quality service to the citizens of Juneau County.

The State budget that is in effect for 2023 includes levy limits. For 2023, the Counties are limited to net new construction. Juneau County's net new construction for 2023 is 1.105%, so we are only able to increase our operating levy by 1.105% in dollars over the 2022 budget. This budget represents an operating levy dollar increase of \$127,402 over 2022 with an operating mil rate of \$3.9455, which is a decrease of \$0.6427 from 2022. Also, the equalized valuation, excluding the TIF districts, of Juneau County increased by \$478,616,300. This is the amount on which the County property tax rate is based. The debt levy for 2023 increased by \$1,211,785. This represents a 6.09% increase in the debt levy from 2022. (See below)

The 2023 budget includes a 3% wage increase in January for all employees, excluding elected officials. The Finance and Computer Committee applied a total of \$300,000 from the Land Sales Capital Projects Fund, \$250,000 from the Forestry Fund, \$153,651 remaining balance of the tower project and \$50,000 from the Aging Fund to balance the budget. The Committee also applied \$78,012 from the ATC Badger Coulee Transmission Line funding to the 2023 budget to fund capital outlay items for the Parks and Land and Water Resources. The Committee also deceided to cut the JCEDC budget by \$73,883 to only fund the full time position, cut the funding from the IRC budget for the Advanced Leadership program facilitator and add the funding for that position to the Extension budget to be funded with unspent contract funds from 2022 that the state will carryover to 2023. The Committee, due to the fiscal constraints of the budget decided not to any reclassification requests. The two new positions were approved as there was no tax levy effect. After a lengthy discussion, The Committee decided to fund most of the capital items with a short term note. The total amount of that note is \$3,740,000. This includes approximately \$38,0000 for borrowing expenses. Please understand that this is a short term note. The funds will be borrowed in December, 2022 and the note will be paid off March 1, 2023. This will result in an interest payment on the debt of approximately \$35,000. Since the counties are under an artificial, state determined levy limit, this is the only way the counties can increase the tax levy to fund capital items. It is a much cheaper alternative to a bond issue. Without the issuance of this debt, there will be no capital outlay in the 2023 budget. If the debt is not approved and capital outlay is needed, there would need to be massive cuts in the 2023 operating budget, resulting in layoffs, as payroll is the largest expense in the budget.

This 2023 Budget Book includes information that more fully explains the historical data for Juneau County, as well as the details for the 2023 budget. Page 2 shows a ten year comparison of equalized values, property tax levies, and property rates. Page 3 shows the 2020-2023 budget trend, as well as 2020 and 2021 actual expenditures by department. Page 4 shows the same information by fund for all revenues, except the property tax levy and page 5 shows the four year property tax levy by department. Page 6 shows revenues, expenditures and property tax levies by fund for 2023. Pages shows revenues, expenditures and property tax levies by fund for 2023. Pages 7 through 17 show the 2023 budget by expense account number. These pages summarize the budget expenses with their offsetting revenues and calculating the property tax levy by account number. The report also shows a comparision to the 2022 budgeted property tax levy and the percentage increase or decrease. Page 18 lists the capital outlay items requested by the departments and proposed by the Finance and Computer Committee for 2023. Page 19 lists the new positions and reclassifications requested by the departments and proposed by the Finance and Computer Committee for 2023.

WHEREAS, Juneau County, Wisconsin (the "County") is in need of an amount not to exceed \$3,740,000 for the public purpose of paying the costs of projects included in the County's 2023 capital outlay program, such as constructing highway improvements and acquiring County equipment (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to authorize the issuance of general obligation promissory notes for such purposes pursuant to Chapter 67, Wis. Stats.; and

WHEREAS, the County may issue general obligation promissory notes only if one or more of the conditions specified in Section 67.045, Wis. Stats., apply; and

WHEREAS, general obligation promissory notes may be issued under Section 67.045, Wis. Stats., if the County Board of Supervisors adopts a resolution to issue the debt by a vote of at least three-fourths of its members-elect; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the County to issue such notes on a taxable rather than a tax-exempt basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Juneau County, Wisconsin, that:

- 1. There shall be issued, pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$3,740,000 (the "Notes") for the public purpose of financing the Project.
- 2. There be and there hereby is levied on all the taxable property in the County a direct, annual tax in such years and in such amounts as are sufficient to pay when due the principal and interest on the Notes.

# POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES OF THE JUNEAU COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

# General Provisions for Committees of the County Board (Including Statutory Boards or Commissions)

1. General: The powers of the county are exercised by the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, as a body politic, through the adoption of ordinances, resolutions, or motions. When it will serve the best interests of the county, the county board may delegate authority over the conduct of specific items of business through a committee.

The term "committee" as used herein includes elected committees, statutory committees, standing committees, and boards and commissions.

The county board may, by resolution, establish the purpose, duties and manner of reporting of the committees.

- 2. **Appointment:** Unless otherwise provided, members of committees shall be appointed by the chairperson of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors. All duly elected supervisors shall serve on their current committees until the county board chairperson appoints new committees.
- 3. **Minutes:** Each committee shall prepare and keep minutes of the proceedings of its meetings, and shall provide the Juneau County Clerk with a copy of same.
- 4. **Notice of meetings:** All notices of meetings shall be placed on an information board in the Courthouse and published on the County website at least 24 hours prior thereto. Such notice shall set forth the subject matter of said meeting as required by Wis. Stats. §§ 19.84 and 19.85.

An information copy of the meeting notice shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to the official newspaper of the Juneau County Board, and to all other media outlets requesting such copies, by the sponsoring committee.

The county board by ordinance may establish a separate procedure for convening the county board in a "declared emergency" as defined by county ordinance.

- 5. Schedule: All committees shall meet regularly and as needed.
- 6. **Duties and Responsibilities:** The duties and responsibilities of committees shall be as established by the county board, is-so-far as they are delegable and do not conflict with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
  - a. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to request that the county board acquire and hold, lease or rent real and personal property for public uses or purposes of any nature, within the limits and purposes of their respective department budgets.

All purchases made by a committee on behalf of its respective department shall be made by said committee and upon the signature of its chairperson.

- b. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to terminate, replace, or discontinue personnel in accordance with the Personnel Policy of Juneau County, and in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Equal Rights Division of the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development.
- c. All committees of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall refer all civil or criminal actions, to which the County is a party, to the corporation counsel or to the district attorney.
- d. Questions regarding policy or the powers or duties of any committee of the county board shall be brought before the board for resolution.
- 7. **Review Responsibility:** Committees shall evaluate programs under their jurisdiction to determine program definition, goals and objectives, costs, efficiency and effectiveness.
  - Committees shall recommend an annual budget for each department under their jurisdiction to the Juneau County Finance & Computer Committee and the county board.
- 8. **Reports:** All committees, or committee members, who attend conferences, conventions, or who represent the County in any type meeting in which the business of the County is affected or discussed, shall make a verbal, or if otherwise beneficial, a written report to the county board at its regular meeting.

#### **ELECTED COMMITTEES**

#### Highway and Public Works Committee.

The highway and public works committee shall consist of five county board members who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the county board for a term of two years to represent the county as follows:

One county board member to represent the northern region; One county board member to represent the southeastern region; One county board member to represent the southwestern region; Two county board members elected at large.

The powers and duties of the highway and public works committee shall be to function pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stats. § 83.015, and to report to the county board on matters pertinent to the highway department and the landfill.

#### STANDING AND STATUTORY COMMITTEES

Standing committees are considered to be committees of the county board to which matters brought before the county board are referred to for review, study, recommendation, or action.

Statutory committees may be defined as those which are specified in state law, if the county provides a particular service governed by statute or when a statute mandates a particular committee to be established.

#### General duties of committees, boards, and commissions are as follows:

- a. Review and recommend the annual budget for county departments
- b. Review of department financial reports for each of the county departments within the committee's oversight
- c. Direct and guide policy and accountability of the departments within the committee's oversight
- d. Approve departmental policies
- e. Review and recommend staffing levels and hours
- f. Review and recommend grant applications and acceptances
- g. Approve departmental fee schedules which are not governed by other law
- h. Review and recommend departmental short and long range goals
- i. Approve and bring forth intergovernmental agreements and contracts as necessary or as otherwise authorized by law
- j. Approve and bring forth resolutions and ordinances for action by the county board
- k. Allow any member of the county board to review any county financial record upon request, subject to HIPAA or other confidentiality rules

#### 1. Land & Water Conservation Committee

A committee on land and water resources conservation is authorized to be created by Wis. Stats. § 59.70(19). A land conservation committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. §§ 59.70(19), (20) and 92.06.

This joint committee shall consist of four county board members.

The duties of the land and water resources conservation committee shall be to:

- (1) function in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.56(3) in all matters relating to the personnel, duties and activities of the state agriculture and extension education department;
- (2) serve as members of the land and water resources conservation committee and function in accordance with provisions of Wis. Stats. ch. 92; and
- (3) serve as committee of jurisdiction in matters relating to the Farmland Preservation Law, Wis. Stats. ch. 91.

#### 2. Extension Education Committee

The committee shall consist of four members of the county board.

The duties of the extension education committee shall be to function in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.56(3) in all matters relating to the personnel, duties and activities of the state agriculture and extension education department.

#### 3. Personnel & Insurance Committee

This committee shall consist of four county board members.

- (a) The duties of the personnel and insurance committee in regard to personnel shall be to:
- (1) Recommend to the county board of supervisors the salaries and other compensation to be paid to all county officers and employees.
- (2) Confer with the various committees, offices and departments upon the creation of new positions as well as classification and salary thereof.
- (3) Review requests for position reclassification and make recommendations to the county board for the acceptance, rejection or modification of same.
- (4) Consider and make recommendations to the county board regarding organization of departments, re-organization and staffing levels.
- (5) Hear grievances when authorized by union contracts or by the county personnel policy.
- (6) Establish an employment policy, which conforms to state and federal laws, and provide for the screening, testing and selection of qualified personnel for employment by the county.
- (7) Develop a code of ethics as may be deemed necessary by the county board of supervisors.
- (b) The duties of this committee in regards to insurance shall be to:
- (1) Determine the amount of bonds to be furnished by the various officers to the county, and report on the sufficiency of each bond to the county board.
- (2) Supervise the placing of all types of insurance upon all county buildings and properties required for the protection of the county, with the approval of the county board supervisors.
- (3) Review annually all bonds, liability and all other types of insurance carried by the county and make recommendations to the county board as is deemed necessary.
- (4) Administer a countywide safety program in accordance with prescribed health and safety standards.
  - (5) Monitor the property inventory of the county for insurance purposes.
  - (6) Review all liability claims against the county.

#### 4. Building Committee

The building committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the building committee shall be to:

- (1) Inspect, from time to time, all county buildings, except those under the jurisdiction of another committee, and to ensure the proper repairs and maintenance of such buildings
  - (2) Coordinate the re-allocation of office spacing in county buildings.

- (3) Receive bids, where necessary, or otherwise let contracts on time and materials, using its best judgment, for the proper maintenance and repair of county buildings. All contracts, bids and specifications shall be let in accordance with Wis. Stats. §§ 59.52(29) and 66.0901, where applicable, and when approved by the county board. The original copy of each contract shall be filed in the county clerk's office.
- (4) Supervise the maintenance staff of buildings not under the jurisdiction of any other committee.

### 5. Emergency Management Committee

An emergency management committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 323.14(1)(a)3. The emergency management committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure the coordination of efforts with the state office of emergency government and county and local emergency government officials.
- (2) Make recommendations to the county board of supervisors relative to the county's responsibilities in regard to emergency government in accordance with Wis. Stats. ch. 166, with the assistance of the emergency government director.

#### 6. Executive Committee

This executive committee shall consist of the elected chairperson and two vice-chairpersons of the county board.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Prepare the agenda for each county board meeting.
- (2) Consider and evaluate resolutions to be taken up at the county board meeting.
- (3) Consider and resolve all special problems that may arise between sessions of the county board that do not fall in the province of a regular committee; or to act when the county board has not taken action to appoint a special committee; or to take action on matters of an emergency nature between sessions of the county board.
- (4) Act as the oversight committee for all the elected officials of the county and the corporation counsel.

The chairperson of the county board, or any member of the three-person executive committee of the board, shall be allowed to attend a meeting of any county committee for the purpose of constituting a quorum, allowing for the committee to function and conduct business when it might not otherwise do so because of a member not being present for the meeting.

For the orderly consideration of county business, any person or committee seeking to have a matter considered by the executive committee of the county board at its monthly meeting shall submit the matter to the county clerk no later than the Friday before the executive committee is scheduled to meet; otherwise, the proposed matter may not be approved by the executive committee

for inclusion on the agenda of the monthly county board meeting, unless the committee in its discretion determines the matter to be of such importance that an exception shall be made.

For all county committees: As soon as possible after members of a county committee have been appointed by the chairperson of the county board, the appointed or elected chairperson of the committee shall conduct an election in which a majority of the committee members select a committee member who is a member of the county board to be vice-chairperson of the committee to act in the place of the chairperson, when he or she is absent from a meeting of the committee.

#### 7. Finance and Computer Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members.

The power vested in the county board in Wis. Stats. § 65.90 with regard to budgetary policy is delegated in part to this committee, whose duties shall be to:

- (1) Prepare an annual budget for the county, submit same to the county board for its consideration and arrange for its publication and notice of hearing.
- (2) Transfer funds between budgeted items of a county department, if such budgeted items have been separately appropriated, up to \$15,000.00.
- (3) Supplement the appropriations for a particular office, department or activity by transfers from the contingent fund. Such committee transfers shall not exceed the amount set up in the contingent fund as adopted in the annual budget, nor aggregate in the case of an individual office, department or activity in excess of \$15,000.00 of the funds originally provided for such office, department or activity.
- (4) Review and make recommendations to the county board for appropriation to a current year budget for a purpose that was not anticipated in the budget. A vote of two thirds of the county board is required to approve such an appropriation.
- (5) Examine the financial condition of the county on a timely basis and advise departments, and the county board thereof.
- (6) Monitor the investment of the county's funds with the county treasurer, and recommend to the county board such investment procedures and use of depositories as will be most beneficial to the county.
- (7) Select and negotiate a contract for the annual audit of the accounts of county with a recognized independent audit firm, and recommend same to the county board of supervisors.
- (8) Meet with the independent auditor after completion of each annual audit and arrange for the auditor to review the findings of the audit with the county board of supervisors upon request of any county board member.
- (9) Set policy and ensure proper administration and application of computer services in the various departments of the county government.

#### 8. Board of Health

- (1) The board of health as a committee shall consist of five members from the county board of supervisors and four citizens who are not members of the county board.
- (2) Non-supervisor committee members will be selected using the criteria described as follows in the Board of Health composition policy:

"[M]embers shall have a demonstrated interest or competence in the field of public health or community health. In appointing the members who are not elected officials or employees, a good faith effort shall be made to appoint a registered nurse and a physician, except that if the appointing authority is unable to locate a willing registered nurse, physician, or both, it shall make a good faith effort to appoint a physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or both. Members of the local board of health shall reflect the diversity of the community..."

- (3) All members of the board of health have voting rights.
- (4) Non-supervisors are appointed by county board chairperson, cannot serve longer than three consecutive two-year terms without a year break. Terms shall be staggered so that not all experience and historical knowledge is gone every 2 years.
  - (5) All members serve at the pleasure of county board chairperson.
  - (6) Supervisors' terms are two-year terms, concurrent with county board elections.
- (7) Members must attend 75% of meetings in person or by electronic means, unless excused by the county health officer.
- (8) The board shall function within the parameters set forth in the "Powers and Duties of Juneau County Committees," §§ 2-710 and 2-711 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances, and Wis. Stats. § 251.03(1).
  - (9) A vice-chair shall be elected by the board and must be a member of the county board.

#### 9. Industrial & Recreation Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the industrial and recreation committee shall be to:

- (1) cooperate with the industrial development corporations within the county;
- (2) recommend programs to the county board for the improvement and development of recreational sites for the good of the county; and
- (3) perform the duties stated in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.56, 59.57 and 59.71.

#### 10. Land, Forestry, Parks & Zoning Committee

This committee shall consist of five county board members.

The duties of the land, forestry, parks and zoning committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure the proper management of all county forest lands, including special use lands, as provided in Wis. Stats. § 28.11, the county forestry ordinance, and the comprehensive ten-year forest management plan.
- (2) Work with the area forester to develop acceptable forestry practices, multiple use projects and outdoor recreational developments.
- (3) Cooperate with the department of natural resources on the conservation aid program and other conservation matters.
- (4) Provide for the appraisal, advertising, sale and closure of sales of all county lands as provided in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.52(6) and 75.35(2).
- (5) Supervise the construction, improvement and maintenance of all county-owned parks and exercise jurisdiction over park personnel, policies and schedules.
  - (6) Coordinate matters of importance with the county surveyor.
- (7) Recommend to the county board the enactment, amendment or repeal of such ordinances as in its opinion are in the best interests of the people of the county in all matters pertaining to zoning.
- (8) Carry out comprehensive plans; perform such additional duties and have such additional authority as the county board of supervisors may confer upon them.
  - (9) Ensure compliance with Wis. Stats. ch. 59, subch. VII.
  - (10) Receive applications for and recommend appointments of the zoning administrator.
- (11) To act as called for under §§ 6-75, 6-77(b), and 6-97 of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances.

#### 11. Sheriff & Jail Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of the sheriff and jail committee shall be to:

- (1) Ensure proper supervision of the sheriff's office and make such recommendations to the sheriff and to the county board, as they shall from time to time deem advisable and in the best interests of the county.
- (2) Recommend to the county board the number of deputy sheriffs that should be maintained in the county.

- (3) Review the operation of and establish internal operating policies for the proper administration of the sheriff's department and the jail.
- (4) Review all requests for equipment, services, salaries, wages or other compensations applying to the sheriff's department, the sheriff, the deputies, the undersheriff, and the jail, and approve/disapprove, or make recommendations to the county board on same.
- (5) Regulate and monitor the enforcement of Wis. Stats. ch. 174 pertaining to stray dogs in the county.
- (6) Coordinate the installation, maintenance and operation of the emergency 911 telephone system and tower communication system in accordance with Wis. Stats. §\$ 59.54(9) and 256.35 and a rural numbering system in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 59.54(4).

#### 12. Veterans Committee

The veterans committee shall consist of three county board members appointed by the county board chairperson.

The duties of the veterans committee shall be to:

- (1) ensure proper administration of the veteran's service office in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 45.001 et seq.; and
- (2) receive applications for, and recommend appointment of the veteran's service officer to the county board.

#### 13. Local Emergency Planning Committee

The local emergency planning committee is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 59.54(8).

The membership shall consist of three county board members and twelve non-members.

The powers and duties of the local emergency planning committee shall be as outlined in Wis. Stats. § 59.54(8).

#### 14. Committee on Aging and Disability

This Committee shall consist of twelve members, three of whom are elected members of the Juneau County Board of Supervisors, plus at least six but no more than nine citizen consumer representatives.

The governing board of the county office of the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Eagle Country Juneau County Office shall be known as the committee on aging and disability, and it shall consist of twelve persons, three of whom are county board members, also known separately as the aging and disability resource center (ADRC) advisory council. The committee on aging and disability shall enact bylaws consistent with the statutes and regulations applicable to the family care program administered by the state department of health services.

(2) Make periodic reports to the county board of supervisors on the progress of this program.

#### 19. Peace and Good Order Committee

This committee shall consist of three county board members.

The duties of this committee shall be to:

- (1) Oversee the implementation of the county junkyard ordinance.
- (2) Oversee implementation and administration of the county's adult entertainment ordinance.
- (3) Consider issues where ordinances should be revised, created or eliminated to address changing needs and circumstances in the county.
- (4) Review the provisions of this Code and recommend updates and revisions to the Code as warranted.

#### **BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS**

#### **Community Action**

This community action committee shall consist of one county board member.

The duties of this committee shall be to attend meetings of the Central Wisconsin Community Action Council and make timely reports to the county board about the various federal programs of interest to the people of the county.

#### Drainage Board

This drainage board shall consist of five persons appointed by the circuit court judge of the county.

The duties of the drainage board shall consist of the responsibilities outlined in Wis. Stats. ch. 88.

#### **Housing Authority**

The county housing authority shall consist of five members. Two members shall be county board members, and three members shall not be members of the county board to be appointed for a term of five years.

The duties and responsibilities of the housing authority shall be as outlined in Wis. Stats. §§ 59.53(22) and 66.1201 through 66.1211.

#### Juneau County Human Services Board

The county human services board shall be and hereby is established in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 46.23(4).

The human services board shall consist of seven members. Four of the members shall be county board members and three of the members shall be non-members of the county board appointed for a term of three years.

The human services board, created by the county board of supervisors pursuant to authority contained in Wis. Stats. § 46.23(4), shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Delivery of human services in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 46.23(3).
- (2) Perform the services required by Wis. Stats. chs. 46, 48, 49 and 51.
- (3) Prepare and submit an annual budget to the county board of supervisors in support of the human services department, and the human services board.
  - (4) Appoint advisory committees to recommend policy to the human services board.

#### Winding Rivers Library Board

This board shall be comprised of representatives of the several counties in the Winding Rivers Library delivery system, of which two members shall be appointed by the county board chairperson to represent Juneau County; one being a county board member, and one being a non-member.

The duties of these representatives shall be to represent the county on the Winding Rivers Library System Board, and to periodically report to the Juneau County Board of Supervisors.

#### **Traffic Safety Commission**

The establishment of a traffic safety commission is mandated by Wis. Stats. § 83.013.

The traffic safety commission shall be composed of the county highway commissioner or a designated representative; the chief county law enforcement officer or a designated representative; the county highway safety coordinator and a representative designated by the county board from each of the disciplines of education, medicine and law, and three representatives involved in law enforcement, highways and highway safety designated by the secretary of transportation.

#### Zoning Board of Adjustment

The zoning board of adjustment is created in the Shoreland-Wetlands Zoning Ordinance. *See* Appendix A, § 14.5, of the Juneau County Code of Ordinances.

This board shall consist of five persons who are not members of the county board, to be appointed by the chairperson of the county board.

#### **Veterans Service Commission**

The veterans service commission shall consist of at least three residents of the county who are veterans, who may or may not be members of the county board, and are appointed for staggered 3-year terms by the county board chairperson.

The duties of the veterans service commission shall be as prescribed in Wis. Stats. ch. 45.

SYNOPSIS: Resolution in Support of Increased County Child Support Funding

WHEREAS, Juneau County administers the Child Support Enforcement Program on behalf of the state, providing a holistic set of services to Juneau County children and their parents, including paternity establishment, assistance with finding employment, obtaining child support and establishing health insurance orders for children, and enforcing and modifying those orders; and

WHEREAS, Child support is one of the most effective anti-poverty programs in the state, with county child support agencies serving approximately 347,000 children and collecting roughly \$906 million in financial support for Wisconsin families in 2021; and

WHEREAS, Child support is proven to reduce childhood poverty rates, lead to better educational and behavioral outcomes for children, and have a positive effect on food security, health and housing stability; and

WHEREAS, County child support agencies work closely with both parents to ensure that they have the help they need to be successful, including assistance with finding employment, referrals to other social service programs and right-sizing orders for individuals impacted by substances use disorders or other challenges; and

WHEREAS, State funding for county child support services has failed to keep up with county agency costs, which have steadily increased due to a high number of caseloads per worker, increased complexity of cases, inflation and new regulations; and

WHEREAS, An abrupt federal interpretation change in June 2019 eliminated \$4.2 million in federal birth cost recovery matching funds for Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's strong performance in child support is at risk without additional funding. The state has already dropped from 2<sup>nd</sup> in the nation for the collection of current support in 2016 to 6<sup>th</sup> in the nation in 2021.

WHEREAS, Without additional state funds, county child support agencies may need to eliminate positions, further increase caseloads, or reduce services, further impacting federal performance measures, which would result in the loss of additional federal funds; and

WHEREAS, The individuals most impacted by insufficient funding for child support are the children and families served by county child support agencies, who will need to seek out public assistance programming absent the financial security provided by the child support program; and

WHEREAS, State investments in child support are amplified by a generous federal match. Every \$1 of state GPR invested in the Child Support Program generates roughly \$2 in federal matching funds; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is incredibly cost-effective, collecting an average of \$6.43 in support for every dollar invested in the program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Juneau County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that state funding for county child support agencies be increased by \$5 million GPR in each fiscal year of the 2023-25 Wisconsin state budget, which will generate approximately \$9.7 million in additional federal funding each year. This investment will ensure that Wisconsin counties can continue to effectively provide economic support to our children.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the County Clerk to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, State Senators and State Representatives representing Juneau County, the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Administration, and the Wisconsin Counties Association for consideration.

INTRODUCED BY: Executive Committee

SYNOPSIS: Resolution Awarding the Sale of \$3,740,000 Taxable General Obligation Promissory Notes

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2022, the County Board of Supervisors of Juneau County, Wisconsin (the "County") adopted an initial resolution (the "Initial Resolution") authorizing the issuance of general obligation promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$3,740,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of projects included in the County's 2023 capital outlay program, such as constructing highway improvements and acquiring County equipment (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Initial Resolution was adopted by the County Board of Supervisors by a vote of at least three-fourths of its members-elect; and

WHEREAS, the County is authorized by the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, to borrow money and issue general obligation promissory notes for such public purposes; and

WHEREAS, none of the proceeds of the Notes shall be used to fund the operating expenses of the general fund of the County or to fund the operating expenses of any special revenue fund of the County that is supported by the property taxes; and

WHEREAS, due to certain provisions contained in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, it is necessary to issue the Notes on a taxable rather than tax-exempt basis; and

WHEREAS, the County has directed Wisconsin Public Finance Professionals, LLC ("WPFP") to take the steps necessary to sell taxable general obligation promissory notes (the "Notes") to pay the cost of the Project; and

WHEREAS, WPFP, in consultation with the officials of the County, prepared an Official Notice of Sale (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference) setting forth the details of and the bid requirements for the Notes and indicating that the Notes would be offered for public sale on December 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the County Clerk (in consultation with WPFP) caused a form of notice of the sale to be published and/or announced and caused the Official Notice of Sale to be distributed to potential bidders offering the Notes for public sale on December 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the County has duly received bids for the Notes as described on the Bid Tabulation attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Bid Tabulation"); and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the bid proposal (the "Proposal") submitted by the financial institution listed first on the Bid Tabulation fully complies with the bid requirements set forth in the Official Notice of Sale and is deemed to be the most advantageous to the County. WPFP has recommended that the County accept the Proposal. A copy of said Proposal submitted by such institution (the "Purchaser") is attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit C">Exhibit C</a> and incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Juneau County, Wisconsin, that:

Section 1. Ratification of the Official Notice of Sale and Offering Materials. The County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies and approves the details of the Notes set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto as and for the details of the Notes. The Official Notice of Sale and any other offering materials prepared and circulated by WPFP are hereby ratified and approved in all respects. All actions taken by officers of the County and WPFP in connection with the preparation and distribution of the Official Notice of Sale, and any other offering materials are hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

Section 1A. Authorization and Award of the Notes. For the purpose of paying the cost of the Project, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum of THREE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,740,000) from the Purchaser in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Proposal. The Proposal of the Purchaser offering to purchase the Notes for the sum set forth on the Proposal, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery, resulting in a true interest cost as set forth on the Proposal, is hereby accepted. The Chairperson and County Clerk or other appropriate officers of the County are authorized and directed to execute an acceptance of the Proposal on behalf of the County. The good faith deposit of the Purchaser shall be applied in accordance with the Official Notice of Sale, and any good faith deposits submitted by unsuccessful bidders shall be promptly returned. The Notes shall bear interest at the rate set forth on the Proposal.

Section 2. Terms of the Notes. The Notes shall be designated "Taxable General Obligation Promissory Notes"; shall be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$3,740,000; shall be dated their date of issuance; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; shall be numbered R-1; and shall bear interest at the rate per annum and mature on March 1, 2023 as set forth on the Pricing Summary attached hereto as Exhibit D-1 and incorporated herein by this reference. Interest shall be payable at maturity. Interest shall be computed upon the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months and will be rounded pursuant to the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. The schedule of principal and interest payments due on the Notes is set forth on the Debt Service Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit D-2 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Schedule").

Section 3. Redemption Provisions. The Notes are not subject to optional redemption.

Section 4. Form of the Notes. The Notes shall be issued in registered form and shall be executed and delivered in substantially the form attached hereto as  $\underline{\text{Exhibit E}}$  and incorporated herein by this reference.

### Section 5. Tax Provisions.

(A) Direct Annual Irrepealable Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Notes as the same becomes due, the full faith, credit and resources of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the County a direct annual irrepealable tax in the year 2022 for the payments due in the year 2023 in the amount set forth on the Schedule.

(B) Tax Collection. So long as any part of the principal of or interest on the Notes remains unpaid, the County shall be and continue without power to repeal such levy or obstruct the collection of said tax until all such payments have been made or provided for. After the issuance of the Notes, said tax shall be, from year to year, carried onto the tax roll of the County and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes of the County for said years are collected, except that the amount of tax carried

onto the tax roll may be reduced in any year by the amount of any surplus money in the Debt Service Fund Account created below.

(C) Additional Funds. If at any time there shall be on hand insufficient funds from the aforesaid tax levy to meet principal and/or interest payments on said Notes when due, the requisite amounts shall be paid from other funds of the County then available, which sums shall be replaced upon the collection of the taxes herein levied.

### Section 6. Segregated Debt Service Fund Account.

(A) Creation and Deposits. There shall be and there hereby is established in the treasury of the County, if one has not already been created, a debt service fund, separate and distinct from every other fund, which shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Debt service or sinking funds established for obligations previously issued by the County may be considered as separate and distinct accounts within the debt service fund.

designated as the "Debt Service Fund Account for Taxable General Obligation Promissory Notes, dated December 30, 2022" (the "Debt Service Fund Account") and such account shall be maintained until the indebtedness evidenced by the Notes is fully paid or otherwise extinguished. There shall be deposited into the Debt Service Fund Account (i) all accrued interest received by the County at the time of delivery of and payment for the Notes; (ii) any premium which may be received by the County above the par value of the Notes and accrued interest thereon; (iii) all money raised by the taxes herein levied and any amounts appropriated for the specific purpose of meeting principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (iv) such other sums as may be necessary at any time to pay principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (v) surplus monies in the Borrowed Money Fund as specified below; and (vi) such further deposits as may be required by Section 67.11, Wisconsin Statutes.

(B) Use and Investment. No money shall be withdrawn from the Debt Service Fund Account and appropriated for any purpose other than the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes until all such principal and interest has been paid in full and the Notes canceled; provided (i) the funds to provide for each payment of principal of and interest on the Notes prior to the scheduled receipt of taxes from the next succeeding tax collection may be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America maturing in time to make such payments when they are due or in other investments permitted by law; and (ii) any funds over and above the amount of such principal and interest payments on the Notes may be used to reduce the next succeeding tax levy, or may, at the option of the County, be invested by purchasing the Notes as permitted by and subject to Section 67.11(2)(a), Wisconsin Statutes, or in permitted municipal investments under the pertinent provisions of the Wisconsin Statutes ("Permitted Investments"), which investments shall continue to be a part of the Debt Service Fund Account.

(C) Remaining Monies. When all of the Notes have been paid in full and canceled, and all Permitted Investments disposed of, any money remaining in the Debt Service Fund Account shall be transferred and deposited in the general fund of the County, unless the County Board of Supervisors directs otherwise.

Section 7. Proceeds of the Notes; Segregated Borrowed Money Fund. The proceeds of the Notes (the "Note Proceeds") (other than any premium and accrued interest which must be paid at the time of the delivery of the Notes into the Debt Service Fund Account created above) shall be deposited into a special fund (the "Borrowed Money Fund") separate and distinct from all other funds of the County and disbursed solely for the purpose or purposes for which borrowed. In no event shall monies in the Borrowed Money Fund be used to fund operating expenses of the general fund of the County or of any special revenue fund of the County that is supported by property taxes. Monies in the Borrowed Money Fund may be temporarily invested in Permitted Investments. Any monies, including any income from Permitted Investments, remaining in the Borrowed Money Fund after the purpose or purposes for which the Notes have been issued have been accomplished, and, at any time, any monies as are not needed and which obviously thereafter cannot be needed for such purpose(s) shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund Account.

Section 8. Execution of the Notes; Closing; Professional Services. The Notes shall be issued in printed form, executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson and County Clerk, authenticated, if required, by the Fiscal Agent (defined below), sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any, or a facsimile thereof, and delivered to the Purchaser upon payment to the County of the purchase price thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery (the "Closing"). The facsimile signature of either of the officers executing the Notes may be imprinted on the Notes in lieu of the manual signature of the officer but, unless the County has contracted with a fiscal agent to authenticate the Notes, at least one of the signatures appearing on each Note shall be a manual signature. In the event that either of the officers whose signatures appear on the Notes shall cease to be such officers before the Closing, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until the Closing. The aforesaid officers are hereby authorized and directed to do all acts and execute and deliver the Notes and all such documents, certificates and acknowledgements as may be necessary and convenient to effectuate the Closing. The County hereby authorizes the officers and agents of the County to enter into, on its behalf, agreements and contracts in conjunction with the Notes, including but not limited to agreements and contracts for legal, trust, fiscal agency, disclosure and continuing disclosure, and rebate calculation services. Any such contract heretofore entered into in conjunction with the issuance of the Notes is hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

Section 9. Payment of the Notes; Fiscal Agent. The principal of and interest on the Notes shall be paid by the County Clerk or the County Treasurer (the "Fiscal Agent").

Section 10. Persons Treated as Owners; Transfer of Notes. The County shall cause books for the registration and for the transfer of the Notes to be kept by the Fiscal Agent. The person in whose name any Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and payment of either principal or interest on any Note shall be made only to the registered owner thereof. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Note to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Any Note may be transferred by the registered owner thereof by surrender of the Note at the office of the Fiscal Agent, duly endorsed for the transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon such transfer, the Chairperson and County Clerk shall execute and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new Note or Notes of a like aggregate principal amount, series and maturity and the Fiscal Agent shall record the name of each transferee in the registration book. No registration shall be made to bearer. The Fiscal Agent shall cancel any Note surrendered for transfer.

The County shall cooperate in any such transfer, and the Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to execute any new Note or Notes necessary to effect any such transfer.

Section 11. Record Date. The 15th day of the calendar month next preceding the interest payment date shall be the record date for the Notes (the "Record Date"). Payment of interest on the Notes on any interest payment date shall be made to the registered owners of the Notes as they appear on the registration book of the County at the close of business on the Record Date.

Section 12. Utilization of The Depository Trust Company Book-Entry-Only System. In order to make the Notes eligible for the services provided by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), the County agrees to the applicable provisions set forth in the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations, which the County Clerk or other authorized representative of the County is authorized and directed to execute and deliver to DTC on behalf of the County to the extent an effective Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations is not presently on file in the County Clerk's office.

Section 13. Official Statement. The County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Preliminary Official Statement with respect to the Notes and deems the Preliminary Official Statement as "final" as of its date for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"). All actions taken by officers of the County in connection with the preparation of such Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda to it or final Official Statement are hereby ratified and approved. In connection with the Closing, the appropriate County official shall certify the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda or final Official Statement. The

County Clerk shall cause copies of the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda or final Official Statement to be distributed to the Purchaser.

Section 14. Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure. The County covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the owners of the Notes, to enter into a written undertaking (the "Undertaking") required by the Rule to provide continuing disclosure of timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. The Undertaking shall be enforceable by the owners of the Notes or by the Purchaser on behalf of such owners (provided that the rights of the owners and the Purchaser to enforce the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific performance of the obligations thereunder and any failure by the County to comply with the provisions of the Undertaking shall not be an event of default with respect to the Notes).

To the extent required under the Rule, the Chairperson and County Clerk, or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Notes, shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the details and terms of the County's Undertaking.

<u>Section 15. Record Book.</u> The County Clerk shall provide and keep the transcript of proceedings as a separate record book (the "Record Book") and shall record a full and correct statement of every step or proceeding had or taken in the course of authorizing and issuing the Notes in the Record Book.

Section 16. Bond Insurance. If the Purchaser determines to obtain municipal bond insurance with respect to the Notes, the officers of the County are authorized to take all actions necessary to obtain such municipal bond insurance. The Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to agree to such additional provisions as the bond insurer may reasonably request and which are acceptable to the Chairperson and County Clerk including provisions regarding restrictions on investment of Note proceeds, the payment procedure under the municipal bond insurance policy, the rights of the bond insurer in the event of default and payment of the Notes by the bond insurer and notices to be given to the bond insurer. In addition, any reference required by the bond insurer to the municipal bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Note provided herein.

Section 17. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability: Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the County Board of Supervisors or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

SYNOPSIS: Requesting that the State Revise the Current Real Estate Transfer Fees Revenue Sharing Formula

WHEREAS, the collection by counties of a real estate transfer fee was mandated by the State of Wisconsin in 1969, and included a requirement that counties remit 50% of all transfer fees collected to the State; and

WHEREAS, in 1981 the State arbitrarily changed the transfer fee formula to now require counties to remit to the State 80% of all transfer fees collected; and

WHEREAS, the County through the Register of Deeds office assumes the annual operating costs of recording all real estate transfers occurring in Juneau County, including the collection of real estate transfer fees; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 Juneau County collected \$609,805.50 in real estate transfer fees with the County's 20% retained share totaling \$121,961.10, and was required to remit 80% or \$487,844.40 to the State; and

WHEREAS, Juneau County real estate transfer fee collections as averaged over the past five years totaled \$2,182,367.40, of which the County retained \$436,473.48; and over that same period \$1,745,893.92 was remitted to the State; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the State of Wisconsin has built up a budget surplus of approximately \$2.5 billion dollars, while many Wisconsin counties continue to struggle financially due to the ever-increasing costs of providing county government services in an inflationary economy, coupled with the financial restrictions imposed by State mandated levy limits; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to financially assist all Wisconsin Counties, Juneau County requests that the State of Wisconsin return the real estate transfer fee share formula to again allow Wisconsin Counties to retain 50% of all total real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% of all real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% to be remitted to the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Juneau County Board of Supervisors shall and hereby does request that the State of Wisconsin revise the real estate transfer fee share formula to again allow Wisconsin Counties to retain 50% of all real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% to be remitted to the State.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to Governor Tony Evers, all members of the State Legislature representing Juneau County, the Wisconsin Counties Association and all other Wisconsin Counties.
